Release Notes

Overview

This document describes the enhancements and major defect fixes that were made to this release of RWMS.

Functional Enhancements

Catch Weight Functionality

In RWMS version 12.0, the following key enhancements were made to Catch Weight functionality:

- The system enabled support for Average Charging.
- The system provided a more discrete use of receiving tolerances to validate actual pallet weight as opposed to nominal pallet weight for products going to case put to store (PTS).
- The system enabled support for Average Weight calculation in RMS for simple pack items by providing specific transactional data.

In release 12.0.2, additional Catch Weight functionality was added as follows:

- The system allows for receiving tolerances to apply as under-receiving tolerances in addition to the over-receiving tolerances currently supported. Under-tolerance validation is implemented at the pallet level only. The expected “nominal” weight of each pallet is based on the item’s unit of measure conversion factor (from item master data) times the unit quantity on the pallet. Further, the minimum weight is calculated using the weight tolerance percentage maintained at the item-supplier. The entered weight during receiving is compared against the acceptable range. Weights falling below the minimum prompt the receiving user with a soft warning.
- The system has undergone modifications related to receiving tolerances functionality such that pallets or cases being received for reserve inventory are evaluated not only against the purchase order (PO) ordered weight but also against the nominal pallet weight using the allowable tolerance (calculated as described above).

Noteworthy Fixed Issues

Bugs reported in previous versions during the development cycle of RWMS 12.0 and RWMS 12.0.1 were rolled into the latest version and included as part of the RWMS 12.0.2 release.

The majority of bugs resolved in this release are related to two areas of functionality, catch weight (described above) and transfer assets (the requirement to track the inventory of transport containers among the distribution center, stores and suppliers).
