- Business analysts who are looking for high-level functional information about this release.
- System analysts and system operation personnel who are looking for high-level functional and technical content related to this release.

Known Issues

- The product name and version number appear incorrectly for Spanish language users.
- Functionality has not yet been added to RWMS to fully support the multi-level distribution (MLD) functionality previously added to Oracle Retail Allocation. Once implemented, an Oracle Retail Allocation user will be able to allocate a distribution center (DC) to DC shipment prior to receipt in the second DC. This functionality causes the merchandise to move as a cross-dock shipment directly to the store from the second DC. This capability of integratingd with the RWMS receiving modules is actively being addressed by development.
