Product Overview

Oracle Universal Records Manager (URM) provides the ability to perform records management, retention management, and litigation support across the entire enterprise. From a single Oracle URM server, organizations can define all their policies for records and retention management, as well as perform legal searches and apply litigation holds.

The Oracle URM Adapter for Content Server (hereafter abbreviated as the Adapter) obtains these policies from the URM server and applies them to the content items stored in the Content Server Vault.

The Adapter provides the bridge between URM which manages the content management policies and the Adapter server's content vault which stores the content. The Adapter enables corporations to manage records and retention policies and legal holds across multiple Content Servers from a single location. The Adapter sends information back to the URM server, so it can maintain an up-to-date catalog of the enterprise's important content. Thus, companies can apply their records and retention policies to more content, more consistently, with less administrative effort, and less disruption for users. These same benefits apply to litigation searches and holds.

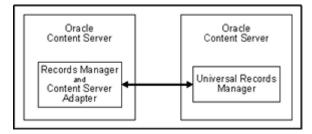
This administration guide is intended for system administrators who need to install and configure the Adapter. System administrators will also use this guide to manage retention functions using the combined user interface for the Adapter and Records Manager (RM). This guide assumes that the product has been installed correctly and that you are familiar with Oracle products in general and the overall architecture of Content Server.

Standard Installation Architecture

This section provides a general overview of the relationships between the primary products.

Content Server has a vault, in which content is stored and managed. The Content Server adapter, when registered, passes the retention schedule from URM to the content in the Content Server vault.

Figure 1-1 Standard Adapter Installation Architecture



The major components involved in a typical installation include:

- ❖ URM—Enables organizations to manage their records and retention policies, disposition processes and litigation or audit holds in a central repository known as a URM Server. These policies, dispositions, and holds are applied to repository content through the Adapter.
- ❖ RM—Enables organizations to effectively manage both record and non-record content items on a retention schedule. The focus of records management tends to be the preservation of records for historical or archival purposes. Conversely, the focus of retention management of non-record content items tends to be the scheduled elimination of content in which the costs of retaining content outweighs the value of keeping it.
- **Content Server**—Stores and manages content in a repository.
- ❖ Oracle URM Adapter for Content Server—Communicates between URM and the Adapter server's content vault. The Adapter enables corporations to control content retention in the Adapter server's content vault through URM which deploys the enterprise's policies. The Adapter provides common retention functionality as follows:
 - Identifying the content in the repository that is of interest to URM.
 - Performing searches and declaring the applicable content items to URM.
 - Performing disposition actions on the existing content items when their retention periods end.
 - Establishing and removing holds and freezes on the content items, as necessary.

Overview of URM and the Adapter

Universal Records Management (URM) allows organizations to manage their records and retention policies, disposition processes, and litigation holds or freezes in a central repository known as a Universal Records Management (URM) server. They can then apply those policies, dispositions, and holds to content stored in multiple repositories

through URM Adapters. The repositories may be any server or application that holds content whose retention is to be controlled.

In this case, the Adapter server's content vault holds records and non-record content that needs to be preserved for a retention period, specified in a corporate retention schedule, and then destroyed according to a corporate disposition process. The records are preserved in place since the Adapter server's content vault has the ability to ensure that the record will remain unalterable during the retention period. Upon request, the Adapter server's content vault is also able to purge the records at the end of the retention period.

The Adapter server's content vault may also hold content that is not considered business records (non-records). There is no requirement that the content be preserved for the retention period although it may be desirable for various reasons. When retention of this content is no longer necessary, it can be disposed of according to the disposition processes stored within URM. With both records and non-records, there is an obligation to ensure that any material that is subject to a litigation or audit hold (freeze) is not deleted, either by a user or as part of a disposition process. The Adapter enables URM to ensure that deletion does not happen.



Note: Content items that are non-records and are not subject to a litigation or audit hold are not transferred to URM. Instead, these documents remain in the Adapter server's content vault and only their metadata is stored in URM.

Overview of the Retention Functions

The Adapter is the intermediary between URM and the Adapter server's content vault and manages their intercommunications. Content is stored in and remains in the Adapter server's content vault while URM simultaneously enforces corporate retention policies, disposition processes, and legal holds on the stored content.

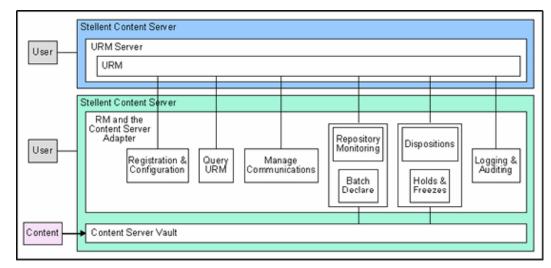


Figure 1-2 Adapter Retention Functions Overview

The Adapter provides the following basic retention functions:

- ❖ Registration—The Adapter registers itself with URM. This ensures that URM knows about the Adapter server's content vault and is ready to manage the stored content within the repository.
- ❖ Configuration—The Adapter handles all configuration requirements. This includes collecting the proper identification and credentials information for URM security and communications. Configuration information also includes mapping metadata fields and defining searches.
- ❖ Query URM—The Adapter queries URM for certain information. For example, it may need to retrieve retention schedules for specific items of interest. Or, the Adapter may need to request URM metadata for content items and obtain lifecycle information.
- ❖ Manage Communications—The Adapter monitors batch processes, handles communication errors with URM, and handles large work requests by grouping them into communication blocks and processing the response in chunks.
- ❖ Repository Monitoring and Batch Declare—The Adapter monitors the Adapter server's content vault by periodically searching the repository and informing URM of any changes in the repository that affect disposition processes or audit holds. For example, the Adapter will inform URM about new content checkins that need to be managed.

- ❖ Perform URM Tasks—The Adapter periodically asks URM for tasks that need to be performed within the repository. These tasks enable URM to abide by the corporate retention policies and disposition processes. Typical tasks include:
 - URM may want the Adapter to perform a search within the Adapter server's content vault and provide a list of items matching the search criteria.
 - As part of a scheduled disposition process, URM may want the Adapter to purge (or use another disposition method) an item that is stored in the Adapter server's content vault.
 - When a litigation hold applies to managed content within the Adapter server's content vault, URM may want the Adapter to retrieve a list of affected items and preserve them to ensure that they are not edited or destroyed.
 - When a litigation hold is removed, URM may want the Adapter to stop preserving the affected items and dispose of them according to retention schedule disposition rules and instructions.
- Logging and Auditing—The Adapter provides consistent logging for the activities it coordinates. The Adapter contributes event information to the log files that are then uploaded to URM, consolidated, and stored.

Compatibility with Content Server

Currently, the Oracle URM Adapter for Content Server 10gR3 communicates with Oracle Universal Records Manager 10gR3. Currently, this version of URM is supported only on Oracle Content Server versions 10gR3.

Supported Databases

The current version of the Adapter supports the same databases as does Content Server 10gR3 and Records Manager Corporate Edition 10gR3:

The following databases are supported:

- ❖ Microsoft SQL Server 2000 with Service Pack 3a or higher
- **❖** IBM DB2 8.1
- ❖ Oracle 9*i* (version 9.2) or Oracle 10*g*



Important: Oracle 9i versions prior to 9.2 are *not* supported. There is a known issue with these versions involving update statements with date fields that can corrupt rows of data (Oracle issue 2446039).



Important: If you are using IBM DB2 as the database, you may need to create additional tablespace to handle a 32K page size. See Preparing a DB2 Database (page 2-2) for further details.

INSTALLATION SUMMARY

Before installing the Adapter software, the following pre-installation tasks and considerations should be taken into account:

- ❖ You must ensure that Universal Records Manager, which includes Content Server, is installed on the URM server. For more information about the basic Adapter architecture, see Standard Installation Architecture on page 1-2. For installation information about URM, refer to the *Oracle Universal Records Manager Installation Guide*.
- ❖ If you are using DB2 as your database, some configuration changes may be necessary. See Preparing a DB2 Database on page 2-2.
- ❖ Before you install the Adapter, you must install the Common Utilities Bundle. See Installing the Common Utilities Bundle on page 2-4.
- ❖ After you have installed the Common Utilities Bundle, you will need to install the Adapter. See Installing the Adapter on page 2-6.



Caution: You CAN NOT install the Adapter for Content Server on a system that has either Records Manager Corporate Edition or Records Manager DoD Edition installed. Updating your system with the Adapter for Content Server IS NOT supported if you already have a Records Manager product installed.

- ❖ After you have installed the Adapter, you will need to restart Content Server. See Restarting Content Server on page 2-8.
- ❖ After you have restarted Content Server, you may need to rebuild the Content Server Search Index. See Rebuilding the Content Server Index on page 2-9.
- ❖ After you have rebuilt the search index, you will need to define an outgoing provider. See Defining an Outgoing Provider (page 2-10).

PREPARING A DB2 DATABASE

If you are using DB2 as the database, you may need to make some configuration changes. DB2 has a default page size of 4K, while the Adapter requires a 32K page size. If you are using DB2's default page size, you will need to create additional tablespace that can handle a 32K page size.

To create additional tablespace for the DB2 database, complete the following steps:

1. In the DB2 command-line processor, create a BufferPool that has a 32K page size:

```
CONNECT TO <db_name> USER <user_name> USING <password> CREATE BUFFERPOOL WIDE SIZE 250 PAGESIZE 32k DISCONNECT <db name>
```

- 2. Reload the Oracle database to activate the newly created BufferPool:
 - ❖ If the Oracle database is the only database in the DB2 instance, use the following commands to reload the database:

```
FORCE APPLICATION ALL

DEACTIVATE DATABASE < db_name >

ACTIVATE DATABASE < db name >
```

- ❖ If there is more than one database in the DB2 instance, use the following commands to reload the database:
 - a. Find the applications that are connected to the Oracle database using the following command:

```
LIST APPLICATIONS FOR DATABASE < db name >
```

- b. Close each application connection using the following command: FORCE APPLICATION <application-handle>
- c. Reload the database using the following commands:

```
DEACTIVATE DATABASE < db\_name > ACTIVATE DATABASE < db\_name >
```



Note: If any of the FORCE, DEACTIVATE, or ACTIVATE commands doesn't return DB20000I, finish all three commands and then run them again.

3. Create the tablespace, temporary tablespace, and system temporary tablespace using the following commands:

```
CONNECT TO <db_name> USER <user_name> USING <password>
CREATE TABLESPACE WIDE_TBSP PAGESIZE 32K MANAGED BY SYSTEM USING
('<absolute_dir_path_for_tablespace>') BufferPool WIDE
CREATE TEMPORARY TABLESPACE TEMP_WIDE_TBSP PAGESIZE 32K MANAGED BY SYSTEM
USING ('<absolute_dir_path_for_temp_tablespace>') BufferPool WIDE
CREATE SYSTEM TEMPORARY TABLESPACE TEMP_SYS_W_TBSP PAGESIZE 32K MANAGED BY
SYSTEM USING ('<absolute_dir_path_for_system_tabspace>')
BufferPool WIDE DISCONNECT <db name>
```



Note: Make sure that the *<user_name>* and *<password>* match Oracle's *JdbcUser* and *JdbcPassword* configuration entries. If they do not match, you will need to grant rights to Oracle's *JdbcUser* on these newly created tablespaces.

4. Make sure there are no tables in the default tablespace.



Important: If tables exist, you should migrate data before dropping the default tablespace. Otherwise, you could lose data when performing the next step.

5. Use the following commands to drop the default tablespace:

```
CONNECT TO <db_name> USER <user_name> USING <password>
DROP TABLESPACE USERSPACE1
DISCONNECT <db name>
```

The Component Wizard main screen and the Component List screen are displayed.

2. On the Component List screen, click **Install**.

The Install screen is displayed.

3. Click **Select**.

The Zip File Path screen is displayed.

- 4. Navigate to the *UrmAgent.zip* file and select it.
- 5. Click **Open**.

The zip file contents that will be installed are added to the Install screen list.

6. Click OK.

The Edit Preference Prompt dialog is displayed and you are prompted to enable or disable the Retention Manager Email option. If you select this option, the Retention Manager Email component is installed.

This component allows automatic capturing of e-mail information. It is used in conjunction with the Outlook Integration portion of the Desktop Integration Suite. For new installations, this option is enabled by default.

The Retention Manager Email component is installed in the following directory:

<install dir>/custom/RmaEmail

7. Click OK.

Component Wizard asks if you want to enable the Adapter.

8. Click Yes.

The Adapter is listed as enabled on the Component List screen.

- 9. Exit the Component Wizard.
- 10. Restart Content Server to apply the updated installation parameters. See Restarting Content Server on page 2-8.

RESTARTING CONTENT SERVER

Whenever you add and enable a new component, you need to restart Content Server. If you prefer or require any down time, you may also choose to stop and then start Content Server with two separate commands.

You can restart Content Server by reinitiating the services (Windows) or by reinitiating the processes (UNIX).

You can also restart Content Server by using the Admin Server. You need to have the 'sysmanager' role to access a content server through Admin Server.

To restart Content Server using the Admin Server, complete the following steps:

- 1. Log into Content Server as a system administrator.
- 2. Go to the Administration Applets page and click the **Admin Server** link.
- 3. On the Content Admin Server page, click the button of the content server instance that you want to restart.

The status page for the content server instance is displayed.

- 4. In the option list for the server instance, click the **Component Manager** link. Verify that the Adapter component is displayed in the **Enabled Components** box.
- 5. In the option list for the server instance, click the **Start/Stop Content Server** link.
- 6. Restart the content server by clicking the restart icon.

REBUILDING THE CONTENT SERVER INDEX



Important: This step is only required if your Content Server is using Verity as the search/index engine. If you are using database searching/indexing, you do not need to rebuild the search index.

A new installation of the Adapter10gR3 adds custom metadata fields to the content server. For an overview of these fields, see Appendix A (*Metadata Fields*). After installing the Adapter for the first time, you need to rebuild the Verity search index.

Please note the following:

- ❖ After installing the Adapter for the first time, you *must* rebuild the search index to ensure the Adapter functions properly. If you do not, security is not applied to search results. This means that users can see content items in the search results list that they do not have access to. If they try to access these content items, an "access denied" error is displayed. This may interfere with your organization's security model as users will be able to see some metadata information about the content items (for example, their title).
- Rebuilding the search index may be a very time-consuming process, depending on the number of content items managed by your content server instance. It is therefore recommended that you rebuild the index during off-peak hours of Content Server use, which is typically at night or on a weekend.

To rebuild the search index, complete the following steps:

- 1. Log into Content Server as a system administrator.
- 2. Go to the Administration Applets page and click the **Repository Manager** link. The Repository Manager utility is started. (You may be prompted to log in.)
- 3. In Repository Manager, open the **Indexer** tab.
- 4. In the Collection Rebuild Cycle area (bottom half), click the **Start** button.

 The index is now rebuilt. During the rebuild process, the Start button in the Collection Rebuild Cycle area is grayed out and cannot be clicked. The process is completed when the Start button is available again.
- 5. Exit the Repository Manager utility.

IsUrmAgentAllowUnregister=1 allows the Unregister Source Action menu to be visible on the Source Information toolbar.

To set these Content Server configuration variable, complete the following steps:

- 3. On the Content Admin Server page, click the button of the content server instance where URM is installed. The status page for the content server instance is displayed.

- 5. To allow the Unregister Source Action menu to be visible, add this variable in the Additional Configuration Variables field and set the value to 1 (true): IsUrmAgentAllowUnregister=1

Tech Tip: While it is recommended that you set Content Server configuration variables using Admin Server, Content Server configuration variables can also be set by editing the *config.cfg* file located in the *<install_dir>/config* directory.

Post-Uninstallation Steps

The External URM Source

The external URM source is from URM's perspective. The term 'source' is intended to represent an external repository that stores documents. In this case, the source is the Adapter server's repository. The documents in this source (repository) are allocated for retention management under URM. For the Adapter server's repository, there is a single external URM Source that is designated for the entire Adapter system.

Presumably, the Adapter server's repository contains a wide variety of documents. Consequently, when the documents are classified into similar groups, there will be a wide variety of retention categories associated with the content items in the external URM Source. Thus, the content items in the URM Source share two characteristics: they are all derived from one repository and they all have the same default Mapped Metadata Fields on page A-3.

External URM Source Registration

After you have created the outgoing provider on the Adapter server, the URM Agent Administration application automatically displays the Register Source Screen (page 3-12).

The following events occur after you register the external URM source:

- ❖ A current retention schedule is downloaded from the URM server and incorporated into Adapter server's content retention management system.
- ❖ The content items in the Adapter server's repository prior to installing the Adapter are not automatically assigned to retention categories. This must be done manually using the Content Server's Batch Loader and/or Archiver. For more detailed information about these utilities, refer to Content Server's *Managing Repository Content* guide.
- New content items checked into the Adapter server can be assigned to appropriate retention schedules during the checkin process.

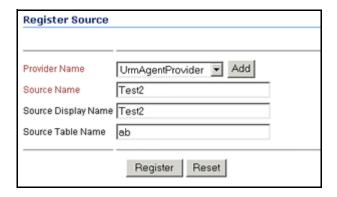

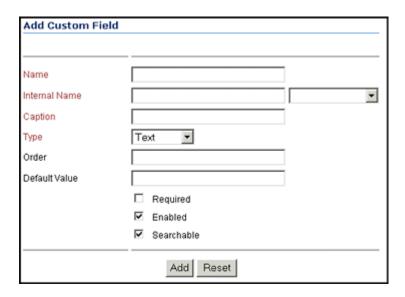

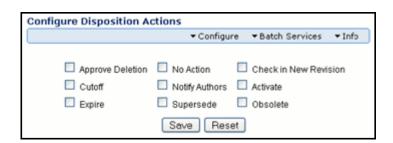

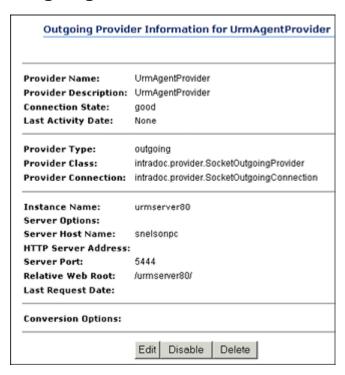

When you click this action option on the Source Information toolbar, the Adapter prompts you to confirm whether you want to unregister (delete) the source. When you confirm your choice, the Adapter immediately deletes the current external URM source. The unregistration (deletion) process is permanent—it cannot be reversed.

ABOUT RETENTION SCHEDULES

A retention schedule is an organized hierarchy of series and categories that enables you to cluster retained items into similar groups, each with its own retention and disposition characteristics. In the Adapter, there can be as many retention schedules as necessary for the requirements mandated by your organization. Retention schedules are set up to make it easy for you to accurately manage retained items.

When you file a retained item into a retention schedule, the disposition of that retained item is determined by the category into which it is filed. Additionally, the category into which the content item is filed determines the security access and status of the retained item (for example, whether or not the retained item is subject to review, or whether the record is permanent).

If you do not want the retained item to inherit the security and status of the category, but want the retained item or record to be filed in a specific location, you can change the security or status either while you are filing it or after it has been filed.

Retention Schedule Hierarchy



A typical hierarchy of a retention schedule consists of:

- **❖** Series on page 4-3
- Retention Category on page 4-3

Series

A series is an optional organizational construct in the retention schedule which enables you to organize categories into functional groups. This is especially useful if you have a multitude of categories. Series cannot contain content items. A series can be nested, which means a series may contain other series.

Retention Category

A retention category is a set of security settings and disposition instructions in the retention schedule hierarchy, below a series. This enables you to organize content into groups with the same retention and disposition characteristics. Categories define the disposition instructions of the retained items.

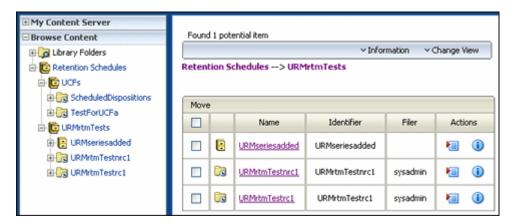
A retention category may contain one or more content items, which then typically follow the security settings and disposition rules associated with that retention category. Categories can be created within a series, but a category cannot be contained within another category, which means a retention category cannot contain other retention categories. Retention categories cannot be nested because the disposition rules for each category may conflict.

Retention Schedule Navigation

You can browse content and navigate the hierarchy in the retention schedule using various techniques. Your permissions and security configuration determine what portions of the schedule you can view. You can navigate by:

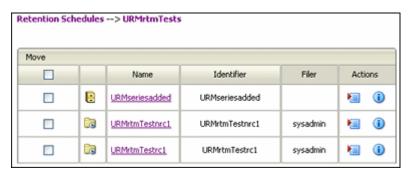

Accessing Retention Schedules Using the Browse Content Tray



When you click the objects in the Browse Content area in Content Server, the tree expands or collapses. By default, retained items and records can be accessed in the retention schedule object. The search page displays the contents of the selected series or category.

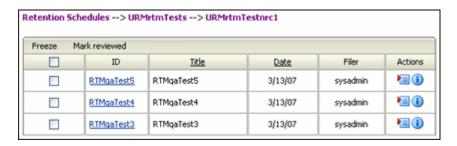
Accessing Retention Schedules Using a Search Result



You can click the link in the Name column on a search results page to navigate to child objects. For example, clicking on the link "URMrtmTestnrc1" shown in the figure above enables you to open the corresponding Exploring Retention Category page (for example, see the figure in Accessing Retention Schedules Using Breadcrumb Trails on page 4-5).

Hover the mouse pointer over the name of a category to quickly view its description. Descriptions over 100 characters are truncated in the popup for easier viewing within the screen. To view the full description of a category, you must view it on the relevant information page. For more information, see Viewing the Information Page for a Retention Category (page 4-6). Series do not have descriptions.

Accessing Retention Schedules Using Breadcrumb Trails



The breadcrumb trail provides a convenient means of navigating a retention schedule. It shows where you are in the schedule hierarchy, and provides links that you can click to quickly move between parent and child levels.

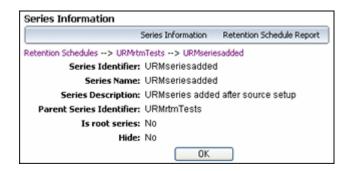
For example, clicking "Series 0031 Combatant Command, etc. Correspondence" in the figure above opens the Exploring screen at the series level.

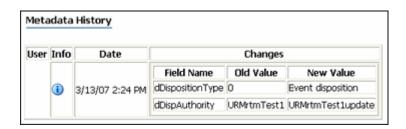

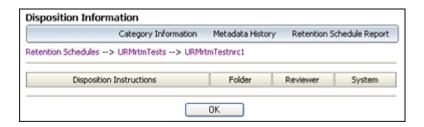

 The Exploring Series "Retention Schedules" page is displayed.
- 2. Navigate to the retention category for which to view disposition information.

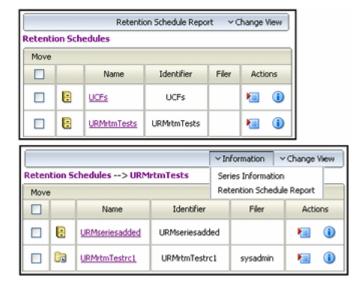

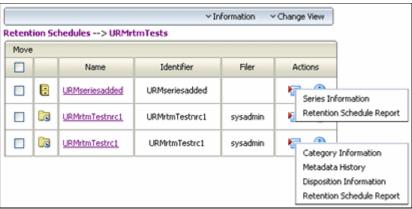

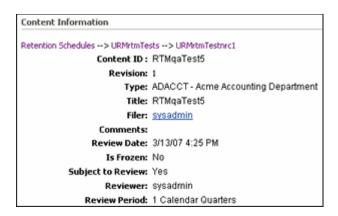
Toolbar Menus

Content Information Area



This area provides filing information about the retained item, including content ID, title, filer, and publication date. For further details on the standard content information metadata, refer to the *Content Server User Guide* and online help system.

Correspondence Fields Area





Note: The correspondence fields are only included on the Content Information page if you selected the Retention Manager Email option druing the Adapter installation process. For more information about this option, see <u>Installing the Adapter</u> (page 2-6).

This area provides information about the content item's author along with various related addresses, as well as additional information about the current status of user accesses. The available Show/Hide toggle switch enables you to display or conceal author information.

Links Area



This area provides links to the native and web-viewable retained item, as well as a number of retention management links.

This area provides release information about the current retained item.

Checking In Content Items

Use this procedure to check in new content. Content items can be checked into a category.



Tech Tip: Use this method of filing content items when you are filing items to disparate locations and have to navigate to a different location within the retention schedule with each check in.

To check in from the main menu, complete the following steps:

- Click New Check In on the toolbar or under the Content Management tray.
 The applicable checkin page is displayed.
- 2. Enter optional information pertinent to the content item. See Check In Page Metadata Fields (page 5-5) for information about metadata fields.
- 3. After you enter all the appropriate metadata values, click **Check In**.

 Upon successful check-in, the check-in confirmation page is displayed.

For more detailed information on checking in content, refer to the online help or the *Content Server User Guide*.

Checking In E-Mail for Retention

This functionality is only available if the applicable option was selected and enabled during the installation process. You can check in e-mail messages as content with the Oracle Outlook Integration for Microsoft Outlook.

You must have the Outlook Integration Suite application installed and configured on your client machine. For assistance with setting up your server, see the online Help for Oracle Outlook Integration.



Important: Checking in batch e-mail removes the mail from your Inbox. Checking in an individual e-mail leaves the mail in your Inbox.

Outlook Integration Toolbar

The Outlook Integration toolbar enables you to configure virtual servers for checking in content with disparate metadata. To display the Outlook toolbar in Microsoft Outlook, click **View—Toolbars—Oracle Outlook Integration**.

Checking In an Individual E-Mail as a Retained Item

Use this procedure to check in an individual e-mail as an individual retained item.



Important: Checking in an individual e-mail leaves the mail in your Inbox. You must manually delete the e-mail to remove it from your mailbox.

To check in an e-mail message as a content item, complete the following steps:

- 1. Open your Microsoft Outlook e-mail client.
- 2. In the **Server** list, select the server into which to check in e-mail content.
- 3. In your Inbox, select the e-mail to check in. The e-mail message becomes highlighted.
- 4. In the Outlook Integration toolbar, click **Checkin Mail Item**. An Outlook message prompts you to allow access into your e-mail application.
- 5. Click **Yes**. The Content Check In Form is displayed.

- 6. Select the **Is Correspondence** check box. The e-mail fields are displayed, some of which are prepopulated for you:
 - a. Addressee(s)
 - b. Other Addressees(s)
 - c. Email Subject
 - d. Email To Lists
- 7. To preview the life cycle of the or retained item before actually checking it into the content server, click **Lifecycle Preview** at the bottom of the content check-in page. This will open a page showing the life cycle that the retained item will go through based on the current selections on the content check-in page.
- 8. Click Check In.

Checking In Correspondence From a Non-Outlook E-Mail Client

Use this procedure to check in correspondence as a retained item if you do not use the Outlook Integration.

To check in e-mail from a client other than the Outlook Integration:

- 1. Open the e-mail client and save the e-mail messages in a text format or HTML.
- 2. Click New Check In.

The Content Check In Form is displayed.

- 3. Check in the content, making sure you select **Is Correspondence** check boxes.
- 4. Be sure to complete the Correspondence fields, as they are not prepopulated for you if you are not using Outlook Integration.

Search Forms Menu Options (Main Menu)



When you install the Adapter, the Search menu options in Content Server are changed. You can use these menu options to quickly narrow down and optimize your searches.

Expanded Search Form

After you have accessed the search page, you can choose to use the expanded version of the form or build a custom search query based on the selected form. By default, several metadata fields on the search form are included in a section that is displayed using the collapsed format. When you select the expanded version of the search form, that section is displayed in the expanded format. For more detailed information and descriptions of each metadata field included on the search form, see Metadata Search Fields (page 6-2), Vital Review Fields (page 6-4), Correspondence Fields (page 6-5), and Date Fields (page 6-6).

Query Builder Form

The Query Builder form is available from the Search Forms drop-down menu on the search page. It enables you to easily build and save complex queries by selecting options from a series of drop-down lists and operator fields. Once a query is built using the Query Builder from, you may edit the query directly, perform the search, or save the query for easy access from your saved queries or through a targeted quick search. For comprehensive information about the Query Builder form, refer to the *Content Server User Guide*. All of the available drop-down lists and operator fields are described in more detail.

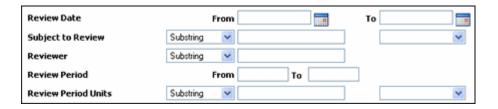
Metadata Search Fields

Although the Search tray and Quick Search field offer convenient search options, the search pages for the Records, Non Records, and Standard Search menu options provide the most comprehensive way to search for content. The metadata fields included and described in the following table are representative of those that may be included in the search form that you select. The actual metadata fields that display are dependent on the components that are enabled and the profiles that are used. See your system administrator for more details.

Title	Searches the descriptive name entered when a content item was filed. Maximum length is 80 characters. Double quotation marks " cannot be used when searching.

Filer	Searches for content items authored by the specified person. By default, the author is the last person who filed the record.

Comments	Searches for the specified keywords in the additional notes entered when a content item was checked in. A comments maximum length is 255 characters.

Custom fields	Any custom metadata fields for your system are displayed on this page. These fields vary by organization.

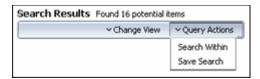

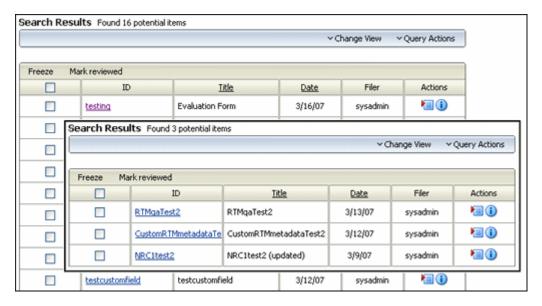


When you install the Adapter, the Query Actions menu options on the Search Results page toolbar enable you to narrow down and/or save your search queries.

Search Within Option

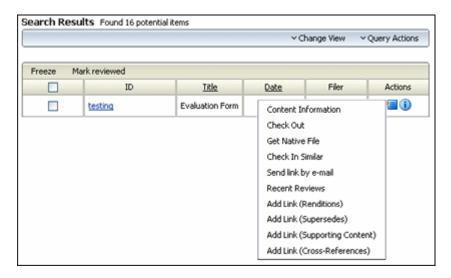


The Search Within option enables you to refine your search results by searching through the initial returned results using additional or more specific metadata values. The insert above illustrates how searching within returned results can optimize the search process. In this case, more specific metadata values reduced the number of items from 16 to three.

Save Search Option

The Save Search option enables you to store a link to the most recent revision of any content item in Content Server. This is done by searching for the item's content ID, then selecting Save Search from the Query Actions drop-down list on the search results page. this saves the search as a link in the My Saved Queries folder in your My Content Server tray. Click the saved search link to always access the most recent revision of a content item. For more information, refer to the *Content Server User Guide*.

Action Icon Menu Options



The content item Action menu pulls down from the Actions icon. The menu lists actions that pertain to the associated content item. For example, some of the options in the item action menu for a content item displayed on the search results page include links to check out the item or view the item's content information.

MAPPED METADATA FIELDS

The content items in the Adapter server's repository are preserved in place because its Content Server can ensure that the content will remain unalterable during the retention period. Therefore, rather than checking the content items into URM, only the values of specific metadata fields for the retained items are uploaded and stored in URM.

When you install the Adapter and register the external URM source, the retention schedule is automatically downloaded from URM and applied to the Adapter's retention schedule. To accommodate the retention schedule synchronization, specific Adapter metadata fields are automatically mapped to the same metadata fields that are used in URM. By default, the following Adapter metadata fields are mapped to the corresponding fields in URM:

- ❖ dDocTitle
- ❖ dDocName
- dSecurityGroup
- dDocAuthor
- ❖ dDocAccount
- **❖** CategoryID (page A-1)



Note: Except for the CategoryID field, the other metadata fields are predefined in Content Server. For more detailed information about them, refer to the *Managing Repository Content* guide.

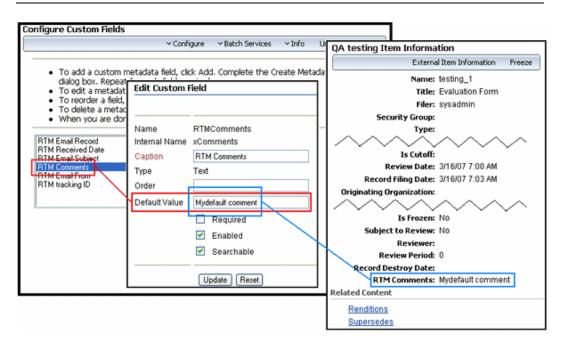

Internal Custom Metadata Fields

You can customize the Adapter by creating your own custom metadata fields using the Configuration Manager. You can define these fields to be indexed and searchable. You can also choose to display them on the Adapter's Check In page, Search page, and Content Information page.

However, the values of these fields are not exported to URM in addition to the Mapped Metadata Fields (page A-3). These custom fields are only used within the Adapter system. For more detailed information about the Configuration Manager and these types of custom metadata fields, refer to the *Managing Repository Content* guide.

Exported Custom Metadata Fields



By default, the only information pertaining to the retention schedule that is transferred to URM are the values from the Mapped Metadata Fields (page A-3) that are automatically mapped when you install the Adapter. However, you can define custom metadata fields for the Adapter server's retained content. The default value that you assign to these custom fields is forwarded to URM and included on the Item Information page in URM. This is the only way that supplementary data can be transferred to URM in addition to the values from the mapped metadata fields.

For example, you can use the Configure Custom Fields Screen (page 3-13) to create a custom metadata field for the Adapter such as RTM Comments. Then, using the Add Custom Field Screen (page 3-15), you can assign a default value for this field (such as, Mydefault comment). The populated custom metadata field is transferred to URM and is included on the content item's Item Information page. Thus, in addition to the mapped metadata field values, this custom metadata field value is included in the exported retention schedule information.



Important: When you configure these custom metadata fields, you must specify a default value for the field. If the custom metadata field is not populated, the value will not be transferred to URM with the information from the mapped metadata fields. This method is the only way to include supplementary content item information.
