1.1 Overview

The JD Edwards World Accounts Payable system accommodates the need for accurate and timely payables that follow your standard procedures as well as those times when proactive cash management calls for overriding the rules. You have the flexibility you need for effective cash management because you, not the system, manage your workflow. At each stage in the workflow, you designate the next step and the system calculates taxes, discounts, and currency conversions according to your specifications.

With the Accounts Payable system, you can streamline the day-to-day functions of your entire accounts payable department and improve communication and reporting among your personnel.

For organizations that have offices around the world, JD Edwards World software provides the flexibility needed to operate in multiple countries, each with unique currency, language, and statutory requirements.

1.2 System Integration

The Accounts Payable system works with other JD Edwards World systems to ensure that all payables transactions and information are fully integrated into accounts payable.

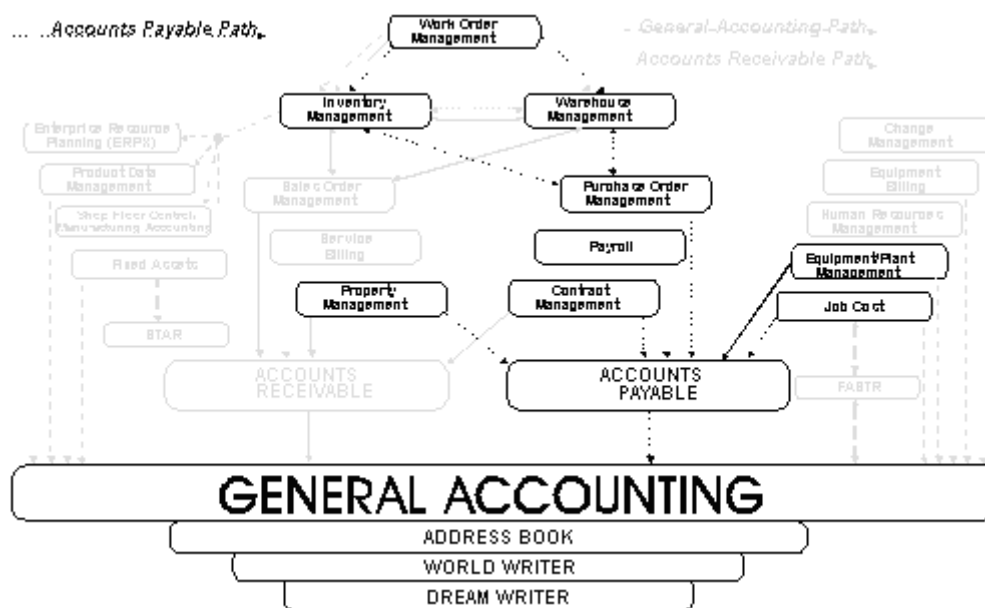
The following systems integrate with the Accounts Payable system, as described.

- Purchase Order Management – Vouchers are created when you match a purchase receipt to the supplier invoice.
- Payroll - Vouchers are created for tax liabilities, and deduction and benefit liabilities during the payroll cycle.
- Contract Management - Vouchers are created when you use the progress payment cycle.

- Equipment/Plant Maintenance - When an equipment charge is entered, the system automatically includes the equipment number from the purchase order on the voucher, or you can do so manually.
- Job Cost - Vouchers are created when payments are made against a contract for a job.
- Property Management - Vouchers are created by the lessee's programs for recurring billings and sales overages. Vouchers are also created for tenants by the security deposit refund program.

The following graphic shows the JD Edwards World systems that integrate with the Accounts Payable system.

1.3 Accounts Payable Features

The Accounts Payable system provides many features that are user defined. These features allow you to adapt the system to your unique business environment and effectively manage your accounts payable.

The features of the Accounts Payable system include:

- Supplier management
- Workflow management
- Multi-national functionality

1.3.1 Supplier Management

With efficient supplier management, you can improve your supplier relationships and leverage your organization's purchasing power for better terms and conditions. As part of managing your supplier information, you determine:

- Whether a supplier sends invoices in a foreign currency (which the system converts to your domestic currency)

- How the supplier prefers to be paid (such as check, draft, and electronic funds transfer)
- Whether to send payments directly to the supplier, to a parent organization, or to another address
- Which payment terms and tax codes are used by the supplier

On a supplier-by-supplier basis, you can review information such as balances forward and open items versus payments using the online inquiries.

1.3.2 Workflow Management

With true workflow management, the system provides features that allow you to implement your current objectives and make adjustments when those objectives change. The features of workflow management include:

- Multiple voucher entry methods
- Duplicate voucher notification
- Flexible tax structures
- Payment processing
- Reporting

1.3.2.1 Multiple Voucher Entry Methods

When a supplier sends you an invoice, you enter the invoice as a voucher in the Accounts Payable system. You can enter vouchers using the method that is most efficient for you. Choose from any of the following methods:

- Standard
- Speed
- Recurring
- Prepayment
- Multiple company, single supplier
- Multiple voucher, single supplier
- Multiple voucher, multiple supplier
- Voucher logging

You can make the entry process even more efficient by using model journal entries for vouchers that use the same accounting distributions.

1.3.2.2 Duplicate Invoice Notification

With duplicate invoice notification, you are notified of any invoices with the same invoice number. This reduces confusion and allows you to control or prevent duplicate payments.

1.3.2.3 Flexible Tax Structures

Different countries have different tax requirements for their suppliers. JD Edwards World supports tax structures such as GST (goods and services tax), PST (provincial sales tax), VAT (value-added tax), tax on tax, and tax-only vouchers. In addition, U.S. clients can perform tax calculations for payables using the Vertex tax calculator for sales and exempt taxes.

1.3.2.4 Payment Processing

Whether you pay vouchers automatically or manually, the result is controlled, efficient, and accurate. You can prioritize your vouchers and have the system handle the payments. Or, you can select vouchers for manual, split, or partial payments based on your cash requirements. On a supplier-by-supplier basis, you can review information such as open items and payments.

An alternative to the conventional method of producing payments is drafts. Drafts, which are promises to pay debts, are used in various countries around the world. Because of the legal nature of the underlying liabilities, requirements and procedures for draft processing differ from those for regular payment processing.

1.3.2.5 Reporting

Successful payables management requires timely and accurate information about cash flow, aging information, discount opportunities, and so on.

With the timesaving, paperless design of the Account Payable system, you can immediately review, analyze and manage up-to-the minute supplier information, payment history, vouchers, and other information online. Alternatively, you can print the same information in a report.

1.3.3 Multi-National Functionality

Multi-national functionality allows you to build a global supplier network to optimize price, terms, and availability of goods. The multi-national functionality in the Accounts Payable system includes:

- Currency processing - Pay vouchers in either the domestic or foreign currency, using any currency in the world - from the Australian dollar to the euro. You can also forecast payments for your payables by currency.
- Multiple languages - Communicate with suppliers in their preferred languages to enhance relationships and reduce potential misunderstanding regarding vouchers and other correspondence.

1.4 Account Numbering Concepts

This guide uses the Business Unit.Object.Subsidiary standard notation for account numbers.

The account number includes both the Where and What. You can use periods, commas, or other user defined symbols to separate the components of the account number. The period (.) separator is the default.

1.4.1 Business Unit - The "Where"

The business unit describes where in your organization the transaction will have an impact. It represents the lowest organizational level within your business, where you record all revenues, expenses, assets, liabilities, and equities. For example, a business unit can be a department, branch office, or truck.

Business units are unique 12-character, alphanumeric fields. The following applies:

- A business unit can belong to only one company.
- A company can have several business units.
- Each company has at least one business unit for the balance sheet.

1.4.2 Object Subsidiary - The "What"

The Object.Subsidiary represents what kind of transaction is being created. An object is a description of the transaction, for example, Cash in Bank. A subsidiary is an expanded description of the object account, for example, Cash in Bank.FNB (First National Bank).

There are two parts of the "what":

- Object (four, five, or six characters, depending on your organization's setup)
- Subsidiary (one to eight characters)

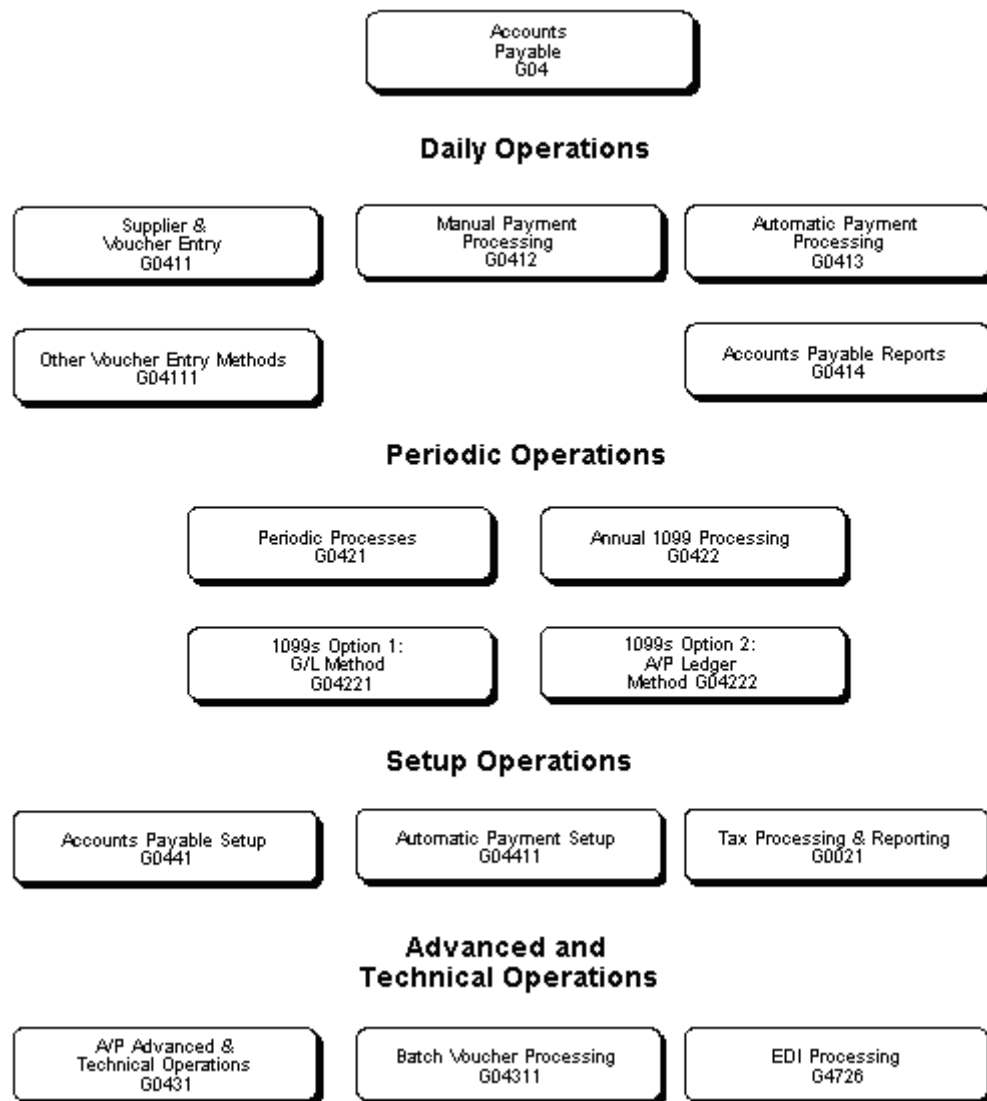

1.6.1 Company Structure

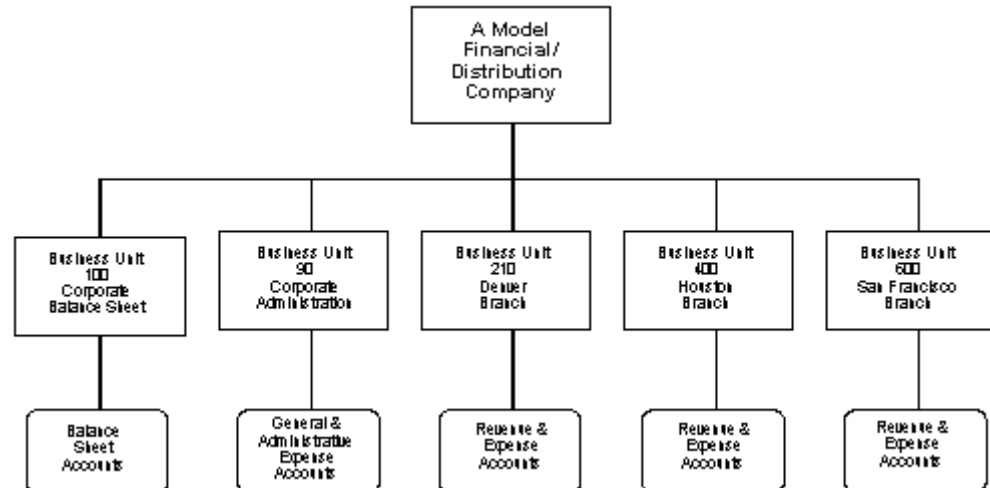
A Model Financial/Distribution Company (company 00100) has its corporate headquarters in Denver, Colorado. Three branch offices report to the Denver headquarters:

- Denver
- Houston
- San Francisco

Each branch office performs sales, marketing, and support functions for its regions. Administrative and accounting functions are done at corporate headquarters. Expenses and revenues are tracked by branch office.

The following illustration shows the business unit structure for company 00100. Notice that the balance sheet business unit (100) has the same identifier as company 00100. Refer to this organization when you do the training exercises.

1.6.2 Chart of Accounts Structure

The chart of accounts identifies the accounts assigned to the business units within your company's reporting structure. It controls:

- How amounts are posted (Posting Edit Code)
- The level of detail (LOD) for account balances
- Accounts assigned to different business units (indicated by X)

The supplier record is the central reference that you use to determine how a supplier's activity is managed by the Accounts Payable system. The supplier master is a central storage place for all of your supplier information.

You must create a supplier master record before you can enter a voucher and issue payment.

Supplier information consists of:

- Entering suppliers
- Locating suppliers

3.1 Entering Suppliers

Navigation

From Accounts Payable (G04), choose Supplier & Voucher Entry

From Supplier & Voucher Entry (G0411), choose Supplier Master Information

Before you enter a voucher and issue payment to a supplier, you must create a supplier record. When you enter a supplier, you are setting up information about how the system processes vouchers and payments for that supplier.

When you enter a supplier, you:

- Enter supplier identification
- Enter supplier mailing information
- Enter address book additional information
- Enter supplier information
- Assign a model journal entry to a supplier
- Enter supplier bank account information
- Enter information for 1099 reporting

Information about suppliers is stored in the following tables:

- Supplier Master (F0401) - Supplier information
- Supplier Master Company/Business Unit Defaults (F04015) - Supplier information specific to company or business unit
- Address by Date (F0116) - Mailing address information
- Bank Transit Number Master (F0030) - Bank account information

3.1.1 What You Should Know About

| Topic | Description |

| Deleting supplier records | You cannot delete a supplier record if there is information in the Supplier Master (F0401), A/P Ledger (F0411), or related tables in other systems. |
| Supplier Master - Company/Business Unit Defaults (F04015) | This optional table allows you to set up multiple supplier master defaults for the same supplier number based on company and/or business unit. |
| Structure type | When you create a parent/child relationship for a supplier, the Structure Type field must be blank. See Viewing Parent/Child Relationships in the <i>JD Edwards World Address Book and Electronic Mail Guide</i> . |
| Multi-Currency | You can store amounts such as amount vouchered year-to-date and amount vouchered prior-year-end in a specific currency. To do this, set a processing option to define the default currency code or the company currency of the responsible business unit. You can also enter them manually. |

| Long Address Number | <p>A user defined name or number that is unique to the address book number. This field can be used to enter and locate information. You can use it to cross-reference the supplier to a Dun & Bradstreet number, a lease number, or other reference.</p> <p><i>Form-specific information</i></p> <p>When you set up suppliers using a long address number, you can access the supplier number more quickly. For example, when you enter a voucher, you use the long address number preceded by the special character assigned to long address numbers in Address Book constants in the Supplier Number field. The system converts the long address number to the supplier number.</p> |

You can also choose Duplicate Alpha Name on Mailing Line to copy the Alpha Name to the Mailing Name field.</p> |
| Mailing Name | <p>The company or person to whom billing or correspondence is addressed.</p> <p>The mailing name prints as the payee name on 1099 forms. You can override this information by using the Type Code field on Who's Who.</p> |

To enter additional address book control revisions information

You can enter a variety of miscellaneous information in the address book, such as information about a particular customer or supplier. You can use the Address Book Control Revisions screen to enter and update Address Book Control fields that need special security, such as tax ID, hold codes, and credit limits.

| Consolidation Code | <p>The Consolidation Code is a way to group associated Address Book numbers in order to report on group financial data.</p> <p>An example would be a chain of stores such as Dollar Stores. You can maintain multiple Address Book numbers, one for each store, in order to have different default, control and statistics associated with each store. However, all stores may be owned and operated by a single corporate entity. A common Consolidation Code lets you report information on an overall basis.</p> |

| Field | Explanation |

| Inactive Code | If the code is set to '1', the entity is inactivated. No further activity or action may be performed against the entity. |
| Homeland Security Flag | A user defined field (01/HL) that indicates or identifies an Address Book Number in terms of its role in Homeland Security. |
| AR/AP Netting (Y) | A code that indicates whether an address is eligible for the A/R and A/P netting process. |
| Subledger Inactive Code | <p>A code that indicates whether a specific subledger is active or inactive. Any value other than blank indicates that a subledger is inactive. Examples are jobs that are closed, employees that have been terminated, or assets that have been disposed. If a subledger becomes active again, set this field back to blank.</p> <p>If you want to use subledger information in the tables for reports but want to prevent transactions from posting to the master record, enter a value other than blank in this field.</p> |
| Person/Corp Code | <p>A code that designates the type of taxpayer. U.S. clients use one of the following codes with the 20-digit Tax field:</p> <p>C – Corporate entity (printed as 12-3456789)</p> <p>P – Individual (printed as 123-45-6789)</p> <p>N – Non-corporate entity (printed as 12-3456789)</p> <p>Blank – Non-corporate entity (not formatted)</p> <p>The system selects suppliers with P and N codes for 1099 reporting.</p> <p>Non-U.S. clients use the following codes with the 20-digit Company field and Individual field:</p> <p>1 – Individual</p> <p>2 – Corporate entity</p> <p>3 – Both an individual and a corporate entity</p> <p>4 – Non-corporate entity</p> <p>5 – Customs authority</p> |
| Tax ID | <p>The identification code required by various tax authorities. This can be a social security number, federal or state corporate tax ID, sales tax number, and so on. Do not enter separator characters. The system verifies the number and prints the separators in their correct format, according to the value of TAXC (Person/Corporation Code). If there is no value for TAXC, the system does not format this number.</p> |
| Add'l Ind Tax ID | An additional identification number that a tax authority assigns to an individual. |
| Certificate | A number that identifies a license or certificate that tax authorities issue to tax-exempt individuals and companies. |
| Credit Limit | <p>The Credit Limit is the maximum negative balance that a customer can be assigned. The credit limit is retained for a customer account in the Customer Master file (F0301). This field is stored as an integer, no decimals.</p> <p>A zero or blank amount is considered no credit allowed for the customer. If an unlimited credit limit is desired, the user can set a maximum limit by entering a large number, such as 9999999999999999.</p> |

| Field | Explanation |

| Hold Payments | <p>A code that controls whether you can enter accounts payable vouchers and make payments to this supplier.</p> <p>Valid codes are:</p> <p>1 – Hold payment of outstanding vouchers and prevent entry of new vouchers for this supplier.</p> <p>Y – Hold payment of outstanding vouchers and prevent entry of new vouchers for this supplier.</p> <p>2 – Hold payment of outstanding vouchers, but allow entry of new vouchers for this supplier.</p> <p>3 – Allow payment but prevent entry of new vouchers for this supplier.</p> <p>N – Allow payment and voucher entry. This is the default.</p> <p>To hold payment of an individual voucher, rather than all outstanding vouchers, use the payment status code in the Voucher Entry program.</p> |
| Hold Purchase Order | A code that allows you to prevent the entry of any future Purchase Orders for the Address Book Number. |
| Hold Receipts/PO | A code that allows you to prevent the entry of any future Receipts Purchase Orders for the Address Book Number. |

| Factor/Special Payee | <p>An address book number that identifies a special payment address for A/P. This address number will be used as the default Alternate Payee on vouchers entered for the supplier.</p> <p>If you leave this field blank during voucher entry, the system supplies the primary address from the Address Number field.</p> |

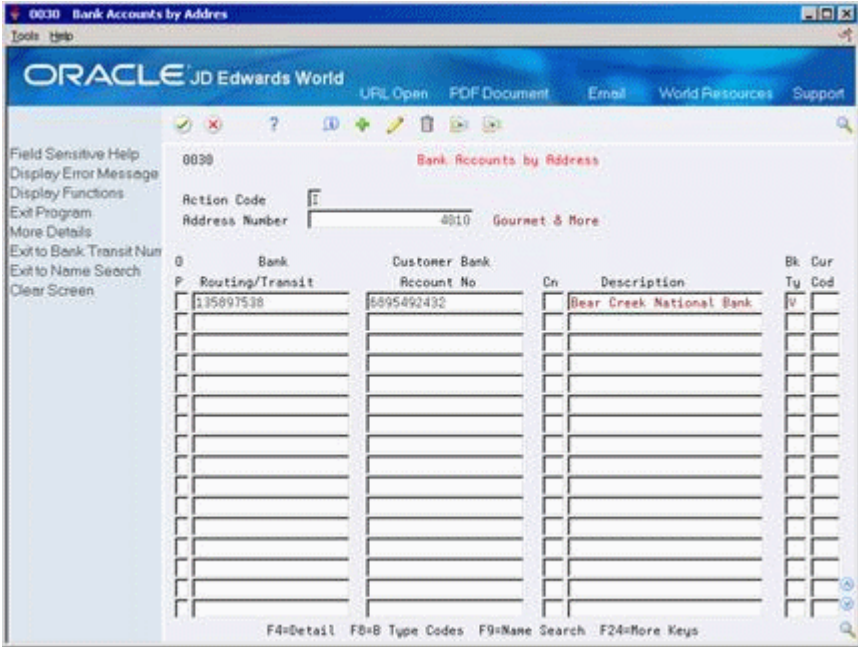

3.1.5.1 Multiple Bank Accounts

You can effectively set up more than one bank account for the same bank type for your suppliers if they have different bank accounts that they would like to use for the same process. Your suppliers may want to use different bank accounts for EFT payment processing depending on currency, location, or some other factor. Although you can only have one bank account per supplier bank type 'V', you can tie currency to each bank type or set up alternate bank types that will essentially allow you to have multiple supplier bank accounts per bank type.

For example, you may identify each bank type V with a specific currency code. The Bank Type and the Currency Code make a unique combination.

You may also create alternate supplier bank types by adding your own bank type to the Bank Type Code UDC table (00/BT). The system uses the Special Handling code for the bank type code to determine if the code will be used by AR or AP. A 2 in the special handling code will be used by A/P. For example, your supplier may have an alternate V type bank account that they would like to use for EFT processing for a specific location. You would set up one record for bank type V and another record such as V1 in the Bank Type User Defined Codes (00/BT). You may then enter bank account information for your supplier for each bank type.

To determine which bank type will be used, assign a bank type to a supplier as the default, you may enter the specific type in the Bank Type field on a voucher or for

3.2 Supplier Master - Company/Business Unit Defaults

In addition to the general supplier information, you have the option to set up multiple supplier master records with default payment information, category codes, and account distribution information that apply uniquely to a specific company and/or business unit. The system stores the Supplier Master Company/Business Units Defaults information in the F04015 table. The system matches the combination of the supplier address number, company number and/or business unit number to retrieve default information from the F04015 record when entering transactions.

This feature allows you to use a single supplier address number with specific default selections for different companies and/or business units. For example you can set different payment terms for a supplier, depending on the company or business unit that generates the transaction. You may set up as many company/business unit default records (F04015) as you need for a supplier, but you will only have one supplier master record (F0401).

5.2 About Voucher Processing

You must create a voucher before you can issue payment to your suppliers. Effective management of voucher processing is fundamental to your accounts payable department.

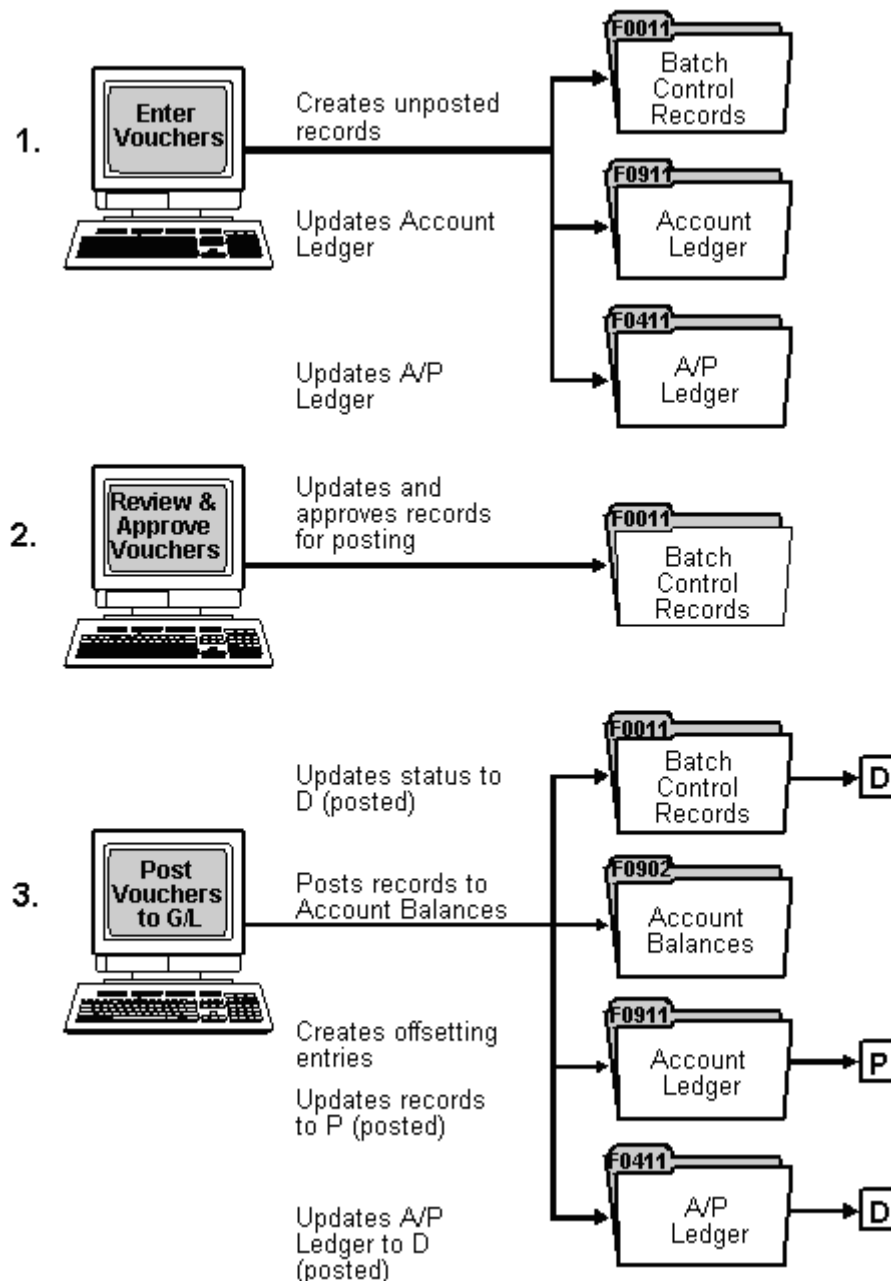

- Working with one time payments
- Entering other types of vouchers
- Working with model journal entries
- Entering speed vouchers
- Reviewing and approving vouchers
- Reviewing vouchers
- Approving voucher batches
- Understanding the post process for A/P
- Posting vouchers
- Revising posted vouchers
- Printing voucher journals

5.2.1 What Is the Three-Tier Process?

Voucher processing is one example of three-tier processing. All JD Edwards World systems use three-tier processing to manage batches of transactions. The term three-tier refers to three standard steps you perform.

The following graphic illustrates the three-tier process.

Figure 5–1 The Three-Tier Process



5.2.2 What Are the Types of Vouchers?

Depending on your needs, you can choose to enter the following types of vouchers:

- Standard vouchers. These vouchers provide the most flexibility and options.

- Speed vouchers. These vouchers offer less flexibility and fewer options than standard vouchers. However, they provide a quicker way of entering voucher and accounting information.

5.2.4 When Do You Review and Approve Vouchers?

After you enter vouchers, you can review and approve them before posting. Use the review program to:

- Review and approve batches
- Review and change individual vouchers
- Review and change journal entries

5.2.5 What Happens When You Post Vouchers?

After you review and approve vouchers, post them to the general ledger. The post program:

- Selects unposted vouchers and edits each transaction
- Creates automatic offsets (document type AE) to A/P trade and tax accounts
- Posts accepted transactions to the Account Balances table (F0902)
- Marks the vouchers as posted in the Account Ledger (F0911 - post code = P) and A/P Ledger (F0411 - post code = D) tables

- Prints a posting edit report, which lists any errors, and a posting journal report

6.2 About A/P Batch Control

The following describes why you would set up batch control and when you would use it.

6.2.1 Why Would You Set Up Batch Control?

Use batch control to verify that the batch of vouchers you enter into the system balances to a manual record of the batch. Batch control information is stored in the Batch Control table (F0011).

If you are using batch control, you enter information about your batch before you actually enter the vouchers. After you enter vouchers, the system compares the control totals with the actual totals you entered for the batch. If the totals do not match, the system displays the difference on Batch Control. This display is for your information only.

Set up two-cycle entry if you want to verify system-calculated fields for each voucher before accepting it. Two-cycle entry requires that you press Enter one time to verify information, and then press Enter again to accept the entry.

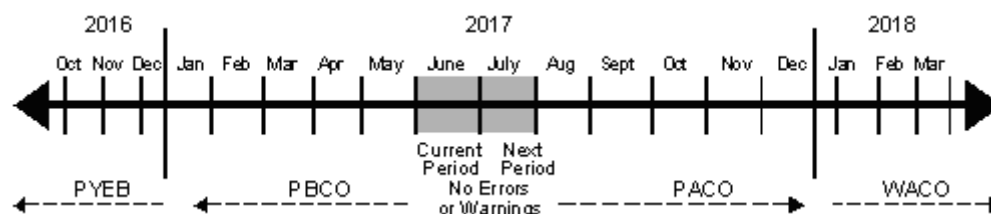

7.1 About G/L Date Warnings

When you enter a transaction, the system edits the G/L date against the open period in the company constants. If you enter a voucher with a G/L date that is not in the current or next accounting period, you get a warning or an error message.

In the example below, if you entered transactions to periods 06 and 07 (June and July), you would not get a warning or an error message because these are open periods. This is known as a "two-period" window.

Figure 7–1 Two-Period Window



7.1.1 What Are the Warning and Error Messages You Might Receive?

The following lists the types of warning and error messages that you receive when you enter a transaction outside of the two-period window. These messages appear based on how you set your general accounting constants and fiscal date patterns.

| Message | Reason | Result |
|-------------------------------|--|---|
| PYEB - Prior Year-End Balance | You tried to post to a prior year. | You get an error message. The system does not accept the entry. |
| PBCO - Post Before Cut Off | You entered a G/L date before the current period | You either get a warning or an error message, depending on your general accounting constants. |

| Message | Reason | Result |
|---------------------------|---|---|
| PACO - Post After Cut Off | You entered a G/L date that is after the two-period window. | You either get a warning or an error message, depending on how you set up your fiscal date patterns. If your fiscal date pattern is not set up for the full year, you get an error message. If it is set up for the full year, you get a warning. |
| WACO - Way After Cut Off | You entered a G/L date in a future year. | You either get a warning or an error message, depending on how you set up your fiscal date patterns. |

8.1 Entering Standard Vouchers

Navigation

From Accounts Payable (G04), choose Supplier & Voucher Entry

From Supplier & Voucher Entry (G0411), choose Standard Voucher Entry

After you receive a supplier's invoice, you must create a voucher before you can issue payment. You create a voucher by entering information from the supplier's invoice. You can also enter information about how you will process the voucher for payment or allow this information to default from the supplier record. The system sets up the voucher to allow payment to the supplier.

To enter a standard voucher, you:

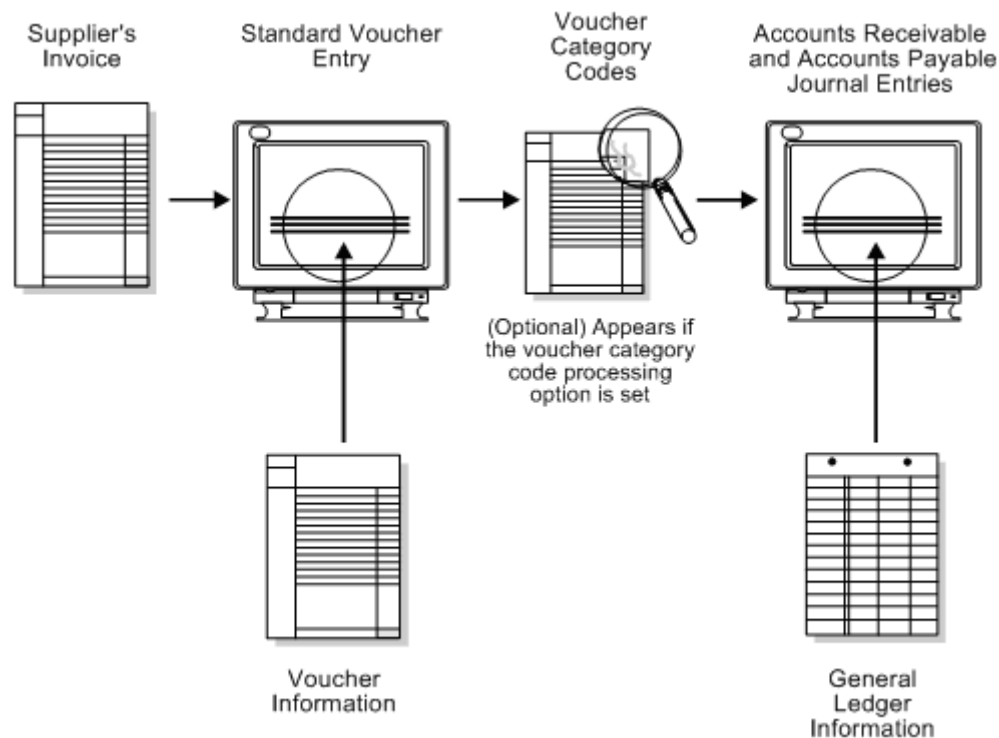
- Enter voucher information
- Assign a voucher category code to a transaction (optional)
- Enter general ledger information

After you enter voucher information, you can assign a voucher category code to track detailed information about the transactions (if your system is set up to do so). Then you enter the general ledger information for the voucher. Typically, you enter a debit to an expense account. When you post, the system creates an offset to a liability account.

You can use the Import/Export function in this program. See the *JD Edwards World Technical Tools Guide* for more information.

The following graphic illustrates the forms that you use when entering standard vouchers.

Figure 8–1 Forms Used When Entering Standard Vouchers



The system assigns a batch type of V for vouchers. When you enter a standard voucher, the system marks it as unposted and adds it to the Account Ledger (F0911) and A/P Ledger (F0411) tables. When you post it, the system updates the Account Balances table (F0902) and marks the voucher as posted in the Account Ledger and A/P Ledger tables.

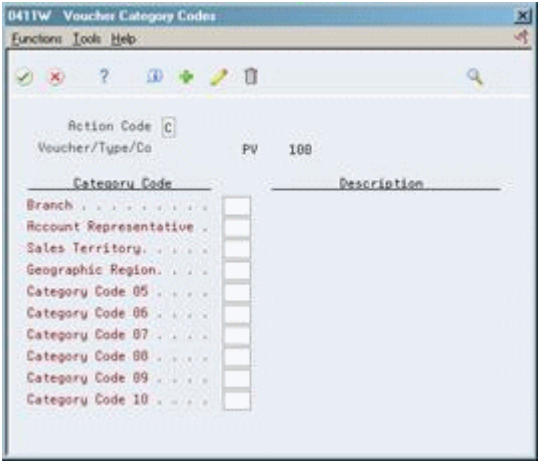

You can change or delete an unpaid voucher before you post it. However, you cannot change the following key fields:

- Voucher Number
- Voucher Type
- Voucher Company
- Supplier Number
- G/L Date

If you need to change the information in a key field, do one of the following:

- Delete the voucher and re-enter it
- Copy the voucher, make your changes before you enter it, then delete the original voucher

8.4 Copying Vouchers

You can create a new voucher by copying an existing voucher and then changing the copy. This procedure is useful when you need to:

- Enter a voucher that is similar to an existing lengthy voucher.

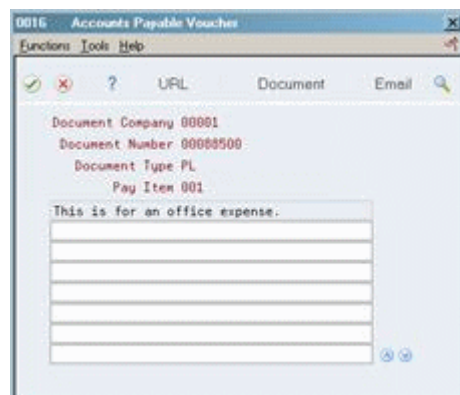

9.1 Overview

One Time Payment (OTP) is a method of entering vouchers and payments for a supplier that you do not need to add to the Address Book system. For example, you might pay a supplier only once and therefore need minimal Address Book information. The process uses a designated Address Book number that you set up in the Address Book as the OTP supplier and it becomes active when you attach the address number to company 00000 in Company Numbers and Names (P00105). When you enter a voucher for this supplier number, a window displays that allows you to enter the name and mailing address for the voucher and payment. The system stores the address information in the One Time Payment file (F0411AB). When you pay this voucher or need to include it in a report, the system retrieves the name and address information from the F0411AB and *not* the Address Book files (F0111, F0116).

Many industries, such as government agencies, real estate management, and telecommunications can use this process whenever they need to make a one time payment to a supplier with which there is no long term relationship or additional reporting necessary. This process saves data entry time and can be a more efficient use of the address book.

9.2 Setup

Add a new Address Book record for use as the One Time Payment supplier number. The address record will only need minimal information such as Alpha Name, Mailing Name, Search Type, Payables Flag set to Y, Receivables Flag set to N. J. D. Edwards World recommends you use an Alpha Name of "One Time Supplier" or something similar, so users are aware of the purpose of this address record and do not mistake it for a standard supplier number.

You also need to add a Supplier Master record for this address book number using the Supplier Master Information (P01054) program. The Supplier Master record functions the same as it does for any other supplier, so use care when setting up this record. Any information you enter in the Supplier Master record defaults to all vouchers that you enter with the OTP address number; therefore J. D. Edwards World recommends a minimal or generic set up. Other considerations include:

- The value in the Factor/Special Payee field defaults to the Supplier Number you enter (OTP address number) and you should not change this.
- When default settings exist for particular Data Dictionary items, you need to confirm that the setting applies to all OTPs. For example, if there are default values for Hold Payment, Payment Instrument or Payment terms, be aware that these will apply to every voucher you enter using the OTP address number, even though the actual suppliers differs.
- If you activate currency, ensure that the Amount Currency field contains the standard currency for storing amounts, such as YTD and PYE voucher amounts.
- Tax Information in the Supplier Master record, such as Withholding percentage, Tax ID, Person/Corp Code and other tax fields should not contain a value. This information defaults to all vouchers for the OTP address book number, regardless of the individual supplier for the voucher.
- You can set up default accounting and distribution information if you need to apply all vouchers that you enter for the OTP address number against a particular G/L account, assign to a specific G/L offset or to use a model journal entry.
- You cannot set up the OTP Address Book number for supplier bank account information (bank type V) in the Bank Account Cross Reference or Bank Account by Address, because the nature of the OTP address number is to use it for multiple suppliers.

Example: Address Book number 42690 has been added with Alpha/Mailing name of OTP. On the Company Numbers and Names screen, address number 42690 displays in the Company Address Number field for company 00000.

9.3 OTP Process

The OTP process includes the basic voucher entry and payment process.

9.3.1 Accounts Payable Approval Process

If you use the Accounts Payable Approval Process, the value you enter in the One Time Payment Processing processing option for the Approval Controls (X0453) determines how the system processes vouchers for one-time suppliers.

9.3.2 Entering Vouchers

You can create an OTP voucher using the following programs:

- Standard Voucher Entry (P04105)
- Speed Voucher Entry (P041015)
- Multi Company - Single Supplier (P041016)
- Manual Payment Without Voucher Match (P04106)
- Speed Payment Entry (P041065)

When creating a voucher for a supplier using the OTP address book number, enter the standard voucher information. When you click Enter, the One Time Payment Window displays (P0411AB). The system prompts for the alpha name, mailing name and mailing address to use for this voucher. You can enter values in the the Phone Number/Type, Tax Identification Number, and Person/Corporation Code for further identification purposes. Click Enter to continue with voucher entry.

The system generates an error if the you attempt to exit (F3) the One Time Payment Address window (P0411AB) prior to adding mailing address information.

9.3.3 Viewing and Changing OTP Information

After you enter an OTP voucher, you can locate, view, and change the address information from several programs.

You use any of the voucher entry programs listed previously to locate the voucher. Choose Exit to One Time Payment (F8) to access the Address Information window (P0411AB) to view and make changes.

You can also use the Name Search - One Time Payment program (P012001) to access OTP information. Access this program from the Supplier & Voucher Entry menu (G0411) and choose Name Search - One Time Payments. On the Name Search - One Time Payment screen, click Enter to display all data in the F0411AB or you can narrow your selection by entering a value in any of the header fields. On the Name Search - One Time Payment screen, you can use the following options:

- 1 to access the Voucher Information program (P04136). This program includes detailed voucher information which you can change.
- 8 to access the One Time Payment Window to change address information.

Additionally, on the Name Search - One Time Payment screen, you can use the function exits to change the display, move the cursor, and access the following programs:

- Address Book Revisions (F11)
- Customer Master (F12)
- Supplier Master (F13)

You can also use the Export function. See *Import/Export* in the *JD Edwards World Technical Tools Guide* for more information.

From the Supplier Ledger Inquiry program, you can choose Toggle Display Format to view the One Time Payment Alpha Name field in the detail area. You can also choose Name Search - One Time Payment (F15) to access the Name Search - One Time Payment program (P012001). On the Name Search - OTP screen you can enter 4 in the Option field next to a detail line to display the voucher information on the Supplier Ledger Inquiry screen.

9.3.4 Creating Payments

You enter payments for OTP vouchers using the standard payment methods:

- Automatic Payment Processing
- Manual Payment with or without Voucher Match (P04102) (P04106)
- Speed Payment Entry (P041065)

Using Automatic Payments, or if you choose the Print option from Manual Payment with Voucher Match, the Address Book servers retrieve the OTP mailing name and address information. The system accesses these servers from the payment print programs, such as Print A/P Payments (P04572) and all other print formats. When you write payments and the payee is an OTP, the system retrieves the mailing information from the One Time Payment file (F0411AB) to use in the payment.

Note: You cannot use Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) payments for vouchers using the OTP address number. EFT payment processing requires that you set up the supplier's bank account number. Because you can use the OTP address book number for multiple suppliers, the system does not allow you to set up a supplier bank account number for this address book number.

9.3.5 Reporting

One Time Payment Report (P044AB) lists all vouchers for all OTP suppliers. The report lists address information as well as gross and open amounts for the voucher. The DEMO version of the report is set up to sequence by document number. You can add a new version and change the Data Sequence to include Alpha Name or Tax ID as the first sequence. These different sequences allow you to verify if there are possible duplicate vouchers/tax IDs or to track how often you enter a voucher for an OTP supplier.

9.3.6 Deleting/Voiding Transactions

When you delete an unposted voucher, the associated address information in the One Time Payment file (F0411AB) is also deleted as there is no longer a corresponding voucher record in the Accounts Payable Ledger file (F0411). When you void a posted voucher, the system retains the information in the F0411AB as the voucher record still exists in the F0411.

9.3.7 Purging

When you use the Purge Closed A/P Records program (P04800), the program removes records in the One Time Payment file (F0411AB) when it deletes the corresponding F0411 records. The system copies records from the F0411AB to the Purge One Time Vendor file (F0411ABP).

9.3.8 Additional Information

Review the following additional topics for more information about OTP:

Business Unit Security

You can use Business Unit Security to prevent unauthorized users from entering vouchers for OTP suppliers. The system processes the business unit that you assign to the address book record for the OTP through the normal Business Unit Security verification, therefore a user must have access to that business unit in order to enter vouchers for OTP suppliers.

Payee Control

If you activate Payee Control to monitor changes to vouchers, be aware that changing the mailing name for a voucher with an OTP supplier does not create a control record in the Payee Control file. This is because Payee Control tracks changes to the mailing name in the Address Book - Who's Who file (F0111) and the system stores the address information for a voucher using the OTP supplier in the F0411AB. Payee Control applies to changes made to the Payee, Factor/Special Payee or Bank Account based on normal functionality.

Alternate Payee

The value in the Alternate Payee field defaults to the OTP address number when creating a voucher. You cannot change this value for an OTP address number.

1099 Processing

If you need to process a 1099 for a one-time-payment supplier, see *Updating 1099 Information for One-Time Payment (OTP) Suppliers*, in the *JD Edwards World United States 1099 Year-End Processing Guide* for more information.

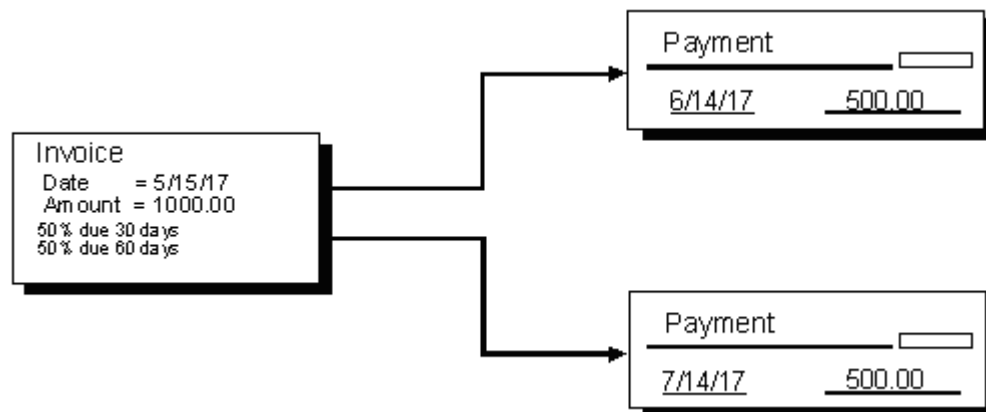
The entry process for standard vouchers serves as the basis for entering other types of vouchers.

10.1 Entering Split Payment Vouchers

You might need to pay your vouchers in installments. For example, a supplier could require that you pay half an invoice amount when you place an order and the remaining amount when the service is complete or when goods are shipped. To do this, enter a split payment.

The system divides payments into equal amounts paid at regular intervals according to the payment terms that are set up in the supplier master record. You can change the payment terms and amounts before payment is made. The system calculates the net due date based on the payment terms that you specify.

10.2 Entering Vouchers with Discounts

Suppliers frequently offer discounts as an incentive for early payment of their invoices. When you enter a voucher with a discount, the system calculates the discount according to the payment terms that are set up in the supplier master record. You can change the discount before you issue payment by changing the payment term or discount available. The system creates the associated journal entries for the discount amount when you issue payment.

10.2.1 Example: Entering Discounts

There are three methods for entering discounts:

- Payment terms
- Discount amount
- Discount percentage

10.2.1.1 Payment Terms

You enter a voucher, specifying payment terms.

10.4 Entering Vouchers with Taxes

Enter tax information on a voucher if you want to override the default tax information. Default information, which is assigned on the supplier master record, applies to an entire voucher and all associated pay items.

The system creates accounting entries for accrued taxes (such as VAT and Use when you post the voucher. AAI item PTyyyy, where yyyy specifies the offset associated with a tax rate/area, identifies the tax account.

10.4.1 Before You Begin

- Set up the appropriate tax rates and areas.
- Set the processing options for the Post program to update the Sales/Use/VAT Tax table (F0018) for tax reporting.
- Set up AAI item PTyyyy (payables taxes)

11.1 Working with Model Journal Entries

You can set up model journal entries as reusable templates to predefine, store, and retrieve regular or recurring G/L transactions. Use models as the basis for journal entries to save time and reduce the potential for error.

You can vary the information included in the model to fit the situation. For example, you might include:

- Account numbers, amounts, and explanations
- Accounts numbers and explanations only (because amounts can vary)
- Account numbers, percentages, and explanations

The system stores model journal entries in the Account Ledger table (F0911) with a posted code that indicates a model and without a G/L date. Actual journal entries contain a G/L date and a posted code that indicates whether they are posted or unposted.

13.1.2 Multi-Currency Batch Totals

You enter vouchers for 10,535.00 EUR and 16,433,500 RUB in the same batch. The system disregards the decimal point in the Russian rubles amount and calculates a hash total. The total amount entered is 17,487,000 (1053500 plus 16433500).

The system displays decimals in the input totals based on the setting in the data dictionary. Using the same figures:

- If you set the data dictionary to display zero decimals, the system displays 17,487,000.
- If you set the data dictionary to display two decimals, the system displays 174,870.00.

14.1 About the Post Process for A/P

After you enter, review, and approve vouchers, you post them so that your general ledger reflects them.

There are two parts to the post process:

- Pre-post
- Post

14.1.1 What Happens During the A/P Pre-Post Process?

When you post payments, the system uses a pre-post process to create records in the Account Ledger table (F0911). In the Accounts Payable system, these records credit the cash account. The system also creates records for discounts taken and lost. When you post vouchers, the system skips the pre-post process because voucher records are created in the Account Ledger table when you enter a voucher.

14.1.2 What Happens During the A/P Post Process?

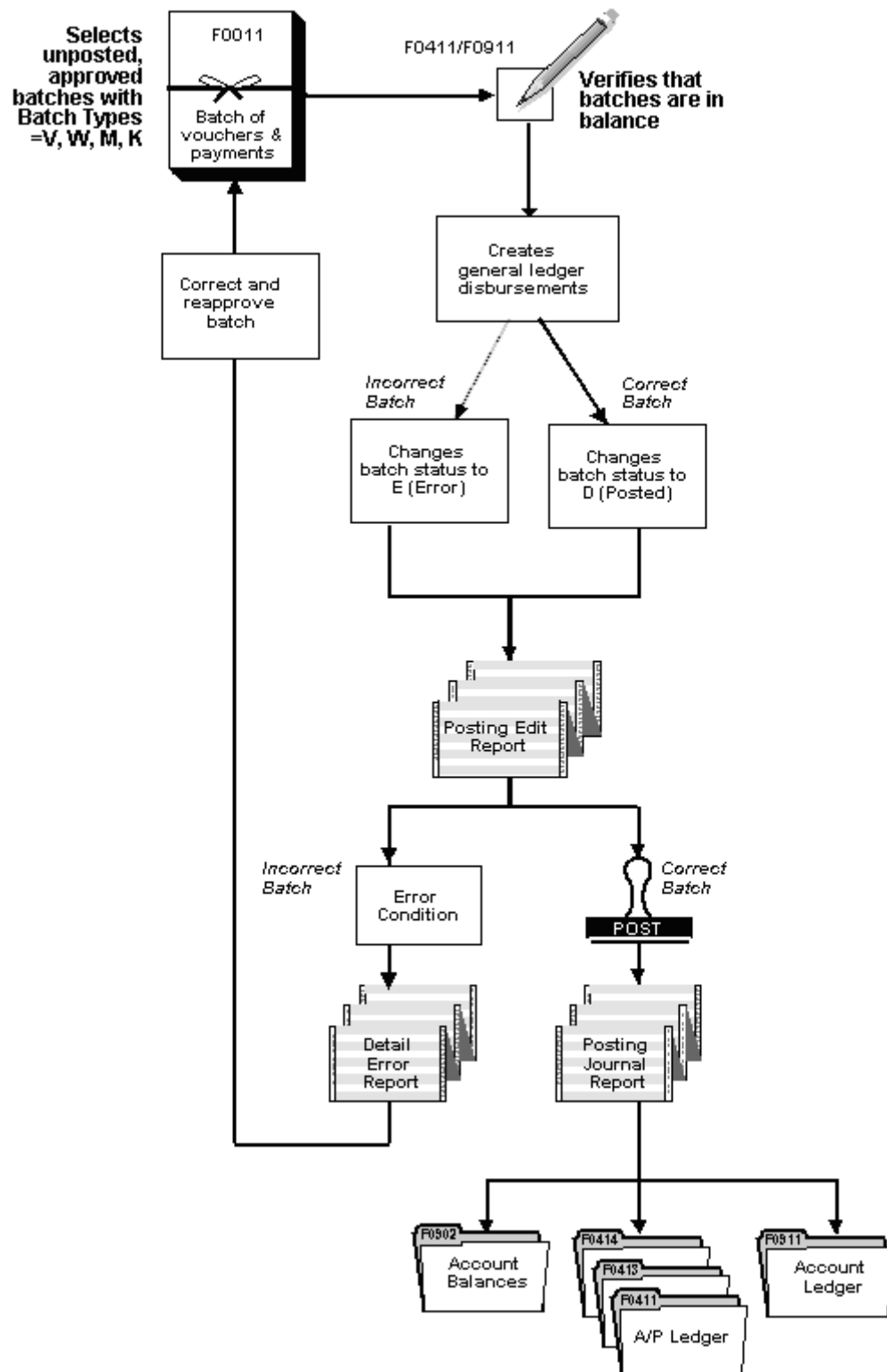
The system performs the following tasks for the post process:

- Selects unposted and approved transactions with the criteria specified in processing options.
- Edits each transaction to determine whether:
 - The account exists in the Account Master table (F0901) and is a posting account.
 - The business unit exists in the Business Unit Master table (F0006).
 - The G/L date is valid.
 - Intercompany settlements exist.
- Edits each batch to ensure that it is in balance and approved for posting.
- Prints a Posting Edit Report that shows any batch errors.

- Prints a Detail Error report that shows if AAIs are not set up correctly or if there is an invalid account number.
- Places the entire batch in error if any transactions are in error. This prevents the batch from posting.
- Retrieves the automatic offset method from A/P Constants.
- Accumulates and posts automatic offset amounts using document type AE. The system uses the company number and the G/L offset from each voucher to locate the AAI item PC. This item contains the offset account to which you are posting.
- Updates the period net postings to include the posted amounts for a particular account in the Account Balances table.
- Updates each G/L posted code to P (posted) in the Account Ledger table (F0911).
- Updates each document in the A/P Ledger table to D (posted) and updates each posted batch status to D (posted) in the Batch Control table (F0011).
- Posts tax entries using the AAI item PT.
- Records tax pay items in the Sales/Use/VAT Tax table (F0018). The processing options control which transactions are recorded.
- Performs intercompany settlements, if applicable.
- Posts the domestic amount to the AA (actual amount) ledger and, if applicable, the foreign amount to the CA (currency amount) ledger.
- Creates reversing entries, if applicable.
- Prints a posting journal.

The following graphic illustrates the A/P post processes.

Figure 14–1 A/P Post Process



14.1.3 How Are A/P Offsets Handled?

The automatic offset is a debit or credit to the A/P trade account. It is controlled by the AAI item PC. During the posting process, the system retrieves the following information for the automatic offset:

- Document type. This is AE (automatic entry).
- Document number. This is based on how you set up your offset method in A/P constants.
- Account description/explanation. For example:
 - Accounts Payable - Trade/Post Offset by Batch V (your batch number)
 - Accounts Payable - Trade/Post Offset by Doc V (your voucher number).

If the transaction includes taxes, the system generates an offset transaction with the characteristics described above, except that the description comes from the AAI item PT for the tax account.

14.2 Posting Programs and Reports

This section describes posting programs and reports.

14.2.1 Post - Create Payment Cash Entries (P04801)

This program writes all the AP F0911 records with the exception of AE documents. This includes payments, voids, discounts and gain/loss records.

14.2.2 General Ledger Post (P09800)

This is an editing program that writes to a posting edit report. This program updates the G/L Posted Code field but never writes a record. During the post, the G/L Posted Code field on the A/P transactions (F0411, F0413 and F0414) changes from blank, to X, to P, and finally to D.

- Blank indicates the batch has not been posted.
- X indicates that the post program has read the records, but the post ended abnormally.
- P indicates that the F0911 record has been created (if necessary), but the post detected an error. Records are updated to a posted code of 'P' while the program accumulates amounts for the AE entry.
- D indicates that the post is complete.

14.2.3 General Ledger Journal Report (P09801)

This is the program that writes all the AE documents and updates the F0902 balance file. The post program works differently depending on the batch type that is being posted.

14.2.4 Posting Edit Reports (R09800)

The posting reports comprise three reports. The first report, Posting Edit Report (R09800) will list any errors that occur in the batch or print the message, "No Errors, Batch Will Post". The report will print each time the post is run. If the batch is out of balance there will be error messages printed on the report. The 'intercompany

settlement' error always appears when there is an error in the batch. You will need to correct any error in addition to the intercompany settlement error first.

The second report, Posting Journal (R09801), lists the journal entries created in the F0911 for the batch (debits, credits and automatic entries that may have been created). This report will only print if the batch posts successfully.

The third report, Batches with Balancing Problems (R098012), will print when the batch is out of balance. This report lists the journal entries that may already exist for the batch as well as the entries the post is trying to create. You will need to use this report to assist in determining what is causing the post to error.

After you enter, review, and approve vouchers, post them to the general ledger.

15.1.1 Before You Begin

- Verify the offset method in the A/P constants
- Verify that the batch has an approved status
- Ensure that all post menu selections are routed to the same job queue and that the job queue only allows one job to process at a time

15.2 Posting Batches of Vouchers

Run only one post program at a time.

To post a batch of vouchers

1. Select the desired processing options.
2. Submit the post.

15.3 Verifying Posted Vouchers

After you post your vouchers, verify that the batch vouchers posted successfully. If a batch did not post, you must correct all errors and set the batch status to Approved before the system will post the batch. The system creates a variety of reports that you can use to verify the posting information.

Complete the following tasks:

- Reviewing the Posting Edit Report
- Reviewing the Batch Edit Report
- Reviewing the Posting Journal
- Reviewing Batches with Balancing Problems Report

15.3.1 Reviewing the Posting Edit Report

After you run the post program, use the Posting Edit Report to verify whether the system posted your batches successfully. The following appear on this report:

- Batches that posted successfully
- Documents with errors that prevented a batch from posting

15.3.2 Reviewing the Batch Edit Report

If you enter vouchers with multiple currencies, the system generates a Batch Edit report. This report lists problems with the batch.

15.3.3 Reviewing the Posting Journal

After you run the post program, use the Posting Journal to verify the automatic offsets that the system created. This report lists only those batches that posted successfully.

If you enter vouchers with multiple currencies, this report lists the amounts in both the CA (currency amounts) ledger and converted AA (actual amounts) ledger for foreign currency transactions. The CA amounts represent the foreign side of the entry. The AA amounts represent the domestic side of the entry.

Additionally, this report lists the currency code of the CA ledger amount and the domestic currency of the company for the AA ledger amount. Both the CA and the AA ledgers must be in balance. CA totals might not be currency specific.

15.3.4 Reviewing Batches with Balancing Problems Report

If you enter vouchers with multiple currencies, this report includes AA (actual amounts) and CA (currency amounts) ledger information. Both the CA and AA ledgers must be in balance.

After a voucher is posted but before you pay it, you might need to change it. For example, you might need to add lines to the G/L distribution. You might also need to void it.

16.1 Revising Posted Vouchers

Navigation

From Accounts Payable (G04), choose Supplier & Voucher Entry

From Supplier & Voucher Entry (G0411), choose Standard Voucher Entry

You might need to change posted, unpaid vouchers. For example, you might need to add lines to the G/L distribution.

The system maintains an audit trail when you change a posted voucher. It uses document type PE (change in gross amount) for the new transactions that adjust the posted transactions.

You cannot change the following key fields:

- Voucher Number
- Voucher Type
- Voucher Company
- Supplier Number
- G/L Date
- Company
- G/L Offset

Company and G/L Offset become key fields when a voucher is posted.

To change the information in one of these key fields, do one of the following:

- Void and re-enter the voucher
- Copy the voucher and change these fields on the new voucher before you enter it

If you make certain types of changes, the system changes the batch status from posted to unposted. You must post the batch again. This is true if you:

- Change the total gross amount for the voucher
- Change the number of vouchers in a batch
- Change a journal entry

If you must post the batch again, you might need to approve the batch before you post it. You must do this if the default entry status for the original voucher was pending.

To revise a posted voucher

On Standard Voucher Entry

1. Locate the voucher.
See [Section 8.2, "Locating Vouchers"](#).
2. Change the information in any field that is not a key field.
3. Access AR and AP Journal Entries by pressing Enter.
4. On AR and AP Journal Entries, complete the following fields to create a balancing entry, if necessary:

16.2 Voiding Posted Vouchers

To remove a posted voucher from your general ledger, you must void it and then post the batch again. You can void a voucher in any open fiscal period. You cannot delete a posted voucher.

To void a paid voucher, you must void the payment. After you do so, the voucher is considered unpaid and can be voided.

The system maintains an audit trail when you void a posted voucher. It uses document type PE (change in gross amount) for the new transactions that reverse the posted transactions.

To void a posted voucher

On Standard Voucher Entry

1. Locate the voucher.
See [Section 8.2, "Locating Vouchers"](#)
2. To void the voucher in a different period, change the following field (optional):
 - G/L Date
3. Access AR and AP Journal Entries by performing the Delete action.
4. On AR and AP Journal Entries, complete the following optional field:
 - Void
5. If you do not complete the Void field, complete the following fields:
 - Account Number
 - Amount
 - Explanation 2
6. Use the change action.
7. To verify the void, locate the original voucher.
8. Verify the following:
 - The gross and open amount for the original voucher information is zero (blank) in the A/P Ledger (F0411)
 - The payment status code is P (paid)
 - The G/L date is unchanged
9. To verify the audit trail, locate the new void document (document type PE).
10. Verify the following:
 - The gross amount in the A/P ledger reflects the amount of the original voucher in the opposite value (a credit amount for a voucher or a debit amount for a debit memo).
 - The G/L date in the A/P ledger reflects the void G/L date.
 - Pay status for the PE record is P.
 - The journal entry in the General Ledger (F0911) has the reversing entry to the same G/L account as the original posted entry.
 - The G/L date for the reversing journal entry matches the void G/L date in the A/P ledger.

This report lists transactions from the A/P Ledger (F0411) and Account Ledger (F0911) tables. The processing time for this report is related to the number of records in your system.

This is a DREAM Writer report.

18.1 Overview

The Accounts Payable Approvals process allows businesses to monitor and manage the outflow of cash through their A/P system. Approvals controls may be set up to determine the Approval Status for all vouchers entered or changed. These controls may be set up based on the voucher's gross or taxable amount, document type, business unit, company or any combination. When A/P Approvals is activated, the system will prevent payment on any voucher that does not have an appropriate Approval Status regardless of its pay status.

The system will use the AP Control file (F0453) when evaluating vouchers to determine if there will be a record created in the A/P Approval Detail File (F04531), and which approvers and status to be assigned. A record is written to the A/P Approval Detail File (F04531) for every voucher, whether it requires approval or not.

The following is the summary hierarchy used to evaluate the vouchers:

- Business Unit/Document Type/Company
- Business Unit/Document Type
- Document Type
- Company/Business Unit
- Company
- Business Unit

Lastly, the defaults are based on the processing options established in [Section 109.4, "A/P Approval - Approval Controls \(X0453\)"](#).

The only exception to the above rule is vouchers created by the Multi-Company Single Supplier (P041016). The evaluation is based on document type or the defaults will be used from Set Approval Flag for Voucher (X0453).

18.3 Approving Vouchers

From **Supplier and Voucher Entry (G0411)**, choose **A/P Approval - Work with Vouchers**

Once A/P Approvals has been activated and controls set up, records will be written to the A/P Approver Detail File (F04531) for every voucher that is entered in the system. This includes vouchers created from the Purchasing and Payroll systems. A/P Approval - Work with Vouchers (P04531) will allow display of all vouchers written to the A/P Approver File. You may inquire on various fields or any combination in order to limit the display of the A/P Approval detail records. The information displayed contains Approval Status, Approved By, Amount Approved, and an asterisk under the Credit Items headings to indicate a credit pay item is included. This program is designed for use as a review tool and for managing the approval status of vouchers in the system.

Figure 18–1 A/P Approval - Work With Vouchers screen

Allowed values for Approval Status are:

| Approval Status | Description |
|-----------------|--|
| Blank or 0 | The voucher is not approved for payment |
| 1 | The voucher is approved by one of the Approvers, either based on control levels set up or by manually approving the voucher. |

| Approval Status | Description |
|-----------------|---|
| 2 | The voucher is approved for payment automatically by the system. Either the amount was below the minimum amount or there was no record found in the control file for document type, company or business unit. Only the user assigned as Approver 1 or Approver 2 may change the Approval Status of a voucher. By using the options available, approvers may change the approval status on vouchers. The approvers cannot assign Approval Status '2' to a voucher; this is a system generated approval only. The following table describes the Approval Status functionality:

| If Approval Status = | Then |
|----------------------|---|
| 2 | The Approver 1 or Approver 2 can change the status to reject (9) or to unapprove (0) |
| 0 | The Approver 1 or Approver 2 can change the status to reject (9) or to approve (1). |
| 1 | The Approver 1 or Approver 2 can change the status to reject (9) or to unapprove (0). |
| 9 | The Approver 1 or Approver 2 can change the status to approve (1). |

The approvers use the option key field to affect the update of the status for each voucher. The Voucher Entry option (4) allows the approver to exit to the appropriate voucher entry program. If the field RPRP3 in the AP Detail file (F0411) is updated with a C for the voucher, the system will exit to the Multi-Company Single Supplier (P041016), utilizing DREAM Writer version ZJDE0001. All other vouchers will use Standard Voucher Entry (P04105), utilizing DREAM Writer version ZJDE0001.

Approvers can use function key exits to Speed Release (P04114), Supplier Ledger Inquiry (P042003) and Supplier Payment Ledger Inquiry (P042004). Approvers have the benefit of an 'Approve All Vouchers' function key which will assist in approving large groups of vouchers at a time.

Generic Text is another beneficial function key, which will allow the approver to make notes to the voucher. The Generic Text appears at the summary voucher level and will not be seen when inquiring on individual voucher pay items. You can use option key 9 in Supplier Ledger Inquiry (P042003) to view generic text created by the AP Approval system.

A/P Approvals - Work with Vouchers (P04531) has one processing option which allows you to designate default values prior to accessing the screen. You can set the processing option with the following fields available for assignment.

- Approver (Enter 'USERID' to get your User ID)
- Approver 1/2/Either/Both Flag

- Document Type
- Approved Status
- Approved By
- FROM Approved Date
- Company

If preloaded information needed for users varies depending on different users, it is recommended you set up separate menu options for each user and update the menu option with the specific DREAM Writer version established for that user.

Note: As an extra security measure, User ID/Password Security is invoked every time the program is selected. Before any user can enter the A/P Approval - Work with Vouchers (P04531) program, they are required to enter their IBM I-Series password, thus preventing an unauthorized user from trying to approve vouchers from an unprotected PC.

18.3.2 Maintenance and Updates

Over the course of time, employees leave the company or are assigned different responsibilities. The Global Update of Approver (P04840) allows you to globally update Approver 1 or Approver 2 from one User ID to another in both the A/P Approval Control file (F0453) as well as the A/P Approver Detail file (F04531).

Evaluate Vouchers - Assign Approval Status (P04532) will allow you to evaluate/re-evaluate and update vouchers based on the assigned version of Set Approval Flag for Voucher program (X0453). As mentioned previously, a new voucher or changed voucher will automatically be run through this program, but there may be occasions to re-evaluate a large group of vouchers, either upon initial implementation of A/P Approvals or if approval control records are added or changed.

A/P Purge (P04800) deletes the corresponding A/P Approval Detail file (F04531) records for vouchers eligible for purging from the AP Detail file (F0411).

When vouchers are deleted or voided in the AP Detail file (F0411), the system will automatically delete the corresponding record from the AP Approval Detail file (F04531).

19.2 About Other Voucher Entry Methods

Not all of your vouchers are typical standard or speed vouchers. You might need to enter a voucher to pay an employee for a travel advance, or you might need to enter several vouchers at the same time for one supplier.

Working with other voucher entry methods consists of:

- Working with logged vouchers
- Working with recurring vouchers
- Entering prepaid vouchers
- Entering vouchers for multiple companies
- Entering multiple vouchers for suppliers

These programs may be found on Menu G04111.

19.2.1 Why Do You Use Other Voucher Entry Methods?

You might have many suppliers with different payment expectations. Depending on the supplier, you might need to enter a voucher with limited information for many internal companies, or set up a voucher that is the same amount every month.

19.2.2 Logged Vouchers

If you do not know which G/L account to distribute a voucher to, you can enter a logged (preliminary) voucher. This is useful if you want to quickly enter a voucher when you receive the supplier's invoice so that you can maintain accurate accounts payable information.

When you enter a logged voucher, the system distributes the total amount of the voucher to a G/L suspense account. Later, you review and redistribute the voucher to the correct G/L accounts.

To view those vouchers assigned to a suspense account, print the Voucher Detail report. This report shows transaction totals from the A/P Ledger table.

19.2.3 Recurring Vouchers

You can enter a recurring voucher for a supplier who sends you invoices for the same amount on a regular basis. This voucher entry method is ideal for lease and rent payments.

You specify the frequency and the number of payments when you enter the original voucher.

19.2.4 Prepaid Vouchers

When a supplier requires you to pay for goods or services before they submit an invoice, enter a prepaid voucher. You can enter prepaid vouchers to:

- Pay employee expenses or travel advances
- Pay deposits on services to be rendered
- Take advantage of discounts

Prepaid vouchers are created with two pay items: one pay item with a positive amount and pay status of A, for approved, and one pay item with a negative amount and pay status of H for hold.

With this method, you can enter a voucher and produce a payment in the next automatic payment run or produce a manual payment immediately by paying the positive pay item. Later, when you receive the actual invoice and create a new voucher for the invoice, the system reduces the payment to the supplier by netting the amount of the negative pay item against the new voucher.

19.2.5 One Voucher for Many Companies

To distribute a voucher among several internal companies of a supplier for the same expense, enter a voucher for multiple companies. You can distribute the voucher among:

- Different G/L offset accounts
- Different bank accounts

19.2.6 Many Vouchers for One or More Suppliers

To enter several vouchers quickly, you can enter:

- Multiple vouchers for one supplier
- Multiple vouchers for more than one supplier

Entering multiple vouchers at one time speeds up the entry process, but limits the information you can enter.

20.1 Working with Logged Vouchers

To enter a voucher before you assign it a G/L account, use voucher logging. Later, review and redistribute the voucher to the correct G/L accounts.

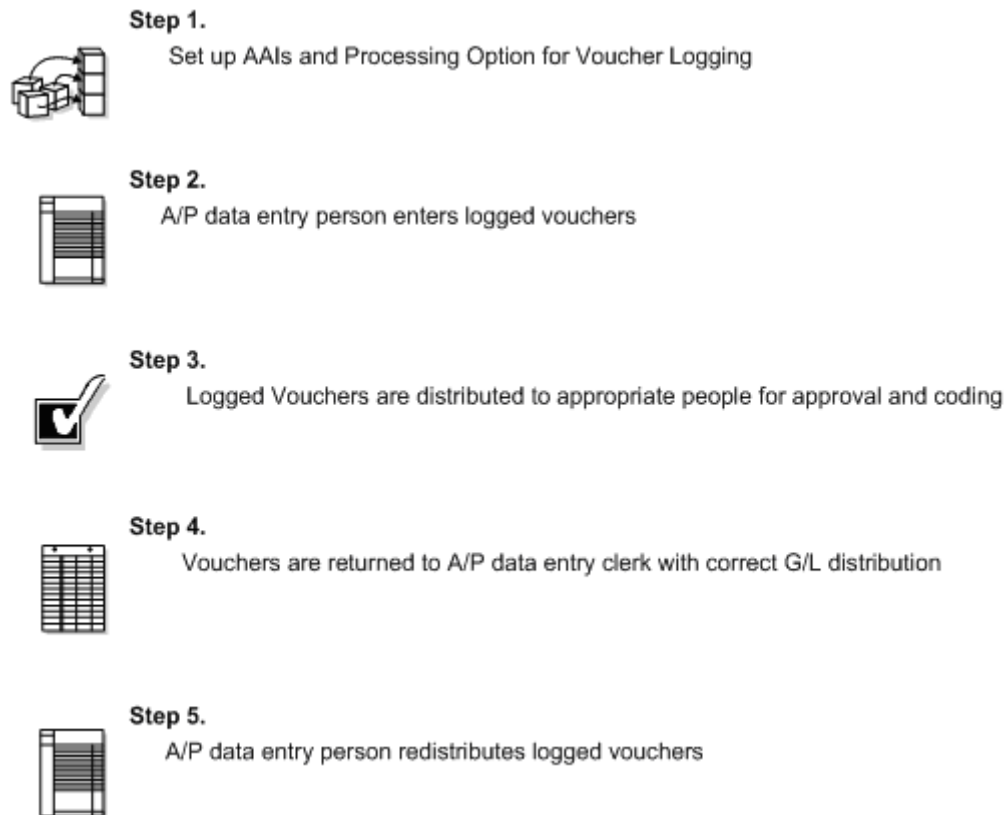
When you enter a logged voucher, the system:

- Creates a voucher with a voucher number and document type of PL.
- Distributes the total amount of the voucher to a G/L suspense account. The default for this suspense account is specified in AAI item PP.
- Records the offset amount based on the A/P trade account (AAI item PC) or the A/P Suspense Trade Account (AAI item PQ), depending on which method is designated on Company Numbers and Names.

Information about logged vouchers is maintained in the A/P Ledger (F0411) and Account Ledger (F0911) tables.

Figure 20–2 Distribution After Posting Voucher

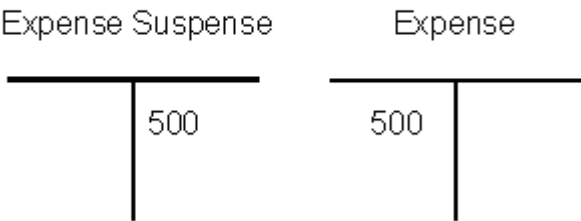

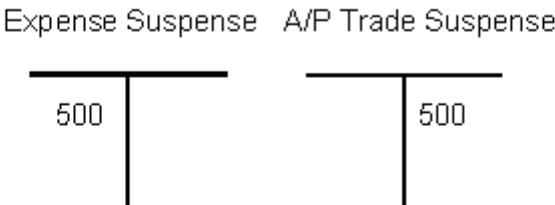

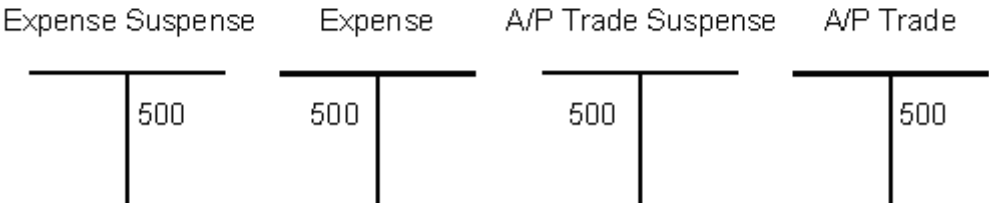

21.1 Working with Recurring Vouchers

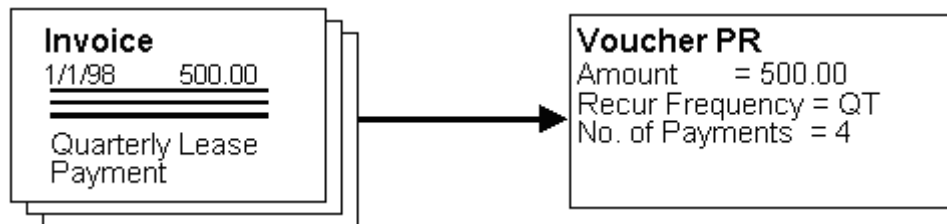
If you owe a supplier a specific amount on a regular basis, such as a lease payment, set up your Accounts Payable system to create the voucher on a recurring basis.

To set up a recurring voucher, you first specify the initial payment, the total number of payments, the recurring frequency, and the accounting distributions for the periodic voucher amount.

Figure 21–1 Recurring Vouchers



On a periodic basis, you generate a copy of the original voucher. This copying process is called recycling. The recycled voucher has its own document number and batch that is different from the original voucher.

Figure 21–2 Recycling a Voucher

When you recycle vouchers, you use a slightly modified version of the JD Edwards World three-tier processing steps:

1. **Recycle** - Recycle the vouchers that you want to submit for payment. You can do this at any time, but usually you recycle on a weekly, monthly, or quarterly basis. The system creates a new voucher.
2. **Review and Approve** - Review and approve the batches.
3. **Post** - Post the batches to the general ledger.

Information about recurring vouchers is maintained in the A/P Ledger (F0411) and Account Ledger (F0911) tables.

When you recycle a voucher, the system makes a copy of the previous copy and updates the appropriate fields. The system repeats this process every time you recycle the voucher until the number of payments equals one. You do not have to pay existing recurring vouchers to generate the next batch of recurring vouchers.

This is a DREAM Writer process.

21.5.1 What Happens When You Recycle Recurring Vouchers?

When you Recycle Recurring Vouchers (P048101) the system:

- Removes the recurring frequency and number of payments on the original voucher.
- Creates a new voucher and updates the following:
 - Voucher number with a new number
 - Document type, based on processing option
 - Batch number with a new number
 - Number of payments (decreases by one)
 - G/L date and net due date, using the recurring frequency to calculate the next date
 - Invoice date and number, according to the processing options
- Updates the A/P Ledger (F0411) and the General Ledger (F0911) for the new voucher.
- Creates an error report, if errors exist. The errors might occur for the following reasons:
 - Accounting distribution records are not created. This happens when there are no matching records in the Account Ledger table (F0911) for the recurring voucher.
 - The G/L date for the newly created voucher is for a prior fiscal year (PYEB) or the G/L date is for a prior month (PBCO).
 - The prior month dates were not specified in the general accounting constants.
 - The G/L date does not fall within a valid fiscal date pattern for the company.

When you recycle a voucher for the first time, the system:

- Makes a copy of the original voucher
- Changes the recurring frequency and number of payments on the original voucher to blank

- Duplicates the recurring frequency from the original to the copy
- Subtracts one payment from the number of payments of the original voucher

21.5.2 Before You Begin

- Set up a separate version for each recurring frequency you use, for example, monthly, quarterly, and annually. Use data selection to choose only those vouchers with a specific frequency.
- Set up a next numbers series for recurring vouchers (optional).

Sometimes it is necessary to pay for goods or services before you receive an invoice. For example, you can enter a prepaid voucher:

- To pay for employee expenses or travel advances
- To pay for up-front deposits on services to be rendered
- To take advantage of a discount

When you enter a prepaid voucher, the system creates a voucher for payment the next time you process a batch of automatic payments. It also creates a pending negative voucher pay item.

When the actual voucher is received, enter the information just as you would a standard voucher. The system reduces the total amount owed to the supplier by the amount of the negative voucher pay item.

If you need to prepay a voucher immediately, use Payment with Voucher Match.

Information about prepaid vouchers is maintained in the A/P Ledger (F0411) and Account Ledger (F0911) tables.

22.1.1 Example: Prepaid Vouchers

An employee requests a travel advance of 1,000. To enter the travel advance as a prepayment, enter 1,000 in the Invoice Amount field and 0 (zero) to an expense account in the G/L distribution. The system creates a negative pay item of 1,000. The voucher post program creates a 1,000 debit for the negative pay item to the prepaid expense account you specified in the AAIs and a 1,000 credit to the A/P trade account.

You can pay the prepaid voucher using either automatic or manual payment processing. When you post the payment, the system creates G/L entries to debit the A/P trade account and credit the cash account.

23.1 Entering a Voucher for Multiple Companies

When you receive a voucher that consists of expenses incurred by multiple internal companies and is to be distributed to different G/L offset and bank accounts, enter a voucher for multiple companies. When you do this, you create a one-to-one correspondence between the general ledger distribution and the accounts payable offset.

For a voucher with multiple companies:

- The G/L distribution line determines which company is used for the offset.
- The account number represents the distribution expense associated with the pay item.
- The system generates a separate pay item for each line of distribution.
- The Category Code field in the detail area allows you to choose a code to designate 1099 information.

The primary difference between a standard voucher and a voucher for multiple companies is that you do not include a company on a multiple company voucher.

Information about vouchers for multiple companies is maintained in the A/P Ledger (F0411) and Account Ledger (F0911) tables.

If you set up Enhanced Subledger Accounting, you can view and change these values in the detail area. See *Work with Enhanced Subledger Accounting in the JD Edwards World General Accounting I Guide* for more information.

23.1.1 Example: Voucher for Multiple Companies

The A/P liability account and bank account used in this example are determined by the following:

- The business unit used in the G/L distribution and the company associated with the business unit
- The A/P class code (G/L offset), which is a default from the supplier master

You distribute a voucher of 2,500 to two accounts:

Use a multiple voucher entry method to quickly enter vouchers with limited information at the same time for one or more suppliers.

Entering multiple vouchers for suppliers consists of:

- Entering multiple vouchers for a single supplier

Unlike the standard voucher entry method, which is a two-step process, the multiple voucher entry method is a single-step process.

You cannot use this method to enter:

- Automatic reversing entries
- Multiple journal entries per voucher
- Prepaid vouchers
- Logged vouchers
- Discounts

- Zero invoice amounts

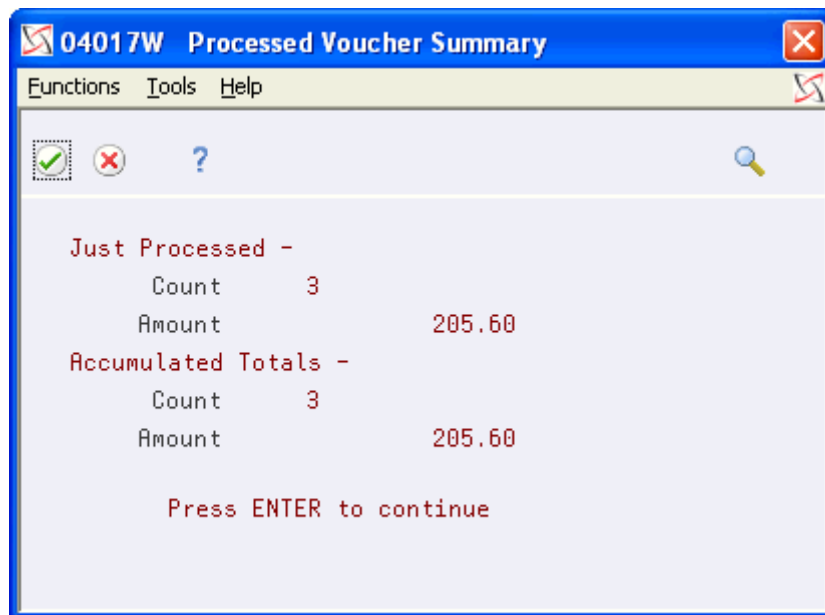

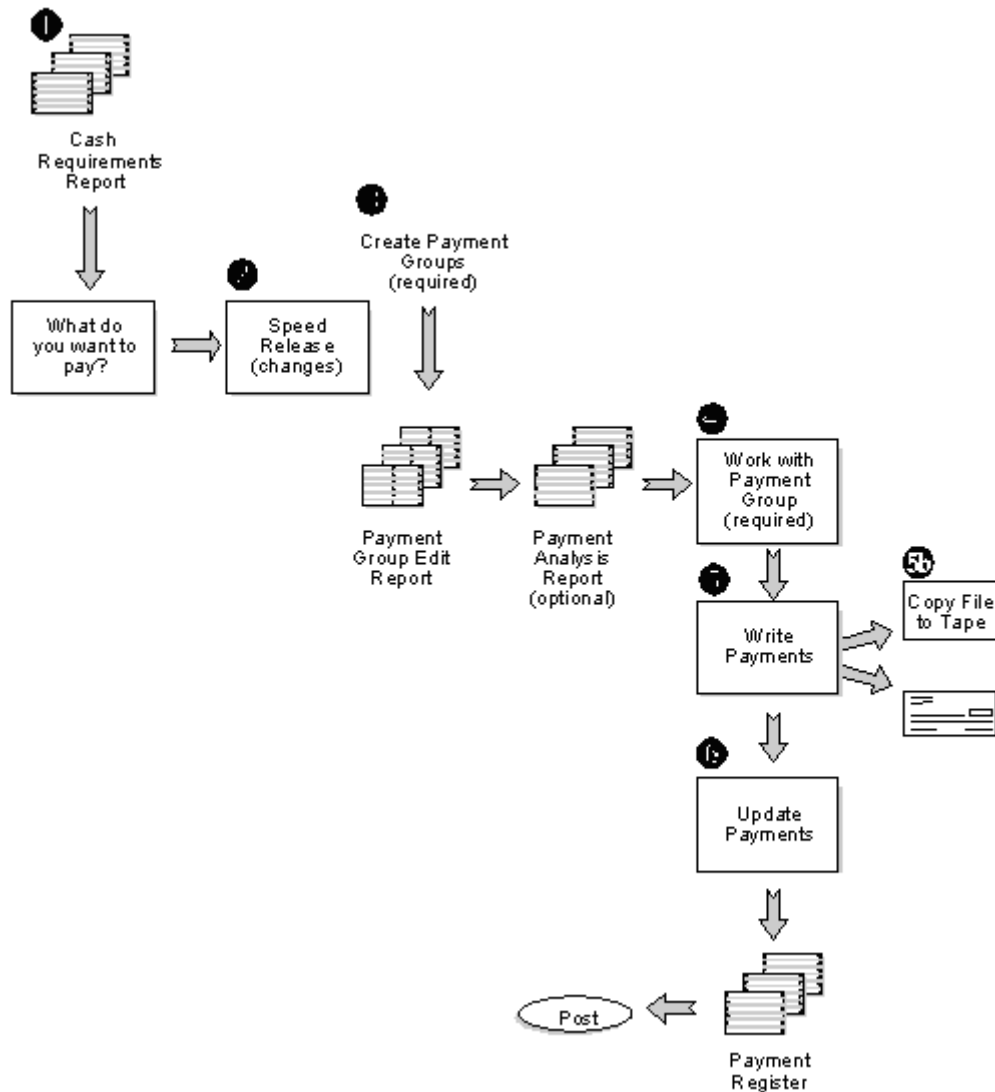

25.2 About Automatic Payment Processing

Automatic payment processing allows you to manage your payments, so you maintain company finances at maximum levels while issuing disbursements on time to take advantage of favorable discount terms. Use automatic payment processing to pay vouchers during your usual payment cycle. Automatic payment processing consists of:

- Withholding supplier taxes
- Preparing vouchers for payment
- Grouping vouchers for payment
- Working with payment groups
- Working with payments
- Updating the A/P ledger
- Approving and posting automatic payments
- Voiding automatic payments

The following illustration shows the automatic payment process.

Work with Supplier Withholding Taxes

You might need to comply with government regulations that require you to withhold a percentage of payments to suppliers for whom you do not have a tax ID.

For example, you can set up the system to automatically withhold a percentage of the amount that you pay your suppliers if they do not supply you with a tax ID. You can post vouchers when you enter them or when you calculate withholding. When you generate payments, you can pay both the supplier and the tax authority at the same time or separately.

To set up a supplier for withholding

If you are required to withhold a percentage of each payment to a particular supplier, you must set up that supplier for withholding. The system will deduct the percentage

you specify from each voucher you enter. It will also make that percentage payable to the tax authority you specify.

Although you can specify the tax authority in the Supplier Master record (F0401), the system also provides a processing option in the Calculate Withholding (P04580) program that you can use to override the tax authority that you specify here.

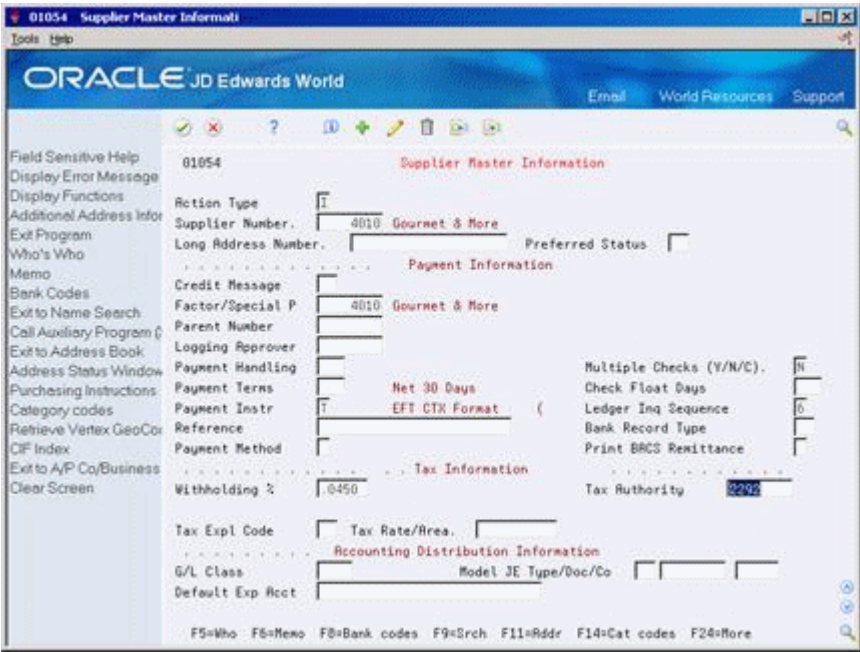

26.2 Calculating Withholding

To calculate withholding, you run the Calculate Withholding (P04580) program.

Calculate Withholding is a DREAM Writer that creates withholding records for existing vouchers. It performs the following:

1. Selects voucher pay items with a pay status of % (withholding applies).

2. Calculates withholding amounts using the withholding percentage in the supplier master record.
3. Changes the pay status on the original pay item from % to A (approved) so you can pay them in the next payment run. However, you can change the pay status in the Pay Status processing option.
4. Creates two pay items
5. Produces two reports

26.2.1 Pay Items

When you run the Calculate Withholding program, the system creates two additional pay items for the voucher or a new voucher with two pay items, depending on how you set the processing options. The system bases this on the withholding percentage that you set up. The system creates:

- A negative pay item for the withholding amount with the same payee, pay status, and due date as the original voucher pay item. This pay item reduces the amount of the voucher by the amount withheld.
 - If you change the default pay status of the original pay item, the system changes the default pay status for the negative pay item.
 - The negative pay item offsets the amount of the original pay item when you process the original and negative pay items for payment.
- A pay item for the withholding amount using the tax authority in the supplier master record as the alternate payee. This new pay item has the same due date and G/L bank account as the original pay item, however, by default you can assign a new G/L Date to the new pay items for the withholding.
 - The system assigns a pay status of H (hold) to pay items for tax authorities so that you can accumulate withholdings and pay them on a periodic basis.
 - You can change the default pay status using the Pay Status processing option.
 - The system does not post the new pay items. You must submit the voucher batch to post for these items.

26.2.2 Reports

The program produces the following reports:

- Calculate Withholding Status Report lists the new pay items and the pay status of each item. PS represents Pay Status on the report.
- Calculate Withholding Error Report (if applicable) lists the vouchers that were not released for payment and the error associated with each voucher or pay item.

26.2.3 Using Create Payment Groups to Calculate Withholding

As an alternative to running P04580 to calculate withholding, you can calculate withholding by setting the Calculate Withholding processing options when you run the Create Payment Groups (P04570) program.

Note: P04570 does *not* post the withholding pay items. If you set the data selection in P04570 to select only posted transactions (Posted Code EQ D), the program chooses only the first pay item (when you post the voucher after entry) and the payment is for the full amount of the voucher because it does not include the withholding negative pay item. The result is that you overpay your supplier by the amount of the tax. If you want to include posted transactions in the data selection, JD Edwards World recommends that you use P04580 to calculate withholding so that you post the new pay items before you run P04570.

The following example illustrates the pay items the program creates when you calculate withholding. In this example, the system creates two pay items:

- A negative pay item to be deducted from the original pay item
- A positive pay item to be paid to the tax authority

To report the amount you are withholding for a tax authority, print an Open A/P Detail Report (P04423) or Open A/P Summary Report (P04413). You set the Payee Address Number (RPPYE) equal to the address book number of the tax authority in the data selection. This report shows only withheld amounts, not the amounts of the original voucher pay items.

You can print the same information from Supplier Ledger Inquiry (P04223) by entering the address number of a tax authority and choosing Print.

You can use the Cash Requirements Report to determine how much money you need for payments and how much money you have in your bank accounts. You can also use it to review upcoming cash requirements.

The report lists vouchers by supplier in four aging columns, provides a total for each supplier and each bank account, and shows the total amount necessary to pay open vouchers.

The Cash Requirements Report includes information related to A/P Approvals. Based on a processing option setting, you can bypass the print of vouchers that are not approved for payment. The report also shows the A/P Approval Status to assist with analyzing cash outflow.

This is a DREAM Writer report.

This report shows transactions from the A/P Ledger table (F0411).

When you review vouchers, the system displays open pay items in ascending order by net due date. It does not display records with pay status equal to paid, draft accepted, or payment in process. The form displays the total of selected vouchers with pay statuses of Approved and Hold.

You might need to revise vouchers before paying them. For example, after you assign a bank account to vouchers, you might later decide that you want to pay those vouchers from a different account. This is especially common when you close a bank account and need to assign the vouchers to the account from which you will now pay.

You can make only changes that do not affect the voucher posting through speed release. Making changes through speed release can be more efficient than making them through voucher entry because:

- You can locate and change more than one voucher at a time
- You can locate and change multiple vouchers for multiple suppliers in one session, using additional search criteria
- The system does not reopen the batch, so you do not need to post it again.

Revising vouchers consists of:

- Revising an individual voucher

- Revising multiple vouchers
- Revising multiple vouchers based on expanded search criteria

28.1 Grouping Vouchers for Payment

Navigation

From Accounts Payable (G04), choose Automatic Payment Processing

From Automatic Payment Processing (G0413), choose Create Payment Groups

Before you can write payments, you must create payment groups. When you create payment groups, the system separates vouchers that have similar information, such as the same bank account and payment instrument. This allows the system to process similar vouchers in the same way. You use the payment groups when you review and write payments.

This is a DREAM Writer program.

You run Create Payment Groups once for each payment cycle. The program typically creates more than one payment group. Each payment group contains information that determines how the group will be processed, including:

- Bank account
- Payment instrument
- Output queue

Each payment group also contains control information that determines which program to use for:

- Payments
- Registers
- Attachments
- Debit statements

If you need to include additional vouchers in a payment group, you can undo the group, approve those vouchers for payment, and rerun the program. The system displays payment groups after you write them until you undo them or update them to the A/P ledger.

The Create Payment Group program allows you to summarize document information on the pay stub or attachment by Document Only as well the default summarization by document and due date.

28.1.1 What Happens When You Create Payment Groups?

When you create payment groups, the system:

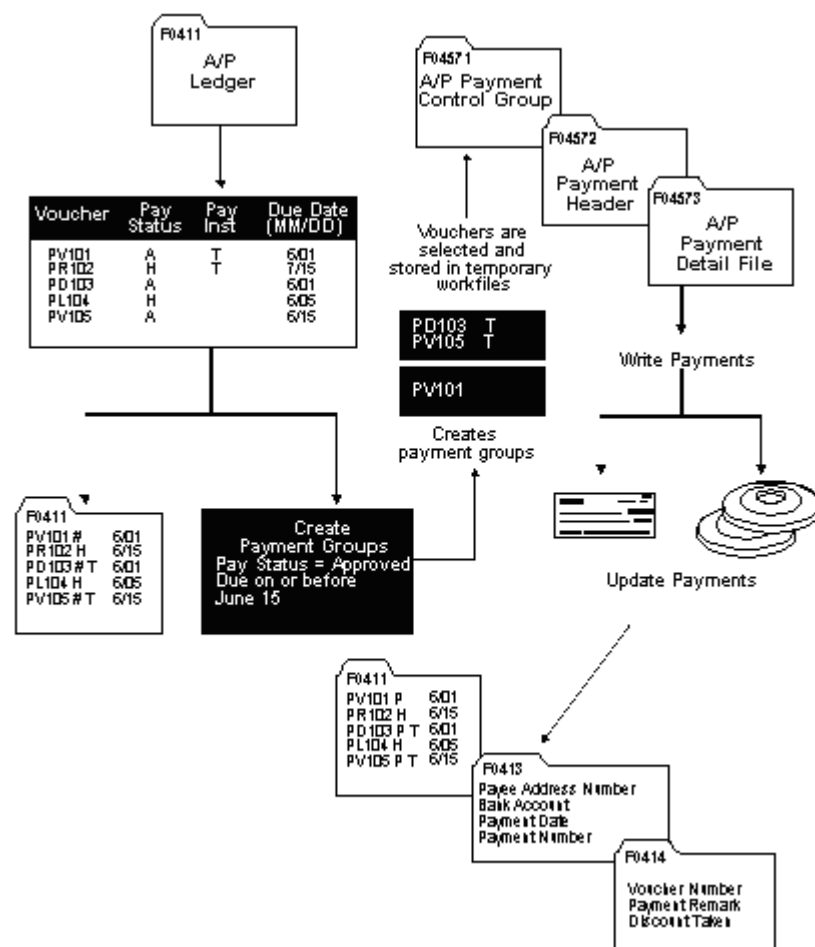
1. Selects vouchers with a pay status of A (approved).
2. Creates payment groups for all selected vouchers by grouping vouchers with the following common information:

- Bank account
- Payment instrument
- Currency code
- Business unit (optional)
- Company (optional)

After the system creates payment groups, each group also has the following information in common:

- Version ID
 - User
 - Creation date
 - Output queue
3. Assigns each payment group a "next status" of WRT (write).
 4. Changes the pay status of selected vouchers from A to # (payment in-process).
 5. Creates worktables to use in writing payments:
 - A/P Payment Control Group table (F04571). Contains a single header record for each payment group with information about that group of payments.
 - A/P Payment Header table (F04572). Contains a record for each payment within a group. These records are the actual payments that will be written and updated to the F0413 file through the Work With Payment Groups program.
 - A/P Payment Detail table (F04573). Contains a record for each voucher pay item within a payment. This is the information that will be printed on the payment stub and updated to the F0414 file through the Work With Payment Groups program..
 6. Prints a Payment Group Edit report that shows vouchers that are selected for payment.

28.1.3 Before You Begin

- Make changes to vouchers, if necessary. You cannot change vouchers that are included in a payment group; you will need to remove the voucher from the group in order to make changes.
- Approve vouchers for payment.

28.2 Reviewing the Payment Group Edit Report

When you create payment groups, the system generates this report, which shows the vouchers that are selected for payment. You can use this report to review vouchers and payment groups.

See sample report below.

28.2.1 Example: Selecting Payment Currency

You set the currency processing method you want to use for payments with a processing option:

- Bank Account Monetary Unit
- Voucher Domestic Currency
- Voucher Foreign Currency
- Current Domestic Amount

You can also use a processing option to override the bank account. Two multi-currency considerations exist for overriding the bank account:

- The monetary bank account must have the same currency as the transaction.
- The bank account's company currency must be the same as the foreign or domestic currency of the transaction.

The following examples describe these methods.

28.2.1.1 Bank Account Monetary Unit

When you use the Bank Account Monetary Unit method, you pay in the currency of the bank account. A gain/loss might be calculated. For example:

Company base currency = USD

Monetary bank account = EUR

| Voucher Number | Domestic | Foreign |
|----------------|----------|---------|
| PV1 | USD | EUR |

Because the monetary bank account is EUR, choosing this method results in paying the foreign amount of the voucher (EUR).

28.2.1.2 Voucher Domestic Currency

When you use the Voucher Domestic Currency method, you pay the domestic amount of the voucher. No gain/loss is calculated. For example:

Company base currency = USD

| Voucher Number | Domestic | Foreign |
|----------------|----------|---------|
| PV1 | USD | EUR |
| PV2 | USD | |

When you choose this method you pay the domestic USD amount for both vouchers.

28.2.1.3 Voucher Foreign Currency

When you use the Voucher Foreign Currency method, you pay the foreign transaction amount of the voucher. A gain/loss might be calculated.

Example 1:

Company base currency = USD

Example 2:

Company base currency = GBP

| Voucher Number | Domestic | Foreign |

When you choose this method you pay the foreign EUR amount for both vouchers.

28.2.1.4 Current Domestic Amount

When you use the Current Domestic Amount method, you pay the current domestic amount of the voucher. A gain/loss might be calculated. For example:

Company base currency = EUR

Transaction currency = USD

| Voucher Number | Domestic | Foreign | Exchange Rate |
|----------------|-----------|-----------|---------------|
| PV1 | 5,000 EUR | 1,000 USD | 5.0 |

When you pay this voucher, the exchange rate has changed:

| Voucher Number | Domestic | Foreign | Exchange Rate |
|----------------|-----------|-----------|---------------|
| PK1 | 6,000 EUR | 1,000 USD | 6.0 |

Choosing this method results in payment of 6,000 EUR. The system calculates a 1,000 EUR loss on the transaction.

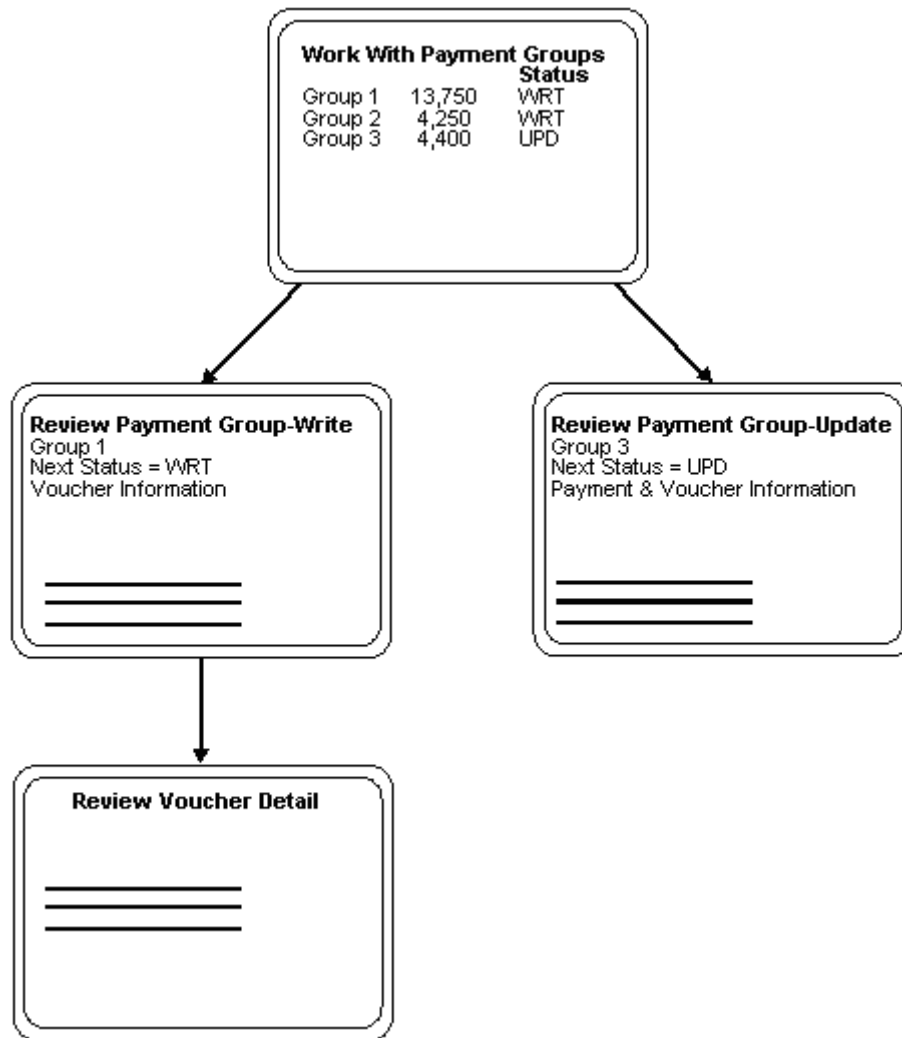

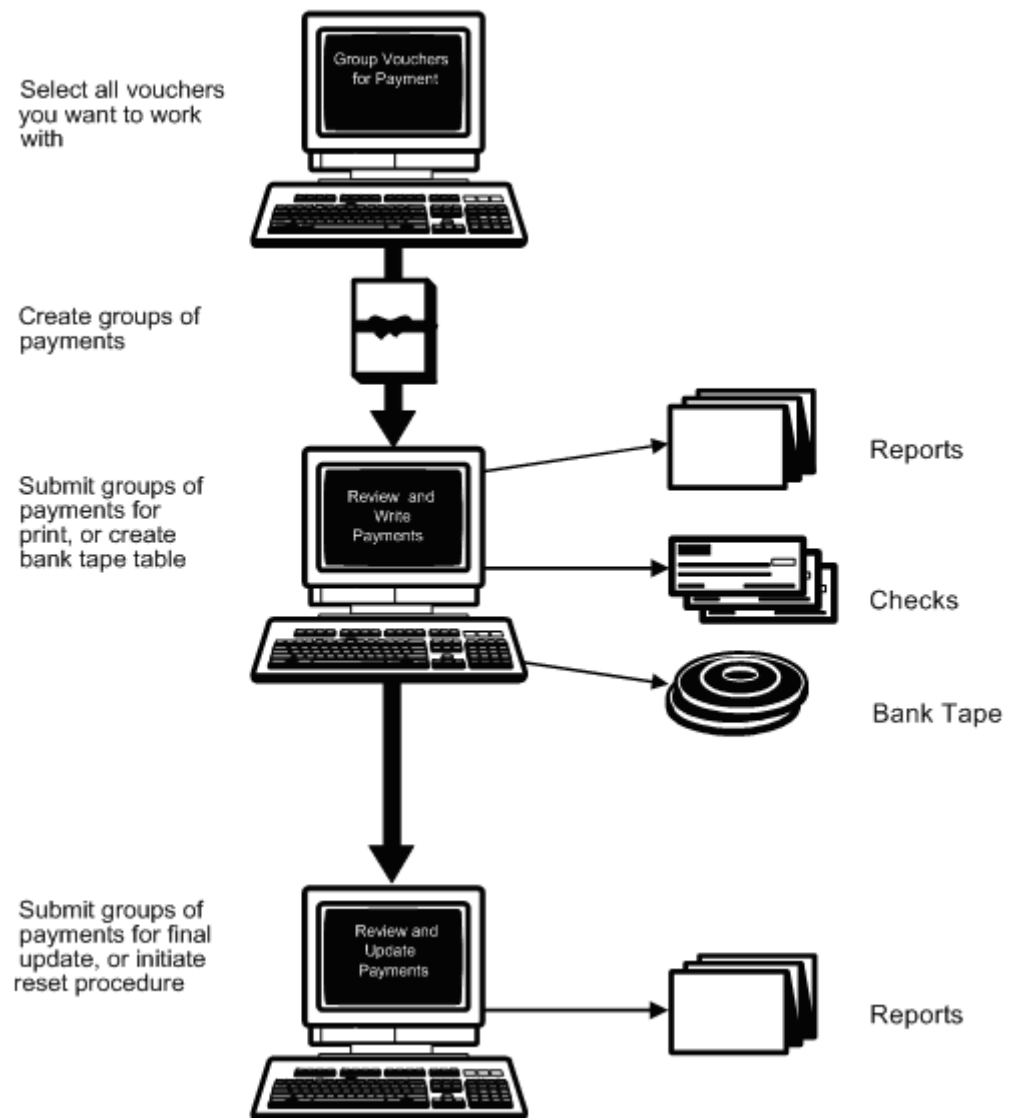
After you create payment groups, you can review and change payments. You generally review payments twice:

- After you create payment groups but before you write payments. This allows you to identify payments and vouchers that you want to change or remove from the payment cycle. You can:
 - Change information at the payment and voucher levels
 - Remove payment groups, payments, and vouchers from the payment cycle
 - Change control information for payment groups
- After you write payments but before you update the A/P ledger. This allows you to identify payments that you want to void or remove from the payment cycle. You can:
 - Void the payments that were written and rewrite them
 - Remove payment groups, payments, and vouchers from the payment cycle

The following graphic shows the relationships among the forms that you use to work with payment groups.

29.2 Printing the Payment Analysis Report

You can print the Payment Analysis Report at any time in the automatic payment process to ensure that payments are correct. This report shows whether payments are ready to be written or ready to be updated to the A/P ledger. It shows all payments in all payment groups.

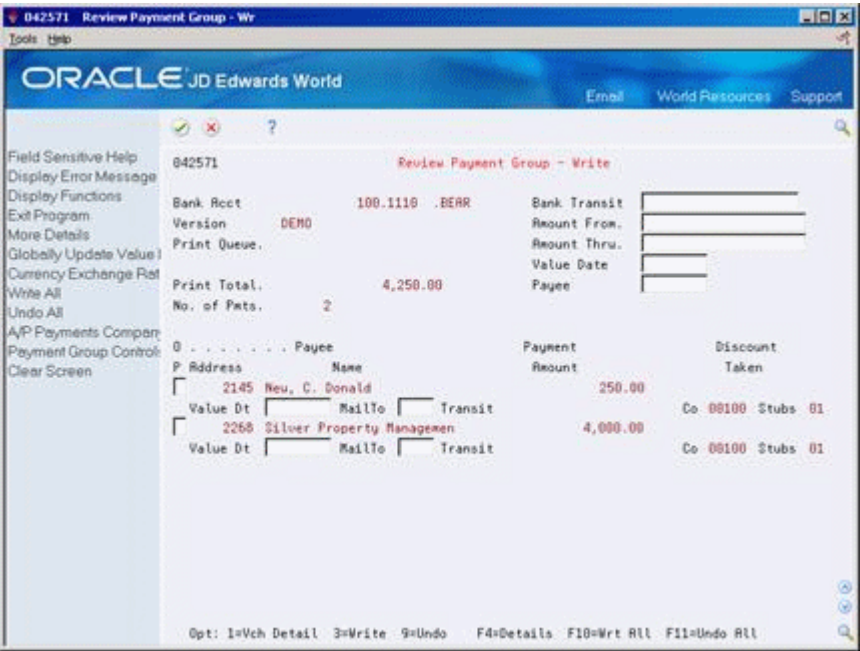

After you create payment groups, you must write payments. When you create payment groups, the system creates temporary payment records. When you work with payments, you use these records to print payments or create a bank tape table, depending on your setup.

30.1.1 What Happens When You Write Payments?

When you write payments, the system uses worktables to:

- Create a matching document with a document type of PK (automatic payment), PT (electronic funds transfer), or P1 (draft). This payment closes the voucher.
- Assign payment numbers.
- Change the next status of the payment group from WRT (write) to UPD (update).
- Print payments (or create bank tape tables) using control information for payment groups.

The system does not update the A/P Ledger table (F0411) until the update process.

30.3 Resetting Payment Processing

You might need to reset payments because of an error, such as a forms jam, wrong payment number, or wrong payment date. You can write payments again by resetting the payment processing. Written payments have a next status of UPD (update). When you reset the payment you are returning the selected payment to a next status of WRT (write) so you can correct the problem and rewrite them.

In Work with Payment Groups (P04257) there is a processing option that gives you the choice whether to process void payments through the G/L for an audit trail.

If the processing option is set to 1 and you reset or undo the payment group after it has been written, the original payment numbers will be processed through the G/L as voids when you post the batch. The posting journal will show void PK records to the bank account with zero amounts. The payments that were not reset and any new payments that were re-written will have PK records to the bank account with the payment amounts.

If the processing option is set to 'blank' and you reset or undo the payment group you can use the check numbers again as no records will be created in the G/L for those payments. The process remains the same as shown in the examples below.

30.3.1 Examples & Processes

This section describes examples and processes.

30.3.1.1 Complete Payment Group Reset

Example: Payment group consists of 2 payments, PK 237 and 238. The payments were created with the wrong payment date so you will need to reset the entire payment group. The processing option in Work with Payment Group is set to process void payment to the G/L.

1. To reset a complete payment group, select the Reset option (8) next to the payment in Work with Payment Groups.
2. The window for Reset Payments (P04257W2) will show you what the next payment number will be, in this example the next payment number is 239..
3. Now you can write the payment group again. When the batch is posted the journal will print the PKs 237 and 238 as voids with zero amounts and payments 239 and 240 will be posted with the payment amounts.

30.3.1.2 Partial Payment Group Reset

Example: Payment group consists of 9 payments. Payments 246 - 249 printed without error, payments 250 - 252 forms jammed and need to be written again, payments 253 and 254 printed without error.

1. To reset a partial group select the Payments option (1) next to the payment group.
2. From Review Payment Group - Update (P042573) select the Reset option (8) next to the individual payments in the group that you want to re-write. In this example you would choose the Reset option for payments 250 - 252.
3. When the payments are rewritten and the batch is posted PK 246 through 249 will post with the payment amounts, PK 250 through 252 will post to the bank account with zero amount and PK 253, 254, 255, 256 and 257 (255-257 are the rewritten payments) will post to the bank account with the payment amounts.

30.4 Removing Processed Payments

After you write payments but before you update them, you might need to remove a payment from the current payment cycle.

To remove processed payments from the current payment cycle, you undo them. The system:

- Voids the payment
- Removes the voucher pay items from the payment group
- Resets the pay status of the voucher from payment in-process to approved

You can then change vouchers and process them for payment at another time.

To remove processed payments

When you write payments, the payment instrument can be an electronic format. In this case, writing payments creates bank tape tables rather than printing them. You must copy these tables to tape or diskette if you want to send the information to a financial institution.

Copying payments to tape consists of:

- Reviewing and changing the status and detail for a tape table
- Copying a tape table to tape or diskette

You set tape format specifications in a processing option for the Produce Bank Tape program (P04572T). You can access these options through the versions list. You can also change many format specifications prior to copying the table to tape.

The A/P Payment Tape table (F0457) is a multimember table. This means that the system does not overwrite a bank tape table when you create a new one. The system also does not automatically delete records in this table. You can delete a member table after you verify that your bank has received the bank tape.

You can also re-copy a bank table to tape if, for example, your financial institution loses the original tape.

To review and change status and detail for a tape table

The detail for a tape table is generally preset by your MIS department in the processing options for A/P Payment Processing - Produce Bank Tape (P04572T). You should not change this information unless instructed to do so.

31.1 Updating the A/P Ledger

Updating the A/P ledger creates transaction records of your payments and your payment register. You can update payments only if the next status of the payment group is UPD (update).

After you update the A/P ledger tables, you can post payments to the G/L. Alternatively; a processing option for Work with Payment Groups allows you to automatically submit payments for posting to G/L after updating the A/P ledger tables.

31.1.1 Before You Begin

- Verify that all payments printed correctly. After you update the A/P ledger, you cannot reset payment processing. You must void the payments and begin the payment process again.
- Review processed payments.

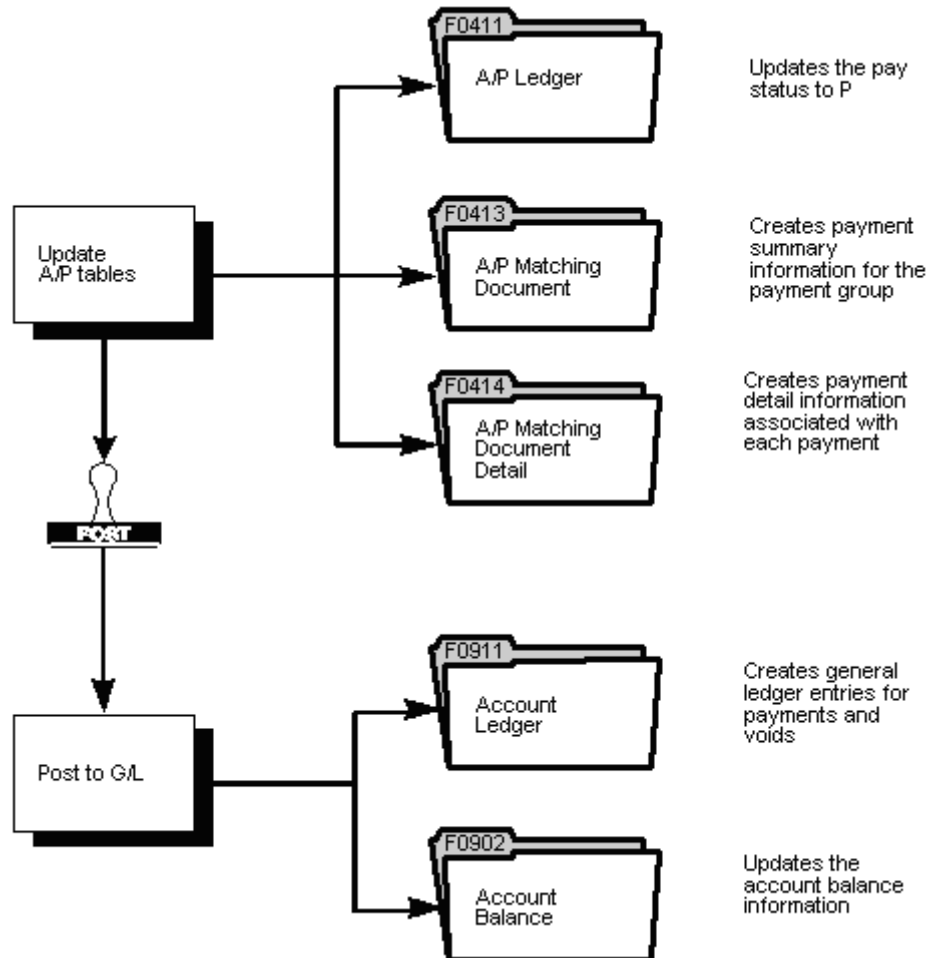
31.1.2 What Happens When You Update the A/P Ledger?

When you update the A/P ledger, the system:

- Processes void payments
- Changes the pay status of vouchers from payment in-process (#) to paid (P)
- Prints a payment register
- Copies payment information from the worktables to the A/P ledger tables:
 - A/P Ledger (F0411)
 - A/P Matching Document (F0413)
 - A/P Matching Document Detail (F0414)
- Clears the worktables, F04571, F04572 and F04573

Figure 31-1 Updating the A/P Ledger and Posting Payments to the G/L

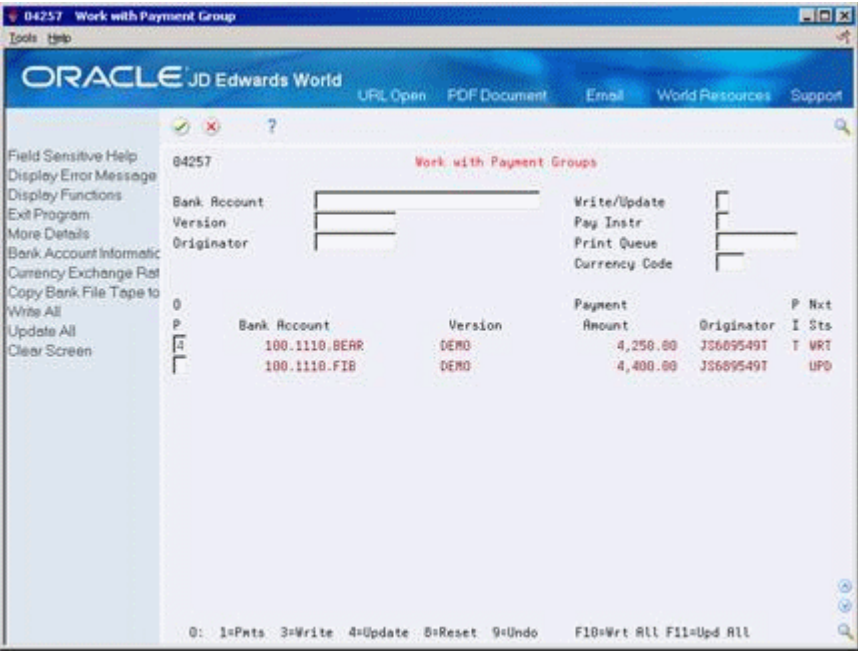

After you update automatic payments to the A/P tables, you must approve the batch and post the general ledger.

You do not need to approve payment batches if:

- The management approval constant is not activated.
- You submit the post automatically from Work with Payment Groups.

All JD Edwards World journal review programs work in the same way. The Automatic Payment Review program displays batches with a batch type of K (automatic payments).

32.3 Posting Automatic Payments

The post program for automatic payments creates payment disbursement entries and offset entries to the general ledger for the payable account. The system typically debits an A/P liability account and credits a cash (or bank) account.

All JD Edwards World post programs post to the G/L in the same way. The post program for automatic payments has the processing option for batch selection set to K (automatic payments). You should not change this.

If you want to post payments automatically, you can change a processing option for Work with Payment Groups to post payments after updating them to the A/P ledger.

You cannot review account ledger information until the post is complete. After you post payments, you can review the accounting distribution information.

33.1 Processing EFT Payments

When you need to remit a payment electronically to a supplier you can use Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) payment method. The process follows the normal payment process. The payment instrument on the voucher will determine whether or not the payment will produce a physical check or use the EFT method where records are written to a file that will be copied to tape and sent to your bank. EFT processing can be used with both the Automatic Payment and Manual Payment process. While there are several ACH formats for EFT payments, JD Edwards World only supports two formats, CTX and PPD.

33.2 Setting Up EFT Payments

This section discusses how to set up EFT payments.

33.2.1 Entering Supplier Master Information

- **Payment Instrument** – You can assign a default payment instrument for suppliers that will be paid via the EFT process. The default payment instrument type for EFT payments in the CTX format is T. The default payment instrument type for EFT payments in the PPD format is V.
- **Bank Accounts by Address (P0030)** – Enter the supplier's external Routing/Transit number and Account number. The Bank Type Code must be V for the Supplier Bank Account or your alternative supplier bank code. See [Section 79.2, "Setting Up Bank Account Cross-References for A/P"](#)
- **Pre-Note Code** – This field is specific to each bank account set up for your supplier. When you add the supplier bank account, the Pre-Note code will default to a P for Pre-Note processing. During the first payment cycle for the supplier, the system will write a physical check and make a pre-note entry to the bank file for confirmation of information. The pre-note code is automatically cleared after the first EFT payment is executed. The system will then process EFT payments for the supplier.

Figure 33–1 Bank Accounts by Address screen

Note: You may bypass the automatic update of the Pre-Note code by setting the Update processing option in Work with Payment Groups (P04257). If the automatic update is bypassed, you will manually update the Pre-Note code when it is needed.

If a change is made to the supplier bank account in Bank Accounts by Address, the pre-note code will default back to a P.

33.2.2 Entering Payment Instrument Defaults (P0417)

The payment instrument designates which AP Payment program will be used to write the payment. For EFT processing different programs are used depending on which ACH format your bank accepts, CTX or PPD. In Payment Instrument Defaults, you must designate the appropriate payment and register program for each payment instrument. See [Section 76.1, "Setting Up Payment Instruments"](#)

- The payment program for the CTX format is P04572T2 and the register program is P04576T.
- The payment program for the PPD format is P04572T1 and the register program is P04576T.
- You can also designate a specific version of each program to be used by accessing the detail area (F4).

- The bank transit number for your company's bank.
- The bank account number for your company's bank.
- Use the exit function to the Bank Account X12 information (F6). This information will be written on the Addendum Record in the bank tape file. (The user's bank will determine the X12 requirements)

33.3 Entering and Processing EFT Payments

This section discusses entering and processing EFT payment.

33.3.1 Processing Automatic Payments

1. Enter vouchers with the appropriate payment instrument.
2. Create Payment Groups (P04570). Review the Electronic Funds Transfer/EDI processing options and set according to your needs. Set the processing option for an override effective date or bank type code to override the default supplier bank account (bank code V).
3. Work With Payment Groups (P04257). Check processing options for Print Options:
 - Verify BACS processing is not activated.

After executing the WRITE function you will see the output in the F04572T file. This is a multi-member flat-file. Once the payment has been written to the bank tape file, the Status of the payment group will be highlighted to indicate that this payment exists in the Bank Tape file.

To confirm the records were written to the bank tape file, from Work with Payment Groups, select Review Payments option. From Review Payment Group – Update, use the Details function (F4) to view the bank tape file the payment was written to and the Member ID for the payment.

Note: If the payment was a pre-noted, the Next Status in Work with Payment Groups will not be highlighted and the Tape File/Member ID will not be populated in Review Payment Groups - Update.

4. Copy Bank Tape File to Tape (P0457). To view output and/or copy the file to tape or diskette:
 - Inquire on by bank, user ID, file ID, Member ID, or any combination. Access the Detail section (F4) for tape information and Member ID if not known.
 - Enter one of the following values in the OP column:
 - 3 – to copy to tape
 - 4 – to copy to diskette
 - 6 – for BACS approval
 - 9 – to delete or cancel.

34.1 Payment Processing Overview

The Accounts Payable system includes two types of international automatic payment processing. They include:

- BACS
- IAT

34.1.1 BACS

The United Kingdom banking system uses the Banks Automated Clearing System (BACS) to transmit money electronically. The Accounts Payable automatic payment processing uses BACS to credit money to a supplier's bank account. The Accounts Receivable system also uses it to collect money from a customer's bank account using the Auto Debit program specifying the UK BACS program (P03575BT).

The features of the BACS automatic payment processing are similar to other types of Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) payments. The BACS payment program (P04572B) produces a file in the format necessary for magnetic tape. Users should contact BACS for the current acceptable methods of sending payment information.

34.1.2 IAT

The International ACH Transaction (IAT) is a Standard Entry Class code for Automated Clearing House (ACH) transactions that identifies international payments. An IAT is an ACH debit or credit entry that is part of a payment transaction originating from or transmitted to an office of a financial agency outside the territorial jurisdiction of the United States. The rule classifies IATs by focusing on the location of the financial agency that handles the payment transaction (movement of funds) and not the location of any other party to the transaction (for example, the originator or receiver). The ACH Network is an EFT system that provides for the interbank clearing of electronic payments for participating depository financial institutions. You can identify an IAT by the Standard Entry Class code - IAT. In addition, the IAT format includes the following elements:

- A unique Company/Batch Header and Entry Detail Record
- Seven mandatory addenda records
- A maximum of five optional addenda records. The corporate originator does not provide the optional addenda records. Financial institutions involved in the transaction may include these at a later time.

A/P programs provide the ability to identify A/P payments as IATs and to create ACH transactions in the IAT format. You can identify IATs via the payment instrument. You can identify the foreign ODFI bank information to support IAT payments which foreign banks fund and foreign RDFI bank information to support IAT payments to foreign banks.

Consider the following questions to determine if you must comply with OFAC obligations and if the IAT rules affect your business:

- Is your company a subsidiary of a multinational company?
- Does your company have foreign subsidiaries?
- Does your company buy or sell to organizations or individuals outside the territorial jurisdiction of the United States?
- Does your company send payroll, pension, or benefit payments via the ACH Network to individuals that have permanent resident addresses outside the territorial jurisdiction of the United States?

If the answer to these questions is yes, consult with your financial institution and refer to NACHA Operating Rules for help determining the affect of the IAT rules and to ensure compliance.

payments via BACS and standard checks from the same Bank Account. This bank account information is the Originating Bank Account on the bank tape.

To change the Bank Address Number, choose Exit to Bank Account Addresses (F8) to access the Bank Account Addresses program (P00302). Additionally, from the Bank Account Addresses screen, you can access the ACH ODFI/RDFI Info Window (P00303) to enter ODFI/RDFI bank information. You use the bank account information in both the Accounts Receivable and Accounts Payable applications.

For security purposes, after the program copies the file, J.D. Edwards World recommends that you delete this file.

After you update payments, you can void unposted and posted payments. When you void payments, the system creates reversing entries.

When you display a payment, the system shows the status of the payment:

- Blank. If there is no status, the payment has not been posted or voided. The system deletes the payment if you void it.
- Posted. If a payment has been posted, you can void it.
- Voided. If a payment has been voided, you cannot void it again.

Optionally, you can void the vouchers that are associated with a payment. When you void vouchers, the system:

- Voids posted vouchers, if there are no other payments against the voucher
- Deletes unposted vouchers

You can:

- Void a payment
- Void a voucher
- Void a batch of payments

35.1.1 What Happens When You Void Payments and Vouchers?

When you void a payment, the system:

- Creates a matching document with a document type of PO (voided payment) in the A/P Matching Document Detail table (F0414). This matching document has a gross amount equal to the void amount and a pay status of P (paid).
- Reopens the original voucher with an open amount and a pay status of A (approved).

When you void a voucher that is associated with a payment, the system:

- Creates an adjustment document with a document type of PE (change to voucher amount) in the A/P Ledger table (F0411). This adjustment document has a gross amount equal to the void amount and a pay status of P (paid).
- Blanks out the gross amount on the original voucher record in the F0411.

When you void posted payments or vouchers, the system reopens the original batch. You must repost the batch to:

- Debit the cash account and credit the A/P liability account for voided payments
- Debit the A/P liability account and credit the G/L distribution account for voided vouchers

35.1.3 Voiding a Batch of Payments

Navigation

From Accounts Payable (G04), enter 27

From A/P Advanced and Technical Operations (G0431), choose A/P Payments Batch - Void/Delete

Using A/P Payments - Batch Delete/Void (P04503), you can delete or void an entire batch of payments.

If there were problems during the printing or processing of payments and you have already updated the payment batch, you can delete or void an entire batch of payments. The A/P Payments - Batch Delete/Void (P04503) program voids or deletes payments based on the payments' post status. If the payment batch is not posted to the G/L, the program deletes the corresponding records from the A/P Matching

Document Header (F0413) and A/P Matching Document Detail (F0414) files. The corresponding batch header is deleted from the Batch Header file (F0011).

If the payment batch has posted to the G/L, the records are processed as voids in the F0413, F0414, and F0011 tables. During the void process, the A/P Matching Document Header file (F0413) records will have the Void G/L Date (VDGJ) updated based on the Void G/L Date processing option set in P04503, the Payment Post Status (ISTP) is updated to blank, and the Payment Amount (PAAP) is cleared. The A/P Matching Document Detail file (F0414) will have new unposted void records created. In the Batch Header file (F0011), the corresponding batch header status is updated with pending or approved status, based on the setting for Management Approval in the A/P Constant file (F0009). You will need to post the void payment transactions to the G/L.

To void a payment batch

From A/P Payments - Void/Delete, P04503.

1. Set the processing options for:
 - Proof or Final mode
 - Batch number to be voided/deleted
 - Void G/L date to be used
 - Print payment detail (optional)
 - Version of the Payment Functional Server to be called (optional)

Note: There is no recovery from Final mode. It is recommended to run the Batch Void/Delete in proof mode choosing to print payment detail to confirm the desired results.

It is highly recommended that you print the payment detail if you are deleting an entire batch. There will be no audit trail other than the report for deleted transactions.

36.1 About Positive Pay Processing

Managing check fraud risk and reducing exposure to fraud is increasingly important to today's finance managers. Financial institutions have a variety of Positive Pay file formats. The JD Edwards World Positive Pay file is a generic file that should meet basic requirements for financial institutions. The file contains information such as payment number, payment date, payment amount, payee and other pertinent information. When a payment is presented to your bank, the bank reviews your Positive Pay transmissions to see if the payment is valid. A payment will only be honored if the Positive Pay transmission matches the payment details.

36.2 Building the Positive Pay Work File

The Positive Pay Workfile Build (P04585) will create records in the Positive Pay Workfile (F0458). The DREAM Writer is based on the A/P Matching Document Header file (F0413) and uses the Data Selection to determine which records to update to the Positive Pay Workfile. For example, you may want to select records for a particular bank account or range of payment numbers.

The information in the F0458 will be updated based on information from the A/P Matching Document Header file and the Bank Transit Number Master File (F0030). These records will be written as unprocessed by having both the Generic Flag (GFL1) and Member ID (MID) set to blank. The Generic Flag (GLF1) represents whether the

record has been processed to the AP Bank tape file or not. The Member ID represents the Bank Tape Member ID which will link the F0458 record to the record created in the AP Bank Tape File (F04581).

The Positive Pay Workfile Build will determine whether a record will be written or updated to the F0458 file. The following criteria will be used to process records to the F0458.

- If payment is not in F0458, write a new record to the F0458.
- If a new payment and it is not voided, write a new record to the F0458.
- If payment record has been updated in the F0413 and a corresponding record does exist in the F0458 but the record has not been processed, then the existing record is deleted and rewritten to the F0458.
- If payment is in the F0458 and has been updated as processed, the record is skipped and that record will not be updated.
- If payment has been voided and exists in the F0458 but has not been updated as processed, then delete the record from the F0458.
- If payment has been voided and exists in the F0458 and has already been updated as processed, then skip the record in the F0458.

36.3 Creating the Positive Pay Bank File

P04586 will read the work file for unprocessed records and will create the F04581/specific member with the data for the bank and update the Positive Pay Workfile (F0458) detail records as having been sent (GFL1 = 1). The Positive Pay Workfile detail record will also be updated with the new member ID. A report will be produced displaying the data in the file and the newly created F04581 member will appear in the heading.

Set the processing option according to your needs and to enter bank tape information.

36.4 Copying the Tape File to Tape

The tape files created on disk are maintained in the A/P Payments Tape file (F04581). All tapes on disk may be reviewed and copied to magnetic tape or diskette through the Copy to Tape program (P0457).

Once the specific member ID is located, open the Detail area (F4) to make sure all tape parameters have been updated properly. Once you are ready to process the member to tape, use the Copy option (3) next to the member record. Once the copy is successful, use the Delete option (9) to delete this member and prevent duplicate processing.

36.5 Purging Processed Positive Pay Information

Version ZJDE0045 of the P00PURGE program has been established to allow users to purge processed positive pay member records from the work file F0458. The DREAM

Writer data selection has been set up to purge only processed items. You may want to further narrow the purge options to Bank Transit number and/or Bank Account.

Processing options are provided to store the purged records on disk in a new physical file in a special purge library, and/or reorganize the file following the purge process.

If you need to issue a payment immediately, you do not need to wait for your next automatic payment cycle. You can enter a manual payment. Processing payments manually includes:

- Working with manual payments
- Approving and posting manual payments

37.2.1 What Are the Types of Manual Payments?

You can enter manual payments:

- For an existing voucher
- Without an existing voucher, but with full voucher information (standard method)
- Without an existing voucher, but with abbreviated voucher information (speed method)

When you need to remit a payment to a supplier immediately, you can use the manual payment processing, bypassing the automatic payment process.

When you work with manual payments, be aware the action code and search type security may affect your ability to inquire upon, add, or change customer/supplier information. You must have the appropriate combination of action code/search type security to enter manual payments.

The entry programs for manual payments create voucher and payment information in the following A/P ledger tables:

- A/P Ledger (F0411) for voucher information.
- A/P Matching Document (F0413) for summarized payment information.
- A/P Matching Document Detail (F0414) for detailed payment information.
- Account Ledger (F0911) for general ledger account information.

38.2 Entering Manual Payments for Existing Vouchers

To create a manual payment for a voucher that you have already entered, enter a manual payment with voucher match. You choose whether to print the payment. If you don't print it, you will prepare it manually.

When you create manual payments for an existing voucher, you:

- Approve the voucher for payment
- Enter payment information

The system creates a payment (PN), updates the pay status of the voucher, and reduces the open amount of the voucher. The payment batch type is M.

To approve the voucher for payment

The system displays only approved vouchers on Payment With Voucher Match.

You can use this report for payments created from the automatic payment process by changing the Batch Type to K in the data selection.

39.3 Posting Manual Payments

This DREAM Writer program creates payment disbursement entries and offset entries to the general ledger for the payable account. The system typically debits an A/P liability account and credits a cash (or bank) account.

All JD Edwards World post programs work in the same way. There is only one post program for both types of manual payments. It has the processing option for batch selection set to M (manual payments), which selects:

- Payments With Matching Vouchers (batch type M)
- Payments Without Matching Vouchers (batch type W)

You should not change the batch selection in this processing option.

This DREAM Writer program creates payment disbursement entries and offset entries to the general ledger for the payable account.

40.1 Voiding Manual Payments

Navigation

From **Accounts Payable (G04)**, choose **Manual Payment Processing**

From **Manual Payment Processing (G0412)**, choose **Void Payment Entry**

You can void posted or unposted payments. Optionally, you can choose to void the vouchers associated with a payment. The process for voiding manual payments is the same as that for voiding automatic payments.

40.1.1 What You Should Know

- Voiding a posted payment creates a separate void record (PO) for the payment, whereas voiding an unposted payment will delete the payment record from the payment files entirely.
- When a posted payment has been voided, the payment batch must be posted again to create the reversing entries in the general ledger file, F0911.
- When voiding a payment, if the original G/L date for the payment is in a prior period, you may need to change the G/L date to the current date in order to avoid re-opening the prior period in order to post the void.
- You may choose to void vouchers at the same time as voiding the payment.
- If you have created and posted a manual payment and voucher from Payment without Voucher Match (P04106) voiding only the payment will create an integrity issue with the batch in regard to A/P to G/L by Batch (P04701). With W type batches the integrity is expecting the voucher and the payment to be in the same batch. When the payment has been voided and the voucher repaid with a new payment, the voucher will still be associated with the original W type batch but the payment will be in a separate, M type batch.
- If the payment is not posted the payment records will be deleted from the payment files (F0413/F0414). If the associated voucher(s) is not posted, the voucher record will be deleted from the AP Ledger (F0411).
- You can create a void payment for unposted manual checks. A processing option in both Manual Payment Programs (P04102 and P04106) can prevent deletion of an unposted manual check, which requires you to use the Void Payment program.

You can specify through the A/P Payment Functional server (XT0413) if you want to document the deleted payment (treat it like a void) or continue with the delete.

41.1 About Payables and Receivables Netting

If you have customers who are also your suppliers, you can use the A/P Standalone Netting program (P03455) to quickly determine your net position and offset the open Accounts Receivable and Accounts Payable transactions. When you evaluate your net position, you calculate the net amount due from or due to another organization. This allows you and the other organization to mutually resolve your open transactions with a single payment. Using the Accounts Payables and Accounts Receivables Netting process, you can quickly process:

- Invoices by using them to offset what you owe your supplier.
- Payments to your suppliers that you can adjust, by subtracting what is due from them.

When you perform the netting process, the system closes transactions in one system and creates a corresponding original document in the other system for the negative amount.

For example, if you owe your supplier/customer 1,000 and your supplier/customer owes you 700, you can use the netting process to generate a debit memo in the Accounts Payable system for -700, and create a receipt document for 700 that closes the invoice in the Accounts Receivable system. When you process payments for the supplier, the system generates one payment for 300.

Receivables and payables netting consists of:

- Netting payables and receivables
- Printing netting reports

42.1 Understanding the Netting Program

You use the A/P Standalone Netting program (P03455) to create net transactions that are from the Accounts Receivable system in the Accounts Payable system that you use to net for payables. You can create net transactions prior to making payments or at the time of payment.

42.1.1 Transaction Details

When you net open vouchers against open invoices, depending on which net amount is greater (payables or receivables), the system generates two documents:

- An original document, type NO, for each transaction that it closes. This document represents the open amount that the system uses to offset the greater due to/from amount from the customer/supplier.
- A matching document, type NM. This document represents the transaction the system closes on the side of the net position with the least due to/from amount.

If the voucher amount (due to the customer/supplier) is greater than the invoice amount (due from the customer/supplier), the system:

- Closes each of the invoices you choose
- Creates a matching document type of NM
- Generates an original document, type NO, in the A/P system to offset the open voucher amounts

The system assigns the NO and NM transactions the same document number so that an audit trail exists between the documents in the two systems. The system also assigns the netting documents the next invoice number from the Next Numbers program for Accounts Receivable (system code 03).

The following example illustrates how the system generates the net documents when the amount of open vouchers is greater than the amount of open invoices.

Transactions before netting:

In this example, you owe your supplier the net amount of 975.

42.1.2 Features

The A/P Standalone Netting program (P03455) includes several features that can assist you in the netting process.

Displaying Transactions, System Totals, Selected Totals, and Net Amounts

There are two methods to locate transactions in P03455. You can:

- Complete the fields in the header portion of the screen, such as Customer/Supplier, Company, and Due Date, to retrieve vouchers and invoices that meet your criteria.
- Choose Supplier Ledger Inquiry (A/P) (F15) or Customer Ledger Inquiry (A/R) (F16) to locate and retrieve transactions. On Supplier Ledger Inquiry or Customer Ledger Inquiry, enter 4 in the Option field and click Enter next to the records you want to include in the netting process. The program replaces the 4 with an * indicating you have chosen these records for netting. Exit (F3) to display these records in P03455 and continue the netting process.

The system provides a total for A/P, A/R, and their net amount.

The system always derives the net amount by subtracting the A/R amount from the A/P amount so you can quickly determine whether you are netting for receivables or payables and which type of program to use. Use the Use A/R or A/P Netting processing option to choose the type of program you want to run.

- If the net amount is negative, you are netting for receivables and must use A/R Stand-Alone Netting.
- If the net amount is positive, you are netting for payables and must use A/P Stand-Alone netting.

In the following example, the Net Total field is 975, which indicates that you are netting for payables if you choose to net all of the transactions that display.

42.1.2.1 What-If Recalculations for Select Transactions

If you do not want to net all of the transactions that display, you can choose individual transactions on which to perform what-if recalculations. When you enter 4 in the Option field next to the transactions and choose What-If Recalculations (F4), the program recalculates the totals based on the transactions you choose and validates that you are using the correct version of the program.

42.1.2.2 Toggle Between A/R & A/P Netting

If you do not have the Netting processing option set to launch the type of netting program that you intend to use (A/P or A/R) or if you attempt to use the wrong type of program to perform the netting process, the system displays the Invalid Netting Amount error message, and does not create the net transactions. You can choose A/R & A/P Netting Toggle (F10) to access the correct program. The program then displays **Mode Alert** and changes the program name to indicate the correct program for the netting process.

42.1.2.3 Subfile Display

The program displays the message ** Last Record ** after the last voucher or invoice record for the customer/supplier. You can continue to scroll through the vouchers in the upper part of the subfile detail area using Page Down. To scroll through the invoices in the lower part of the subfile detail area, place your cursor in the Option field next to an invoice and then Page Down.

You can toggle the screen to review only the voucher or invoice transactions. Choose:

- Full A/P Subfile Screen (F11) to display only vouchers

- Full A/R Subfile Screen (F12) to display only invoices

To return to the previous screen, choose Exit (F3), Full A/P Subfile Screen (F11), or Full A/R Subfile Screen (F12) again. You must return to the view that includes both vouchers and invoices before you can toggle to another full screen.

42.1.2.4 Changing the G/L Date

The program uses today's date as the G/L date. To net transactions using a different G/L date than today's date, you must first enter a date in the G/L Date field and then locate the customer/supplier transactions. You cannot change the G/L date after you locate the transactions because the system validates the G/L date you enter against the period number for the company you enter or Company 00000, as the default, to determine whether PBCO, PACO, or WACO messages apply.

42.1.3 Multicurrency

After you activate multicurrency for your system, the system can net transactions only when:

- The base currency code for the company that you enter in the transactions is the same for both the vouchers and invoices that you want to net.

For example, if you enter an invoice in USD for a company with a currency code of CAD, you cannot net this transaction against a voucher in USD for a company with a currency code of CHL.

- The transactions must have the same transaction currency.

If you enter an invoice in Canadian dollars for a company with a currency code of USD, you can only net it against a voucher in Canadian dollars for a company with a currency code of USD.

The system displays only the transactions that conform to the currency rules in the A/P Standalone Netting program (P03455).

42.2 Determining Liabilities

When you perform the netting process, you net for either receivables or for payables depending on where the liabilities exist. You can determine liabilities by:

- Printing the Receivables/Payables Netting report (P03450). This report prints only those customers/suppliers with open invoices and vouchers available to net. If this report includes a customer/supplier that has a potential A/P offset, the total amount of vouchers to pay exceeds the total amount of invoices to receive, you are netting for payables. If this report includes a customer/supplier that has a potential A/R offset, the total amount of invoices to receive exceeds the total amount of vouchers to pay, you are netting for receivables.
- Running the A/R or A/P Stand-Alone Netting program (P03455). When you locate a supplier/customer, the system displays the totals for A/P, A/R and their net. You can also choose to obtain totals for specific records. If the system displays a net total that is a positive number, you are netting for payables. If the system displays a negative total, you are netting for receivables.
- Printing the Netting - Aging Report (P03466). This report includes aging information as well as customers/suppliers who have open balances in both systems. Also, the Netting - Aging Report requires that you build netting workfiles to perform the aging function. See [Section 43.2, "Creating the A/R and A/P Netting Report Workfile Table"](#) for more information.

See [Chapter 43, "Print Netting Reports"](#) for more information about the reports.

42.2.1 Before You Begin

- Designate one address book number as the customer/supplier record. The system cannot net vouchers and invoices from more than one address book record. You can assign a unique Search Type to this record, if necessary, to distinguish it as a netting address book record.
- Set the AR/AP Netting field to Y on the Address Book Control Revisions screen if you want to apply netting to specific address book records. You access this screen from the Address Book Revisions program (P01051) by choosing Address Book Control Revisions (F13). See [Chapter 3, "Enter Suppliers"](#).
- Run Update AR from Address Book (P03802) to update the AR/AP Netting Indicator field (RPAT2) with the value in the address book record, if necessary. When you enter invoices, the system updates the AR/AP Netting Indicator field (RPAT2) in the Accounts Receivable Ledger (F0311) invoice records according to the value you enter in the AR/AP Netting field in the Address Book system. If invoices exist prior to you setting this field or if you want to change the setting, you must run this program.
- Set the Override Address Book Authority processing option in the AP/AR Netting program (P03455) to override the system validating the value in AR/AP Netting Indicator field (RPAT2), if necessary.
- Set up the AAI for the netting suspense account NC for each company that you use to enter netting transactions. NC specifies the distribution account that the system uses when it generates the NO document and the G/L bank account on the receipt for the NM document. The system does not use a default NC for company 00000. See [Section 67.1, "About AAIs for A/P"](#)
- Set the processing options for the A/P Standalone Netting program (P03455).

42.2.2 Netting the Transactions

There are two methods you can use to net transactions. They include:

- Netting transactions in stand-alone mode
- Netting transactions during payment processing

42.2.3 Netting Transactions in Stand-Alone Mode

Typically, you use this method to net for payables when you are not ready to make payments. You net transactions in stand-alone mode using the A/P Standalone Netting program (P03455), which you access directly from a menu.

Netting transactions in stand-alone mode includes the following tasks:

- Create net transactions
- Review net transactions
- Delete unposted net transactions
- Post net transactions
- Process payments for net payables transactions

42.2.4 What You Should Know About

The system creates the NO/NM netting transactions and clears the screen.

42.2.5 Processing Options

 - Choose Supplier Ledger Inquiry (A/P) (F15)
 - Choose Customer Ledger Inquiry (A/R) (F16)
2. On Supplier Ledger Inquiry or Customer Ledger Inquiry, review the transactions.

To delete unposted net transactions

You can delete net transactions only if you did not post the transactions. If you did post the net transactions, you must continue the payment process and then void the payment to reverse the net transactions.

1. On A/P Stand-Alone Netting, to locate transactions, complete either of the following fields and click Inquire:
 - Cust/Supplier
 - Parent Number
2. To narrow your search, complete the following optional fields:
 - Company
 - Due Date
 - Currency Code
3. Enter 9 in the Option field next to the NO netting documents that you want to delete.
4. Click Change.

To post net transactions

There are three methods to post net transactions. They include:

- Set the Automatic Posting processing option for P03455 to automatically post the net transactions.
- Use the A/P Netting Post program (P03853) on the Manual Payment Processing menu (G0412) to post both A/P and A/R net transactions simultaneously. You must enter both batch numbers. Ensure you leave the A/P Netting processing option blank.
- Use the Post program (P09800) to post the A/R and A/P batches separately.

The system creates the following entries in the Account Ledger table (F0911) when you post the original netting documents:

- An AE document to the A/P and A/R trade accounts. The value in the Offset Method field in the A/R and A/P constants determines whether the system generates one AE for the batch of transactions or one AE for each document.
- An NM document for each receipt to the account you specify in AAI item NC.
- An NO document for each original voucher to the account you specify in AAI item NC.

Note: You cannot delete posted net transactions. You must include them in a payment/receipt process, void the payment/receipt and then void the net transactions.

When you net transactions, the system uses the account in the AAI item NC as the expense distribution account for the NO transaction that it creates for the voucher. The system generates an offset to the same account for the Account Ledger table (F0911) NM transaction that it creates for the net matching document that close the invoices.

To process payments for net payables transactions

There are two methods to process payments for net payables transactions. They include:

- Process A/P payments automatically. See [Chapter 25, "Overview to Automatic Payment Processing"](#) for more information.

Note: If you use automatic payment processing, verify that the Data Selection and Processing Options for Create Payment Groups (P04570) are not set up to exclude processing amounts less than zero.

- Use the Payment with Voucher Match program (P04102).

The system creates the PK/PN matching document for each NO voucher that is paid.

When you post payments for net transactions, the system creates the standard G/L bank account and trade account (offset) entries. The system does not generate entries to the netting account.

42.2.6 Netting Transactions during Payment Processing

You can create net transactions during the payment process. When you choose to create net transactions during the payment process, you must be aware of the following:

- The system automatically posts the net transactions even if you leave the Automatic Posting processing option in the A/P Stand-Alone Netting program blank.
- If you make a mistake during the netting process, you must continue with the payment process. After the program generates the payment, you must post the batch, void the payment, and then void the net transactions.

Netting transactions during payment processing includes the following tasks:

- Create net transactions using payment with voucher match
- Void payments and void net transactions

To create net transactions using payment with voucher match

Navigation

From Accounts Payable (G04), choose Manual Payment Processing

From Manual Payment Processing (G0412), choose Payment with Voucher Match

If you display the supplier vouchers before you choose A/R A/P Netting (F23), the system overwrites the vouchers that display with the vouchers and invoices you choose from the netting application. You cannot retrieve and display vouchers, and then append them with invoices from the netting application.

After you create net transactions, you must complete the payment entry process and post the payment.

1. On Payment with Voucher Match, complete the following fields:

- Supplier Number
- G/L Bank
- Currency Code (optional)
- Payment G/L Date

- On Manual Payments with Voucher Match, enter the net amount due the supplier in the Payment Amount field and click Enter.

The program creates the NO and NM netting documents. The program also posts the batch of net transactions when you exit this program, even if you leave the Automatic Posting processing option in the A/P Stand-Alone Netting program blank.

42.2.7 Voiding Payments and Voiding Net Transactions

You can void payments that include net transactions using the Void Payment Entry program (P04103). The program allows you to restore the open amount of the net transactions or void them. The system performs the following when you void payments:

- When you void the payment and do not void the net transactions, the system restores the open amount to the original NO netting documents.
- When you void the payment and void net transactions, the system
 - Generates the void payment record (PO)
 - Creates matching records for the NO and NM documents (PE and RO respectively)
 - Opens the original invoices and voucher transactions.

If the system issues date warnings for the void or warnings and errors for vouchers that you are trying to delete, it will not void the items until you click Enter for each warning or correct the errors

You cannot void unposted paid net transactions.

You must post the voided payment, voucher, and receipt batches.

To void payments and void net transactions

43.1 Printing Netting Reports

When you do business with another organization as both a customer and a supplier, you can print netting reports that show whether your company owes or is owed money.

These reports do not make adjustments to the account ledgers. The reports only list unusual conditions, such as:

- The A/R balance is a credit.
- The A/P balance is a debit.
- The customer or supplier has both A/R and A/P balances.

You can use this information to net the receivable and payable balances for eligible organizations.

Before you can print the Netting - Aging Report, you must create the work file it uses. When you do this, the system rebuilds the A/R and A/P Netting Workfile table (F03465) based on current information in the A/R Ledger and A/P Ledger tables.

You print the Netting - Aging report when you want the system to age balances. This report lists transactions by customer and supplier aged by currency type.

This report lists information from the A/R and A/P Netting Workfile table (F03465).

When you print this report, the system:

- Totals the open A/R and open A/P details for each account.
- Ages the balances for each account as determined by the processing options.

44.2 About A/P Draft Processing

A draft is a promise to pay a debt. Drafts are used in various countries around the world. Draft processing is a variation of automatic payment processing.

Because of the legal nature of the underlying liabilities, the steps for draft processing differ slightly from the steps for automatic payment processing. The tasks that have a different result in draft processing are:

- Writing payments
- Updating the A/P ledger

Draft processing also consists of the following additional tasks:

- Selecting paid drafts
- Posting outstanding A/P drafts

44.2.1 Set Up Draft Processing

44.2.1.1 Automatic Accounting Instructions:

Set up AAI item PD for the drafts payable account which the system uses as a tracking account until the draft is paid. You can also set up AAI item PDx, where x equals the user defined code for payment instrument, for each payment instrument. You may set up company-specific AAI's or use Company 00000 as a default.

All other AAIs used are based on general voucher and payment processing.

44.2.1.2 User Defined Codes:

There are 3 User defined Codes (UDCs) required for draft processing:

44.2.2 How Does Draft Processing Differ from Automatic Payment Processing?

The following describes the steps for draft processing that are different from automatic payment processing or that have a different result.

44.2.2.1 Writing Payments

When you write payments, the system creates and prints drafts.

44.2.2.2 Updating the A/P Ledger

When you update payments to the A/P ledger, the system:

- Creates a payment batch. When the batch is posted, the journal entries debit the A/P trade account and credit the drafts payable account. The system uses AAI item PDx to identify the G/L account to use for drafts payable.
- Creates an original document record in the A/P Ledger, F0411, with a document type of P1 and a pay status of D (draft created). This document is the draft, which replaces the original voucher.
- Creates a matching document record in the A/P Ledger with a document type of P1. This matching document closes the voucher.
- Changes the pay status of the voucher from # (payment in-process) to P (paid).
- Creates a P1 record in the A/P Matching Document Summary file, F0413, for the amount of the draft.
- Creates P1/PV record(s) for each voucher paid by the draft in the A/P Matching Documents Detail file, F0414.

44.2.2.3 Selecting Paid Drafts

When you know a draft has been paid, you select it. This closes the draft and allows you to post it. This step has no equivalent in the automatic payment process.

44.2.2.4 Posting Outstanding A/P Drafts

After a draft has been paid, you post it to the general ledger. The system selects drafts with a pay status of draft selected, then generates and posts journal entries that debit drafts payable and credit the payables bank account. It also changes the pay status of the draft to paid and generates a post report. This step has no equivalent in the automatic payment process.

44.2.3 Example: Paying Drafts

The following chart shows how the system uses the document type and document number information to group the entries related to the original voucher. The table shows one draft replacing several vouchers. Each row represents a new record in the accounts payable tables.

After you select paid drafts, you post them to the general ledger. This updates the general ledger with the final payment information.

Post Outstanding Drafts is a DREAM Writer program that selects all drafts with a pay status of draft selected (#). It uses the AAI item PDx to generate and post journal entries that debit the drafts payable account and credit the payables bank account. It also changes the pay status of the draft to Paid and generates a posting report. The journal entries are created with a batch type G and the batch number will not be directly associated to the Accounts Payable batch where the draft was created.

Voiding drafts utilizes the same process as voiding standard payments. Void Payment Entry (P04103) will be used to void a draft and should be selected from any one of the payment menus.

If the system issues date warnings for the void or warnings and errors for vouchers that you are trying to delete, it will not void the items until you click Enter for each warning or correct the errors.

If the draft is updated and posted to the bank account, the system will update and create the following documents for the draft void:

- A matching document type PE with pay status P and posted code D. The AP Detail File (F0411) will display the original P1 record with a zero amount, and will show P1 with matching document type PE for the void with the amounts in reverse of the original entry. If the voucher is not voided at the same time, the original voucher will appear as open for payment again.
- A matching document type PO in the AP Matching Detail file (F0414) for the void payment. The AP Match Detail File (F0414) will have the PO document created for the void of the P1. The AP Matching file (F0413) will have the payment amount set to zero and the void GL date populated. The original P1 detail record in the AP Match Detail File will remain unchanged

Approve and post the voided payment batch. The system will create a debit to the bank account and credit to the accounts payable trade account.

If the draft is not updated and posted to the bank account, the system will update and create the following documents for the draft void:

- System will delete the P1 record located in the AP Detail File (F0411). If the voucher is not voided at the same time, the original voucher will appear as open for payment, again.
- System will also create PO document type in the AP Matching Detail file (F0414) for the void payment. The AP Matching file (F0413) will have the payment amount set to zero and the void GL date populated. The AP Match Detail File (F0414) will have the PO document created for the void of the P1. The original P1 detail record in the AP Match Detail File will remain unchanged.

Approve and post the void. The system will create a debit to drafts payable and credit to accounts payable trade.

47.2 About Supplier Ledger and Payment Information

When you want to audit a supplier's transaction history, you can review the supplier's ledger and payment information.

Supplier ledger and payment information consists of:

- Reviewing supplier ledger information
- Reviewing payment information

At different times during the A/P process, you might need to view voucher and payment information for a specific supplier. To do this, review the supplier ledger for information such as:

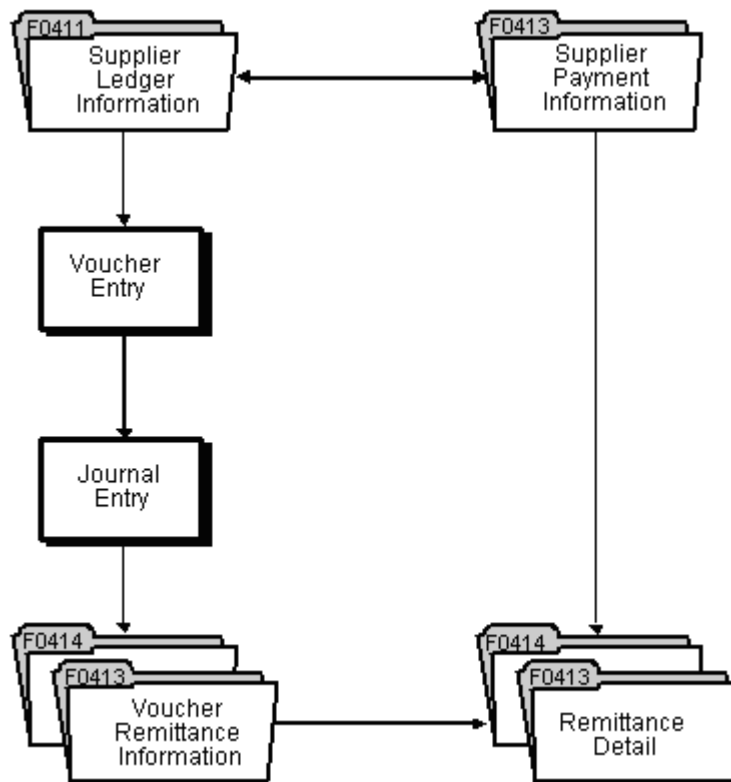
- Open amounts remaining on a voucher
- Invoice, account, and purchase order information
- Pay status or posted code for a voucher
- Voucher detail and associated journal entry information
- Payment history

You might need to view transaction history for a supplier (payee), payment number, or bank account. To do this, review the supplier's payment information, such as:

- Payment detail and associated journal entry information
- Remittance information
- A/P ledger information

The following graphic shows how you view supplier ledger information in conjunction with payment information.

When you work with supplier information, be aware the action code and search type security may affect your ability to inquire upon, add, or change customer/supplier information. You must have the appropriate combination of action code/search type security to work with Supplier Ledger information.

- The A/R balance is a credit.
- The A/P balance is a debit.

- The customer/supplier has both A/R and A/P balances.

When you print this report, the system:

1. Totals the open A/R and open A/P balances for each account.
2. Compares the two sums.

As part of your internal balancing procedures, you need to verify that your data is correct.

This task consists of:

- Processing A/P integrity reports
- Printing A/P "as of" reports

53.2.1 Why Should You Run Periodic Reports?

Both of the following types of periodic reports help identify balancing problems and data inconsistencies between your accounts payable and general ledgers.

Run integrity reports to:

- Ensure that your A/P and general ledgers remain in balance
- Identify any problems and inconsistencies in a timely and efficient manner

Run "as of" reports to:

- View summary or detail information about your accounts payable
- Compare totals on the "As of" report to your A/P trade account balance in the general ledger to identify any balancing problems

54.1 Processing A/P Integrity Reports

Navigation

From **Accounts Payable (G04)**, choose **Periodic Processes**

From **Periodic Processes (G0421)**, choose an option under the **A/P Integrity Reports** heading

Integrity reports help identify any problems and inconsistencies with your data so that you can resolve them and ensure that your JD Edwards World systems remain in balance. Use these reports to verify that your A/P data matches your G/L data and that your A/P payments have the correct pay status.

Processing A/P integrity reports consists of:

- Running A/P Integrity Reports
- Correcting A/P Out-of-Balance Conditions

You should:

- Submit one integrity report at a time
- Run these reports when other users are not accessing the system, to ensure accuracy

54.2 Running A/P Integrity Reports

To identify potential balancing problems and data inconsistencies, run A/P integrity reports. This task consists of:

- Running A/P Original Document to G/L by Batch
- Running A/P Payments to G/L by Batch
- Running A/P to G/L by Offset Account

- Running A/P Payment Header to Detail

Run these integrity reports:

- Weekly, so you do not risk compromising your accounting data
- As-needed during the conversion process at a new software installation site or during an initial learning period, so you can correct any errors promptly

When balancing to the general ledger, you can include both posted and unposted transactions.

54.2.1 What You Should Know About

| Topic | Description |
|----------------------|---|
| "As of" capabilities | Integrity reports do not have "as of" capabilities. That is, you cannot run the reports as of a certain date, such as the last day of the month, to ensure that your data was in balance at that time. You can run the report only as of the current day. |

54.2.2 Running A/P Original Document to G/L by Batch (P04701)

A/P Original Document to G/L by Batch verifies that each batch of A/P Ledger (F0411) gross amounts is in balance with the corresponding batch of Account Ledger (F0911) amounts. It also checks for an invalid pay status on every pay item.

This report performs two types of integrity tests:

- Balance Test
- Pay Status Test

54.2.2.1 Balance Test

This test performs the following for each batch:

- Compares the gross amount in the A/P Ledger table (F0411) to the Account Ledger table (F0911) G/L distribution amounts. These amounts should be equal.
- Compares the gross amount in the A/P Ledger table (F0411) to the Account Ledger table (F0911) G/L offset amounts. These amounts should net to zero.

If the tests are in balance, the integrity report is blank. If they are not, the batch totals appear on the integrity report.

When the system totals gross amounts, it does not add gain/loss transactions to the gross voucher amounts. It also does not add the discount taken or subtract the discount lost from the gross amount for the associated payment transaction.

The system adds the VAT to the voucher gross amount and subtracts the amount of use tax on transactions. It also adds the VAT from unposted PE (matching document type) transactions for any change to the gross amount.

54.2.2.2 Pay Status Test

This test checks the pay status on every pay item in a batch. When documents are listed in the 'Invalid Pay Status' column, it means one of two conditions have been met:

- The document has a pay status of A and has no open amount or
- The document has a pay status of P and has an open amount.

If a voucher does not have an open amount, the pay status should be P (Paid). If a voucher has an open amount, the pay status should not be a P (Paid). If there are any discrepancies, the batch number, document number, document type, pay item and pay status prints on the integrity report.

54.3 Running A/P Payments to G/L by Batch (P04702)

This section discusses how to run reports.

54.3.1 Manual Payments With Match and Automatic Payments

The A/P Payments to G/L by Batch report, P04702, verifies that each batch of A/P Matching Document Detail (F0414) is in balance with the corresponding Account Ledger (F0911) Distribution and Automatic Offset amounts for batch types K and M.

This test performs the following for each batch:

- Compares the payment amount in the A/P Matching Document detail table (F0414) to the Account Ledger table (F0911) Automatic Offset amounts. These amounts should net to zero.
- Compares the payment amount in the A/P Matching Document detail table (F0414) to the Account Ledger table (F0911) Distribution amounts. These amounts should equal.

If all conditions are met, the batch will not appear on the report. If there is a difference, the batch will appear on the report displaying the variance.

Note: When the system totals the amounts, it ignores gain/loss transactions because there are no offset accounts in the G/L.

54.3.2 Manual Payments Without Match

For Manual Payments Without Match (type W) batches the integrity checks the A/P Detail Ledger table (F0411) gross amount to the A/P Matching Document Detail table

(F0414) payment amount, and the Account Ledger (F0911) Distribution and Automatic Offset amount because the vouchers are created at the same time as the check record.

This test performs the following for each batch:

- Compares the Account Ledger table (F0911) Distribution amount and Automatic Offset amount. These amounts should net to zero.
- Compares the voucher amount in the A/P Detail Ledger table (F0411) to the total voucher amounts in the Account Ledger table (F0911) Distribution amount. These amounts should equal.
- Compares the payment amount in the A/P Matching Document table (F0413) to the Account Ledger table (F0911) Distribution amounts. These amounts should equal.

If all three conditions are met, the batch will not appear on the report. If there is a difference, the batch will appear on the report displaying the variance.

Note: When the system totals the amounts, it ignores gain/loss transactions because there are no offset accounts in the G/L.

54.3.3 Running A/P to G/L by Offset Account (P047001)

This integrity report offers a comparison of posted A/P Ledger tables (F0411, F0414) amounts and the corresponding A/P control offset (Trade) account amounts in the Account Balances table (F0902).

You can set processing options to zero in on only out-of-balance accounts and to select the detail to print. With the option to print ledger detail and to print only ledger records considered out-of-balance (calculated gross does not equal the ledger open amount), you can quickly focus on the documents that might be causing the out-of-balance condition.

The program uses the AAIs for all PC items to determine the offset accounts used for the vouchers entered. Next, it calculates the open balances for the vouchers, sorting by the G/L Offset field, and makes specific adjustments for balancing to the corresponding F0902 A/P trade account. If there is a discrepancy, the account is printed on the report along with the F0411 open voucher balance, the F0902 account balance, and the difference between the two amounts. This ensures that all offsets were posted correctly.

Technically, the program accumulates the total of all the vouchers' gross amounts, subtracts any payments and discount amounts, and makes adjustments for any unposted documents in the F0411 file to arrive at the posted open amount for the

F0411 column on the report. The F0902 A/P trade account total is a calculation of the current fiscal year's beginning balance and the sum of all period entries.

This test performs the following:

- Summarizes the AP ledger (F0411) gross amount field for vouchers where the open amount is not equal to zero for each AAI GL account. The GL class code points to the AP control offset account in the AAIs.
- Compares the GL account balance amount to the corresponding AP ledger amount. The net difference between these amounts should be zero, indicating that the accounts are in balance. If they are not, the difference is printed on the integrity report.
- Prints the sum of any GL class code that cannot be associated with an account in the Account Balances table. This usually occurs if an AAI is missing or if it points to an invalid account.

54.3.4 Processing Option Considerations

The AP to GL by Offset (P047001) processing options can be set to limit printing of accounts to only those that are out of balance, allow printing of detail information from the AP ledger files for those accounts, and will also limit the detail information printed to only those ledger records considered out of balance (calculated gross amount does not equal the ledger open amount). If all processing options are left blank, the program will show summary information for all accounts. If the processing options are populated, the program works as described below:

Processing Option 1 - if the value is 1 the integrity report will only print accounts where the F0411 gross amount of open vouchers and the F0902 are out of balance. If the value is left blank, all accounts associated with the AAI item PC are printed.

Processing Option 2 - works in conjunction with processing option 1. If the value is 1 only the detail will print for an account that is out of balance. If the value is 2 the detail for all accounts will print (this could generate a very large report). If the value is left blank, no detail will print.

Processing Option 2a - if processing option 2 is left blank, this processing option is ignored. If the value is 1 only the detail will print where the F0411 gross, less payments, is NOT equal to the open amount. If the value is left blank, all detail will print.

HINT: For the integrity to show documents where the F0411 gross amount less payments is NOT equal to the open amount, set the processing options as follows:

- Processing Option 1 - blank
- Processing Option 2 - 2
- Processing Option 2a - 1

54.5 Running A/P Payment Header to Detail (P04714)

This integrity identifies any discrepancies or mismatches between the A/P Payment Header file (F0413) and the A/P Payment Detail file (F0414). Mismatches can occur due to incorrect purging of records or other unexpected database issues. If there are discrepancies for the payment information, a report will print displaying the specific Payment ID Number and whether the header or detail is missing for the payment.

This report does two integrity checks:

- Checks records in the Payment Header file (F0413) by payment id for associated records in the Payment Detail file (F0414).
- Checks records in the Payment Detail file by payment id for associated records in the Payment Header file.

55.1 Generating the "As Of" Date Tables

Run the Date File Generation program (P04901) to update your worktables. The system uses the date you specify in the "As Of" Date processing option to select records and creates the following:

- "As Of" A/P Ledger worktable (F0411A), based on the A/P Ledger table (F0411)
- "As Of" A/P Matching Document worktable (F0413A), based on the A/P Matching Document table (F0413)
- "As Of" A/P Matching Document Detail worktable (F0414A), based on the A/P Matching Document Detail table (F0414)

You can use the "As Of" A/P Matching Document and "As Of" A/P Matching Document Detail worktables to produce custom reports that include payment information as of a specific date.

The "As Of" Processing allows you to rebuild the F0411A by company. Create a different version of P04901 for each company that you want to build different "As Of" date tables. You can rebuild using a different "As Of" date for each company by setting the processing option for partial build. The system expects if the processing option is set to partial build, the company value in the data selection must have *VALUE or *RANGE. Input the correct company number(s) on the Value screen, even if you are only selecting one company.

Note: If more than 45 companies are needed for selection, simply add additional company selections. You can select up to 225 companies for the partial build, which is five separate Data Selection records separated with an OR statement.

The records are all included in the same F0411A file. If you choose to only include records for companies 00001 and 00050, existing records for those two companies will be deleted and the data will be rebuilt. The "As Of" date on each record is stored in the Date Updated (RPUPMJ) field. The data sequence on the reports sorts by the Date Updated (RPUPMJ) first.

55.1.1 What Happens When You Generate the Date Table?

The Date File Generation program selects vouchers and matching documents with a G/L date less than (before) or equal to the date you specify in the processing options. The program:

- Determines the open amount of the voucher based on the voucher's gross amount, adjustments and payment transactions processed on or before the "As Of" date.
- Writes the open amount to the "As Of" A/P Ledger worktable after all transactions for a voucher have been processed.
- Business Unit security will be used in this process. Only records with those Business Units allowed for the user will be updated in the process.

55.1.2 Before You Begin

- Determine if you will include paid items in the worktable. Including paid items increases the processing time significantly.
- Schedule this procedure after business hours to ensure adequate processing time.

55.1.3 What You Should Know About

The Pay Status code for your F0411A records will automatically be set to a P if there is no open amount existing in your Accounts Payable Ledger (F0411) record at the point in time of the "As Of" date. An A will default if an open amount exists in your F0411 record (A = Approved, P = Paid). No other Pay Status codes will be written to the F0411A file. For example, if the F0411 record has an open amount and pay status of H, the record will be written to the F0411A with a pay status of A.

This as of build supports up to 999 pay items per document.

55.2 Reviewing A/P "As Of" Information

To review information in your A/P ledger as of a specific date, run the following "as of" reports:

- Open A/P Detail
- Open A/P Summary

These DREAM Writer reports are excellent problem-solving tools. For example, you can use the Open A/P Detail report to compare the A/P period end balance to the general ledger A/P trade account balance.

These reports include information as of the date you specify when you run the generation program. They are versions of the Open A/P Detail and Open A/P Summary reports and are based on a join logical table (F0411AJC) of the Address Book Master table (F0101) and the A/P Ledger "As Of" worktable (F0411A).

55.2.1 Before You Begin

- Verify the Based on File field on DREAM Writer Additional Parameters is set to F0411AJC
- Verify that the processing option for "As Of" Processing is set in the version of the Open AP Report you are running.

56.2 About 1099s

The JD Edwards World Accounts Payable system helps you produce 1099s, an income tax reporting form required by the U.S. federal government for many types of payments. Federal regulations require that you annually report payments made to suppliers using 1099 forms. You send 1099s to suppliers of goods and services who are not corporate entities, such as individuals and partnerships.

You can choose to produce 1099s using one of the following two methods:

- General Ledger (G/L) method
- A/P Ledger method

The method you choose depends on amount of data in the Account Ledger table (F0911).

The 1099 process requires you to complete the following tasks:

This section describes the first three tasks. These tasks, plus the fourth task, producing 1099s, are described in more detail in the United States 1099 Year-End Processing Guide. JD Edwards World publishes this guide at the end of every calendar year. This guide includes specific information for the reporting year and detailed instructions for each 1099 program. You can access and download the guide from JD Edwards World Documentation.

1099 preparation consists of:

- Reviewing 1099 address book information
- Choosing a 1099 method
- Building the 1099 work files

56.3 How Do You Prepare for 1099 Reporting?

When preparing for 1099s it is important to consider the following:

- Begin preparing for 1099s by reviewing address book information before year end to allow plenty of time for researching and updating supplier and voucher information.
- You must have information in the G/L or A/P Ledger tables. The system requires this information to calculate 1099 information for specific suppliers. For this reason, you should not purge the following tables until after you print 1099s:

| Table | Description |
|---|---|
| Address Book Master (F0101) | Do not purge address book records for any supplier with A/P activity in the calendar year you are reporting. |
| Supplier Master (F0401) | Do not purge supplier master records for any supplier with A/P activity in the calendar year you are reporting. |
| A/P Ledger (F0411), A/P Matching Document (F0413), and A/P Matching Document Detail (F0414) | If you are using the A/P Ledger method, do not purge vouchers paid in the calendar year you are reporting. You must have information in these tables for all vouchers paid in the 1099 reporting calendar year for which a 1099 might be required. If it is necessary to purge these tables, you must restore the A/P Ledger Purge (F0411P), A/P Matching Document Purge (F0413P), and A/P Matching Document Detail Purge (F0414P) tables before you produce 1099s. |
| Account Ledger (F0911) | In addition to the above, if you are using the G/L method, do not purge the Account Ledger for the calendar year you are reporting. You must have information in this table for all journal entries involving transactions in the 1099 reporting calendar year for which a 1099 might be required. If it is necessary to purge this table, you must restore the Account Ledger Purge table (F0911xx, where xx is the reporting year) before you produce 1099s. |

Reviewing address book information is the first task in the 1099 process.

57.1 Reviewing Address Book Information for 1099s

Accurate 1099 reporting depends on setting up supplier and company records correctly. The information for suppliers must meet 1099 specifications to be accepted by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

Begin preparing for 1099s early enough to review address book information for your suppliers and companies, enter corrections, and still meet the 1099 deadline. Leave sufficient time for researching and updating supplier records.

57.2 Reviewing Supplier and Company Information for 1099s

As part of the 1099 process, you must review address book records for your suppliers and companies to ensure that you have the necessary information and that your information meets IRS requirements. To do so, access the following forms:

- Supplier Master Information
- Company Numbers and Names
- Address Book Revisions

When you review your supplier and company information, ensure adherence to the following:

- Supplier address information guidelines
- Company information guidelines

57.2.1 Supplier Address Information Guidelines

When you review supplier address information for 1099s, consider that:

- The mailing name prints as the payee name on 1099 forms. If this is not the legal name of supplier, you must enter a mailing name on Who's Who and flag it as the legal name.
- The last non-blank line of the mailing address prints as the street address on 1099 forms.
- You must indicate which suppliers do not have a U.S. address.
- You must have a valid tax identification number (TIN) for each supplier.
- You must assign a Person/Corporation code of P (person) or N (non-corporate entity) to suppliers for whom you want to process 1099s.
- You can combine supplier records that collectively constitute a single legal entity by using one of the five alternate Address Number fields on Address Book-Additional Information. This lets you select the correct mailing name. This must be consistent, so you must use the same alternate Address Number field for every supplier. For example if you are using Alternate Address Number 3 for the combined supplier address number, then you must use that same field to combine other suppliers. This concept is the same for combining company address numbers, and uses the same alternate address number field.
- If a payee's legal name is different from the name under which the company is doing business, T (1099 legal name) should appear in the Type Code field.

57.2.2 Company Information Guidelines

When you review company information for 1099s, consider that:

- If the company number is different than the company's address book number, you must assign the company address book number to the company on Company Numbers and Names.
- You must have a valid TIN for each company. One TIN can be used for multiple companies.
- The address, name, TIN and phone number for the company prints on 1099 forms.
- You can combine company records that collectively constitute a single legal entity by using one of the five alternate Address Number fields on Address Book-Additional Information. This lets you select the correct mailing name. This must be consistent, so you must use the same alternate Address Number field for every company you are combining. For example if you are using Alternate Address Number 3 for the combined company address number, then you must use that same field to combine other company address numbers. This concept is the same for combining supplier address numbers, and uses the same alternate address number field.

57.3 Verifying Supplier Information for 1099s

A tax ID is required for each supplier. The system uses this information for the TIN on 1099 forms, which is required by the IRS for 1099 purposes.

You can verify the completeness and accuracy of your supplier tax ID information by:

- Reviewing the W-9 Exception Report
- Reviewing the W-9 Report with Tax ID

These reports list suppliers who are individuals (P) or non-corporate entities (N), as assigned on Supplier Master Information. After you review each report, make any corrections, then print and review the reports again.

57.3.1 Reviewing the W-9 Exception Report

You can verify the completeness and accuracy of your supplier tax ID reviewing the W-9 Exception Report.

To meet IRS requirements, you must have a tax identification number for each supplier. The W-9 Exception Report lists suppliers who are assigned this number.

This report lists suppliers who are individuals (P) or noncorporate (N), as assigned on Supplier Master Information. After you review the report, make any corrections, then print and review the report again.

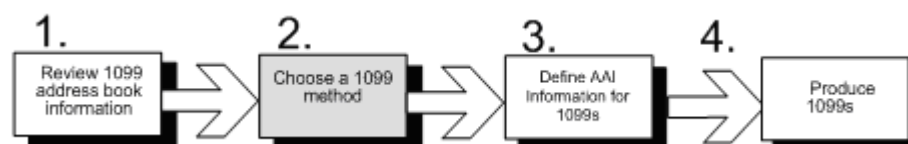

Before processing 1099s, you must decide which of the following 1099 methods you will use:

- G/L method
- A/P Ledger method

The method you choose depends on how complete the data is in your system.

The following factors might also affect your decision about which method to use:

The G/L method uses AAIs to determine G/L account number ranges for 1099 processing. You must edit the 1099 AAI items to tie your chart of accounts to the corresponding IRS form and box.

You need to define the following AAI items, depending on the type of 1099 forms you will process:

| Item | Description |
|--------|---|
| PXAxxx | 1099-MISC (Miscellaneous) form |
| PX1xxx | 1099-DIV (Dividend and Distribution) form |
| PX6xxx | 1099-INT (Interest Income) form |

Individual AAI items are associated with boxes on the 1099 form. For example, PXA1xx is associated with Box 1 on the 1099-MISC form, PXA2xx is associated with Box 2, and so forth. Each pair of AAI items defines the beginning and end of a range of object accounts.

59.2 What Are AAI Object Accounts?

Object accounts and object account ranges determine which voucher payments are included in 1099 processing. Before processing 1099s using the G/L method, you need to determine which object accounts are eligible for 1099s. After you determine the accounts, you must define the following AAI information:

- AAI items
- Object accounts

You assign object or expense accounts to AAIs for 1099 processing. When deciding which object accounts to assign, do not include the following:

- Cash accounts
- A/P trade accounts
- A/R trade accounts

Follow these guidelines when you define object account ranges for your AAIs for 1099s:

- Set up AAIs for company 00000 only.
- Do not leave object account for any item blank.
- Use odd numbers to indicate the beginning of a range and even numbers to indicate the end of a range. For example, 01-02, 03-04, and so on.
- Do not overlap ranges.
- Do not skip ranges. For example, do not use 01-02 and 05-06 without also using 03-04.
- Enter the object and subsidiary for the end of the range.
- Use up to 49 ranges for each type of 1099.
- Delete any unused 1099 ranges. You cannot just clear the Business Unit, Object Account, and Subsidiary fields.

To set up exchange rate difference processing

When foreign vouchers are paid and exchange rate differences cause a gain/loss to occur, it is required in some countries that the gain/loss amount be handled as a legitimate transaction. 62.1 Setting Up Payee Control

Use Payee Control to control changes made to selected, critical payee and bank account information. It prevents payments to a payee pending review and approval of the changed information.

When the system detects a change to a controlled field, it writes a record to the Payee Control table (F0450). This record includes the original information, the changed information, and the address book number of the person who made the change.

Until a change is approved, the system prevents automatic payments to a payee for whom controlled information has been changed. The programs for creating payment groups and writing payments do not process these payments. However, the system does not prevent you from writing manual payments.

Setting up Payee Control consists of:

- Installing the Payee Control table (F0450) in your production environment
- Setting up security for the Payee Control Approval program (P0450)
- Setting up security for the Payee Control server (X0450)
- Setting the processing options for the Payee Control server

62.1.2 Accessing the Payee Control Server

You can use Versions List to change the processing options for the payee control server (X0450). You can also access the server by choosing Payee Control function (F8) in the A/P Constants.

62.2 Setting Up Security for the Payee Control Server

To set up security for the payee control server:

- Set up report version security so a user cannot modify the version of the payee control server.
- Set up function key security so that a user cannot exit from A/P constants to the version of the payee control server to modify it.
- To make changes to the payee control server, you must change DEMO version ZJDE0001. If you change a different version, you must rename that version to ZJDE0001.

Security can be set up so only specified users can approve Payee Control records. There are two ways to set up security:

63.1 Overview

To transfer funds electronically, you must set up address book bank account information for your customers and suppliers. This information is necessary for processes such as Accounts Receivable drafts and automatic debits as well as Accounts Payable EDI and EFT payment processes.

You set up supplier bank account information by accessing either Bank Accounts by Address from Supplier Master Information (Bank Codes function) or by setting Up Bank Account Cross References. The program (P0030) is the same regardless of which method is used to set up the information. This program will allow you to do the following:

- Define and use more than one bank account per customer/ supplier.
- Provide a Pre-Note status for each bank account, rather than one per customer/supplier.
- Provide a mechanism to 'retire' one bank account using an expiration date while keeping it in the file as an audit trail.
- Provide additional bank account default by utilizing the currency code field as a key to the Payment Instrument Default file F0417.

63.2 Bank Type Code

The Bank Type Code associated with a bank account is used to:

- Distinguish external bank accounts from internal bank accounts.
- Define the type of external bank account, for example a customer or a supplier bank account.

63.2.1 Bank Type Code User Defined Table

Supplier's and Customer's must have valid Supplier bank type (V) and Customer bank type (D) accounts in order to process Drafts, EFT payments and other receipt and payment functions. You may only have one bank account per bank type. However,

your customers and suppliers may use multiple bank accounts for different processes, locations or specific to a currency denomination.

To accommodate multiple bank accounts per bank type you can set up additional bank type codes to be used as alternative customer/supplier bank accounts. The Bank Type Code field is two characters, so an example of an alternative supplier bank type code could be V1. Bank Type codes are set up and defined in User Defined Codes (UDC) table 00/BT. The Special Handling code for the bank type is used to determine if the bank type code will be associated with A/R processes or A/P processes:

- Special Handling Code 1 = A/R processes
- Special Handling Code 2 = A/P processes

For example, you may have a supplier that uses two bank accounts, each for a different location. Bank type V is set up in the UDC table but you need to add an alternative bank code to accommodate the second bank account. As shown below, bank type V1 has been set up for the second supplier bank account.

63.2.3 Bank Account by Currency

You may identify a bank type with a specific currency code. The Bank Type Code and the Currency Code make a unique combination allowing you to set up multiple customer or supplier bank accounts that are specific to currency transactions.

For example, your supplier may want EFT payments made in USD currency to be sent to a bank located in the U.S. whereas EFT payments made in Japanese Yen (JYP) are to be sent to a bank located in Tokyo. In this instance, you would set up two Supplier bank accounts, bank type code 'V', with the currency code USD assigned to the U.S. bank and the currency code JYP assigned to the Tokyo bank. When electronic payments are generated for the supplier, the payment transaction currency will determine which supplier bank account to use.

Note: The currency code field is displayed only if Currency processing is activated.

63.2.4 Pre-Note Code

The Pre-Note code is assigned to individual bank account records. When adding a new bank account, the pre-note code will automatically default to 'P', for pre-note. When an electronic payment process is run, the pre-note code will update to blank and the date of the automatic update will be recorded.

63.2.5 What You Should Know About

63.2.6 Effective Date/Expiration Date

There may be instances where your supplier opens a new bank account and closes an existing account. You may retire a current bank account and designate an effective date for new accounts. Enter the appropriate date to start using a bank account in the Effective Date field for the bank account. To retire an account but keep the account information in the bank file for audit purposes, set the Expiration Date for the bank account that will be retired.

64.1 Overview

The Accounts Payable Approvals process allows businesses to monitor and manage the outflow of cash through their A/P system. Approvals controls may be set up to determine the Approval Status for all vouchers entered or changed. These controls may be set up based on the voucher's gross or taxable amount, document type, business unit, company or any combination. When A/P Approvals is activated, the system will prevent payment on any voucher that does not have an appropriate Approval Status regardless of its pay status.

The system will use the AP Control file (F0453) when evaluating vouchers to determine if there will be a record created in the A/P Approval Detail File (F04531), and which approvers and status to be assigned. A record is written to the A/P Approval Detail File (F04531) for every voucher, whether it requires approval or not.

64.2 Accounts Payable Constants

Navigation

From Accounts Payable Setup (G0441), choose Accounts Payable Constants

The A/P Approvals field (GCRMP) in A/P Constants (P000904), controls the use of A/P Approvals. The following are the valid values for the A/P Approvals field:

- Blank - A/P Approvals is not activated. Any voucher entered to the system may be included in the payment process.
- 1 – A/P Approvals is activated. The voucher amount to be evaluated for approval will represent the Gross Amount of the voucher.

- 2 – A/P Approvals is activated. The voucher amount to be evaluated for approval will represent the Taxable Amount of the voucher.

Set the value of the A/P Approvals to 1 or 2 to activate A/P Approval processing:

A/P Approval Control Revisions (P0453) has been established to set up the approval level controls used to determine the Approval Status for all vouchers entered or changed. This program allows you to set up Company, Business Unit, Document Type and or minimum amounts over which vouchers will need approval to be paid.

Records set up within this program will be added to the A/P Approval Control File (F0453). You may inquire on these records by document type, business unit, company or any combination.

Credit/negative total vouchers are handled like the positive vouchers, except the evaluation uses LESS THAN logic. So, if the table has a value of 500.00-, any amount greater than 500.00-, such as 400.00- or 10.00-, will be set to "approved", and less than 500.00-, such as 800.00-, will be set to "unapproved."

You can set up the approval control by document type only, by company, by business unit or any combination. This is where you specify the minimum amounts and the approvers.

Note: The Approver 1 and Approver 2 fields use the IBM I-Series User ID. This is an important security feature used in A/P Approval - Work with Voucher program (P04531).

64.4 Global Approver Update (P04840)

From A/P Control Revision, choose the Global Approver Update function (F9) to access the DREAM Writer version list for Global Approver Update. This program uses the FROM and TO processing options to globally update Approver 1 and/or Approver 2 from one User ID to another in the A/P Approval Control file (F0453) and the A/P Approval Detail File (F04531). This update is necessary when users leave the company or change positions within the company and are no longer valid approvers. The Update Approver Version processing option allows you to select a specific version of the Global Update of Approver - Approval File (P04841). You may set up a specific version of P04841 to be called when you want to evaluate a specific subset of data from the A/P Approver file (F04531).

64.5 Re-evaluate Voucher Status

From A/P Control Revision, choose the Re-evaluate Voucher Status function (F10) to access the DREAM Writer version list for Evaluate Vouchers-Assign Approval Status. This program is designed to evaluate or re-evaluate a large group of vouchers for approval status based upon the information established in the Set Approval Flag for

Voucher program (X0453). Evaluate Vouchers-Assign Approval Status may be executed upon initial implementation of A/P Approvals process in order to assign an approval status for all existing open vouchers. You may also run this program if there have been additions or changes to approval control records so that vouchers are re-assessed based on the new controls.

You may use a processing option for this program to designate a specific version of the Approval Controls server (X0453) to be used to evaluate vouchers.

64.6 A/P Approval – Approval Controls

The A/P Approval - Approval Controls server (X0453) has been designed to handle functions related to A/P Approvals. If you are writing, deleting or changing payment related fields, the system will evaluate the voucher to set the proper approval status. The system will only utilize version ZJDE0001 for processing, except for the Evaluate Voucher program (P04532) which contains a processing option to specify a version. The following processing options are utilized in the evaluation of the vouchers, and must be set up prior to using the A/P Approval system. These options allow you to determine how to manage vouchers that fall outside the approval amount levels or do not have a control record assigned to the document type, business unit or company. In addition, vouchers with credit pay items may be set to unapproved for further review.

- **Processing Option 1 - Less Than Minimum Defaults**, designates whether the voucher is to be automatically approved if it is under the minimum amount established in the A/P Approval Control File (F0453). If vouchers are to be created as unapproved when below the minimum, set the value in the Approver 1 field to blank. It is recommended to designate an Approver 2 so that the voucher will be allowed approval at a later time by the person designated as Approver 2. When Approver 1 is left blank for automatic unapproved status, the Approver field in the AP Approval File (F04531) will be set to the value of DEFAULT. If Approver 2 is also left blank, the User ID field will be set to the value of NOAPPROVER and it will become necessary to update the Approver fields using Global Approver Update (P04840) to allow approval by a valid User ID. If there is a valid User ID in the Approver 1 field, this will designate that all vouchers processed will be set as approved.
- **Processing Option 2 - No Control Record Found**, designates whether the voucher is to be automatically approved if there is no control record found in the A/P Approval Control File (F0453). When vouchers are to be created as unapproved when no control record is found, set the value in the Approver 1 field to blank. It is recommended to designate an Approver 2 so that the voucher will be allowed approval at a later time by the person designated as Approver 2. When Approver 1 is left blank for automatic unapproved status, the Approver field in the AP Approval File (F04531) will be set to the value of DEFAULT. If Approver 2 is also left blank, the User ID field will be set to the value of NOAPPROVER and it will become necessary to update the Approver fields using Global Approver Update (P04840) to allow approval by a valid User ID. If there is a valid User ID in the

Approver 1 field, this will designate that all vouchers processed will be set as approved.

- Processing Option 3, Credit Alert, designates whether to automatically set any voucher that has a credit pay item to unapproved, regardless of any other criteria.
- Processing Option 4, One Time Payment Processing, provides tighter controls to the One Time Payment Process. If Approver 1 is blank, a One Time Payment voucher will go through the same approval assessment set for any other voucher. For example, if a One Time Payment voucher was created, the system will follow the AP Approval Controls in the table, or the processing options in X0453 will be used for below minimums and no control record. If you would like to monitor the One Time Payment processing, you should update Approver 1 with a valid User ID. Approver 2 is optional, but recommended if Approver 1 is blank. Approver 2 has no bearing on the approval process, it is used to allow a user to inquire and update the voucher for approval, if necessary.

Note: The processing options along with the records displayed in the A/P Approval Control Revisions (P0453) should be reviewed to ensure that all possible voucher combinations have been covered.

65.1 Setting Up Payment Terms for A/P

Navigation

From **Accounts Payable (G04)**, enter 29

From **Accounts Payable Setup (G0441)**, choose **Payment Terms Revisions**

You can set up codes for the various payment terms, such as net and due upon receipt, that your suppliers use. This makes entering your vouchers easier.

When you enter a supplier record, you specify the payment terms that the supplier uses most frequently. Then, when you enter or release a voucher, you can either:

- Accept the default payment term
- Designate a different payment term

The system calculates discounts and payment due dates based on the payment terms you set up.

Information about payment terms is stored in the Payment Terms table (F0014).

65.2 Setting Up Payment Terms

This section discusses setting up payment terms.

65.2.1 About Payment Terms Codes

To set up a payment terms code, you use one, or a two- or three-character combination, of the following:

- Alphabetic (A – Z)
- Numeric (1 – 999)
- Special characters (including blank)

You should set up a blank code for the most commonly used payment terms. If you do this, you must also set up a non-blank code for the same payment terms in case you need to change a supplier's payment terms later.

For example, you have a supplier with a payment terms code of D (due upon receipt). The supplier changes the terms to net 30 days, which is set up as a blank code. Because you cannot replace the existing code of D with a blank, you must use a non-blank code, such as N for net 30 days.

Figure 65–1 Payment Term Revisions screen

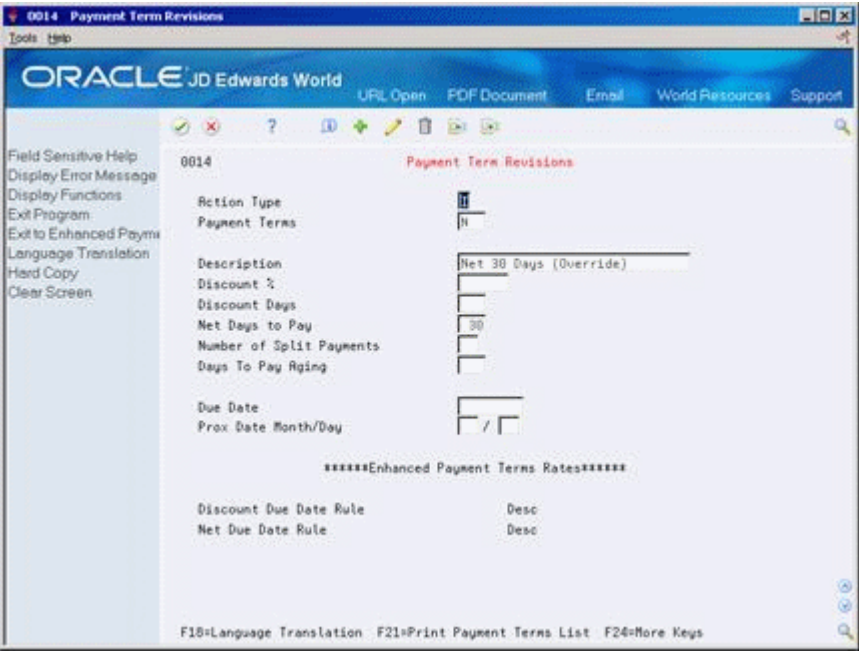
To set up net payment terms

A supplier might give you a specific number of days to pay an invoice. When you enter a voucher, the system calculates the net due date by adding the number of days to the invoice date.

For example, if the net days to pay is 30, and the invoice date is June 14, the due date is July 14.

To set up net with discount payment terms

A supplier might allow a discount if you pay a voucher within a certain number of days. The system calculates the due date by adding the invoice date to the number of discount days.

For example, if a voucher has a discount of 1%, discount days of 10, and net days to pay of 30, the payment terms allow a 1% discount if you pay the voucher within 10 days of the date entered for invoice date. If you do not pay within 10 days, you have 30 days to pay the net amount.

To set up proximate date payment terms

A supplier might specify a voucher due date by indicating the proximate, or subsequent, month and day. The system calculates the month that the voucher is due by adding the proximate month to the month of the invoice date. The proximate day is the date in that month.

For example, an invoice date is May 20, the proximate month is 1, and the proximate day is 10. In this case, the payment is due on June 10.

To set up due upon receipt payment terms

A supplier might expect payment upon receipt of a voucher/invoice. For due upon receipt payment terms, the system sets the due date equal to the invoice date.

For example, if the invoice date is June 10, the due date is June 10. If there is no invoice date, the system uses the G/L date.

To set up split payment terms

Instead of paying all of a voucher at one time, you might arrange with a supplier to pay a voucher with equal, consecutive payments. To do this, set up split payment terms.

For example, a voucher has an invoice date of July 1, two equal payments are due, and the number of days between payments is 30. In this case, the first payment is due July 31, 30 days from the invoice date. The second payment is due August 30, 30 days from the first payment due date.

If the supplier allows a discount, the system applies the entire discount to the first pay item.

65.3 Setting Up Advanced Payment Terms

Payment terms can range from simple to complex, depending on the policy of your organization. For example, you might set up a simple payment term such as 1/10, net

30 to encourage early payment. You might also set up a more complex or advanced payment term to allow an invoice or a voucher to be split into multiple payments with a different discount percentage for each payment.

Payment terms provide you with the flexibility to define how the system calculates due dates and discount percentages for your invoices and vouchers. A due date can either be a net due date or a discount due date. Because of the complex and diverse ways of calculating due dates, you can set up due date rules using various components to calculate a due date. For example, you can specify that the system add 10 days to the based on date, which might be the G/L date, when calculating the discount due date of an invoice.

After you set up due date rules for both the net due date and the discount due date, you set up the payment term code. You can specify a due date rule as either a discount due date or a net due date. This enables you to link the rules together with a discount percent to define the:

- Default payment term code for a customer or supplier
- Payment term code of a specific invoice or voucher

The system stores payment term information in the following tables:

- Advanced Payment Terms (F00141)
- Due Date Rules (F00142)
- Due Date Rules Day Range (F00143)
- Installment Payment Terms (F00144)

65.4 Setting Up Due Date Rules

Before you set up specific payment terms, you must define the rules that the system uses to calculate due dates for invoices and vouchers. You can set up as many due date rules as necessary.

A due date rule can consist of any of the following components:

| Rule Component | Description |
|----------------|--|
| Based on Date | This can be an invoice date, G/L date, a service tax date, and so on. |
| Days to Add | This is the number of days that the system adds to the based on date. |
| Months to Add | This is the number of months that the system adds to the based on date. |
| Fixed Days | This is the same day every month, such as the 10th or 15th of each month. |
| Date Range | This is a range of days that the system uses in conjunction with other components. |

| Rule Component | Description |
|-------------------|---|
| Work Day Calendar | This is a calendar that you can use to ensure that the due date is on a work day. |
| Work Day Rule | This is a rule that you can use to ensure that if a due date is on a non-work day, the system moves it forward or backward to an actual working day. It also determines whether to count non-work days when calculating the due date. |

By using a combination of these components, you can set up a variety of payment terms. For example, you might set up date rules as follows:

- Use the invoice date as the based on date and add one month. For example, if the date of the invoice is June 25th, the due date is July 25th.
- Use the G/L date as the based on date, and add one month and five days. For example, if the G/L date is June 12th, the due date is July 17th.
- Use the G/L date as the based on date, set up a day range, specify a number of days to add to the day range and a month to add. For example, if the G/L date is June 2nd, the month to add is 1, and the date ranges are:
 - The 1st through the 10th, add 5 days
 - The 11th through the 31st, use the 31st as the fixed day

Since the based on date is within the first date range, the system adds five days and one month to the last day in the date range. Therefore, the due date for the payment is July 15th. This is commonly known as a "swing payment term," and is most often used in Germany.

When setting up due date rules for your payment terms, you can set up workday calendars. These calendars enable you to specify the actual work days, weekends, holidays, and so on of your organization. You can set up multiple calendars and reference the name of one in the due date rule.

After you set up a work day calendar, you specify which action to take if the system calculates the due date on a non-work day. You do this on the Due Date Rule Revisions form. For example, you can instruct the system to:

- Ignore non-work days when counting the days to calculate the due date and not allow the due date to occur on a non-work day.
- Use the work day after the calculated due date as the due date. For example, if the calculated due date occurs on the weekend, the system moves it to the following Monday.
- Use the work day before the calculated due date as the due date. For example, if the calculated due date falls on the weekend, the system moves it to the previous Friday.

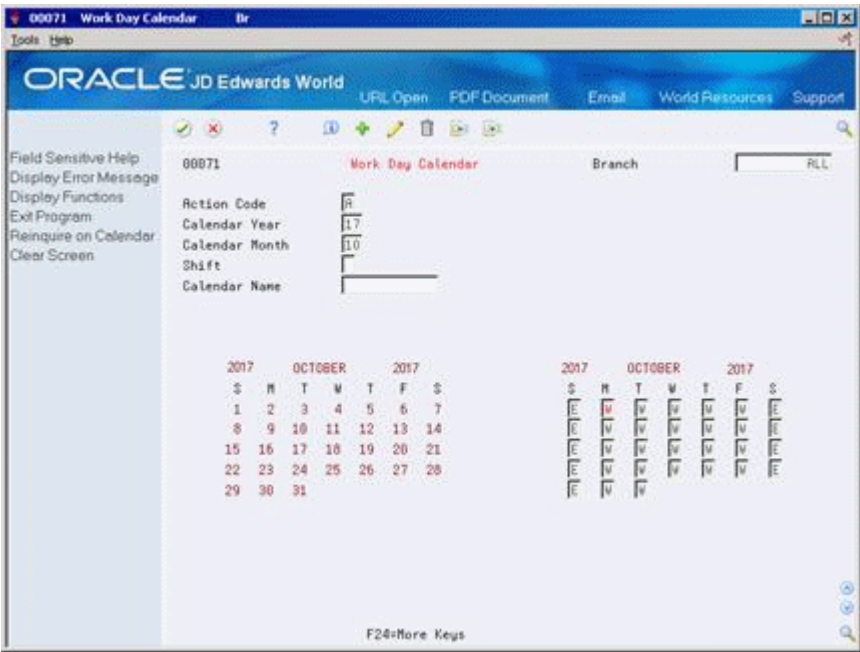
If you specify a work day rule, you can adjust the payment's due date to correspond with your working days. For example, you can prevent unintended "grace periods" that might occur if the due date falls on a Saturday and your business is closed. In

addition, you can specify that the payment is due in 30 working days instead of 30 calendar days.

You can set up codes for various payment terms, which determines the net due dates, discounts, and discount due dates for your invoices and vouchers. This makes entering invoices and vouchers more efficient.

When you enter a customer or supplier record, you specify the payment term code that the customer or supplier uses most frequently. Then, when you enter the invoice or voucher, you can either:

- Accept the default payment term code
- Designate a different payment term code

65.6.1 Payment Term Codes

When you set up a payment term code, you can use a one-, two- or three-character combination of the following:

- Alphabetic (A – Z)
- Numeric (1 – 999)
- Special characters (including blank)

You should set up a blank code for the most commonly used payment terms. If you do this, you must also set up a non-blank code for the same payment terms in case you need to change a supplier's payment terms later.

For example, you have a supplier with a payment terms code of D (due upon receipt). The supplier changes the terms to net 30 days, which is set up as a blank code. Because you cannot replace the existing code of D with a blank, you must use a non-blank code, such as N for net 30 days.

Instead of a customer or you paying all of an invoice or voucher at one time you can set up installment payment terms to pay an invoice or voucher with multiple payments over a specified period of time.

When you set up installment payment terms, you can set up equal payments or unequal payments with different percentages. You can also specify a different discount percent for each installment. The system calculates the due date of each installment based on the due date rule you assign to it.

The following describes two examples of installment payment terms:

| Term | Description |

| Equal payments with a discount due date | <p>You might set up five equal payments. Each payment includes a ten percent discount if paid within the discount period that you defined in the discount due date rule.</p> <p>The actual due date of the payment depends on the net due date rule that you set up.</p> |

65.8 Working with Payment Terms for Multi-Tiered Discounts

You can set up payment terms that allow for multiple discount percentages. For example, you might set up a payment term that allows your customer to receive a 20 percent discount on their invoice if they remit payment within 10 days, a 10 percent discount if the invoice is paid within 20 days, and no discount with the full amount due in 30 days.

After you set up payment terms for multi-tiered discounts, you can assign the payment terms to the applicable vouchers or invoices. You run the multi-tiered batch update program to recalculate the discount available for your vouchers or invoices based on the number of days that have passed and the current tier.

For example, you might set up a multi-tiered payment term for which the first tier is 30 percent for 10 days and the second tier is 20 percent for 20 days. You assign the payment term to an invoice. When the invoice is 11 days old and you run the multi-tiered batch update program, the system replaces the discount amount at 30 percent with the discount amount at 20 percent. The discount due date becomes 20 days from the date of the invoice.

Working with payment terms for multi-tiered discounts consists of:

- Setting up a multi-tiered due date rule
- Updating the discount available for multi-tiered terms

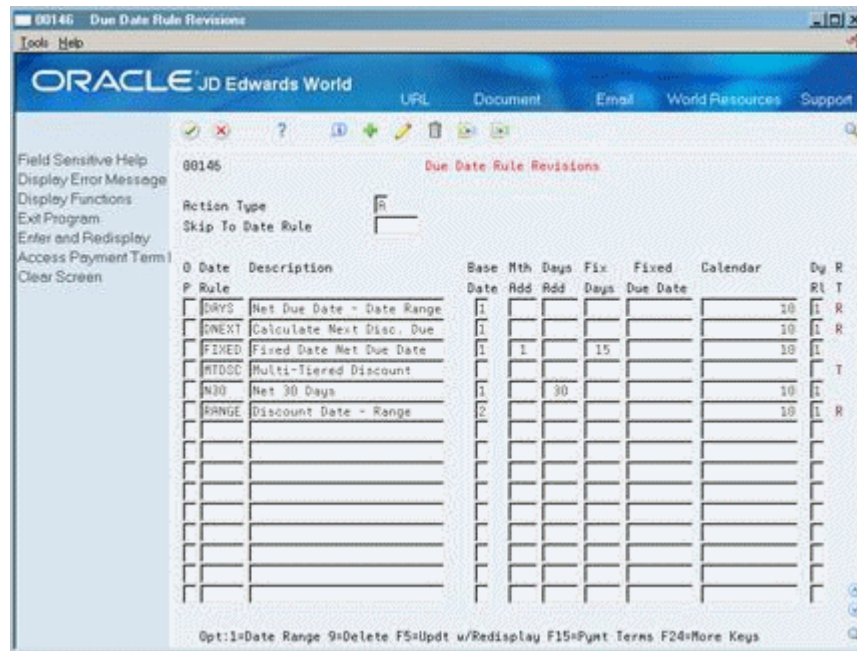


Figure 65–13 Multi-Tiered Due Date Rule screen

To update the discount available for invoices and vouchers that you assign multi-tiered discount payment terms, you run the multi-tiered batch update programs. The update programs recalculate the discount available for your vouchers or invoices.

When you update the discount available for multi-tiered terms, the system verifies the date of the invoice or voucher to determine whether the document has crossed a tier defined in the date rules for the assigned payment term. If it has, the system recalculates the available discount based on the number of days that have passed and the current tier.

66.1 About AAI's

Automatic accounting instructions (AAI's) define the relationships between your day-to-day accounting functions and your chart of accounts. Each system that interfaces with the JD Edwards World General Accounting system has AAI's.

The system uses a company/AAI item combination to determine which account to use. For example, AAI's tell the system to credit an A/P trade account when posting vouchers or to make a payment from a bank account when posting payments.

To allow for more flexibility, some AAI items have one of the following user defined suffixes:

- x suffix - The x suffix indicates a currency code. Some AAI's have a suffix of xxx to accommodate three-character currency codes. Use these AAI's to set up multiple AAI types for each company.
- y suffix - The y suffix indicates a G/L class code. Some AAI's have a suffix of yyyy to accommodate one- to four-character class codes. For example, the object account for notes payable (A/P class NOTE) can be different from the one for trade accounts payable (A/P class TRAD).
- z suffix - The z suffix indicates a payment term code for the discount AAI items RKD/RKL only.

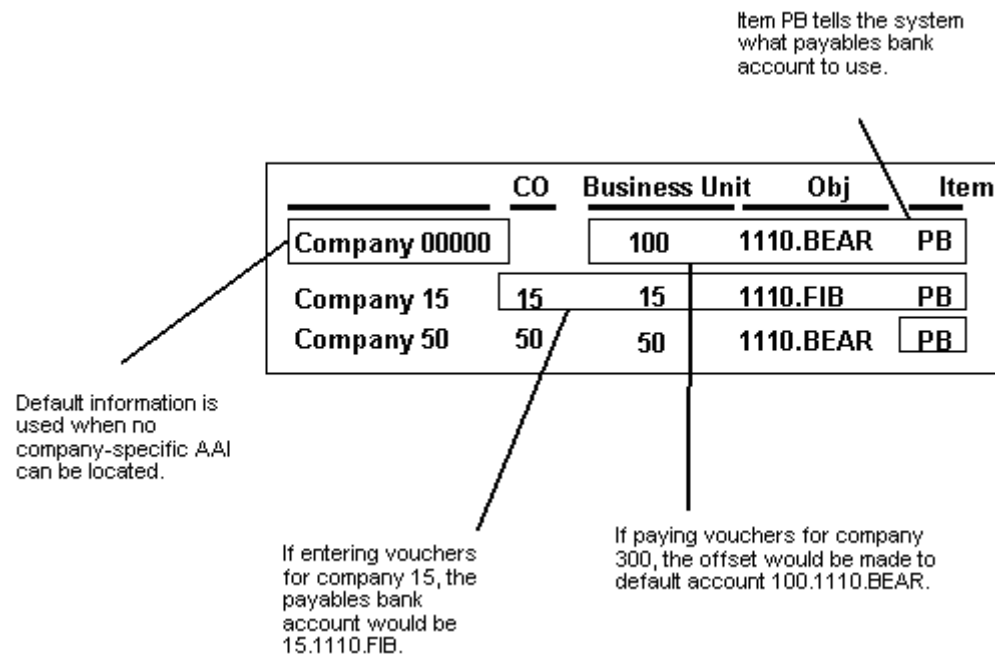
Information about AAI items is stored in the Automatic Accounting Instructions Master table (F0012).

66.2 What Are Default AAI's?

Your system includes AAI's that are already assigned to company 00000. You must customize these AAI's to fit your company, business unit, or object account setup.

You must assign a valid account to the default AAI's for company 00000. If the system cannot find an AAI for a specific company, it uses the AAI for company 00000. You do not need to set up an AAI for any company that uses the default AAI.

66.3 How Does the System Search for AAIs?

The following example uses company 00100 and A/P class code TRAD to show the sequence that the system uses to search for AAIs:

1. Search for company 00100, item PCTRAD.
2. If not found, search for company 00000, item PCTRAD.
3. If not found, search for company 00100, item PC_____.
4. If not found, search for company 00000, item PC_____.

If none of these AAI items are found, there is an error in the AAI setup.

67.1 About AAls for A/P

AAI items for A/P always start with the letter P. For example, PC is the AAI item for payables class and PB is the AAI item for payables bank.

The name of an AAI item, such as PC, is hard coded. Each AAI item has account codes consisting of a business unit, object, and subsidiary, which are mapped to your chart of accounts.

67.2 What AAls Are Available?

The following is a brief description of the AAI items available in the Accounts Payable system. AAI items may have suffixes of yyyy, designating a G/L Offset, xxx, designating a transaction Currency Code, or zzz designating a payment term code (applicable to AAI item PKD only).

- Default Bank Account (PByyyy or PBxxx)
- Trade Accounts Payable (PCyyyy or PCxxx)
- Payable Discounts Available (PKDzzz)
- Payable Discounts Lost (PKLzzz)
- Preliminary Distribution for Voucher Logging (PPyyyy)
- Suspense A/P Trade Account (PQyyyy)
- Payables Tax (PTyyyy)
- Drafts Payable (PDx)
- AP/AR Netting (NC)
- Gain on Foreign Currency (PGxxx)
- Loss on Foreign Currency (PLxxx)
- Unrealized Gain on Foreign Currency (PVxxx)
- Unrealized Loss on Foreign Currency (PWxxx)
- Unrealized Gain/Loss Offset on Foreign Currency (PRyyyy or PRxxx)

- Alternate Currency Gain (PYxxx)
- Alternate Currency Loss (PZxxx)
- Alternate Currency Clearing Account (P7)

Note: Do not use code 9999 as it is reserved for the post program and indicates that offsets should not be created.

67.2.1 Payables Bank Accounts – PB

An AAI item for default bank account (PB) is required. These AAI's define the default bank accounts that the system assigns when paying a voucher if you do not enter a bank account number during voucher entry.

If some suppliers or invoices must be paid from a specific bank, you must set up a bank-specific PBxxx or PByyyy item. If currency processing is turned on, the item PBxxx will be looked at before item PByyyy.

67.2.1.1 Example

Gourmet and More must be paid from OMNI National Bank, which is not the default payables bank. Set up the G/L class code of OMNI in the supplier master record or on each voucher for Gourmet and More.

The following example illustrates how to set up a PB item:

| Item | Description | Co | BU | Obj | Sub | Seq No. |
|--------------------|----------------------------|----|-----|------|------|---------|
| PBOMNI (PByyyy) | OMNI bank-specific code | | 100 | 1110 | OMNI | 4.015 |

The following example uses company 00070 (a company that works with multiple currencies) to show the sequence that the system uses to search for different types of AAI's:

1. Search for company 00070, item PCUSD, where USD is the currency code.
2. If not found, search for company 00000, item PCUSD.
3. If not found, search for company 00070, item PCTRAD, where TRAD is the default G/L class from the supplier master information.
4. If not found, search for company 00000, item PCTRAD.
5. If not found, search for company 00070, item PC_____.
6. If not found, search for company 00000, item PC_____.

If none of these AAI items are found, the post program will generate an error that the AAI item is not set up.

67.2.2 Payables Class Accounts – PC

An AAI item for trade accounts payable (PC) is required. These AAI's act as a holding or clearing account until you pay the voucher. The payables class AAI's specify the default trade accounts that the system uses.

For the payables class, you may need to set up the following:

- Default AAI item for company 00000

- Company-specific AAI items
- Class codes PCyyyy for company 00000
- Company-specific class codes
- Company-specific currency codes PCxxx

The payables class code can be specific to a supplier so that when you enter a voucher, the system uses the class code from the supplier master record.

67.2.2.1 Example

The following example illustrates how to set up PC items:

67.2.3 Payable Discounts Available – PKD

An AAI item for payable discounts available (PKD) is required if you are taking discounts. This item defines the profit and loss accounts for discounts available. The system uses PKD for the automatic offsets that it creates when posting a payment.

Discounts taken are the net of discounts available and discounts lost. Both AAI PKD and its associated item PKL can point to the same general ledger account number.

Set up the default AAI item for company 00000 for all companies using the same discount taken account or a specific AAI per company with a different discount taken account.

You may also set up a discount taken AAI item specific to a payment term code, both company specific and/or for company 00000. This is similar to AAI items that use G/L offsets or currency codes in the hierarchy. For example, you may set up PKDzzz where zzz is equal to the payment term code. The system will look first for item PKD company specific, then PKDzzz company specific; if no items are found it does the same search for company 00000.

67.2.4 Payable Discounts Lost – PKL

An AAI item for payable discounts lost (PKL) is required if you are taking discounts. This item defines the profit and loss accounts for discounts lost. The system uses PKL for the automatic offsets that it creates when posting a payment.

Set up a default PKL account or a specific PKL account per company.

You may also set up a discount lost AAI item specific to a payment term code, both company specific and/or for company 00000. This is similar to AAI items that use G/L offsets or currency codes in the hierarchy. For example, you may set up PKLzzzz where zzzz is equal to the payment term code. The system will look first for item PKL company specific, then PKLzzzz company specific; if no items are found it does the same search for company 00000.

67.2.5 AP Discount AAI's with Job Cost

When using the Job Cost module along with voucher that carry discounts, additional AAI set up may be needed. In the discount process, the software searches first for the Job Cost AAI's (PKJ, PKJL). The Job Cost discount AAI's direct the programs to post the discount to individual jobs, by using the Business Unit from the voucher. If there are no Job Cost AAI's set up, the system uses the PKD and PKL AAI's.

67.2.6 Preliminary Distribution for Voucher Logging – PP

An AAI item for preliminary distribution (PPyyyy) is required if you are using voucher logging. This item defines the preliminary expense suspense account that the system uses during voucher logging.

67.2.7 Suspense A/P Trade Account – PO

The AAI item for suspense A/P trade account (PQyyyy) is optional. This item defines the A/P trade account that the system uses during voucher logging.

You designate the use of the suspense trade account on Company Numbers and Names by accessing A/R-A/P with the F4 key:

- If you enter 0 (zero), the system uses the A/P payables class (PC) AAI item to post the liability to a regular trade account.
- If you enter 1, the system uses the voucher logging - trade (PQ) AAI item to post the liability to a suspense trade account.

When the preliminary expense account is redistributed to the actual expense account, the system adjusts the suspense trade account (PQ) to the actual trade account (PC).

67.2.7.1 Example

You enter a voucher in the amount of 100 in Voucher Logging Entry. If the suspense flag is set to 1, the system debits the preliminary expense account in AAI item PP and credits the trade suspense account in AAI item PQ.

Figure 67–1 Voucher Logging Entry Notation with Suspense Flag Set to 1

When you know the expense account to post the voucher to, you use Voucher JE Redistribution. You must manually enter the expense account. The system:

- Credits the preliminary expense (PP)
- Debits the A/P trade suspense (PQ)
- Credits the A/P trade (PC)

67.2.8 Payables Tax – PT

The AAI item PT is used with A/P tax information. The system either uses PT or PTyyyy (where yyyy = value in G/L Offset entered in the tax rate area for a specific tax rate/area) depending on which tax explanation code is used. Tax explanation codes for Use tax use item PT. Tax explanation codes for VAT tax use item PTyyyy. Tax explanation code B (which is a combination of VAT and Use tax) use both PTyyyy and PT. In the tax rate area, the first line is used for VAT (which requires a G/L Offset) and the second line is used for Use (which ignores any G/L Offset).

67.2.9 Drafts Payable – PD

An AAI item for drafts payable (PDx - where x represents the payment instrument) is required if you are using drafts.

67.2.10 AP/AR Netting – NC

AAI item NC defines the suspense account used in AP/AR Netting.

67.2.11 Gain/Loss on Foreign Currency – PG/PL

An AAI item for realized gain (PGxxx) and realized loss (PLxxx) on foreign currency is required if you are using multiple currencies. These items:

- Defines the account the system uses to track foreign currency gains/losses
- Creates the gain/loss when you enter payments
- Are available by company and currency
- Represents the currency code using xxx (optional)

Set up default item PGxxx and PLxxx for company 00000 and/or specific AAI items PGxxx and PLxxx per company.

67.2.12 Unrealized Gain/Loss on Foreign Currency – PV/PW/PR

An AAI item for unrealized gain (PVxxx) and unrealized loss (PWxxx) on foreign currency is required if you are using multiple currencies.

- Unrealized Gain/Loss Offset on Foreign Currency

An AAI item for unrealized gain/loss offset on foreign currency (PRyyyy or PRxxx) is required if you are using multiple currencies.

The following applies to AAI items PVxxx and PWxxx:

- Create reversing entries for unrealized gains or losses on open items due to changes in the exchange rates since the original entry was made
- Determine the offset account to use when creating unrealized gains/losses.
- To create a reversing (offsetting) journal entry, AAI item PR is used.

Set up default AAI items for company 00000 or specific AAls for a company

67.2.13 Gain/Loss on Alternate Currency – PY/PZ/P7

An AAI item for realized gain/loss for payments in an alternate currency is required (PYyyyy, or PYxxx and PZyyyy, or PZxxx, respectively). AAI item PZ defines the clearing account for differences in the foreign ledger.

69.1 About User Defined Codes for A/P

You need to set up and customize user defined codes for your business needs. Many fields in the Accounts Payable system accept only user defined codes. For example, when you enter a supplier's invoice, you must enter a user defined code to specify a voucher's payment status. The system does not accept a payment status that is not in the user defined list of valid payment statuses.

Each user defined code in the Accounts Payable system is either soft-coded or hard-coded. You can customize any soft-coded user defined code to accommodate your specific business needs, and you can set up additional codes that are soft-coded. You cannot customize a hard-coded user defined code.

A type of user defined code is identified by the system code and the user defined code list. For example, 00/DV represents system 00 and user defined code list DV.

69.2 Which User Defined Codes Are Available?

The user defined codes in the Accounts Payable system are:

- Document type codes
- Payment status codes
- Payment instrument codes
- Tax calculation codes
- Aging Vocabulary Codes
- Special handling codes

Information about user defined codes is stored in the User Defined Codes table (F0005).

69.2.1 Document Type Codes

When you enter a transaction, such as a voucher or a draft, you must specify the document type.

The document type code, document number and company, and G/L date are the link between the Accounts Payable system and the General Accounting system.

The system maintains two groups of document type codes:

- Voucher document type codes
- Matching document type codes

69.2.1.1 Voucher Document Type Codes

Voucher document types (00/DV) are also known as original documents. Original documents can exist by themselves. You must attach (or match) a matching document to an original document. All original documents are hard-coded.

Set up a code for each type of original document that you use when you enter vouchers.

| Voucher Type | Description |
|------------------------|---|
| PV (voucher) | The system creates this voucher when you enter a supplier's invoice during voucher entry. You can associate this document type with matching document types PE, PK, PN, PT, and PO. |
| PR (recurring voucher) | The system creates this voucher for a specific number of payments. |
| PM (manual voucher) | The system creates this voucher when it creates the corresponding payment. |
| PD (debit memo) | The system creates this voucher when you enter a supplier's credit. |
| PL (voucher logging) | The system creates this voucher when you enter a supplier's invoice using a suspense account. |
| P1 (draft) | The system creates this draft voucher when you use draft processing. This replaces the original (underlying) voucher. |
| NO (AP netting) | The original document created to offset an open receivable. |

69.2.1.2 Matching Document Type Codes

Matching Document Types (00/DT) represent documents that cannot exist by themselves. You must attach (or match) each to a corresponding original document. For example, a manual payment is a matching document that must have a corresponding voucher as the original document. All matching documents are hard-coded.

The system provides the following codes for the matching documents that you use when you enter vouchers.

| Document Type | Description |
|--------------------------------|---|
| PE (change the voucher amount) | The system creates an audit trail record by changing the amount of a posted voucher or voiding the voucher. |
| PK (automatic payment) | The system creates an offsetting payment, using the automatic payment process. |
| PN (manual payment) | The system creates an offsetting payment during manual payment entry. |
| PT (electronic funds transfer) | The system creates an offsetting payment, using the electronic payment process. |

| Document Type | Description |
|-------------------|--|
| P1 (draft) | The system creates an offsetting payment, using draft processing. |
| PO (void payment) | The system creates a negative amount voucher and an audit trail record when voiding a payment. |
| NM (AP netting) | The matching document created when offsetting open payables. |

69.2.2 Payment Status Codes

Payment status codes (00/PS) indicate if a voucher is approved, pending, paid, and so on. You assign a payment status code if you need to change the status that the system has assigned. Payment status codes are hard-coded.

The system provides the following payment status codes:

| Payment Status Code | Description |
|---------------------|--|
| A (hard-coded) | Approved for payment. |
| D (hard-coded) | Draft accepted. |
| E (hard-coded) | Draft expired. |
| H (soft-coded) | Held/pending approval. You can set up additional codes for each type of hold status for vouchers. |
| P (hard-coded) | Paid in full. |
| R (hard-coded) | Retainage. |
| % (hard-coded) | Withholding tax applies. |
| # (hard-coded) | Payment in-process. The system marks any vouchers you select during pre-payment processing with # (pound sign). This prevents any changes to the voucher until payment processing is complete. |

69.2.3 Payment Instrument Codes

Payment instrument codes (00/PY) indicate various methods of payment, such as draft, check, and electronic funds transfer. You assign a payment instrument code to each voucher. Set up a code for each type of payment instrument that you use.

| Payment Instrument Code | Description |
|-------------------------|--|
| B (soft-coded) | BACS (UK EFT processing) |
| C (soft-coded) | Check (8.75 inches) |
| D (soft-coded) | Draft |
| N (soft-coded) | Note |
| T (hard-coded) | Electronic funds transfer (EFT - CTX format) |
| V (hard-coded) | Electronic funds transfer (EFT - PPD format) |
| W (soft-coded) | Check (8.5 inches) |
| X (hard-coded) | Electronic data interchange (EDI) check |
| Y (hard-coded) | EDI wire |
| Z (hard-coded) | EDI |

69.2.4 Tax Calculation Codes

You assign codes (00/EX) for various methods of calculating taxes, such as sales tax and VAT. You then use AAI's to direct each code to a different account. The first letter of the code is hard-coded. You cannot change it. Set up a code for each type of tax calculation method that you use.

| Calculation Code | Description |
|------------------|-------------------------|
| B | VAT + use tax |
| C | VAT + sales tax |
| S | Sales tax |
| U | Use (self-assessed) tax |
| V | VAT |

71.1 Setting Up Category Codes for Vouchers

Your company might want the flexibility to track detailed information about a voucher transaction, and not be limited to tracking information by supplier only. For example, if a division of your company purchases a wide variety of products from suppliers, you might want to classify each transaction by the specific product you purchased. In this example, if you purchase materials to manufacture, you could classify the transactions by grains, processing chemicals, and product packaging.

By classifying your voucher transactions, you can print reports such as A/P aging and open balances reports showing activity by product. You can also avoid using or creating G/L distribution accounts for each type of product that you purchase.

To classify your voucher transactions, you must set up voucher category codes. You can use ten of the 30 address book category codes for this purpose. However, before you can classify your transactions using voucher category codes, you need to ensure that you have completed the following tasks:

- Setting up a voucher category code
- Assigning a voucher category code to a data dictionary item

71.1.1 Process Flow for Using Voucher Category Codes

The following graphic illustrates the steps involved in setting up and working with voucher category codes. The Address Book category codes are stored in the Address Book Master (F0101), fields AC01-AC30. The values for each category codes are set up in User Defined Codes (UDC) table 01/01– 01/30.


Figure 71-1 Process Flow for Using Voucher Category Codes

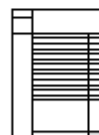

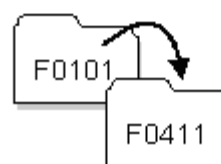

To set up a voucher category code

Navigation

From Address Book (G01), enter 29

From Address Book Setup (G0141), choose Address Book Category Codes

From Address Book Category Codes (G01411), choose a category code

You can use up to ten address book category codes (user defined codes 01/01-30) to classify voucher transactions. You do not have to set up consecutive codes. For example, you could set up category codes 02, 04, 09, 11, 22, and so on, for your voucher category codes.

An alternative to setting up voucher category codes is to use existing user defined codes. If you choose to do this, give careful thought about which ones have values that are appropriate to use as voucher category codes. Then do the following:

- Identify which existing user defined codes you want to use
- Assign the codes to the appropriate data dictionary items

For example, you might choose to use codes that exist for system 55 as your voucher category codes. These user defined codes are set up by businesses that customize codes specifically for their business needs and are protected from future use by JD Edwards World software.

To assign a voucher category code to a data dictionary item

Navigation

From Advanced and Technical Operations (G9), choose Run Time Setup

From Run Time Setup (G90), choose Data Dictionary Alternatively, enter DD on a command line

After you set up voucher category codes, you must create the link from the codes, which are stored in the Address Book Master table (F0101), to the Accounts Payable Ledger table (F0411). You do this by assigning voucher category codes to data dictionary items.

The data dictionary items YC01-YC10 provide a link to each of the ten category codes that you use specifically for voucher transactions. To create the link, you specify the user defined code table in the data item so that the system accesses the appropriate category code for your vouchers.

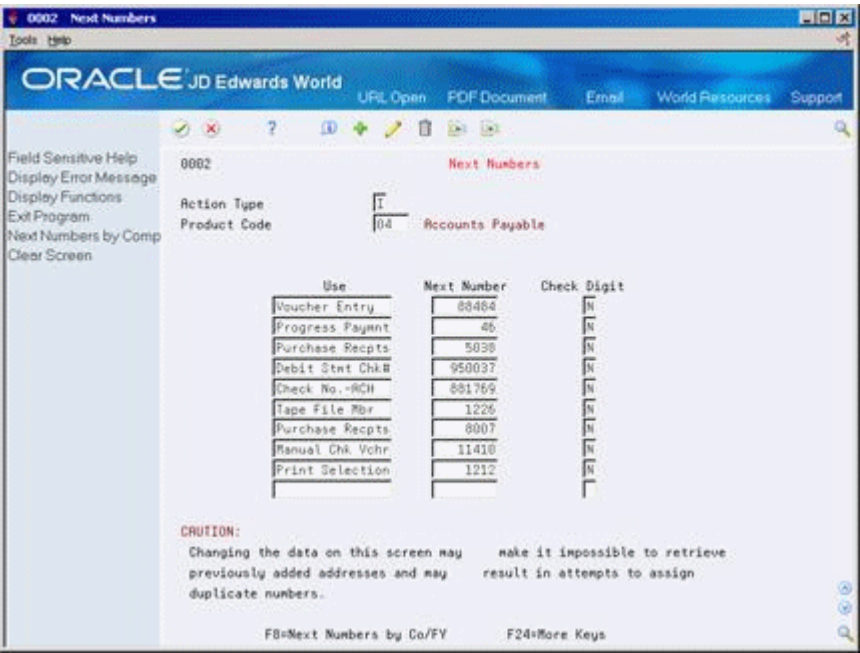
When you enter a document, such as a voucher, you can assign a document number or you can let the system assign it using next numbers. The next numbers program assigns numbers to accounts, journal entries, and other documents using either or both of the following:

- Standard next numbers. The system finds the next available number in the Next Numbers table (F0002) and assigns the number to the document.
- Next numbers by company and fiscal year. The system assigns a unique set of next numbers for each company, fiscal year, or combination of company and fiscal year in the Next Numbers by Company/Fiscal Year table (F00021).

Setting up next numbers consists of:

- Reviewing standard next numbers
- Activating check digits for standard next numbers
- Assigning next numbers by company and fiscal year

To activate check digits for standard next numbers

You can have the system assign check digits for any set of standard next numbers. Check digits prevent transposition errors on next numbers, such as supplier master numbers. Do not use check digits for general accounting next numbers.

- Setting up company information, if you produce payments by company or if you want to print company information on your payments
- Setting up bank account information for A/P, if you use bank tapes to transmit payments
- Setting up draft processing for A/P, if you use draft payment instruments

76.1 Setting Up Payment Instruments

You must define your payment instruments. Payment instruments can be checks (of different sizes), tapes, drafts, BACS, and so on. Clients outside the U.S. must set up automatic payments for country-specific payment instruments. You determine the format of each payment instrument by choosing the programs that produce its component parts:

- Payment - This is the printed copy or tape table for the payment.
- Payment register - This is the printed list of payments.
- Attachment - This is a printed report that contains the detail information that does not fit on a payment stub.
- Debit statement - This is a printed list of debit balances. It shows net amounts that are either a credit or that zero out a voucher.

80.2 About A/P Tax Setup

Various tax authorities assess and collect taxes. In order to comply with governmental tax regulations, you need to set up tax information in your Accounts Payable system. After you set up this information, you can:

- Track taxes according to different tax rates and areas
- Assign a default tax rate to a supplier
- Apply a tax rate to an entire voucher or individual pay items
- Enter a tax amount or have the system calculate the amount
- Track tax history in a separate table

A/P tax setup consists of:

- Setting up tax authorities for A/P
- Setting up tax rates and areas for A/P
- Understanding tax explanation codes for A/P
- Setting up AAIs for A/P taxes
- Setting up tax rules by company for A/P

Alternatively you can set up your taxes with Vertex(tm). This consists of:

- Working with Vertex for A/P

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After you set up your tax information, you designate tax amounts in the supplier master record or when you enter a supplier's invoice.

80.2.1 What Are the Different Types of Taxes?

You might be assessed one of the following types of taxes:

| Tax Type | Description |
|--|---|
| Sales Tax | This tax is calculated on the gross sales price of the goods. Customers who buy goods for their own use pay sales tax at the time of purchase. Suppliers who buy goods for resale do not pay sales tax. |
| Use Tax | This tax is a sales tax, calculated and self-assessed by the buyer. A use tax might be levied when a company keeps the goods it manufactures for its own use. For example, a pencil manufacturer might owe a use tax when it keeps some of the pencils it manufactures for the use of its own employees. A use tax might also be levied when a buyer in one tax area is responsible for direct payment of local sales taxes on goods and services purchased outside the local tax area. For example, a catalog company in New York does not collect sales taxes from buyers in Colorado, but the buyers must pay the Colorado tax authorities directly. |
| Value Added Tax (VAT) | This tax is collected at each stage in the production and distribution of goods and services as value is added. As a business adds value to a product, the business pays VAT on the added value. |
| Canadian Goods and Services Tax (GST) and Provincial Sales Tax (PST) | In Canada, the federal government assesses a GST. The provincial governments assess a PST. The tax rates vary from province to province and are calculated using the value of the goods or the value plus GST. |

Tax types are not exclusive to a single country. For example, VAT is used worldwide and encompasses a variety of value added taxes, such as:

- IVA in Italy
- TVA in Belgium
- GST in Singapore

A/P Cash Forecasting is a DREAM Writer program that generates a Cash Summarization table (F0032). The information in this table consists of:

- Total amount of all open vouchers
- Due dates of open vouchers
- Amount required to pay vouchers

The Cash Summarization table contains summary information from G/L, A/P, and A/R. The cash type designates the system in which the information originated. A cash type is alphanumeric and can be up to five characters. The default cash type for A/P records is 04. JD Edwards World recommends that you use the same cash type each time you run the program. If you run the program again with a different cash type, there will be two sets of A/P information in the Cash Summarization table.

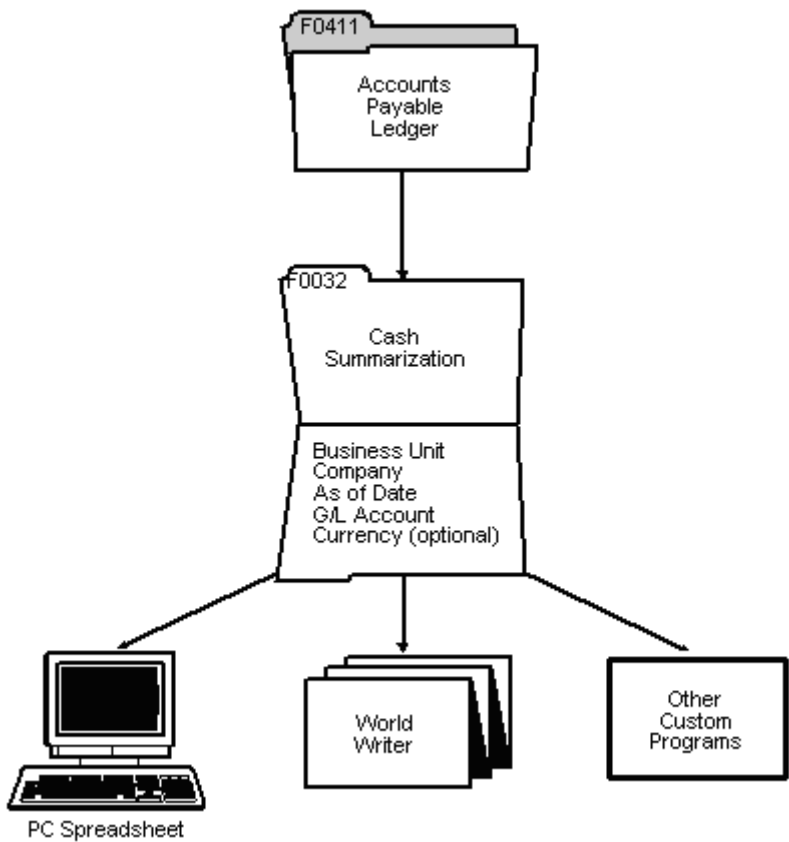
You can use World Writer to view the information created by this program. The information can also be downloaded to a standard spreadsheet program or used by custom programs to perform cash analysis.

When you run A/P cash forecasting, the system:

- Consolidates open vouchers from the A/P Ledger table (F0411).
- Summarizes information by business unit, company, due date, and currency.
- Deletes existing records in the Cash Summarization table with the cash type you specify in a processing option.
- Updates the Cash Summarization table with the new information.

83.2 About Batch Voucher Processing

In order to use the process, you must write a custom program to load A/P transaction information from your system into the F0411Z1 file and corresponding distribution information into the F0911Z1 file. Batch Voucher Processing will edit the information entered and create records in the A/P Detail file, F0411, and the General Ledger detail file, F0911. Additionally, records will be created in the A/P Payment Summary file, F0413, and the A/P Payment detail file, F0414, if you are processing paid vouchers.

Batch Voucher processing allows you to upload information from an outside system directly into JD Edwards application files. By using the Batch Voucher Processing for Accounts Payable transactions, you are ensured voucher records are created as consistently as if they were entered manually. Batch processing provides all the default information necessary to process vouchers successfully.

Batch voucher processing consists of:

- Reviewing batch vouchers
- Revising batch vouchers
- Processing batch vouchers
- Purging processed batch vouchers

83.2.1 What Happens During Batch Voucher Processing?

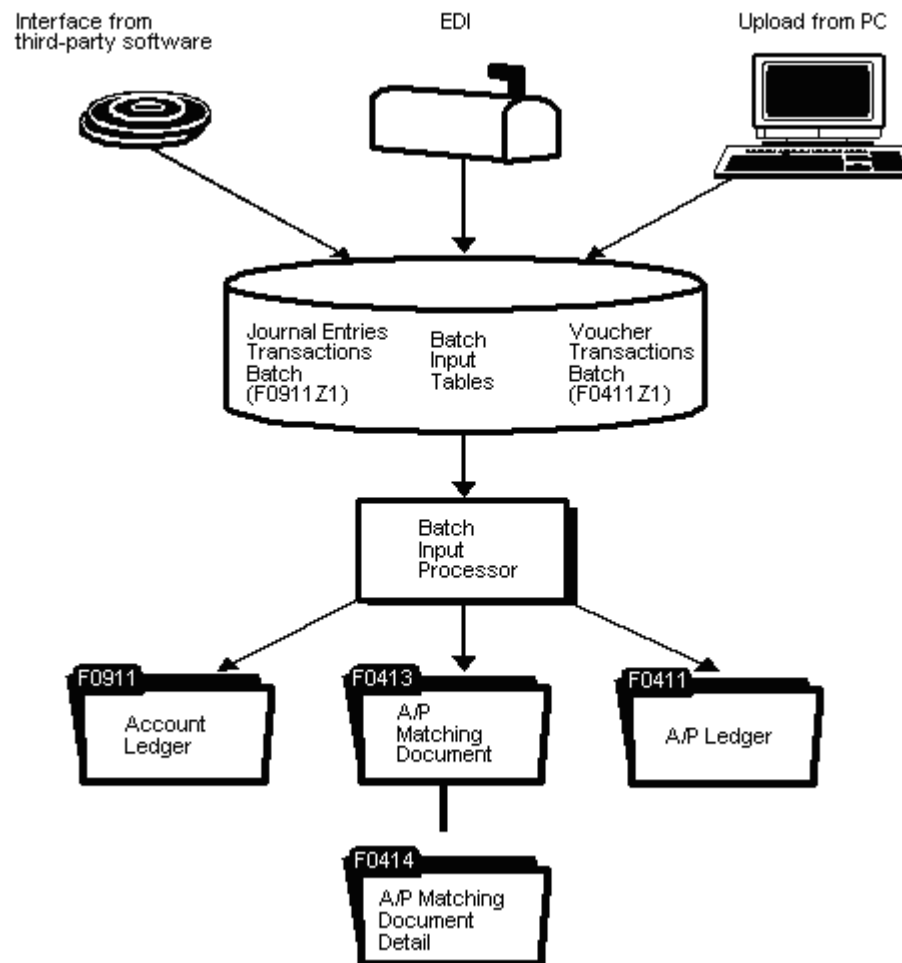
After you transfer, review, and revise batch vouchers, you process the batch of voucher, which creates the following:

- Voucher information in the A/P Ledger table (F0411)

- Associated accounting distribution information in the Account Ledger table (F0911)
- Payment information in the A/P Matching Document (F0413) and A/P Matching Document Detail (F0414) tables

| User ID | The source of the transaction. This can be a user ID, a workstation, the address of an external system, a node on a network, and so on. This field helps identify both the transaction and its point of origin. |
| Batch Number | The number that the transmitter assigns to the batch. During batch processing, the system assigns a new batch number to the JD Edwards World transactions for each control (user) batch number it finds. |

| Processed | <p>An indicator to mark records as successfully processed through the batch processing system. After a record has been marked as processed, it can no longer be updated through the batch processing program.</p> <p>Valid values are:</p> <p>0 – Unprocessed only</p> <p>1 – Processed and unprocessed</p> |
| From Date | <p>The beginning date in the date range. This is the date starting with which you want the system to display information.</p> <p><i>Form-specific information</i></p> <p>Enter the beginning date of the batches you want to review. This is the date that the transactions were entered into the batch input table, regardless of the original source or the method of transfer.</p> |
| Thru Date | <p>The ending date in the date range. This is the date through which you want the system to display information. If you leave this field blank, the system uses the current period.</p> |
| Transaction Number | <p>This is the number that an Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) transmitter assigns to a transaction. In a non-EDI environment, you can assign any number that is meaningful to you to identify a transaction within a batch. It can be the same as a JD Edwards World document number.</p> |

85.1 Working with Batch Vouchers

After you transfer vouchers to the JD Edwards World Accounts Payable system from another source, you might need to correct or delete them. Revise batch vouchers by manually entering a new one, or by changing or deleting an existing one.

Typically, you should not need to add a voucher to a batch. An exception is when you experience difficulty processing transactions from an interfaced system. To detect and correct any discrepancies, compare the voucher you manually enter to the voucher that the interface system creates.

When you revise a batch voucher, you update information in the Voucher Transactions - Batch (F0411Z1) and the Journal Entry Transactions - Batch (F0911Z1) tables.

85.2 Adding Vouchers to Batches

When you add a voucher to a batch, you supply limited information and the system supplies the remaining data. The transaction information you enter creates JD Edwards World vouchers in the batch A/P ledger and the batch account ledger. Vouchers remain in the batch table until you process and purge them from the Voucher Transactions - Batch table.

85.3 Creating Payment Information

You may process voucher payment information by loading the check number into the Payment Item/Number field (VLDOCM). Information in this field will automatically generate payment records in the F0413 and F0414 files. You do not need to activate a processing option.

Payment records must have a one-to-one relationship to vouchers. In other words, one check may not pay multiple vouchers. If you have this situation, you will need to process the payments manually.

85.4 Revising Unprocessed Batch Vouchers

When you find an error in an unprocessed batch voucher, change or delete it. In order to revise transaction information for a batch voucher, it must include a:

- Voucher type

- Voucher number
- Document company
- Company

86.2 Verifying Batch Voucher Information

When the system cannot process a batch voucher, it lists the voucher on an exceptions report. Use this report to detect the errors and verify batch voucher information.

The system produces this report in proof mode, prior to final processing.

86.3 Correcting Batch Vouchers

If any errors occur during the processing they will be noted on the edit report. The errors may be corrected and the batch reprocessed. If one transaction in the batch is in error, the entire batch will not process. Once the batch has been successfully processed, the field, processed (VLEDSP) will be updated from 0 to 1. These records will remain in the F0411Z1 and F0911Z1 files until they are purged.

To correct batch vouchers

1. Do one of the following:
 - Change the voucher data at its source and re-transmit the batch to the JD Edwards World Accounts Payable system
 - Update the individual batch records on Batch Voucher Revisions
2. Submit your batch of vouchers for processing again.

Processed Batch Voucher Purge is a DREAM Writer program that removes all processed vouchers from the Voucher Transactions - Batch table (F0411Z1). You can use Data Selection to limit which transactions or batches to be purged.

Purging only removes batch vouchers and does not affect A/P ledger (F0411) vouchers.

88.1 Objectives

88.2 About Payee Control

Payee control is an audit feature that helps to ensure that one person cannot commit and conceal an error or act of fraud of selected, critical transaction information. When changes are made to a transaction, this feature holds payments to the payee pending review and approval of changed information. One person enters the change and another approves it. Thus, the involvement of two people is required to affect changes to transactions.

Depending on how you set the processing options for the payee control server, you can control changes, or additions and changes to each of the following fields (and corresponding tables):

| Field | Description |
|------------------------------------|--|
| Alpha name (F0101) | Changes to a supplier's alpha name can divert the physical payment. The alpha name can be changed on Address Book Information and the Address Book Addition window. |
| Bank account number (F0030, F0411) | Changes to a bank account number can divert an electronic payment. The bank account number can be changed on Bank Account Cross Reference, the Bank Account Cross Reference window and at the voucher level. |
| Bank transit number (F0030) | Changes to a bank transit number can divert an electronic payment. The bank transit number can be changed on Bank Account Cross Reference and the Bank Account Cross Reference window. |
| Bank account type (F0030) | Changes to a bank account type can divert an electronic payment. The bank account type can be changed on Bank Account Cross Reference and the Bank Account Cross Reference window. |

| IBAN number (F0030) | Changes to the IBAN number assigned to a Supplier's Bank Account Information will affect the validation of The International Bank Account Number. The IBAN number can be changed on the Bank Account Cross Reference and the Bank Account Cross Reference window. |

When the system detects a change to a controlled field, it writes a record to the Payee Control table (F0450). This record includes the original information, the changed information, and the address book number of the person who made the change.

Until a change is approved, the system prevents automatic payments to a payee for whom controlled information has been changed. The programs for creating payment groups and writing payments do not process these payments. However, the system does not prevent you from writing manual payments.

Payee control consists of:

- Reviewing and approving changes to controlled data
- Printing changes to controlled data
- Purging approved payee control records

88.2.1 Example: How Payee Control Works

In this example, Gourmet & More is set up as follows:

Supplier number = 4010

Alternate payee number = 4010

You add a voucher for supplier number 4010 and enter an alternate payee number of 5910. If you have the payee control feature activated, the system creates a payee control record because the alternate payee numbers (4010 and 5910) do not match. This record must be approved by another person before payment can be issued.

- Convert Supplier Master currencies
- Update Supplier Company/BU information

As part of your cash management procedures, you might want to see the total vouchered amount for a supplier. To see accurate totals, update the supplier's year-to-date (YTD) voucher amounts. Generally, you do this either monthly or at the end of a calendar or fiscal year as part of your system-wide annual close.

93.1 Updating YTD Voucher Amounts

Navigation

From **Accounts Payable (G04)**, enter 27

From **A/P Advanced & Technical Operations (G0431)**, choose **Update YTD Voucher Amount**

When you run Update YTD Amount, P04820, the system does the following for all suppliers across all companies based on the beginning and ending date you specify:

- Calculates total voucher amounts from the A/P Ledger table (F0411)
- Updates the following in the Supplier Master table (F0401):
 - Year-to-date voucher amounts
 - Prior year-end voucher amounts

Updating YTD Voucher Amounts is a DREAM Writer process.

93.1.1 How It Works

The program uses beginning and ending G/L dates entered in processing options 1 and 2 in conjunction with a method entered in processing option 4 to update the file.

93.1.1.1 Computation Method 1

This method uses the dates entered in the processing options to calculate the prior year vouchered amounts and update the Amount Vouchered PYE field; therefore it is critical that A/P transactions from the prior year exist in your environment. Any transactions with G/L dates after those entered in the processing options will have amounts updated in the Vouchered YTD field.

For example, if the current year is 2018 and I wish to calculate vouchered year-to-date amounts (based on a calendar year), I would enter a beginning date of 1/01/17 and an ending date of 12/31/17. These dates identify the prior year, so all transactions after 12/31/17 will be updated for the current year. If I entered dates beginning with 1/01/18 and ending 12/31/18, the Amount Vouchered PYE field would be updated and any transactions after 12/31/18 would be updated in the Amount Vouchered YTD field.

You may run this process as often as desired, but it can only be accurate if A/P vouchers between the beginning date range to the current date have not been purged from the A/P Detail file (F0411).

93.1.1.2 Computation Method 2

This method assumes that transactions from the prior year have been purged or are missing. You still enter the dates of the prior fiscal year, but the program uses the information differently. Since there aren't any records for the prior year, the program calculates the Vouchered YTD amount by adding the amounts of vouchers with G/L date after the Thru Date (entered in the processing options), then subtracts this total from the existing Amount Vouchered YTD total. The result is updated in the Amount Vouchered PYE field. The Amount Vouchered YTD field is simply replaced with the newly calculated year-to-date amount.

For example, my supplier, ABC Company, has a current Amount Vouchered YTD total of \$10,000 (since the last time the program was run). My company is on a calendar year for 2018, and the From and Thru Dates are entered as 01/01/17 and 12/31/17, respectively. All the vouchers with a GL date after 12/31/17 would comprise my new year-to-date amount (let's use \$6500). The new prior year amount is calculated by subtracting \$6500 from the original \$10,000. Therefore, the new Amount Vouchered PYE is \$3500 and the new Amount Vouchered YTD is \$6500. Of course if I had been on the system for more than two years, the Amount Vouchered PYE would include all years prior to the current year.

Beware! If you run this process more than once (using Computation Method 2) you will end up with zero in your Amount Vouchered PYE field.

If you change specific information for a supplier record or a voucher category code, you should update your A/P ledger to ensure that you are working with current information in the A/P ledger (F0411).

94.1.1 What Happens if You Do Not Update Approver?

This example illustrates a problem you might encounter if you do not update the approver number for existing vouchers in the A/P ledger.

You set up Dominique Abbott (address book number 4002) as the approver for A & D Parts (supplier number 4005) vouchers. You set a processing option to display the Approver Number field on Voucher Logging Entry. On June 1, you enter two vouchers for A & D Parts. Dominique Abbott is the approver for these vouchers. On June 2, Dominique Abbott leaves the company without redistributing the vouchers you entered.

Dominique Abbott is replaced by Melvyn Easter (address book number 6000). On Supplier Master Information, you change the approver number for vouchers for A & D Parts from 4002 (Dominique Abbott) to 6000 (Melvyn Easter). On June 10, you enter another voucher for A & D Parts. Melvyn Easter is the approver for this voucher.

On June 15, Melvyn Easter is ready to redistribute the logged vouchers. The following shows the information in the A/P Ledger table.

| Date | Transaction Records | Approver Number |
|----------|---------------------|-----------------------|
| 06/01/98 | PV 3285 | 4002 Dominique Abbott |
| 06/01/98 | PV 4267 | 4002 Dominique Abbott |
| 06/10/98 | PV 5342 | 6000 Melvyn Easter |

Melvyn Easter enters his approver number (6000) on Voucher J. E. Redistribution. The system displays all vouchers that have Melvyn Easter (number 6000) as approver depending on the following:

- If you do not update approver information, Voucher J. E. Redistribution only displays PV 5342 because this is the only voucher that has Melvyn Easter (number 6000) as approver. PV 3285 and PV 4267 still have Dominique Abbott as approver.
- If you update approver information, Voucher J. E. Redistribution displays all three vouchers because the program has read the supplier record for A & D Parts and changed the approver for all open vouchers to 6000 (Melvyn Easter).

Note: Running Update A/P Records with A/B Information will automatically update both the Approver number and the value for category code 7 unless you set the processing option for P04820 to protect category code 7 from being updated.

94.1.2 Updating Voucher Category Codes

After you set up voucher category codes, any program that you use that updates the accounts payable ledger automatically updates the corresponding category code values for vouchers. You run Update A/P Ledger with A/B Information if you make any of the following changes:

- You change one of the values for an Address Book category code (AC01-AC30). For example, the category code 05 is Manufacturing Materials. Within that code, you change the value from PRC (Processing Chemicals) to PPK (Product Packaging) for your supplier.
- You change the UDC value (01/01 - 01/30) for a category code. For example, you change the UDC description for category code 05 (UDC table 01/05) for Manufacturing Materials to Materials to Manufacture.
- You change the user defined code table assigned to a data dictionary item in the YC01-YC10 range. For example, you change YC05 to link to user defined code 01/06 instead of 01/09.

When you run Update A/P with A/B Information, you specify in a processing option which voucher category codes that you want to update. This program updates the voucher category codes from the Address Book Master (F0101) to the Accounts Payable Ledger (F0411).

95.1 Purging Closed A/P Records

From **A/P Advanced & Technical Operations (G0431)**, choose **Purge Closed A/P Records**

To conserve system disk space, purge your paid A/P records periodically. Run the Purge Closed A/P Records program (P04800) to reduce the number of A/P transactions within your active A/P Ledger files, and to update those records to history in the A/P Purge files. Disk space should be evaluated prior to executing the purge program. Since you will initially be copying records from the A/P Detail files (F0411, F0413 and F0414) to the A/P Purge files (F0411P, F0413P and F0414P) you will be utilizing more disk space until the purged files can be removed from the drive and transaction files can be reorganized.

Be careful not to purge A/P ledger information that may be needed by other systems, such as Procurement.

The system locates, copies, and purges all A/P records (F0411, F0413, F0414) with a G/L date that is on or before the date entered in the processing option.

When you purge A/P records, you run a DREAM Writer that:

- Removes paid transactions from the A/P Ledger, A/P Matching Document, and A/P Matching Document Detail tables if:
 - The G/L date of the transaction is on or before the "as of" date set in a processing option.
 - The open amount is zero.
- Removes A/P payment summary information from the A/P Matching Document table if the payment date of a record is on or before the payment date set in a processing option
- Copies purged records to the following tables:
 - Purge-A/P Ledger (F0411P)

- Purge-A/P Matching Document (F0413P)
- Purge-A/P Matching Document Detail (F0414P)

For reporting purposes, you can keep these tables on your system or copy them to another medium. If you keep them on your system and you purge again, the system adds newly purged records to the existing tables.

After you purge A/P records, contact your System Administrator to run Reorganize Files. This reorders the remaining records, maximizes system disk space, and speeds system processing.

Note: If the voucher or payment records have generic text associated with them, the system does not copy generic text to another file; it just deletes the associated records.

To maintain file integrity among the F0411, F0413 and F0414 files, the system must evaluate each voucher and payment record independently:

- If a voucher does not meet the purge criteria, none of its corresponding payment records are purged.
- If a payment does not meet the purge criteria, none of the vouchers it paid are purged.

By purging only completed sets of records, the system does not orphan records in any file.

The system uses the following criteria to determine purge eligibility for each voucher and payment transaction:

- The G/L date is less than or equal to the date entered in the processing option of the purge program.

Note: The payment/check date (DMTJ) is the G/L date of the payment record.

- The pay status (PST) of the voucher is P and the open amount (AAP) is blank.
- The posted code (POST for F0411 and F0414, ISTP for F0413) on the transaction is D.

To prevent the system from purging recurring vouchers, set the Number of Payments to equal (EQ) ZERO in the data selection. To avoid unpredictable results while purging, do not change the following data sequence:

1. Document Company
2. Document Number
3. Document Type

95.1.5 Working with Purge Files

If you have the disk space, you might want to purge records without removing them from your system. This allows you to report on those records, if necessary. Since records for multiple years could be written to the F0411P, F0413P and F0414P files, you may wish to rename this file to differentiate it from A/P transactions purged for a different date. If the files remain in your library and the purge is run again, the system appends the newly purged records to the existing purge files.

Important! One risk to appending newly purged records to existing purge files is that the system might return a duplicate key error on the payment ID. When payment records are purged, the system reassigns those payment IDs to new payment records. If these new payment records are subsequently purged and appended to existing purge files, this returns an error and does not complete the purge. To avoid duplicate key errors, do one of the following:

- If you want to keep the purge files in your production library, rename them. For example, use the format F0411Pmmyy, where mm = the month and yy = the year.
- Copy the purge files to a different library.
- Copy the purge files to a tape or CD.

After you successfully purge transactions, there are several related tasks to complete. You might need to contact your system administrator to perform some of these tasks:

- Develop a plan to purge related F0911 records. If you have not purged the corresponding Account Detail (F0911) records, the system will report an out of balance condition on all of the purged batches when you run the A/P Orig Doc to

G/L Batch (P04701) and A/P Payments to G/L by Batch (P04702) integrity reports.

Either purge the corresponding F0911 transactions (batch types V, K, M, and W) or use Data Selection in the integrity reports to process transactions for specific years only.

- Reorganize the transaction files. The system does not automatically regain the disk space left from the purged records. To regain this space, you must run the Reorganize Files program (P98999), which reorganizes the data in the file to remove the used space and rebuilds the file indices.
- Copy the purged files (F0411P, F0413P and F0414P) to another library or to a tape or CD.
- Clear the purged files, if they are copied to another medium.

95.2 Purging Approved Payee Control Records

After you approve changes to controlled data, purge the control records.

Run version ZJDE0024 of the generic purge program (P00PURGE). This program selects and purges records in the Payee Control table (F0450). Purging control records removes the audit trail. This is a batch program.

95.2.1 Processing Options for P00PURGE

SAVE PURGED RECORDS

1. Enter a '1' to save the purged records to a special purge library. (Default of blanks will NOT save any purged records.)

This processing option allows you to retain the purged data in a file that is generated in a special purge library. The system generates the library name by concatenating JD Edwards World to the date on which the purge is run. The format of the date conforms to the format that the system uses, without date separators. For example, if you purge the payee control file on May 1, 2007, the system generates the library, JDE050107. The system creates the purge file with the same name that it uses for the library.

REORGANIZE FILE

This processing option allows you to automatically reorganize the purged file (F0450) to regain the disk space. The system does not remove the space regained from purging records until the file is reorganized.

B.1 Multi-Currency Option "Off"

If the multi-currency option is not activated, the decimals associated with specific amount fields are determined by the Display Decimals defined in the data dictionary by your System Administrator.

B.2 Multi-Currency Option "On"

This section discusses the effects of having multi-currency turned on.

B.2.1 "Units" Ledgers

Decimals for amounts representing associative units ledger types, such as BU and AU, are determined by the Display Decimals in the data dictionary.

B.2.2 "Amounts" Ledgers

Decimals for amounts other than units are determined as follows:

- Any transaction entered with a currency different from the currency assigned to the company of the account being used is considered "foreign."
- The decimal position is determined by the transaction's currency code.
- The number of decimals for a currency is defined in the Currency Codes table (F0013).

All ledger types other than CA or any units ledger type, as mentioned above, are considered "domestic" ledgers. The currency's decimal position is determined by the currency code assigned to the company of the account used. This allows multiple companies in the same environment to have different currencies in the AA ledger.

For example, Company 00100 is a U.S. dollar (USD) base currency company, and its AA ledger represents USD. Company 00002 has euros (EUR) as its base currency, and its AA ledger then represents EUR.

An exception to this rule occurs when a currency has been assigned to a ledger type in the user defined code list (09/LT). If the special handling code of a ledger type

contains a currency code, the decimals for the ledger are determined by that currency code.

For example, you have a company with a base domestic currency of euros (EUR). However, you want to establish a budget in U.S. dollars (USD). You can set up a ledger with USD in the Special Handling Code of the user defined code list (09/LT). Any entry made to that ledger is considered USD and not EUR.

The designation of a currency code for a ledger type should only be done as an exception. A currency code designation for a ledger type applies to all companies using that ledger. Therefore, you should not indicate a currency for the AA or CA ledger.

B.2.3 Totals on Reports

The decimal position for totals on reports follow the same rules as presented above. The currency code defined for the ledger type is the first determining factor. If that is blank, the currency of the company to which the last account is associated determines the decimal position. For summary amounts representing "foreign" currency in the CA ledger, the following rules apply:

- F0902/F1202 - Balance reports use the "denominated in" Currency Code field on the record.
- F0911 - Transaction reports use the account currency code. If it is blank, the transaction currency code of the last record is used.
- F0311/F0411 - Customer and Supplier Ledger reports use the currency code on the last record. In some cases, reports have been changed to indicate that a total is not applicable if multiple currencies are summed. You would then see "****N/A****" used instead of a total.

B.2.4 Monetary (Currency-Specific) Accounts

If an account has been assigned a specific currency code, transactions entered to that account must be in that currency. This rule applies to the AA and CA ledgers only. If other ledger types have been established, the monetary account restrictions do not apply.

Note: For monetary account revaluation purposes, a document type of JX overrides an edit that exists in programs so entry can be made directly to the AA ledger.

B.2.5 Technical Considerations

The Account Balances table (F0902) contains two currency codes:

- CRCD - This code represents the original transaction currency.
- CRCX - This code represents the denominated currency.

The following table illustrates the use of the CRCD and CRCX fields. The Account Balances table can optionally be posted in detail by the originating currency of the transaction.

For every transaction currency, you will have a corresponding balance. If this amount of detail is not required, your account balances can be summarized into one AA and one CA ledger balance for each account. (This does not consider the effect of posting by subledger to an account.)

C.1 Overview

To successfully upload batch vouchers from outside sources such as PC data entry, third party or customer systems, or electronic data interchanges (EDI), to the Voucher Transactions - Batch Table (F0411Z1), you must enter data into certain fields.

Table 1 in this appendix lists the fields required by the Batch Voucher Processing program for uploading. Tables 2 and 3 list optional fields that might be useful to you in organizing the data, but are not required by the program. Table 4 lists fields that the system ignores during the upload process. The functional server does not pass ignored fields to the JD Edwards World fields.

Each field in tables 1-3 is shown as required, conditional, or optional, as follows:

- R = Required. You must enter data in this field to successfully upload the transactions to the Voucher Transactions - Batch table.
- C = Conditional. Under certain conditions, you must enter data into this field to successfully upload the transactions to the Voucher Transactions - Batch table. The conditions are listed in the table under Explanation.
- O = Optional. You may enter data in this field.

Other information in the tables includes:

- Value. The valid input value is edited. If no value is listed, you may enter any value that meets the field's alpha/numeric specifications.

If the table shows DD as the value, the system takes valid values from the data dictionary specifications for the data item. The system can validate data dictionary specifications against user defined codes, allowed values, or upper/lower allowed values.

If a file or user defined code (xx/xx) is listed in the table, the system validates the value you enter against that file or user defined code.

- Default. The default value that the system assigns if you leave the field blank. If no default is listed, the system uses the initialization value for the data item, with

blanks for alpha fields and zeros for numeric fields. If DD is listed, the system uses the default value for the data item from the data dictionary. You can revise some of the defaults through the functional server processing options (XT0411Z1).

- **Formats. Julian Date.** The JD Edwards World Julian date format is CYYDDD, where C is the century (1900=0, 2000=1), YY is the year, and DDD is the day of the year. The different formats are:
 - **Numeric amounts.** The data dictionary shows amounts with a 0 data file decimals. The data item size includes the decimal values. For example, if the display decimals = 2, the file keeps \$5.50 as 550. If display decimals = 0, the file keeps \$1000 as 1000.
 - **Multi-currency.** If you are working in a multi-currency environment, the system uses the company or account display decimals for ledger type AA (domestic), and the transaction currency code for ledger type CA (foreign).

Other special format considerations appear under Explanation for the specific field. If no format is listed, use the data dictionary specifications for the data item to enter the field.

D.1 Overview

The time it takes to locate vouchers on Supplier Ledger Inquiry grows in proportion to the number of records in the system. Supplier Ledger Inquiry uses logical files whenever possible to speed processing time. You can, however, set up the selection criteria to use IBM's Structured Query Language (SQL).

The following table states which combinations are supported by the use of a logical file. The combination of Fields Entered, Paid Value and Sequence will determine which logical files can be used for your search. Combinations other than what is presented below will automatically use SQL to retrieve the information, if SQL processing has not been prevented by the processing option.

Note: If the processing option has been set to sequence by Net Due Date, Invoice Date or G/L date (2, 3 or 8) in descending order, SQL will be automatically used for these searches.

E.1 About Functional Servers

Several JD Edwards World programs access functional servers. The purpose of functional servers is to provide a central location for standard business rules about entering documents, such as vouchers, invoices, and journal entries. These business rules establish the following:

- Data dictionary default values
- Field edits and valid values
- Error processing
- Relationships between fields or applications

The advantages of a functional server are:

- It reduces maintenance of entry programs because edit rules reside in one central location.
- You can standardize documents across all applications because you create them using the same business rules.
- Generally, the user interface (appearance and interaction) of a form is now separate from how a program works.

To set up business rules for an entry program

The steps for setting up business rules for an entry program are:

1. Create a DREAM Writer version for a specific functional server program (for example, XT0411Z1 for voucher entry).
2. Set the processing options within the version according to your company requirements.
3. Specify the version you want the entry program to use in the processing options for that entry program.

You can have all your entry programs use the same DREAM Writer version (and thus, use the same rules) or you can set up different DREAM Writer versions. JD Edwards World provides DREAM Writer version ZJDE0001 as the default functional server version for your entry programs.

Caution: Only the person responsible for system-wide setup should make changes to the functional server version. For more information about how to set up DREAM Writer versions, see the *JD Edwards World Technical Foundation Guide*.

F.1 Procurement to Accounts Payable Relationship

When you receive the goods and services on a purchase order, a liability is created in the Accounts Payable system. If you perform government accounting, you might recognize the liability for an encumbrance at the time of purchase order entry instead of at the time of receipt.

After you create a voucher for a purchase order, all information in the Procurement and Accounts Payable systems should correspond. The general ledger account in which the system stores amounts received but not vouchered should equal zero.

When you choose to use Procurement for Accounts Payable, you should involve representatives from both departments as you set up your system and process transactions. Both representatives should be thoroughly familiar with their respective systems.

The following graphic depicts the interface and file interactions between the Accounts Payable system and the Procurement system (and Inventory Management system, if applicable).

Note: If you must change or void a voucher, you must do so in the Procurement system. Changes you make to a voucher in the Accounts Payable system will not update the Procurement system.

F.2 The Procurement System

The JD Edwards World Procurement system accommodates a diverse range of purchasing activities for:

- Replenishing inventory
- Acquiring materials used in completing projects
- Charging purchased goods and services to specific departments, jobs, or cost centers

Procurement involves order entry through actual payment of the goods and services that you receive. You must carefully plan the cycle through which you intend to process your orders and set up the Procurement system accordingly. Set up considerations include order types, line types, and order activity rules.

You can perform activities that are specific to your procurement operation, such as special orders processing, approval processing, and supplier management. A variety of features are available to help you process orders in a fast and effective manner. Extensive review and reporting capabilities can help you make decisions about current and future purchasing strategies.

F.3 System Integration

The Procurement system works in conjunction with JD Edwards World accounting, distribution/logistics, and manufacturing systems to cover all aspects of processing purchase orders.

The Procurement system accommodates Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) so that you can send and receive documents electronically.

The following graphic illustrates how the Procurement system integrates with the Accounts Payable system and other JD Edwards World accounting and distribution/logistics systems.

F.3.1 General Accounting and Accounts Payable

The Procurement system integrates with the General Accounting and Accounts Payable systems. With the use of Automatic Accounting Instructions (AAIs) and user-input account numbers, the system relays pertinent transaction information to your accounting systems.

The Procurement system retrieves supplier payment information, tax information, and so forth from the Accounts Payable system.

F.3.2 Address Book

The Procurement system works in close coordination with the Address Book system to retrieve:

- Supplier address information
- Ship-to address information
- Warehouse address information
- User identification information

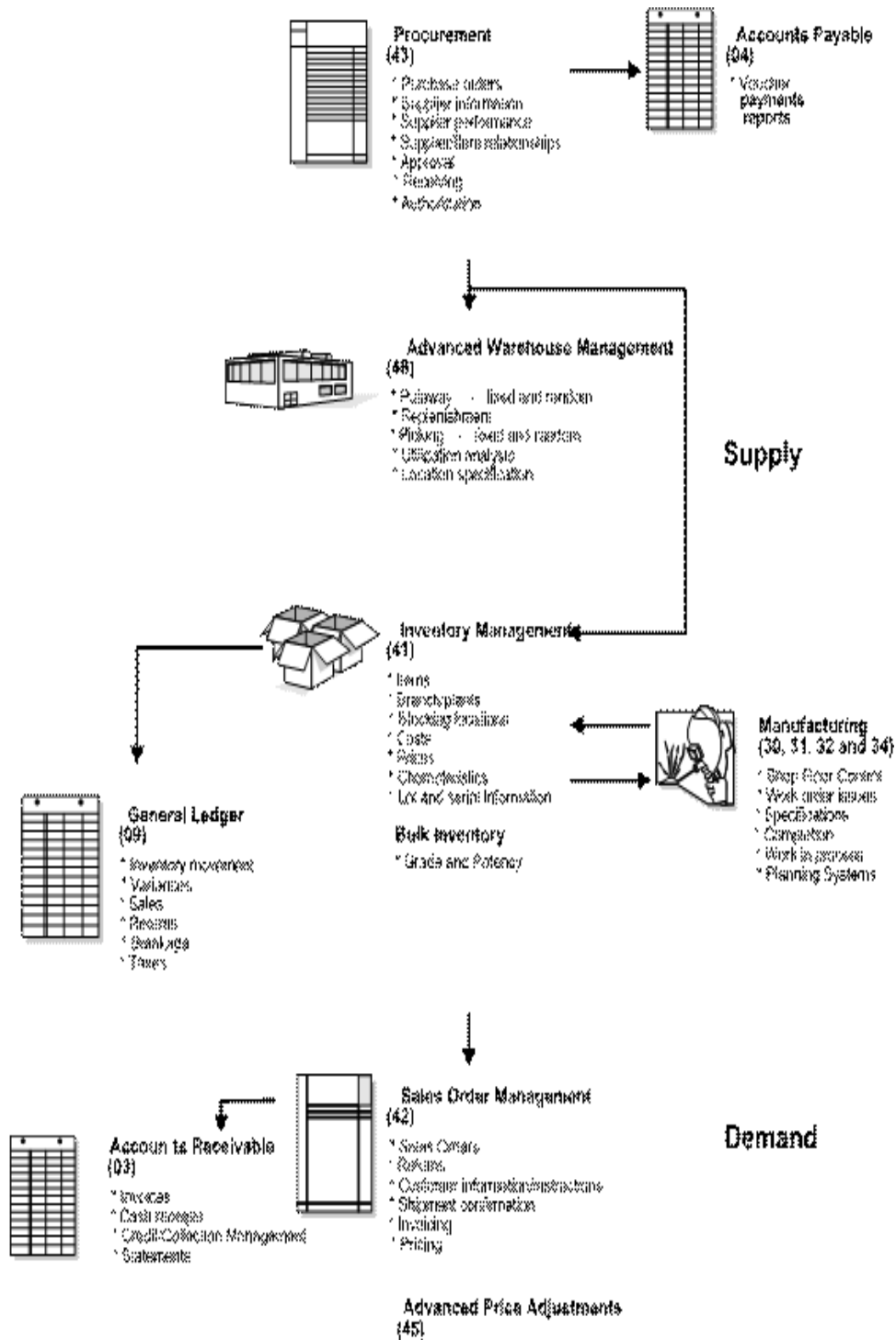
F.3.3 Distribution/Logistics

Your organization might integrate the JD Edwards World Procurement system with the JD Edwards World Inventory Management system. This integration involves the validation and exchange of information that pertains to inventory items.

Other JD Edwards World distributions/logistics systems with which the Procurement system integrates include:

- Advanced Warehouse Management
- Sales Order Management
- Forecasting
- Distribution Requirements Planning

The following graphic illustrates how the Procurement system interacts with other systems to meet supply and demand requirements in a stock based distribution/logistics environment. (System numbers are in parenthesis.)



F.3.4 Manufacturing

Your Procurement system can interact with several JD Edwards World manufacturing systems to help process parts availability, work orders, forecasting and planning, product costing, and so forth.

F.3.5 Other JD Edwards World Systems

Other systems with which your Procurement system might interact include:

- Fixed Assets
- Job Cost

F.3.6 Electronic Data Interchange

EDI is the computer-to-computer exchange of business transactions, such as purchase orders, invoices, and shipping notices, in a standard format that most computers can process.

The Electronic Commerce system consists of JD Edwards World System 47, which is the application interface containing interface files and programs. System 47 works with a third party translation software that translates EDI standard data into a JD Edwards World file format, so that the JD Edwards World application software can manage the data.

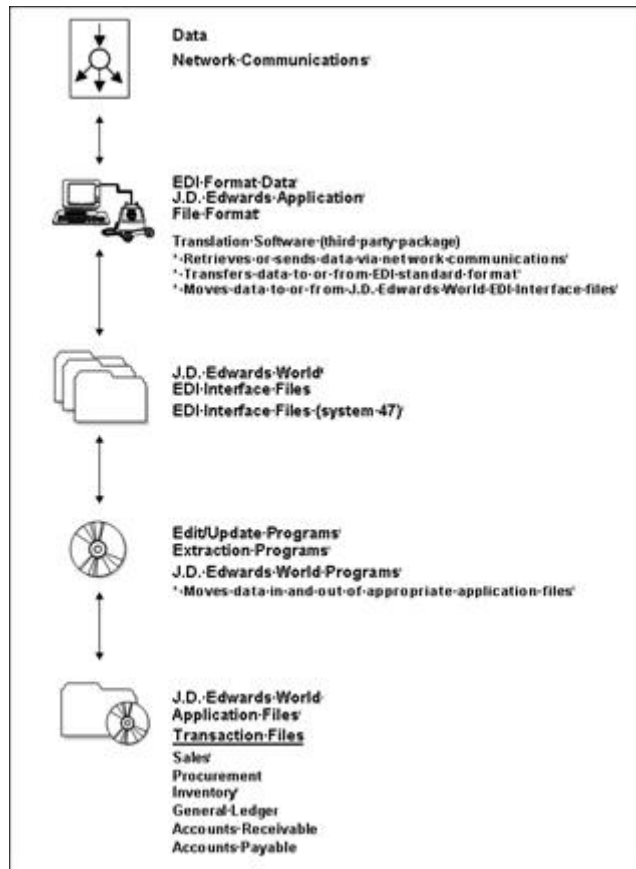
F.3.6.1 Processing EDI Documents

When you receive documents, your third party translator software:

- Retrieves the data via network communications
- Translates the data from EDI standard format to JD Edwards World application file format
- Moves the translated data into the JD Edwards World EDI interface files

The JD Edwards World Electronic Commerce system then moves the data into the appropriate application files.

When you send documents, the system performs the procedures above in reverse order. The following graphic illustrates the EDI process:

F.4 Features, Terms, and Concepts

This section discussed features, terms and concepts.

F.4.1 Procurement Methods

Based on your business objectives, the system provides two different methods by which you can procure goods and services:

- Purchasing for inventory
- Purchasing to the general ledger

F.4.1.1 Purchasing for Inventory

Your organization might manage an inventory or stock-based operation, which includes:

- Retail items for sale to customers
- Items for internal consumption
- Manufactured items
- Repair and maintenance items

You must use the purchasing for inventory method to purchase goods for a stock-based environment. This method enables full integration between the Procurement system and the Inventory Management system. You purchase items based on the item numbers that exist in the Inventory Management system. The Procurement system:

- Validates that items exist in the Inventory Management system
- Retrieves item information from the Inventory Management system, such as item descriptions, units costs, units of measure, and so forth
- Updates item information in the Inventory Management system, such as on-hand balances, unit costs, and so forth

In a stock-based environment, item costs are classified as inventory on the balance sheet until you issue the items out of inventory. If you sell the items, they become cost of goods sold. If you use the items internally, you determine the expense account to which to charge the items at the time of issuance.

F.4.1.2 Purchasing to the General Ledger

Your organization might purchase goods, materials, or services that are used internally or are subsequently charged to outside parties. Purchases might apply to a:

- Job
- Program
- Internal consumption

- Repair and maintenance
- Parts chargeable on a work order

You use the purchasing to general ledger method to charge purchases against general ledger account numbers. Each account number represents a job, program, project, or so on. This method accommodates non-stock and services and expenditures based environments.

You can optionally use the purchasing to general ledger method to purchase items that exist in the Inventory Management system. The Procurement system validates item numbers and retrieves item descriptions and costs from the Inventory Management system, but does not update item balance information.

Tracking commitments or encumbrances is a common practice in non-stock and services and expenditures based environments. A commitment or encumbrance is the recognition of a future obligation. If you purchase to the general ledger, you can have the system track commitment or encumbrance amounts when you enter purchase orders.

F.4.2 Purchasing Environments

The Procurement system provides three different environments in which you can perform your purchasing activities:

- Stock based
- Non-stock based
- Services and expenditures based

The stock based environment is designed to accommodate those who perform purchasing to inventory. The non-stock and services and expenditures based environments accommodate those who perform purchasing to the general ledger.

You choose the environment that is most conducive to your operation. For example, the stock based environment enables you to perform activities common to inventory operations, such as supplier management and rebate processing. The non-stock and services and expenditures based environments enable you to track encumbrances.

Several activities are common among all three environments. However, menus and screens are set up differently to accommodate processes and procedures for each specific type of operation.

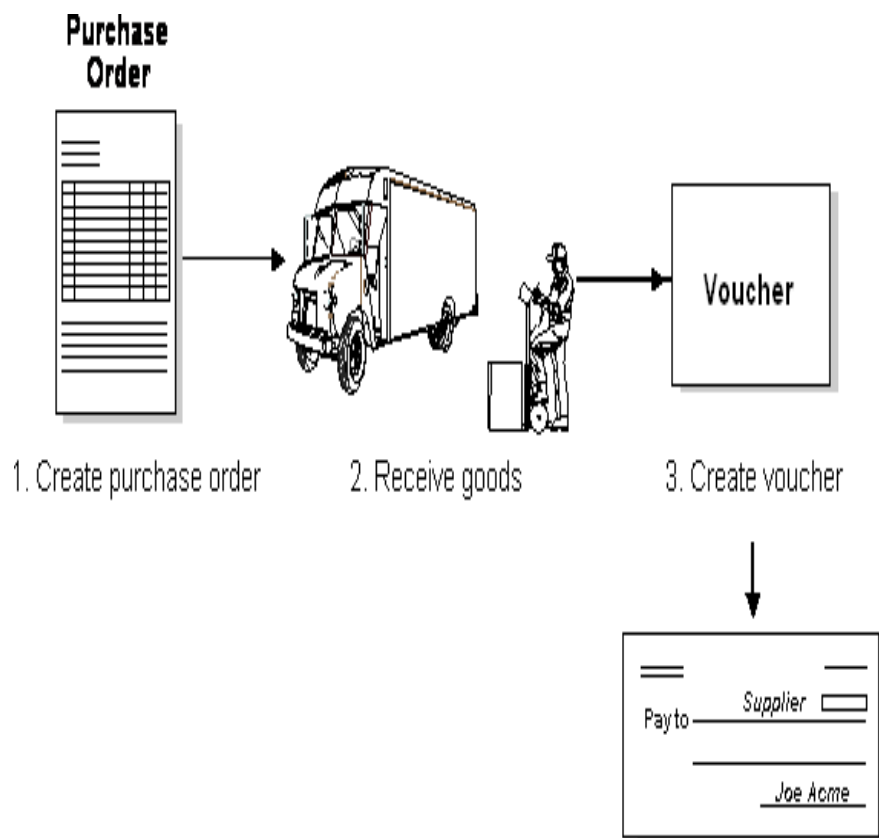
The environments you use depend entirely on the objectives of your organization. Some organizations might choose to use all environments, while other organizations might choose only to use one environment.

F.5 Detailed Information

F.5.1 Purchase Order Processing Cycle

The purchase order processing cycle consists of three primary steps:

- Creating a purchase order
- Receiving the goods or services
- Creating a voucher to pay for the goods or services



After you create a purchase order, you can use one of two methods to receive the goods or services:

- Enter receipt information on the system (formal receiving process or three-way match)
- Have the system automatically generate receipt information when you create a voucher (informal receiving process or two-way match)

If you purchase for inventory, you must use the formal receiving process. If you purchase to the general ledger, you can use either the formal or informal receiving process.

The method you use to create vouchers depends on your receiving process. If you use the formal receiving process, you can create vouchers:

- Individually, by verifying that invoice information matches receipt information
- In batch mode, using existing receipt records

If you perform informal receipts, you must compare invoice information to the original purchase order to create a voucher.

The following graphic shows the files that are affected as a purchase order flows through the purchasing process.

Each time you enter an order, you must provide details about the items and services that you want to order. For each item or service, you must enter a line of detail which describes the order, including the quantity and cost.

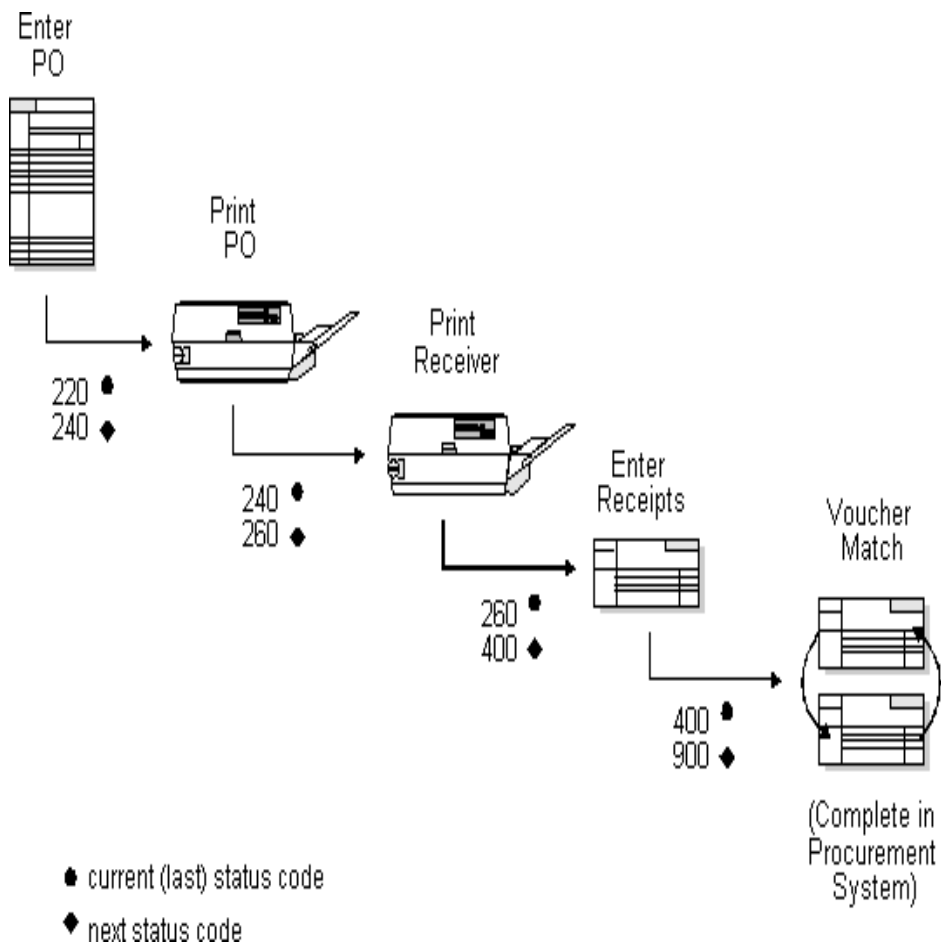
You must specify a line type for each detail line that you enter. The line type indicates how the system manages information on the detail line. For example, you might have a line type of S (for stock items) to indicate that the system is to increase the quantity

of the item in the Inventory Management system and reflect the cost in the general ledger and the Accounts Payable system.

You must set up order processing cycles to indicate how the system is to process the detail lines on each of your order types (purchase orders, requisition, blanket orders, and so forth). For example, you can set up the processing cycle for purchase orders as follows:

- Create purchase order
- Print purchase order
- Print purchase receiver
- Receive goods or services
- Create voucher

You use order activity rules to set up the required steps for a processing cycle and to indicate the progression of the steps. You must assign a current and next status code to each step in the process. These codes identify the current status of an order detail line and the next step to which the system advances the line.



For each processing cycle you set up, you must specify the order type and line type to which it applies. For example, the processing cycle shown above might only apply to purchase order detail lines to which you assign a line type of S.

F.5.2 Purchasing Terms

F.5.2.1 Commitments and Encumbrances

Commitments and encumbrances are recognitions of future obligations. Each time you enter a purchase order, you can track the resulting commitment or encumbrance amount. Such tracking is common to non-stock and services and expenditures based purchasing operations.

F.5.2.2 Landed Costs

Landed costs are costs that exceed the purchase price of an inventory item. For example, a landed cost might be a commission, a brokerage fee, a freight charge, and so on.

F.5.2.3 Last-In Cost

The last-in cost is a costing method used for items. It is the last cost that a supplier charged you for a certain item. For example, if the cost of Item A was 5.00 the last time you received it, the last-in cost for Item A is 5.00.

F.5.2.4 Weighted Average Cost

The weighted average cost is the most common costing method used for items outside of a manufacturing environment. It is the total cost of the items you purchase divided by the quantity. For example:

| Quantity on Order | Purchase Cost | Total Cost |
|--|---------------|------------|
| 4 | 10.00 | 40.00 |
| 10 | 10.50 | 105.00 |
| 5 | 10.25 | 51.25 |
| 19 | | \$196.25 |
| 196.25 / 19 = 10.33 \$10.33 = total weighted average cost | | |

F.5.2.5 Standard Cost

Unlike the weighted average or last-in cost for an item, a standard cost remains consistent unless you manually change it. Standard costs are commonly used in manufacturing environments to determine the cost of goods. You might assign a standard cost to an item when you depend on a certain set price to build a product.

F.5.3 Optional Procurement Activities

Optional procurement activities you can perform include:

- Creating multiple purchase orders simultaneously
- Ensuring that orders are approved prior to processing
- Creating special orders, such as:
 - Quotes
 - Requisitions
 - Blankets

- Non-stock orders
- Place orders on hold
- Performing commitments or applying encumbrances
- Obtaining and comparing price quotes for items and services
- Tracking changes to purchase orders
- Applying tolerances or budgeting
- Setting up and tracking rebates to which you are entitled
- Monitoring items from the moment they leave a supplier's warehouse
- Managing relationships between suppliers and items
