Introduction

This document assists administrators in configuring Oracle Identity Manager (OIM) to use with P6 EPPM. OIM is an enterprise identity management system that centrally administers user accounts and access privileges. It manages the entire user identity lifecycle to help your organization meet changing business and regulatory requirements and provides essential auditing, reporting, and compliance functionality.

About Connecting Oracle Identity Manager 10g to P6

The OIM connector includes a resource directory with all user attributes and two files—a JAR file to communicate with P6 EPPM and a dynamically generated XML file representing P6 users and their properties.

As an administrator, you can take advantage of the OIM connector to provision P6 EPPM users. With the help of P6 EPPM Web Services, the OIM connector helps you administer the complete user identity life cycles of P6 users. As a primary example, when you create a new user in OIM, it will also create a new user with the same user login name, password, email address, and personal name in the P6 EPPM database.

The core attributes and operations supported by the connector are listed below.

Attributes

The following user attributes are managed:

- Login Name
- Password
- E-mail Address
- Personal Name

Operations

The following operations are supported:

- Create User: Add a new user in P6 via OIM.
- Modify User: Modify an attribute, such as an e-mail address or personal name, in P6 via OIM.
- Delete User: Remove a user in P6 via OIM.

Installing the OIM Applications

Follow the steps below to install OIM and the other applications needed to use OIM:

- Install Oracle Identity Manager (OIM). Refer to the following URL for documentation specific to this release: http://www.oracle.com/technetwork/documentation/oim1014-097544.html
- 2) Install P6 and P6 EPPM Web Services. Check that you have OIM, P6, and P6 EPPM Web Services up and running before moving on to the next step. P6 EPPM Web Services must be configured to run in cookie-based authentication mode.
- 3) Download the Oracle Identity Manager Connector for Primavera P6.
- 4) Extract the ZIP archive.
- 5) From the extracted zip, copy the following Primavera-P6-EPPM.properties files to the \oim\xellerate\connectorResources directory:
 - Primavera-P6-EPPM.properties
 - Primavera-P6-EPPM_de.properties
 - Primavera-P6-EPPM_en.properties
 - Primavera-P6-EPPM_en_US.properties
 - Primavera-P6-EPPM_es_MX.properties
 - Primavera-P6-EPPM fr.properties
 - Primavera-P6-EPPM_ja.properties
 - Primavera-P6-EPPM_pt_BR.properties
 - Primavera-P6-EPPM ru.properties
 - Primavera-P6-EPPM_zh_CN.properties
 - Primavera-P6-EPPM zh TW.properties
- 6) Copy primavera-p6eppm-prov.jar to the \oim\xellerate\JavaTasks directory.
- 7) Copy p6ws-jaxws-client.jar to the \oim\xellerate\ThirdParty directory.

Note: The p6ws-jaxws-client.jar is not included in the OIM Connector ZIP archive; it is in the P6 EPPM Web Services client folder (for example, P6EPPM_HOME\ws\client).

- 8) Save **PrimaveraP6EPPMProv.xml** to a local drive.
- 9) (Only if applicable; otherwise, skip this step) If using the WebLogic application server, edit the **xlStartWLS** file:

In Windows:

- a. Edit the xlStartWLS.cmd file.
- b. Add XLHOME\ThirdParty\p6ws-jaxws-client.jar as part of the EXT_POST_CLASSPATH.

For example:

set EXT POST CLASSPATH=XLHOME\ThirdParty\p6ws-jaxws-client.jar

where XLHOME is your XL home directory (for example, C:\oracle\Middleware\Oracle_XL).

In UNIX:

- c. Edit the xIStartWLS.sh file.
- d. Add XLHOME/ThirdParty/p6ws-jaxws-client.jar as part of the EXT_POST_CLASSPATH. For example:

set EXT_POST_CLASSPATH=XLHOME/ThirdParty/p6ws-jaxws-client.jar where XLHOME is your XL home directory (for example, test/oracle/Middleware/Oracle_XL).

Configuring the OIM Application to Work with P6

Follow the steps below to configure OIM and the other applications needed to use OIM:

1) Login to the OIM sysadmin console as an administrative user.

For example:

http://OIM_Host:14000/sysadmin

- 2) Under the **System Management** section, choose **Import**.
- 3) In the **Deployment Manager Import** dialog box:
 - a. Browse to the PrimaveraP6EPPMProvOIM11gR2.xml file and select it.
 - b. Select Add File.
 - c. Enter the P6 EPPM Web Services parameters.
 - d. Select View selections.

Note: If a red X displays next to the **UD_PM_USER** parameter, a user already attempted to import or export that UD_PM_USR version. Right-click **UD_PM_USR** and select **Remove**.

- e. Select **Import** to complete the process.
- 4) In the Configuration section, click IT Resource.
- 5) Search for **Primavera EPPM Resource** and verify the Primavera Resource information you imported is correct.
- 6) In the **Configuration** section, click **Application Instances** then click **Create**.
 - a. Enter your information in the **Fill Name** and **Display Name** fields.
 - b. In Resource Object field, choose Primavera P6 EPPM User.
 - c. In IT Resource Instance field, choose Primavera P6 EPPM IT Resource.
 - d. Click Save.

Note: In OIM11gR2, you can provision users through **Application Instances**.

Adding or Updating the P6 EPPM Web Services Connection Information for the P6 EPPM IT Resource

To add or update the P6 EPPM Web Services connection information:

- 1) Launch a web browser and open the OIM Administrative and User Console.
- 2) Expand Resource Management and select Manage IT Resource.
- 3) Select **Search** to see the available IT Resources.
- 4) Locate Primavera P6 EPPM IT Resource and select Edit.
- 5) Add the valid parameters for the P6 EPPM Web Services installation and select **update**.

For example, if the Web Services URL is http://server:8080/p6ws/services with a default user name/password of 'admin,' then:

Note: The following are examples, not defaults. Use the user name, password, and URL you created when you installed P6 EPPM Web Services.

- In the Protocol field, enter http.
- In the Admin User Password field, enter admin.
- In the Host Name field, enter server.
- In the Port field, enter 8080.
- In the Admin User Name field, enter admin.
