Overview

This integration is applicable to Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service (WACS).

Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service Integration to Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud helps to manage vendor and end-to-end hybrid procurement originated in Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service using Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud. This pre-built integration represents significant business value for utilities that need to manage their purchases to fulfill demand to complete work orders and activity. Vendor and Vendor Location are master in Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud and synced to Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service. Purchase request for goods and service made in Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service are sent to Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud.

Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud handles all purchases for Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service - creating purchase order within cloud and sending back the purchase order to Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service. Receipts, in turn, created in Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service are sent to Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud to close the purchase order.

The corresponding modules in Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud for this integration are Supplier, Purchase requisition, Purchase order and Receipts. All the four integration flows have filter criteria that can be selected based on the business requirement.

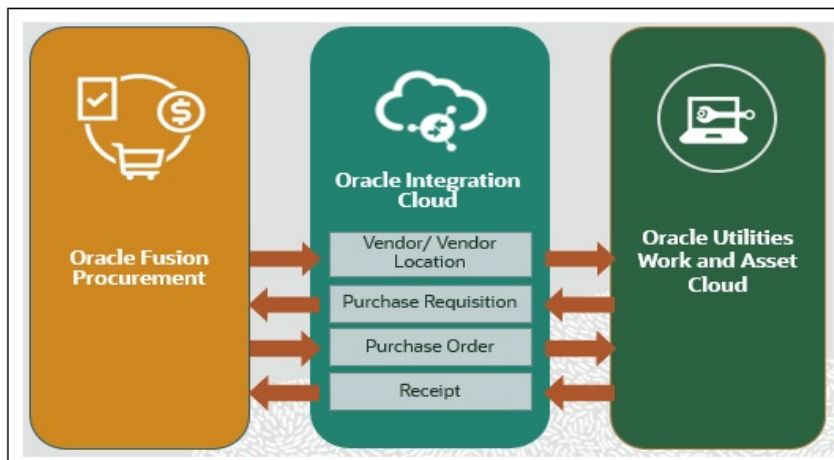

The integration supports the following flows:

- Vendor and Vendor Location (Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud Initiated)
- Purchase Requisition initiated from Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service to Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud
- Purchase Order initiated from Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud to Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service
- Receipt Integration initiated from Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service to Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud

Vendor and Vendor Location Integration

The Vendor and Vendor Location interface integrates the Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud Suppliers records with the Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service Vendor records. Vendor records are stored to arrange goods and service to perform the assigned activities. Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud will master Vendor and Vendor Location.

Purchase Requisition and Purchase Order Integration

The Purchase Requisition interface integrates the Purchase Request originating from Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service with Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud. Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud is the master for Procurement. Users in Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service create request for the material required and are synced with Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud. After creation, the requests in Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud are converted to Purchase Orders by a buyer. Using business events, the Purchase Orders are sent to Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service.

Receipt Integration

The Receipt interface is a sync of the Receipts recorded for the material received in Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service to Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud. As Oracle Fusion Procurement Cloud is the master in this integration, Receipts are sent back to cloud to complete the Procurement cycle by recording a Receipt on the open Purchase Order.
