1 Oracle Database Patch Requirements

If you are using any of the 11g Release 1 (11.1) gateways listed below with Oracle Database 10g Release (10.2) or earlier, you need to download database Patch 5965763 from the Oracle *Metalink* Web site.

- Oracle Database Gateway for Sybase 11g Release 1 (11.1)
- Oracle Database Gateway for SQL Server 11g Release 1 (11.1)
- Oracle Database Gateway for Informix 11g Release 1 (11.1)
- Oracle Database Gateway for Teradata 11g Release 1 (11.1)
- Oracle Database Gateway for ODBC 11g Release 1 (11.1)

2 Oracle Database Gateway for WebSphere MQ

The deployment script file `pgmobj.sql` located in the `Gateway_Home\admin\deploy` directory contains incorrect database link and library names. These incorrect names result in the malfunctioning of the gateway. You can detect this issue if the ORA-28509 error message is displayed and no gateway trace files are generated.

Workaround: To resolve this issue, make the following changes to the `pgmobj.sql` script:

1. Replace all the database link names `pg4mqdepdblink` with `dg4mqdepdblink`.
2. Replace all the library names `libpg4mq` with `libdg4mq`. Save the `pgmobj.sql` script and follow the instruction available in the gateway

manual to run the script. To run the script, use SYS user as SYSDBA in SQL*Plus on the Oracle database that needs access to the gateway.

This issues is tracked with Oracle bug 6448585.
