Preparing to Install eaDirect

This chapter provides an overview of the eaDirect installation tool and describes installation tasks that must be performed before you install eaDirect.

What You Need to Know Before Installing eaDirect

Before installing eaDirect, you will have to install and configure several other third-party software applications that work with eaDirect. Note that the instructions in this guide describe how to install eaDirect in a distributed computing environment that includes at least one dedicated server for application components and another dedicated server for database components.

When installing eaDirect in a distributed environment, the recommended sequence is to install and configure components on the database server first, then install and configure components on the application server. Also, to ensure a reliable and effective environment for creating eaDirect applications, you must meet the software and hardware minimum requirements (as listed in the topic *Hardware and Software Requirements*) and confirm that eaDirect and the applications that work with it are installed and configured correctly.

A successful installation of eaDirect depends on completing the following preinstallation tasks:

- Confirm that your system configuration meets the recommended software and hardware requirements
- Set up the eaDirect environment

Hardware and Software Requirements

Confirm that your system meets the minimum recommended hardware and software requirements for installing eaDirect.

<u>Hardware:</u>

- Pentium III or higher processor (or compatible class processor)
- 256MB of RAM (512MB recommended)
- 4GB hard drive (8GB and higher for large data files)
- 1.5GB free disk space for the eaDirect database

<u>Software:</u>

- Microsoft Windows 2000 Server (SP2)
- Microsoft SQL Server 2000
- Bea WebLogic Server 6.1 (SP3)
- Sun Java 2 SDK, Standard Edition 1.3.1 (and required patches)
- Internet Explorer 5.5 (SP2) or Internet Explorer 6.0
- Netscape Navigator 6.2
- CD-ROM device that is supported by Windows 2000

Setting Up the eaDirect Environment

In order to ensure the proper operation of eaDirect, you must confirm that the third-party software applications that support eaDirect are installed on the appropriate server. When installing these applications it is very important that you follow the instructions in each product's installation documentation. This will help to ensure the integrity and reliability of the eaDirect application environment.

Use the information below to determine the software components that must be installed on each server in your distributed environment (eaDirect is listed among the applications).

Application Server:

- eaDirect 3.2 application server components.
- Windows 2000 Server (SP2). Go to www.microsoft.com for product information and documentation.
- Microsoft SQL Server 2000 Client Tools. Go to www.microsoft.com for product information and documentation.
- Bea WebLogic Server 6.1 (SP3).

If you plan to create a WebLogic Cluster, see the WebLogic user documentation at www.weblogic.com for instructions.

• Sun Java 2 SDK, Standard Edition 1.3.1 with required patch cluster.

You can use the Java SDK 1.3.1 that WebLogic Server 6.1 provides in its distribution (minus the required patch cluster), or you can download Sun JDK 1.3.1 from www.java.sun.com.

- Internet Explorer 5.5 (SP2) or Internet Explorer 6.0.
- Netscape Navigator 6.2.

Database Server:

- eaDirect 3.2 database server components
- Windows 2000 Server (SP2)
- Microsoft SQL Server 2000
- Sun Java 2 SDK, Standard Edition 1.3.1 with required patch cluster. This is required for running the eaDirect database creation and configuration tool on a database server in a distributed environment.

Preparing to Install eaDirect

The required third-party software that works with eaDirect must be obtained separately. eaDirect does not provide them as part of its product distribution. Consult the appropriate vendor's web site for information on how these products can be obtained.

For general installation and maintenance information regarding Windows 2000 Server and other third-party software, see the user documentation that is shipped with each product.

When Installing Microsoft SQL Server 2000

When installing Microsoft SQL Server 2000, it is recommended that you select Mixed Mode (Windows Authentication and SQL Server Authentication) as your default authentication mode. Selecting Windows Authentication Mode **only** might cause the database creation and configuration procedure (as described in Chapter 2) to fail.

Installing eaDirect Product Components

The installation of eaDirect product components is done through the InstallAnywhere tool. The tool is provided with eaDirect on its distribution CD-ROM. The following screen shows where you select the eaDirect components to install. Note that the features you see depends on which features you purchased.

Through the tool's easy-to-follow graphical user interface, you can choose to do a full or custom install of eaDirect components on a single server or on multiple servers in a distributed environment. The following tables describes the various eaDirect installation options: Preparing to Install eaDirect

Installation Option	Components Installed	
Full	Installs eaDirect application server components, eaDirect database server components, WebLogic J2EE files for eaDirect, eaDirect composition tools, and online product Help. This is the default installation option for eaDirect.	
	Note : Use this installation option to install eaDirect on a single machine. See the topic <i>Installing eaDirect</i> <i>in a Non-Distributed Environment</i> for more information.	
Database	Installs the eaDirect database server components.	
Custom	Gives users the option to install eaDirect application server components, eaDirect database server components, WebLogic J2EE files for eaDirect, eaDirect composition tools, eaDirect sample applications, Hierarchy samples (if licensed), and online product Help.	
Tools	Installs the eaDirect composition tools, sample applications, and online help for the composition tools.

InstallAnywhere copies eaDirect files from the distribution CD-ROM to the appropriate directories, and sets up the directory hierarchy for database server and application server components. It also adds icons to the eaDirect program group that is accessible from the Windows Start menu.

For specific information about installing eaDirect components using InstallAnywhere, see the topics *Installing the eaDirect Database Components* and *Installing the eaDirect Application Server Components*.

Installing eaDirect in a Non-Distributed Environment

This guide is organized to show how to install eaDirect in a distributed environment that has at least one dedicated database server and application server. However, using the InstallAnywhere 'Full' installation option, you can choose to install all the eaDirect product components on a single machine. The following procedure describes how to do this.

To install eaDirect using the 'Full' installation option:

1. From the *Windows* subdirectory on the installation CD-ROM, double-click the command to invoke the InstallAnywhere GUI:

A start-up screen is displayed.

- 2. On the Introduction screen, read the eaDirect introductory information. Then click Next.
- 3. On the License Agreement screen, carefully read the terms of the agreement (use the scroll bars to move up and down on the screen) and accept the terms of the license agreement by clicking the appropriate radio button. Then click **Next**.
- 4. On the Enter Serial Number screen, enter your product serial number. It is stapled to the inside front cover of this guide (if your serial number has been misplaced, contact edocs Technical Support). Then click Next.
- 5. On the Choose Install Folder screen, accept the default installation folder (C:\EDCSbd) or click Choose to specify another installation folder. Then click Next.
- 6. On the Choose Product Features screen, click Full (default installation option). Then click Next.

Preparing to Install eaDirect

- 7. On the Choose Shortcut Folder screen, specify where you want to create product icons. You can accept the default (create product icons in a new program group labeled 'eaDirect'), or click the Other radio button then Choose and specify a different location for the product icons. Then click Next.
- 8. On the Pre-Installation Summary screen, confirm that the information is accurate. Then click Install.

At this point, the eaDirect database and application server components copied to the designated installation folder. A status bar on the bottom of the screen shows each component being installed. No user intervention is necessary.

- 9. The Install Complete screen reports a successful installation and the directory that contains the eaDirect components.
- 10. Click **Done** to exit the installer.

Completing the Full Installation

If you have installed eaDirect using the InstallAnywhere 'Full' installation option, you can ignore the database server components installation at the beginning of Chapter 2, and proceed directly to the topic *Setting Up the SQL Server Database for eaDirect*. Similarly, you can also ignore the application server components installation procedure in Chapter 3.

Setting Up a Database Server for eaDirect

Overview

This chapter provides instructions for installing eaDirect on a database server and configuring the third-party software that works with it. If you have not completed the prerequisite tasks for installing eaDirect as described in the topic, *What You Need to Know When Installing eaDirect*, do so now. This will help to ensure a smooth and successful installation.

Setting up a database server to support eaDirect involves completing the following tasks:

- 1. Confirm that Microsoft SQL Server 2000 is installed
- 2. Install eaDirect using the provided installation executable
- 3. Run the database creation and configuration tool to configure SQL Server for eaDirect

The installation and configuration examples shown in this chapter uses default eaDirect pathnames. If you choose not to accept the default pathnames, make sure your pathnames are consistent throughout the installation of eaDirect on the database and application servers.

Understanding the eaDirect Directory Structure on a Database Server

The eaDirect home directory on the database server contains all the files needed to create and configure the eaDirect production database. When you install the eaDirect database server components, you are prompted to specify a 'destination' directory. By default, this directory is *C:\EDCSbd* and it has a pre-defined hierarchical directory structure.

At the top of the directory hierarchy is *EDCSbd*. Below *EDCSbd* are the subdirectories \db\mssql (which contains a subdirectory named migration) and \tmp. These subdirectories are used for database creation, configuration, and migration.

To designate a different destination directory for the eaDirect database server components, enter the pathname to the directory when prompted during the installation procedure. It is recommended that you install eaDirect in the same directories on both the database server and the application server.

Installing the eaDirect Database Server Components

If you have not completed the prerequisite tasks for installing eaDirect as described in the topic, *What You Need to Know Before Installing eaDirect*, do so now. This will help to ensure a smooth and successful installation.

To install the eaDirect database server components:

1. From the *Windows* subdirectory on the installation CD-ROM, double-click the command to invoke the InstallAnywhere GUI:

Dirins.exe

A start-up screen is displayed.

- 2. On the Introduction screen, read the eaDirect introductory information. Then click Next.
- 3. On the License Agreement screen, carefully read the terms of the agreement (use the scroll bars to move up and down on the screen) and accept the terms of the license agreement by clicking the appropriate radio button. Then click **Next**.
- 4. On the Enter Serial Number screen, enter your product serial number. It is stapled to the inside front cover of this guide (if your serial number has been misplaced, contact edocs Technical Support). Then click Next.
- 5. On the Choose Install Folder screen, accept the default installation folder or click **Choose** to specify another installation folder. Then click **Next**.
- 6. On the Choose Product Features screen, click Database. Then click Next.

- 8. On the Pre-Installation Summary screen, confirm that the information is accurate. Then click Install.

At this point, the eaDirect database server components are copied to the designated installation folder. No user intervention is required.

9. The Install Complete screen reports a successful installation and directory that contains the database server components.

If the installation fails, determine the cause of the problem and reinstall eaPay. If you need to contact edocs Technical Support, see the section *If You Need Help*.

10. Click **Done** to exit the installer.

Setting Up the SQL Server Database for eaDirect

Setting up the SQL Server database for eaDirect consists of the following configuration procedures:

- Increasing the default width for SQL numeric columns
- Configuring the eaDirect production database


The following topics describe how to do each procedure.

Increasing the Default Width for SQL Server Numeric Columns

By default, the width for SQL Server numeric columns is 28 characters long. However, eaDirect **requires** that the width of numeric columns be a minimum of 38 characters long. This means you must increase the default width for numeric columns in SQL Server in order for the database creation and configuration tool to run successfully.


To increase the default width of SQL Server numeric columns:

- 1. From the Start menu, select **Programs** and **Microsoft SQL Server**, and click **Enterprise Manager**. The SQL Enterprise Manager window is displayed.
- 2. In the left pane, expand Microsoft SQL Servers and SQL Server Group to show your server. The sample screen shows a SQL server named DOC HUGHES.

- 3. In the left pane, highlight your SQL server by right clicking on its name, and then click **Properties** from the menu.

- 4. Click **Startup Parameters** at the bottom of the dialog. The Startup Parameters dialog is displayed showing the name of the server.
- 5. Enter the startup parameter -p in the Parameter text field.

6. Click **Add.** The new startup parameter is added to the list of existing parameters.

7. Click **ok** to close the dialog.

8. Stop and start the SQL server for the new startup parameter to take effect. Right-click the server name and select **Stop** from the menu.



9. To start the SQL server, right-click the server name and select **Start** from the menu.

Creating and Configuring the eaDirect Production Database


Creating and configuring the eaDirect production database consists of a series of screens where you specify information about the database including the username and password needed to access it, the name of the database, the server on which it is installed, and the pathnames for the SQL Data and Log files. You use the Java database configuration tool, *DBConfigTool.jar*, to create and configure the production database.

You will need the required Java SDK (see the topic *Software and Hardware Requirements* for more information) on the machine from where you will be running *DBConfigTool.jar*. This could be the machine your database is on, or another machine. Again, the machine that has your database on it does not need the Java SDK unless you will be running *DBConfigTool.jar* from it.

However, if you are doing a single-server installation of eaDirect, make sure that the required Java SDK has been installed.

When installing Microsoft SQL Server 2000, it is recommended Caution that you select Mixed Mode (Windows Authentication and SQL Server Authentication) as your default authentication mode. Selecting Windows Authentication Mode only might cause the database creation and configuration procedure to fail. To create and configure the eaDirect production database: 1. Open a Command Prompt window and change directory to %EDX HOME%\db\mssql (where %EDX HOME% is the eaDirect installation directory). 2. Select Create and configure new database (default), and then click Next. A second database configuration screen is displayed.



- 3. Click Next. The Database Administrator Information screen is displayed.
- 4. Enter the Admin Name and Admin Password (if your database has one) for the SQL database. By default the Admin Name is 'sa'.

5. Click Next. The Database Information screen is displayed.

6. Specify a new database user name, database password, and database name for the new database. Also, enter the name of the server on which the database will be created. For example:


- 7. Click Next. The Database Path Information screen is displayed.
- 8. Specify the pathname to the database installation directory, location of the SQL data file, and the location of the SQL log file. For example:




11. Click **Close** to exit from the database creation and configuration tool.


What to do if the Database Creation and Configuration Fails

If you have to abort the database creation and configuration procedure, or if it fails to create and configure the database (generates a "Failure" screen), do the following steps before running the database tool again.

- 1. From the Start menu, select **Programs** and **Microsoft SQL Server**, and click **Enterprise Manager**. The Enterprise Manager screen is displayed.
- 2. Expand the SQL Server Group and click the Database folder.
- 3. Highlight the name of the newly created database and delete it from the list of installed databases. The sample screen shows the database, edx0, being deleted.



4. Scroll down to the Security folder and expand it to show Logins. Delete the user for the database that you just deleted. The sample screen shows the database user *edx dba* being deleted.



5. Open a Command Prompt window and run the database creation and configuration tool again, making sure that the values on a screen are correct before proceeding to the next screen.

Setting Up an Application Server for eaDirect

Overview

This chapter provides instructions for installing eaDirect on an application server and configuring the third-party software that support it. Setting up an application server to support eaDirect involves completing the following tasks:

- Confirm that WebLogic Server 6.1 (SP3) is installed
- Confirm that JDK 1.3.1 with required patch cluster is installed
- Install the eaDirect application server components
- Define your eaDirect environment
- Configure WebLogic Server's Java resources for eaDirect

If you have not already configured the database server, do so now. See Chapter 2 for more information.

The installation and configuration examples shown in this chapter use default pathnames for eaDirect. If you choose not to accept the default pathnames, make sure your pathnames are consistent throughout the installation of eaDirect on the database and application servers.

Understanding the eaDirect Directory Structure on the Application Server

The eaDirect home directory on the application server contains all the files that are needed and created by the eaDirect application. When you install the eaDirect application server components, you are prompted to specify a 'destination' directory. By default, this directory is C:*EDCSbd* and it has a pre-defined hierarchical directory structure.

At the top of the directory hierarchy is *EDCSbd*. Below *EDCSbd* are several subdirectories that are grouped by functionality and contain the J2EE enterprise applications, dynamic link libraries, executables, log files, configuration files, and sample applications that eaDirect uses. It is recommended that you install eaDirect in the same directory on the application and database servers.

```
<EDCSbd>
```

During the eaDirect installation several files (such as the product Release Notes and the eaDirect installation log file) are copied to *EDCSbd*. These files are not shown in the sample directory structure above.



When installing eaDirect on a single machine with the InstallAnywhere 'Full' option, the database subdirectories (as mentioned in the topic *Understanding the eaDirect Directory Structure on a Database Server* in Chapter 2) are included in the eaDirect directory hierarchy shown above.

Directory	Contents
AppProfiles	Contains the Versioned Sets (configuration and HTML template files created in the design environment) that are published to the production environment.
bin	Contains the eaDirect release notes and files used to start the Scheduler from a command prompt window, or as a Windows service.
config	Contains configuration files that are used to define the eaDirect environment.
Data	Contains files that are copied to this directory after the Scanner finds them in the Input directory for an application and moves them here. The other production tasks use these files to process the input data from a service provider.
Input	Contains the input data files from a service provider that are needed by the Scanner production task.
J2EEApps	Contains the eaDirect J2EE EAR file <i>ear-eadirect.ear</i> . This file also contains the WAR files for the eaPay, eaPost, and eaXchange add-on modules.
jre	Contains library and binary files that are used by the Java Runtime Environment.
lib	Contains several executable java archive (<i>.jar</i>) files and Dynamic Link Libraries (<i>.dll</i>).
logs	Contains application log files.
Output	Contains any output files generated by the application and its jobs.
samples	Contains the <i>ear-easample.ear</i> and <i>ear-eatraining.ear</i> sample applications in subdirectories labeled \ <i>eaSample</i> and \ <i>eaTraining</i> . Also contains sample files that can be used with <i>ear-easample.ear</i> and <i>ear-eatraining.ear</i> .
	Also includes <i>hierarchySample</i> (if licensed) and <i>umfSample</i> (if licensed).
Uninstall	Contains the eaDirect 3.2 uninstall script and other files pertaining to uninstalling eaDirect.

Installing the eaDirect Application Server Components

If you have not completed the prerequisite tasks for installing eaDirect as described in the topic, *What You Need to Know Before Installing eaDirect*, do so now. This will help to ensure a smooth and successful installation.

When you install eaDirect, you are prompted to specify a 'destination' directory. By default, the eaDirect application server components are installed in C: EDCSbd.

To install the eaDirect application server components:

1. From the *Windows* subdirectory on the eaDirect installation CD-ROM, double-click the command to invoke the InstallAnywhere GUI:

Dirins.exe

A start-up screen is displayed.

- 2. On the Introduction screen, read the eaDirect introductory information. Then click Next.
- 3. On the License Agreement screen, carefully read the terms of the agreement (use scroll bars to move up and down on the screen) and accept the terms of the license agreement by clicking the appropriate radio button. Then click **Next**.
- 4. On the Enter Serial Number screen, enter your product serial number. It is stapled to the inside front cover of this guide (if your serial number has been misplaced, contact edocs Technical Support). Then click Next.
- 5. On the Choose Install Folder screen, accept the default installation folder (C:\EDCSbd) or click Choose to specify another installation folder. Then click Next.
- On the Choose Product Features screen, click App Server. Then click Next.

- 7. On the Choose Shortcut Folder screen, specify where you want to create product icons. You can accept the default folder or click the Other radio button, and then click Choose to specify a different location for the product icons. Then click Next.
- 8. On the Pre-Installation Summary screen, confirm that the information is accurate. Then click Install.

At this point, the eaDirect application server components are copied to the designated installation folder. A status bar on the bottom of the screen shows each application server component being installed. No user intervention is required.

- 9. The Install Complete screen reports a successful installation and the name of the directory that contains the application server components.
- 10. Click Done to exit the installer.

Defining Your eaDirect Environment

eaDirect provides several configuration files that you use to define your environment for WebLogic Server. Among these files are *edx_env.bat* and *edx_bcp.config*, which are used to provide specific information about your environment. During installation of eaDirect, all the configuration files are copied to %*EDX_HOME*%/*config*.

Setting up the eaDirect environment for WebLogic Server involves modifying the eaDirect configuration files *edx_env.bat* and *edx_bcp.config.bat* for your environment.

Modifying *edx_env.bat* and *edx_bcp.config.bat*

When modifying *edx_env.bat*, you will have to define values for the following undefined environment variables:

Environment Variable	Value
APP_SERVER	Specifies which application server you are using, wl (WebLogic) or ws (WebSphere)
EDX_HOME	Pathname to the eaDirect installation directory
WL_HOME	Pathname to the WebLogic Server installation directory
WL_DOMAIN	WebLogic Server domain name
JAVA_HOME	Pathname to the installed JDK

To modify *edx_env.bat*:

- 1. From Windows Explorer, navigate to %EDX HOME%\config.
- 2. Open *edx_env.bat* by right clicking on it, and selecting **Edit** from the menu. The default *edx_env.bat* file will look like:

```
@rem define APP_SERVER begin
@rem define APP_SERVER end
@rem define EDX_HOME begin
@rem define EDX_HOME end
@rem define JAVA_HOME
@rem define JAVA_HOME
```

@rem define WL_HOME
@rem define WL_HOME
@rem define WL_DOMAIN
@rem define WL_DOMAIN

3. Modify *edx env.bat* to reflect your eaDirect environment. For example:

```
@rem define APP_SERVER begin
@set APP_SERVER=wl
@rem define APP_SERVER end
@rem define EDX_HOME begin
@set EDX_HOME=C:\EDCSbd
@rem define JAVA_HOME end
@rem define JAVA_HOME
@set JAVA_HOME=C:\JDK131
@rem define WL_HOME
@set WL_HOME=C:\bea\wlserver6.1
@rem define WL_HOME
@rem define WL_HOME
@rem define WL_DOMAIN
@set WL_DOMAIN=mydomain
@rem define WL_DOMAIN
```

4. Save and close *edx_env.bat*.

To modify *edx_bcp.config.bat*:

- 1. From Windows Explorer, navigate to %EDX_HOME%\config.
- 2. Open *edx_bcp.config.bat* by right clicking on it, and selecting **Edit** from the menu.
- 3. The default *edx_bcp.config.bat* file contains default settings that you might have to change for your environment. The values for User and Password should match the *username:password* combination entered during the database creation and configuration process. The value for SQL server is the name of the SQL server on which you created the eaDirect database.

@set JAVA_OPTIONS=%JAVA_OPTIONS% -Dcom.edocs.tasks.loader.user=sql_username @set JAVA_OPTIONS=%JAVA_OPTIONS% -Dcom.edocs.tasks.loader.password=sql_password @set JAVA_OPTIONS=%JAVA_OPTIONS% -Dcom.edocs.tasks.loader.server=sql_servername

4. Modify *edx_bcp.config.bat* for your environment. For example:

```
@set JAVA_OPTIONS=%JAVA_OPTIONS% -Dcom.edocs.tasks.loader.user=edx_dba
@set JAVA_OPTIONS=%JAVA_OPTIONS% -Dcom.edocs.tasks.loader.password=edx
@set JAVA_OPTIONS=%JAVA_OPTIONS% -Dcom.edocs.tasks.loader.server=doc_hughes
```

5. Save and close *edx_bcp.config.bat*.

Modifying WebLogic Server Startup for eaDirect

You can start WebLogic Server for eaDirect in two ways:

- From a Command Prompt window
- As a Windows Service

Depending on how you choose to start WebLogic Server, you will have to modify either the *startWebLogic.cmd* or *InstallNtService.cmd* command to allow WebLogic Server to process environmental variables and database settings for your environment each time it starts up. The following topics describe how to pass your eaDirect environment to WebLogic Server at start up from a Command Prompt window, or as a Windows Service.

Starting WebLogic Server from a Command Prompt Window

To start WebLogic Server from a Command Prompt window:

- 1. From Windows Explorer, navigate to %WL HOME% config mydomain.
- 2. Open *startWebLogic.cmd* by right clicking its name and selecting **Edit**. Add the following lines of code at the top of the 'user-defined variables' section:

@Set EDX_HOME=<your_eaDirect_installation_directory> @call %EDX_HOME%\config\edx_env.bat

- 3. Remove any other entries that might be in the 'user-defined variables' section.
- 4. In the 'runWebLogic' section, add the following lines of code just beneath the 'set CLASSPATH' command:

@call %EDX_HOME%\config\edx.config.bat

Note that the file *edx.config.bat* calls *edx_bcp.config.bat*, which contains the SQL Server database settings you defined earlier.

5. In the same section, add your WebLogic Server password. This is the password that you specified when you installed WebLogic Server.

@rem Set WLS_PW equal to your system password for no password prompt at server startup. set WLS_PW=<your_WebLogic_password>

set wis_Pw=<youi_weblogic_passworu>

6. In the same section, replace the current Java command with the following lines of code:

```
"%JAVA_HOME%\bin\java" %JAVA_OPTIONS% -classpath "%CLASSPATH%" -
Dweblogic.Domain=%WL_DOMAIN% -Dweblogic.Name=myserver "-Dbea.home=C:\bea" -
Dweblogic.management.password=%WLS_PW% -
Dweblogic.ProductionModeEnabled=%STARTMODE% "-
Djava.security.policy==C:\bea\wlserver6.1/lib/weblogic.policy" Weblogic.Server
```

- 7. Save and close *startWebLogic.cmd*.
- 8. Open a Command Prompt window, and change directory to %WL HOME%\config\mydomain. For example:
 - $C: \ cd bea \ wlserver6.1 \ config \ ydomain$
- 9. At the command prompt, run the command to start WebLogic Server:
 - C:\> startWebLogic.cmd

Starting WebLogic Server as a Windows Service

If you have already installed WebLogic as a Windows Service and are upgrading from eaDirect Version 2.1, you will need to uninstall and then reinstall the WebLogic Service so that the new classpath (*edx_common.jar*) will be included. Otherwise, you will receive an error and the new pools will not work for logging. You also should delete the Logger service because it is not used anymore.

To start WebLogic Server as a Windows Service:

- 1. From Windows Explorer, navigate to *%WL_HOME%\config\mydomain* (where *%WL_HOME%* is the WebLogic installation directory).
- 2. Make a copy of *InstallNtService.cmd* in case you have to go back to the original settings.
- 3. Open *InstallNtService.cmd* by right clicking on its name, and selecting Edit.
- 4. Add the following lines of code in the 'SETLOCAL' section:

@set EDX_HOME=<your_eaDirect_installation_directory> @call %EDX HOME%\config\edx env.bat

```
SETLOCAL
@set EDX_HOME=C:\EDCSbd
@call %EDX HOME%\config\edx env.bat
```

5. In the 'Set Classpath to load WebLogic Classes' section, add the following line of code after the Set CLASSPATH command:

@call %EDX_HOME%\config\edx.config.bat

rem *** Set Classpath to load Weblogic Classes

```
Set CLASSPATH=.;C:\bea\wlserver6.1\lib\weblogic_sp.jar;
C:\bea\wlserver6.1\lib\weblogic.jar
@call %EDX_HOME%\config\edx.config.bat
```

Note that the file *edx.config.bat* calls *edx_bcp.config.bat*, which contains the SQL database settings you defined earlier.

6. In the 'Set Command Line' section, replace the original settings:

-ms64m -mx64m

With the variable: %JAVA OPTIONS%

```
set CMDLINE="%JAVA_OPTIONS% -classpath \"%CLASSPATH%\"
-Dweblogic.Domain=mydomain -Dweblogic.Name=myserver
-Djava.security.policy==\"C:\bea\wlserver6.1/lib/weblogic.policy\"
-Dbea.home=\"C:\bea\" weblogic.Server"
```

 In the 'Install the service' section, change the name of the service (-svcname:<*your_service_name*>) if necessary. By default, the service name is "myserver".

```
rem *** Install the service
"C:\bea\wlserver6.1\bin\beasvc" -install -svcname:myserver
-javahome:"%JAVA_HOME%" -execdir:"C:\bea\wlserver6.1"
-extrapath:"C:\bea\wlserver6.1\bin;C:\EDCSbd\lib" -cmdline:%CMDLINE%
```

8. In the same section, replace the current setting:

```
-javahome:"c:\bea\jdk131" (where -javahome points to your installed JDK)
```

with the following:

-javahome:"%JAVA HOME%"

```
rem *** Install the service
"C:\bea\wlserver6.1\bin\beasvc" -install -svcname:myserver
-javahome:"%JAVA_HOME%" -execdir:"C:\bea\wlserver6.1"
-extrapath:"C:\bea\wlserver6.1\bin;C:\EDCSbd\lib" -cmdline:%CMDLINE%
```

9. In the same section, add your WebLogic Server password after the '-cmdline' setting.

-cmdline:%CMDLINE% -password:<your WebLogic password>

```
rem *** Install the service
```

```
"C:\bea\wlserver6.1\bin\beasvc" -install -svcname:myserver
-javahome:"%JAVA_HOME%" -execdir:"C:\bea\wlserver6.1"
-extrapath:"C:\bea\wlserver6.1\bin;C:\EDCSbd\lib"
-cmdline:%CMDLINE% -password:lovelyday
```

10. In the same section, add the path *C*:*EDCSbd**lib* as an extra path (substituting your drive where necessary).

```
rem *** Install the service
"C:\bea\wlserver6.1\bin\beasvc" -install -svcname:myserver
-javahome:"%JAVA_HOME%" -execdir:"C:\bea\wlserver6.1"
-extrapath:"C:\bea\wlserver6.1\bin;C:\EDCSbd\lib"
-cmdline:%CMDLINE% -password:documentation
```

- 11. Save and close *installNtService.cmd*.
- 12. Open a Command Prompt window, and change directory to %WL HOME%/config/mydomain. For example:

```
C:\bea\wlserver6.1\config\mydomain
```

13. Run installNtService.cmd to install WebLogic Server as a Windows Service.

```
C: \setminus > installNtService.cmd
```

- 14. A confirmation message is shown in the Command Prompt window if the server is installed successfully.
- 15. From the Control Panel, open the Services dialog, and then start the WebLogic Server service.

Troubleshooting Tips

• If the WebLogic service is unable to find *edx_bcp.config.bat* at startup

If the WebLogic service is not able to find the file *edx_bcp.config.bat*, add the path *-extrapath:C:\bea\wlserver6.1\bin;%PATH%* to *installNtService.cmd* (substituting your drive where necessary):

```
"C:\bea\wlserver6.1\bin\beasvc" -install -svcname:myserver
-javahome:"%JAVA_HOME%" -execdir:"C:\bea\wlserver6.1"
-extrapath:"C:\bea\wlserver6.1\bin;%PATH%" -cmdline:%CMDLINE%
-password:lovelyday
```

• If you encounter problems when running customized Web pages

If you encounter problems when running customized Web pages, do the following:

- From your domain in the WebLogic Server Console, select Servers and <your_server>. A tabbed dialog with the name of your server on it is displayed in the right pane.
- 2. On the Configuration/Compilers tab, change the Java Compiler value from the default 'javac' to the location of 'javac' in your installed JDK. For example: *C:\JDK131\bin\javac*.
- 3. Restart WebLogic Server.
- If the scheduler and logger processes are running before starting WebLogic

When starting WebLogic, if you get the error:

```
<Error> <ConnectionManager>
<Closing: 'weblogic.rjvm.t3.T3JVMConnection@7387aa' because of: 'Server
received a message over an uninitialized connection: 'JVMMessage from: 'null'</pre>
```

Shutdown the eaDirect scheduler and logger processes, and restart WebLogic.

Configuring WebLogic Server's Java Resources for eaDirect

After you have successfully configured the SQL database for eaDirect, you must create and configure several Java Database Connectivity (JDBC) and Java Message Service (JMS) resources on WebLogic Server. These resources enable the manipulation of existing data from relational databases and other data sources, and enable application components to asynchronously send and receive messages.

Specifically, you will be doing the following:

- Configure JDBC Connection Pools
- Configure JDBC Transaction (Tx) Data Sources
- Configure JMS Connection Factories
- Configure JMS JDBC Stores
- Configure JMS Servers
- Configure JMS Topics
- Configure Session Pools

You configure WebLogic's Java resources through the web-based WebLogic Server Console. By default, WebLogic copies the Java configuration settings to %*WL_HOME%*/config\mydomain\config.xml (where %*WL_HOME%* represents the directory in which you installed WebLogic Server).



When entering required attribute values for Java resources, be particularly mindful of case sensitivity. Failure to heed case sensitivity can result in problems later on, including not being able to log into the eaDirect Command Center.

To configure WebLogic Server's Java Resources for eaDirect:

- Start WebLogic Server, if it isn't already running. (You can start the default WebLogic server by going to the Start menu and selecting Programs and Bea WebLogic E-Business Platform and WebLogic Server 6.1. Then click Start Default Server.)
- 2. From the Start menu, select **Programs** and **Bea WebLogic E-Business Platform** and **WebLogic Server 6.1**, and click **Start Default Console**.

You can also open the WebLogic Server Console from a web browser by entering a URL with the following syntax:



Configuring the JDBC Connection Pools

A connection pool contains named groups of JDBC connections that are created when the connection pool is registered, usually when starting up WebLogic Server. WebLogic Server opens JDBC connections to the database during the startup process and adds the connections to the pool.

Your application borrows a connection from the pool, uses it, and then returns it to the pool by closing it. For more information about how WebLogic Server uses JDBC connection pools, refer to the WebLogic programming and user documentation at http://bea.com/.

You will create three JDBC Connection Pools. The next section describes how to create the first JDBC Connection Pool. After that procedure, the values for the remaining two connection pools are listed. Create those connection pools following the procedure shown for the first connection pool.

To configure the first JDBC connection pool:

- 1. From your domain in the left pane, select Services and JDBC and Connection Pool.
- 2. In the right pane, click the **Configure a New JDBC Connection Pool** link. A tabbed dialog for configuring a new connection pool is displayed.
- 3. On the Configuration/General tab, enter values for the Name, URL, Driver Classname, and Properties attributes, as shown in the following table:





Configuring the JMS Connection Factories

Connection factories are data objects that enable Java Messaging Service (JMS) clients to create JMS connections. You define and configure one or more connection factories to create connections with predefined attributes. WebLogic Server adds the connection factories to the JNDI space during startup, and the application retrieves a connection factory using WebLogic JNDI.



Configuring a JMS Store

Through the use of JDBC, JMS enables you to store persistent messages in a database, which is accessed through a designated JDBC connection pool. The JMS database can be any database that is accessible through a WebLogic-supported JDBC driver.

Configuring Session Pools and Connection Consumers

A session pool will allow a listener (called a connection consumer in WebLogic) to have multiple threads that will improve performance under heavy load. A session pool must be created for each connection consumer.

Caution	If you upgraded WebLogic 6.1 SP2 to SP3, you may encounter a known issue in the WebLogic Server Console when configuring a session pool. It is not uncommon to see an InstanceNotFoundException message. If an exception occurs, try to configure the session pool again.
	If the exception still occurs, you may need to restart the WebLogic server. However, you can also try clicking on the left pane and refreshing it. If you see that the session pool has been added, then you do not need to restart the server. You should now be able to add the consumer.
	This issue does not apply if did the full installation of WebLogic 6.1 SP3, and did not upgrade from SP2.

There are currently seven connection consumers in eaDirect 3.2. There are five connection consumers for logging, one for disputes, and one for annotations. The following provides an example of how to create a session pool and connection consumer for annotations:



Deploying eaDirect J2EE Applications to WebLogic Server

In general, deploying an application involves three distinct phases:

- Component creation, typically done by application developers
- Application assembly, typically done by application developers (although they may not have participated in the 'component creation' phase)
- Application deployment, typically done by both application developers and system administrators

During application development and testing, it's not unusual for application programmers to deploy their own applications. However, when the application has been assembled and is ready for production, a system administrator most likely will deploy it.

You deploy eaDirect applications through the WebLogic Server Console. Three J2EE applications are provided in the eaDirect software distribution:

To deploy eaDirect J2EE applications to WebLogic Server:

- 1. Start WebLogic Server if it isn't already running. This can be done from the Services dialog, or by clicking **Start Default Server** in the WebLogic Server program folder.
- Open the WebLogic Server Console. From the Start menu, select Programs and Bea WebLogic E-Business Platform and WebLogic Server 6.1, and click Start Default Console.

You can also open the WebLogic Server Console from a browser using the URL syntax: http://host:port/console. For example:

9. After *ear-eadirect.ear* has been uploaded and installed, the Deployments folder in the left pane should look like:



Before leaving the WebLogic Server Console, you might want to take time to make sure that all required EJBs and WAR files have been deployed to the target server. Doing this can possibly prevent problems from arising later that can interfere with the normal operation of eaDirect.

Expand each J2EE application in the left pane to show its EJBs and WAR file. Click on either an EJB or the WAR file, and then click the **Targets/Servers** tab in the dialog that is displayed in the right pane. If necessary, move the target server from Available to Chosen. Click **Apply** for the change to take effect the next time the server is started.



If you choose to deploy eaSample at this time, you must first run *create_demo_oc_table.bat*, which creates the database tables needed for the Order Capture feature. Failure to do so will result in errors when you start WebLogic Server. *See Appendix A: Using eaSample* for more information.

Setting Up an Application Server for eaDirect

- 10. Stop WebLogic Server. You can do this from the WebLogic Server Console by right-clicking on myserver, and selecting Stop this server from the menu.
- 11. Restart WebLogic Server. You can start the default WebLogic server by going to the Start menu and selecting **Programs** and **Bea WebLogic E-Business Platform** and **WebLogic Server 6.1**. Then click **Start Default Server**.

If you have installed WebLogic as a Windows service, you can stop and restart WebLogic Server through the Services dialog.

Starting the eaDirect Scheduler

After all the eaDirect EAR files have been deployed to the WebLogic Server, you must start the eaDirect Scheduler in order to schedule and run jobs in the eaDirect Command Center. If you attempt to run a new job with the Scheduler not running, the job will not run and you will see 'Not yet started' as its status.

You can start the Scheduler in two ways:

- From a Command Prompt window
- As a Windows Service

Starting the Scheduler from a Command Prompt Window

To start the Scheduler from a Command Prompt window:

- 1. Open a Command Prompt window and change directory to %EDX_HOME%\bin.
- 2. Start the Scheduler using the following command syntax:

```
C:\> wl_scheduler -start -url t3://localhost:<port>
```

For example:

```
C:\> wl_scheduler -start -url t3://doc_hughes:7001
```

3. If the Scheduler starts successfully, a start-up message with the name of the log file is displayed in the same Command Prompt window you entered the command (note that you must leave this command window open as long as the Scheduler is running). A log file is created in *%EDX HOME%\Logs*.

Starting the Scheduler as a Windows Service

When starting the Scheduler as a Windows Service, you will be required to modify *SCH.txt* (Scheduler template file), which is copied to *%EDX HOME%\bin* when you install eaDirect.

To install and start the Scheduler as a Windows Service:

- 1. In Windows Explorer, navigate to %EDX_HOME% bin.
- 2. Open the file *SCH.txt* by right clicking on its name, and then selecting **Open** from the menu.
- 3. Modify the Java Classpath information in *SCH.txt* to reflect your active Java environment. For example:

```

```



Testing the Installation and Configuration of eaDirect

You can test the installation and configuration of eaDirect on the application server by logging in to eaDirect's web-based production environment called the Command Center. The Command Center is the administrative 'hub' of the eaDirect production environment and it is where you create applications and jobs, configure and schedule them to run, and monitor their activity.

The Command Center is also password protected, requiring a valid username and password to enter. For detailed information about the activities that take place within the Command Center, see the *eaDirect Production Guide*.

To log into the Command Center:

1. Start the application and database servers if they are not running. Both can be started from their individual program folders, or from the Services dialog.

- 2. Start the Scheduler, if it isn't already running.
- 3. Open a web browser and enter the URL to invoke the Command Center. The default URL syntax takes the form:

http://server:port/eaDirect

For example:

http://doc_hughes:7001/eaDirect

4. A successful connection opens the Command Center Login Administrator page.



7. If you are unable to log in, click **Service Status** on the menu to see what the problem is. For example, a database configuration problem might prevent a user from logging in to the Command Center.

There is a database configuration problem.

- 8. Troubleshoot the problem by carefully reviewing what you have done up to this point. In particular, you will want to:
 - Verify that the SQL 2000 database is running
 - Verify that the database has been setup properly (sometimes this may mean re-running the eaDirect database set up script *DBConfigTool.jar*)
 - Verify that the Java JDBC and JMS resources configured in the WebLogic Server Console are correct
 - Verify that the eaDirect EAR file has been properly deployed
 - Verify that all required EJBs and WAR files have been deployed correctly
 - Verify that a target server has been chosen for all required EJBs, EAR, and WAR files
- 9. After this is done, stop and restart the application server, then try logging into the Command Center again.

Additionally, if the Indexer and Formatter jobs are not recognized in the Command Center after you have started WebLogic as a Windows Service, do the following:

- 1. In the Command Center, open the Job Configuration page.
- 2. If the *.dlls* are not being identified, as shown by an error message in the DDF Path field and the Indexer task's indexed fields not being displayed, add the path C:\EDCSbd\lib as a system variable in the System dialog (accessible through the Control Panel).
- 3. Start WebLogic again and return to the Job Configuration page in the Command Center. If the DDF Path fields for the Indexer and Formatter jobs do not contain error messages and you can see the indexed fields in the Indexer, then the WebLogic service is now able to recognize the Indexer.dll and Formatter.dll correctly.
- 4. The WebLogic service might also not be able to recognize the Index.dll and Formatter.dll due to the length of a pathname. If this happens, add the following line to the 'cmdline' path in *installNtService.cmd*:

-Djava.library.path=\"%PATH%;C:\EDCSbd\lib;\"

Migrating eaDirect To A New Version

Migrating eaDirect Databases

This chapter describes how to migrate an eaDirect 3.0 database to eaDirect 3.2. edocs strongly recommends that you back up your current database before migrating to eaDirect 3.2 in case you have to restore it due to a migration problem.

No migration is necessary when upgrading from eaDirect 3.1 to eaDirect 3.2.


To migrate an eaDirect 3.0 database to eaDirect 3.2:

- 1. Open a command window and change directory to %EDX HOME%\db\mssql.
- Run the Java database creation and configuration tool, *DBConfigTool.jar*.
 C:\> java -jar DBConfigTool.jar
- 3. The Database Configuration screen is displayed. Click Migrate, and then click Next.



Upon completion of the database migration process, you might want to check the migration log files in %EDX_HOME%\db\mssql\migration*.log to make sure that all the database tables, including tables for annotations and disputes, were created.

Migrating eaDirect Applications

When upgrading to a new version of eaDirect, you must migrate your J2EE and Web applications to accommodate the changes in the new version. The sample applications provided with each version of eaDirect provide examples of how to use the current features of eaDirect. Your site must update the components in your application, and you must re-deploy your application.

You must also update your application to work with the new sample application. To accomplish that:

1. Merge your custom code into the sample application, and rename it. For more information about how to do this, see the *eaSDK: Customizing and Deploying Applications* document.

2. Re-deploy your custom application, as described in *To deploy eaDirect J2EE applications to WebLogic Server*:.

See the *What's New in eaDirect 3.2* document for information about new features in 3.2, and information about how to add support for those features to your application.

See the *eaSDK: Customizing and Deploying Applications* document for information about the components that make up the J2EE and Web applications, and the procedures for recreating EAR and WAR files.







You do not have to specify the WebLogic service name on the command line because it is named in *uninstallNtService.com*.

Uninstalling the Scheduler as a Windows Service

To uninstall the Scheduler as a Windows Service:

- 1. Open a Command Prompt window, and change directory to %EDX HOME%/bin.
- 2. Uninstall the Scheduler as a Windows Service:

About eaSample


eaSample is a sample J2EE application that eaDirect provides as part of its software distribution. You can use it as a framework for developing a custom EJB application; it contains all the Java Server Pages (JSPs), HTML, image files, scripts, and templates you need to get started. eaSample deploys as *ear-easample.ear*.

You can use eaSample to view the sample NatlWireless, Training, and NW_LDDetail applications provided with your system. You can use the data and design files in these sample applications to become familiar with eaDirect by creating sample billing applications and jobs, publishing data and design files in the form of *version sets*, and scheduling the jobs to run in the Command Center, the administrative 'hub' for the eaDirect production environment.

eaSample demonstrates the following types of data presentment:

- Dynamic HTML views
- Detail data extraction (DetailExtractor job)
- Annotations
- Disputes
- Order capture

Setting Up Database Tables for Order Capture in eaSample

In order to use the Order Capture feature in the eaSample application that is provided with the eaDirect distribution, you must manually execute a SQL Server batch file that creates the appropriate database tables for the sample application. The command syntax is:

create_demo_oc_table.bat database_name database_username database_password

This command must be run on your database machine.

To create database tables for Order Management in eaSample:

- 1. Open a Command Prompt window and change directory to %EDX HOME%\samples\eaSample\db\mssql
- 3. Run the *Create_demo_oc_table.bat* file providing the database username, database SID, and database password. For example:

C:\> create_demo_oc_table.bat edx0 edx_dba edx

- 4. When the batch file has completed executing, you are returned to the command prompt. Note that no additional user input is required.
- 5. Close the Command Prompt window.


The eaSample application requires that its JDBC Connection Pool name be **edxUserConnectionPool**, as mentioned in the topic *Configuring a JDBC Connection Pool*. If you are using the default JDBC connection pool name for eaSample, you can ignore this topic.

However, if you are using a different connection pool name other than the default connection pool name **edxUserConnectionPool**, you will have to manually edit the connection pool name in the following EJBs for the eaSample application in order for it to deploy correctly.

- ejb-oc-cc
- ejb-oc-health
- ejb-oc-telco


To manually edit the connection pool name in eaSample:

1. From your domain in the WebLogic Server Console, select Deployment and Applications, and expand ear-easample.



Viewing Sample Customer Information in NatlWireless using eaSample

The following steps describe how to use eaSample to view the sample eaDirect application called NatlWireless. NatlWireless is a set of eaDirect design and data files which eaDirect provides in with its software to demonstrate the various features of an eaDirect presentment application.

You must set up NatlWireless in the eaDirect Command Center (production environment), then enroll and log onto eaSample to view sample bills.

Setting up NatlWireless in the production environment includes the following general steps, described in detail below:

- 1. Create a new application for NatlWireless in the eaDirect Command Center.
- 2. Create a new Indexer job, publishing the application DDF for the job to use, configure the four tasks that run sequentially as part of the Indexer job, and run the job. Then publish the NatlWireless application (dynamic HTML view) files designed to display the statement summary.
- 3. Create and configure a DetailExtractor job, publishing the DDF, database table XML file, and statement XSLT style sheet view files designed for the DetailExtractor job, and run the job. Then publish the three dynamic XML Query files (views) designed to display the extracted NatlWireless data and demonstrate the disputes and annotations features.

To create a new application for NatlWireless in the eaDirect Command Center:

- 1. Start WebLogic Server and the Scheduler, if not already running.
- 2. Open a web browser and enter the URL to the eaDirect Command Center, using the syntax:

http://host:port/eaDirect



- 19. Click **Create** and repeat the previous two steps twice to publish two additional XML Query views (both view names are hard coded in your JSP HTML pages as the specific names the Web browser looks for in the code):

View Name	File

AnnotationQuery	annot_sql.xml

20. Close the Publisher. You can proceed to use eaSample to display the data.

To use eaSample to view NatlWireless statements:

1. When the Indexer job completes successfully (status changes to "Done"), open a Web browser and access eaSample using the following URL syntax, substituting your own server name (host) and port number:


