These release notes describe new features and enhancements as well as any specific installation and implementation considerations for Oracle Content Portlet Suite (CPS) version 10g Release 3 (10.1.3.3.2).

1 What's New

CPS includes the following new features and enhancements compared to earlier 10gR3 releases:

Localized Portlet Interfaces

This version of CPS offers localized portlet interfaces. The following languages are supported: English, German, French, Spanish, Portuguese (Brazil), Italian, Dutch, Chinese (both traditional and simplified), Japanese, and Korean. Please note that the software help is in English, regardless of the selected interface language.

2 Installation Considerations

The following special considerations should be taken into account when installing this version of CPS:

- CPS requires that Content Integration Suite version 10gR3 be installed and available.
- Java Virtual Machine (JVM) J2SE 1.4 or later is required.
- If you are deploying CPS for Oracle Application Server Portal, you must ensure the portal server has been installed with all the languages you wish to use. By default, the installer for Oracle Application Server Portal installs in English and in the operating system language. If you need additional languages, you must perform an advanced installation. Refer to the Oracle Application Server Portal documentation for additional information.

3 Implementation Considerations

The following implementation considerations should be taken into account when using this version of CPS:

Portlet Interface Language

The portlet interface language is automatically set, depending on the locale of the operating system of the client computer. For example, if you are running a

German version of Microsoft Windows, then the CPS software will have a German interface.

4 Documentation

CPS comes with a full set of PDF documentation. This documentation is located in the /docs directory of the unbundled CPS distribution file.

CPS Installation Guide

The CPS Installation Guide contains information to assist administrators responsible for the installation of Content Portlet Suite. Each supported portal server has a dedicated installation guide:
