

# Oracle® Retail Price Management

Release Notes

Release 14.0.3

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Oracle Retail Price Management (RPM) Release 14.0.3 is a patch release for RPM 14.0.

RPM 14.0.3 includes selected defect fixes and enhancements for RPM 14.0 code. Oracle Customer Support investigates submitted issues assuming that all released updates have been applied. It is the customer's decision when to apply a new release; however, delays in applying updates can complicate the support process.

## About Patch Releases

Oracle Retail patch releases are periodic releases that can include new defect fixes and product enhancements.

Documentation for patch releases includes the following:

- New and updated guides (for example, operations and user guides) that apply to the patch release level. See "[Related Documentation](#)" for a list of the documents published for RPM 14.0.3.
- Defect reports for new fixes and enhancements for the patch release.

## Applying a Patch Release

Before applying the RPM 14.0.3 patch release, be sure that:

- RPM 14.0 has been installed.
- Patch release RPM 14.0.2 has been applied.

Before applying the release over your files:

- Note whether any modules have been customized. If so, the customizations must be reapplied to the new version of the module, or the fix may need to be applied to the custom version of the code.

- Copy the original files to a different directory before you copy over them, in case you need to refer to them at a later date.

## Running Scripts

Back up data before running any script, because the scripts provided do not preserve data. See defect reports for details.

Check with your database administrator to determine whether your database should be analyzed after a script is run. In many cases, analysis of the database is necessary to take advantage of new or modified indexes intended to improve performance of the application.

## Technical Enhancements

The technical enhancements described below are included in this release:

- Partitioning of the RPM\_BATCH\_LOG for instrumentation maintenance activity.
- Performance improvements for the transactional promotions conflict check process.
- Technical enhancement in the RPM\_PURGEEEXPIREDEEXECUTED job explode timelines logic.

## Noteworthy Fixed Issues

The following defect fixes and enhancements are included in RPM 14.0.3. This is not a complete list; see the cross-reference spreadsheet and defect reports for a complete list and full details.

**Table 1 Noteworthy Fixed Issues**

Defect Number	Summary
20766672	Unable to edit a large promotion with component that has 1192 details.
20894492	RPM goes into conflict check and takes more than 2 hours to complete a conflict check.
20894247	The Injector batch conflict check process never ends when executed.
19344238	When you run the RPM_PURGEEEXPIREDEEXECUTED batch file, the clearance does not purge.
20893486	Items are not reclassified in the RPM_FUTURE_RETAIL table.
20924267	Issues exist when approving a transaction type/storewide promotion in RPM.
20893299	When creating a complex promotion with 25k, no message is received for '240' seconds.
21154008	Partitioning the RPM_BATCH_LOG table as a result of RPM instrumentation
21075241	When a deal is created from RPM vendor funded promotion and is linked to an existing promotion created in the past, the deal active date defaults from the promotion start date rather than the promotion component start date.
21025318	Item details are missing for complete promotions using item list.
20901709	VFP deals do not get applied to the promotion components in the Maintain Component window.

## Defect Fixes and Documentation

A defect fix is a modification to the base Oracle Retail code (for example, a bug fix, a performance enhancement, or a functional enhancement). Each defect fix that is included in this patch has a corresponding defect report titled <defect-number>.PDF (for example, 1234567.PDF) that is posted to My Oracle Support at the following location: Oracle Retail Defect Document Listings (Doc ID: 2021275.1). Review each defect report carefully before implementing the defect fixes. Note that scripts do not preserve data. Make sure that all data is backed up before you run any script.
