1 About the Tour

Welcome to the Portal Example—Portlet Features and Functionality tour. This tour is based on a fictitious Web site called Avitek Financial Services. Avitek Financial Services is a retail financial portal that provides a single point of access to several kinds of visitors, such as guests, investors, and financial advisors. Avitek Financial Services provides various kinds of business content, applications, and services from both internal and external sources. Additionally, the content is personalized for each type of visitor.

Avitek Financial Services contains several marketing campaigns, the ability to trade stock, and the ability author and review newsletters; it contains specific portlets for investors to access company profiles, service requests, and newsletters written by their financial advisors; and it contains convenience portlets such as Dictionary, Bookmarks, Stock Quotes, and WebSearch.

The tour shows you every portlet in the Avitek Financial Services and demonstrates various possibilities in portlet design and content. This tour is *not* intended to demonstrate portal functionality. To familiarize yourself with portal functionality, please take the *Portal Example—Visitor and Administrator Features* tour at <http://edocs.bea.com/wlp/docs70/ptour/index.htm>.

You can take this tour in the order it is presented or simply go to the portlet you are interested in and follow the instructions. **The password for all predefined visitors (visitor1–visitor10) is “password”.** This tour provides descriptions and instructions for accessing and using each Portal Example portlet and provides information about underlying processes, the location of its Java and JavaServer Pages (JSP), and other pertinent information, such as whether a portlet is part of a marketing campaign.

Starting the Tour

Before you begin the tour, make sure the following are installed:

- WebLogic Server 7.0
- WebLogic Portal 7.0, including Portal Examples

To begin the tour you need to first start the server and then launch the Portal Example.

1. Start the WebLogic Portal as follows:

Windows: Start Menu → Programs → BEA WebLogic Platform 7.0 → WebLogic Portal 7.0 → Portal Examples → Portal Example → Launch Portal Server

UNIX: Run `<install directory>/weblogic700/portal/samples/portal/sampleportalDomain/startSamplePortal.sh`

2. After WebLogic Portal is running, start the Portal Example as follows:

Windows: Start Menu → Programs → BEA WebLogic Platform 7.0 → WebLogic Portal 7.0 → Portal Examples → Portal Example → Start Portal Example

UNIX: Log on to the Portal Example client. If you installed WebLogic Portal with the default settings, you can use the following URL in a browser that is invoked on the same machine as the server:

`http://localhost:7501/sampleportal/index.jsp`

where localhost is the name of the server running the Portal Example.

You are now ready to begin touring Avitek Financial Services.

Portlet Overview

As previously mentioned, the Avitek Financial Services portal contains a wide variety of portlets. [Table 2-1](#) provides a short description of each portlet.

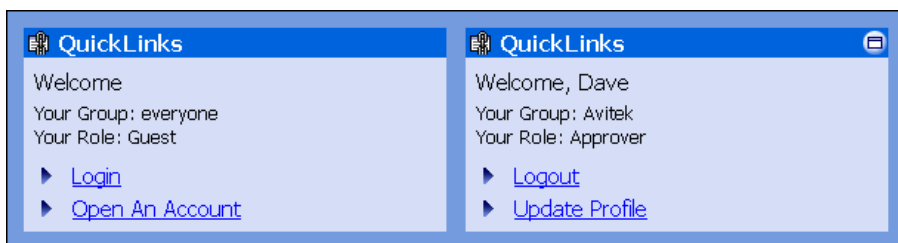

Group Portals, Roles, Visitors, and Passwords

Group Portals The Avitek Financial Services portal has two group portals: the Avitek group portal and the default group portal. (The default group portal was automatically generated when the Avitek Financial Services portal was created.) Group portals are different configurations of a portal. Each group portal has a specified user group and allows delegation of privileges among administrators. For most of this tour and within the application, the group portals are usually referred to by their user group name, as shown in the QuickLinks portlet (Figure 2-1).

Figure 2-1 Group and Roles



Visitors and roles The Avitek Financial Services portal has ten predefined visitors (visitor1, visitor2 ... visitor10). Every visitor belongs to a group and a role. The portlets displayed to a particular visitor depend on that visitor's group membership and role. Each group and role has different capabilities and privileges. To see the functionality of the various portlets, you need to switch visitor types.

Note: Roles also determine which Entitlement Segments a visitor belongs to. For example, a visitor whose role is *Investor* is placed in the Investor Entitlement Segment. Entitlement Segments and their default values are defined in the E-Business Control Center. The values (properties) for a particular visitor is set in the WebLogic Portal Administration Tools. Passwords All predefined visitors use the same password, which is “password” and is case sensitive.

The following list describes the effect of each group and role on portlet availability:

- Everyone Group, Guest Role—These portlets are displayed to everyone regardless of group membership and role.
- Avitek Group—These portlets are displayed to visitors that belong to the Avitek group. Visitor 1–10 all belong the Avitek group. This group has the following roles:
 - Approver Role—Provides the ability to reject, approve, or delete newsletters written by financial advisors.
 - Financial Advisor Role—Provides the ability to write newsletters.
 - Investor Role—Provides the ability to read newsletters written by a particular financial advisor.
 - Guest Role—Provides the ability to view and use all portlets except the Newsletter portlets.










Portlet Controls

Portlet controls allow you to use portlets. For example, a portlet may have more than one view; it may be maximized, minimized, or detached from the portal. Portlet views are implemented using JavaServer Pages (JSP). They range in complexity from containing simple static HTML content to employing JSP tag libraries or JSP scriptlets that access Enterprise JavaBeans (EJB) components or other application functionality within the application server. The controls for portlets in the Avitek Financial Services portal are listed in [Table 2-3](#).

	Maximize	Maximizes the portlet to the full width of the browser window.
	Unmaximize	Returns a maximized portlet to its original size.

	Minimize	Minimizes the portlet so that only the Title is displayed.
	Restore	Returns the minimized portlet to its original size.

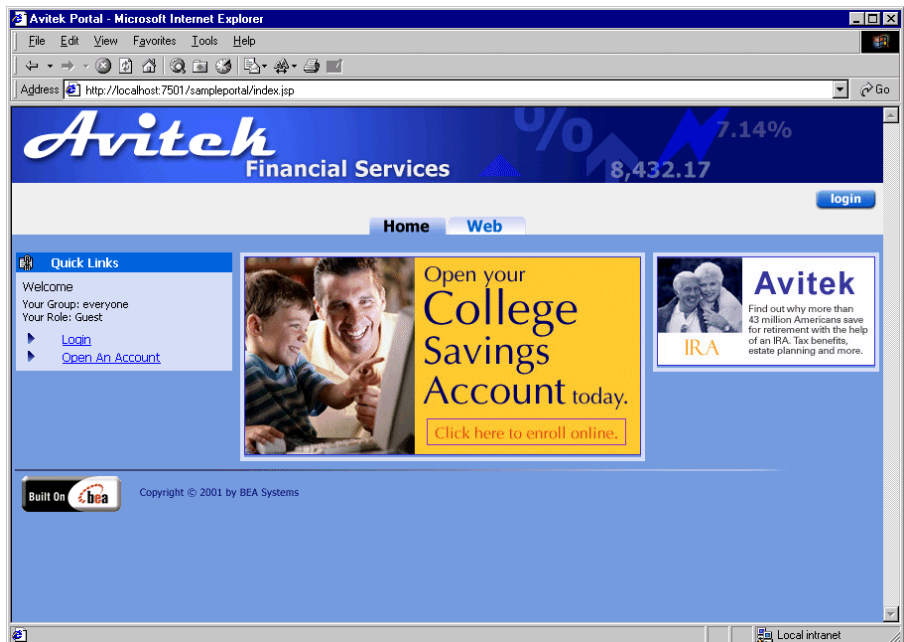
Home Page

The contents of the Home page depend on whether a visitor is logged in and on the visitor's group membership and role. The following sections illustrate these differences.

Home Page—Visitor Not Logged In

The default Home page, shown in [Figure 3-1](#), appears before a visitor logs in. The default Home page contains three portlets. The College Savings Account and Avitek IRA advertisements occupy placeholders inside portlets (the PrimaryCampaign and SecondaryCampaign portlets, respectively). The content of these placeholders changes depending on which campaign is invoked. For a full discussion about the campaigns in the Portal Example, see [Chapter 5](#), “Campaigns and Portlets.”

Home Page—Visitor Logged In

As previously mentioned, the portlets displayed on the Home page change when a visitor logs in. To see some of the other portlets displayed after login, complete these steps:

1. Click the **Login** button.
2. In the User ID field, enter “visitor10”.
3. In the Password field, enter “password”.

Note: The password for Visitors 1–10 is “password”.

4. Click the **Login** button. The Home page opens, as shown in Figure 3-2.

5. Notice that Visitor 10's Home page contains eight portlets. Visitor 10 belongs to the Avitek group and the guest role. Group managers determine which portlets their members can access. 6. To log out, click the **Logout** button. The Home page returns to its default configuration.

To further explore how the user role affects which portlets are displayed on the Home page, log in as other visitors—try visitor1 for the Approver role, visitor3 for the Advisor role, and visitor4 for the Investor role.

Web Page

Like the Home page, the contents of the Web page also depend on whether a visitor is logged in or not. The following sections illustrate these differences.

Web Page—Visitor Not Logged In

To view the default Web page, click the **Web** tab.

The default Web page contains three portlets: Dictionary, WebSearch, and Quote. [Figure 3-3](#) shows the Web page when a visitor has not logged in.

Web Page—Visitor Logged In

To view the Web page when a visitor has logged in, complete the following steps:

1. Click the **Login** button.
2. In the User ID field, enter “visitor10”.
3. In the Password field, enter “password”.

Note: The password for visitor1–10 is “password”.

4. Click the **Login** button. The Home page opens.
5. Click the **Web** tab.

The Web page for Visitors 1–10 contains five portlets: WorldNews, Dictionary, WebSearch, Bookmarks, and Quote. [Figure 3-4](#) shows the Web page for these visitors.

6. To log out, click the **Logout** button. The portal displays the Home page in its default configuration.

Dictionary Portlet

The Dictionary portlet allows you to look up the definition of a word by connecting to the Merriam-Webster Web site. It is a simple JavaServer Page (JSP) application.

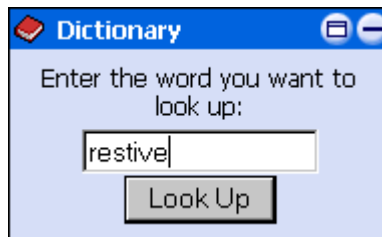

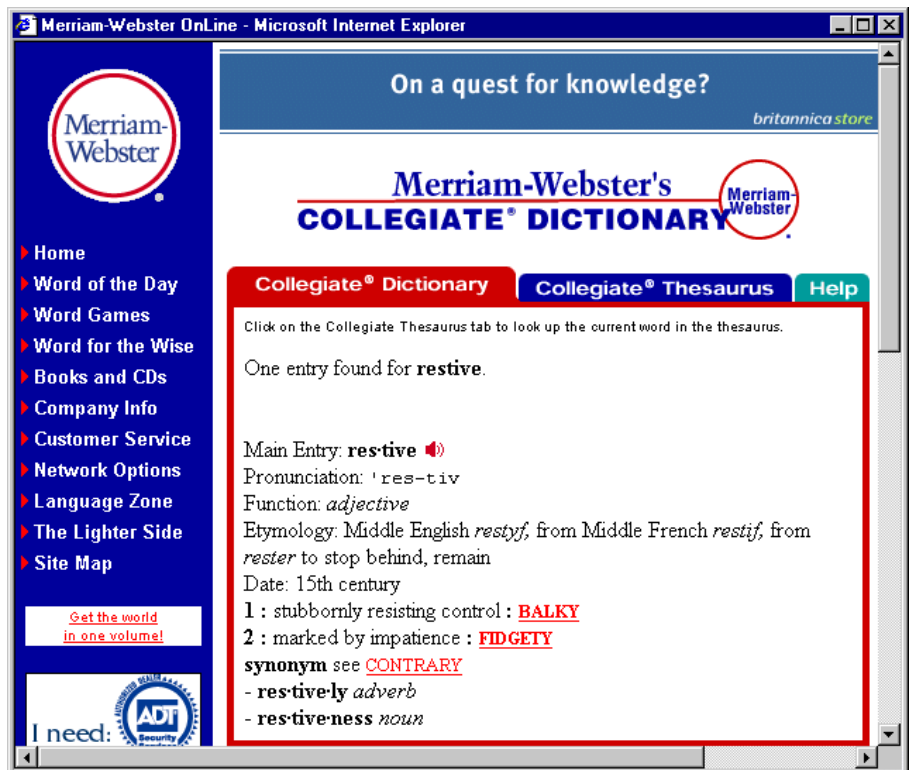
1. From the Home page, click the **Web** tab.

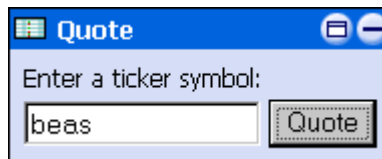

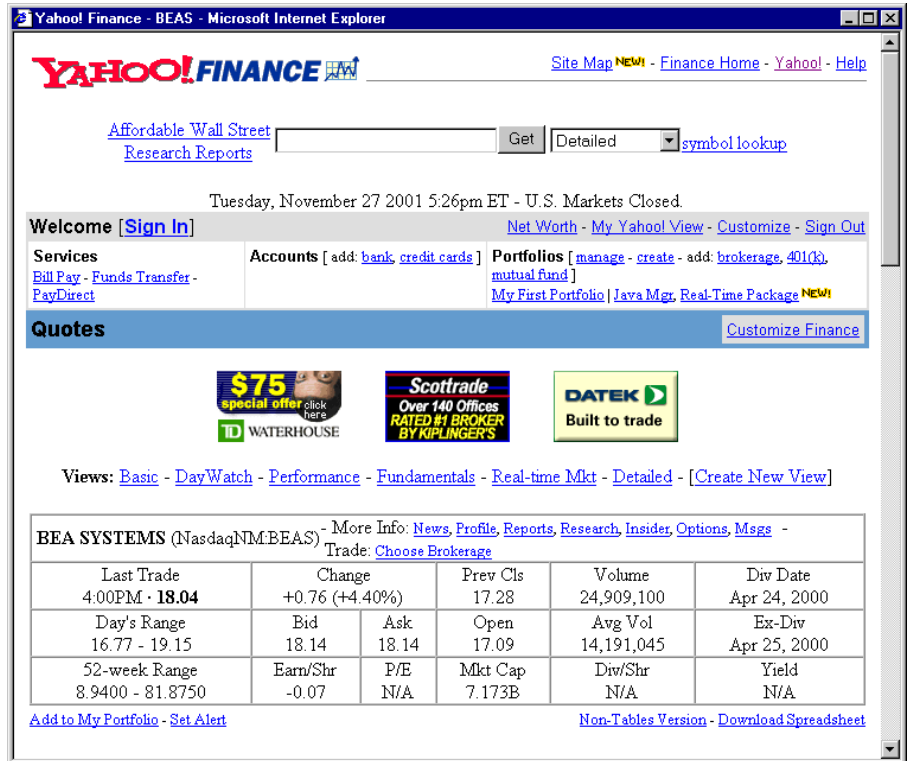

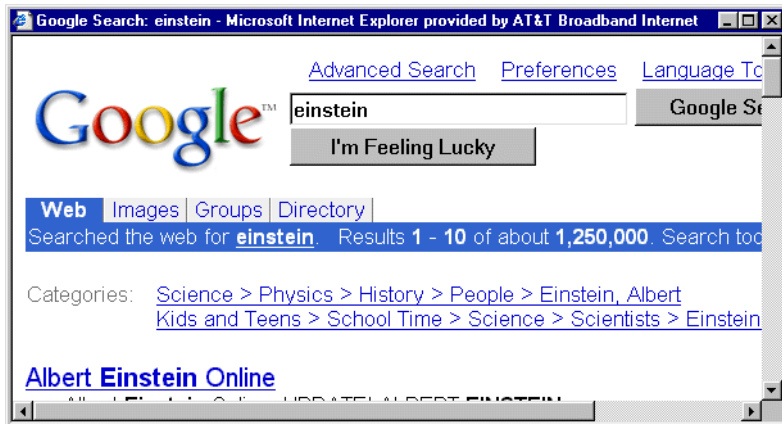

WorldNews Portlet

The WorldNews portlet links to various news agencies on the internet and displays the new stories they publish. It retrieves news stories based on user preference and displays them as links. This portlet demonstrates the use of the WebLogic Server Extensible Markup Language (XML) and Extensible Stylesheet Language (XSL) JSP tags.

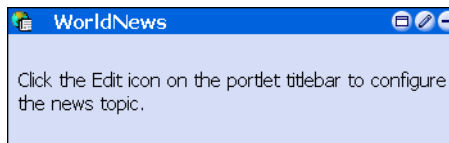

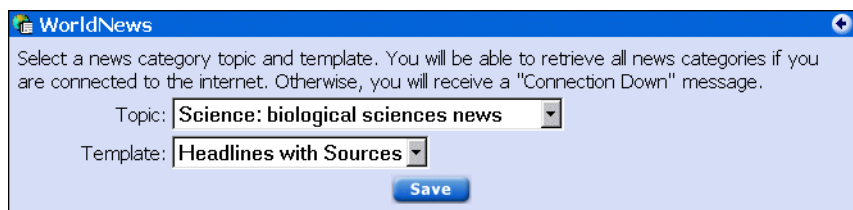
1. Log in as any visitor.
2. From the Home page, click the **Web** tab. [Figure 4-7](#) shows the WorldNews Portlet before it has been configured.

3. Click the **Edit** button in the titlebar. The portlet maximizes and is now editable, as shown in [Figure 4-8](#).

4. Select a Topic and a Template from the drop-down lists, click the **Save** button, and then click the **Finished** button. The portlet now shows the topics from the selected news source, as shown in [Figure 4-9](#).

5. To view a news story, click one of the links. The story is displayed in a new browser page, as shown in [Figure 4-10](#).

Bookmarks Portlet

The Bookmarks portlet provides a way for you to store the names and URLs of Web sites. After a bookmark is created, clicking the link opens the site in a new browser window. This portlet is implemented through Enterprise JavaBeans (EJB) 2.0 entity beans.

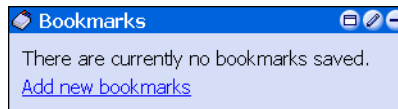

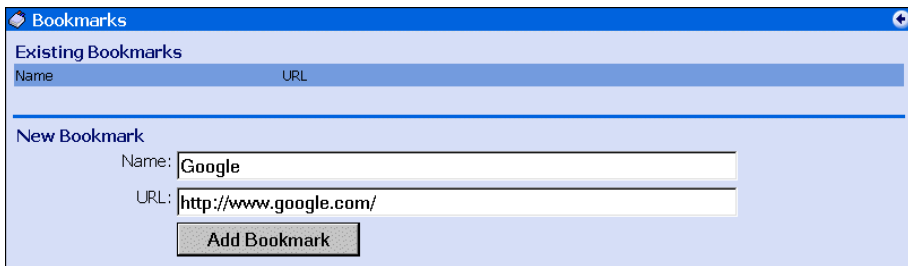
1. Log in as any visitor.
2. After the Home page appears, click the **Web** tab. The Bookmarks portlet appears, as shown in [Figure 4-11](#).

4. Enter the name and URL of a Web site you frequently visit, and then click the **Add Bookmark** button. The portlet shows the added bookmark, as shown in [Figure 4-13](#).

5. Add another bookmark, and then click the **Finished** button. The portlet returns to its original size and displays the new bookmarks, as shown in [Figure 4-14](#).

5 Campaigns and Portlets

The Avitek Financial Services portal contains five marketing campaigns, which are listed below:

- College Fund Campaign—Default campaign. It displays an advertisement in a placeholder within the PrimaryCampaign portlet on the Home page.
- Avitek IRA Campaign—Default campaign. It displays an advertisement in a placeholder within the SecondaryCampaign portlet on the Home page.
- Welcome Campaign—Sends an email when a new account is opened.
- Personal Investment Advisor Campaign—Displays an ad for the Personal Investment Advisor when investors have increased their Risk Tolerance to a value of 5.0 or greater. It replaces the ad for the College Fund Campaign.
- Avitek Credit Card Campaign—Displays an ad for the Avitek Credit Card when an investor has purchased at least \$25,000 in stock and the Risk Tolerance has reached a value of 5.0 or greater. It replaces the ad for the Avitek IRA Campaign.

QuickLinks Portlet

The QuickLinks portlet provides various kinds of information and useful links, such as group membership and user role, login and logout, and risk rating. It invokes the security Webflow and sets the portfolio portlet into edit mode. 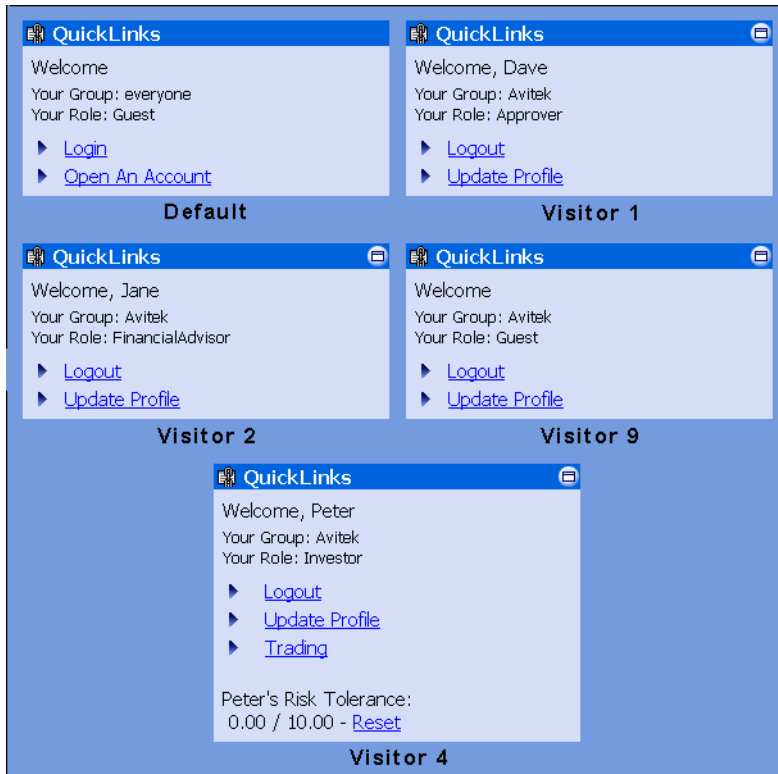

Figure 5-1 QuickLinks Portlet—Group Membership Differences

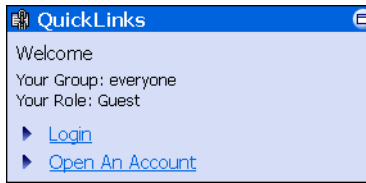

CompanyProfiles Portlet

The CompanyProfiles portlet displays profiles for specific companies. This portlet is involved in two different campaigns: the Personal Investment Advisor campaign and the Avitek Credit Card campaign. These campaigns are invoked when a visitor's risk tolerance increases to 5.0 or greater. Everyone starts off as a conservative investor with a low-risk tolerance. When you click on the high-risk companies in this portlet (Juniper Networks and Micron Technology), your risk tolerance increases. The increase in risk tolerance triggers the Personal Investment Advisor campaign. The Avitek Credit Card campaign is triggered when the increased risk tolerance is 5.0 or greater and the visitor purchases at least \$25,000 in stock.

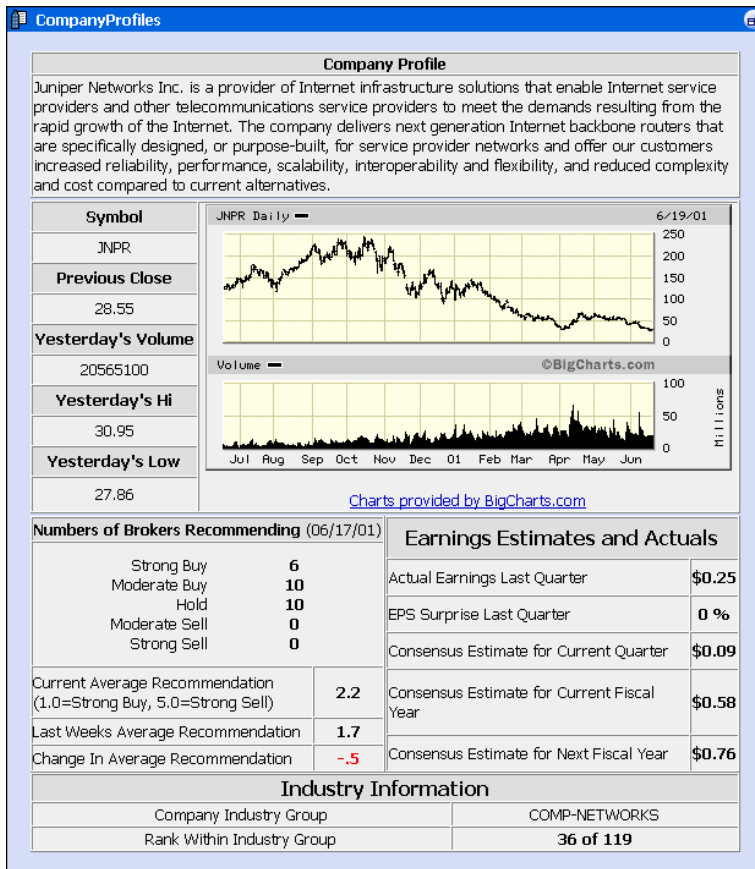

6 Newsletter Portlets

- [ReviewNewsletters Portlet \(for Approvers\)](#)—Approvers can approve, reject, or remove the newsletters written by the financial advisors. Approved newsletters are automatically delivered to the designated investor.

Visitors 4–7 belong to the Avitek group as investors. The Newsletter portlet for investors contains a list of newsletters created by the particular visitor's financial advisor. This portlet demonstrates providing customized content through Service Provider Interface (SPI) implementation and Content Selectors. 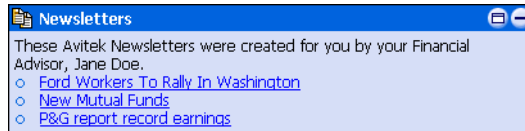

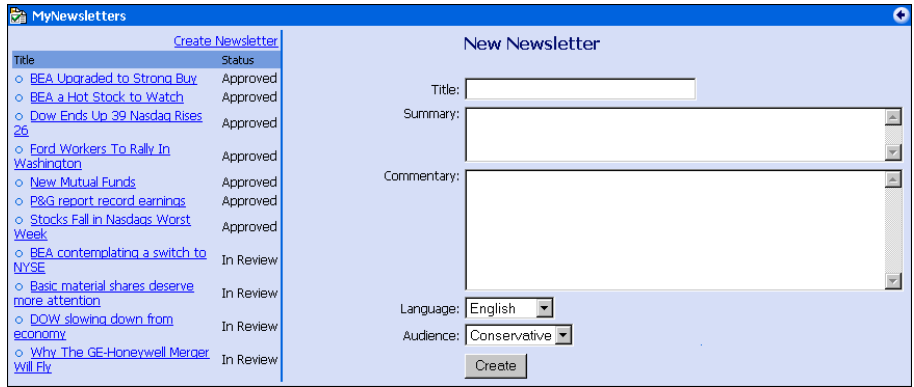

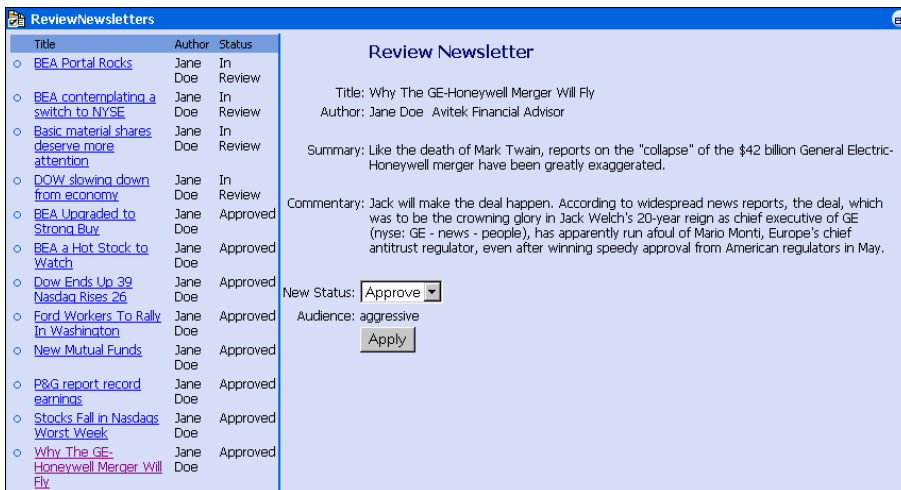

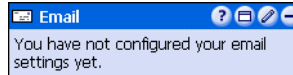

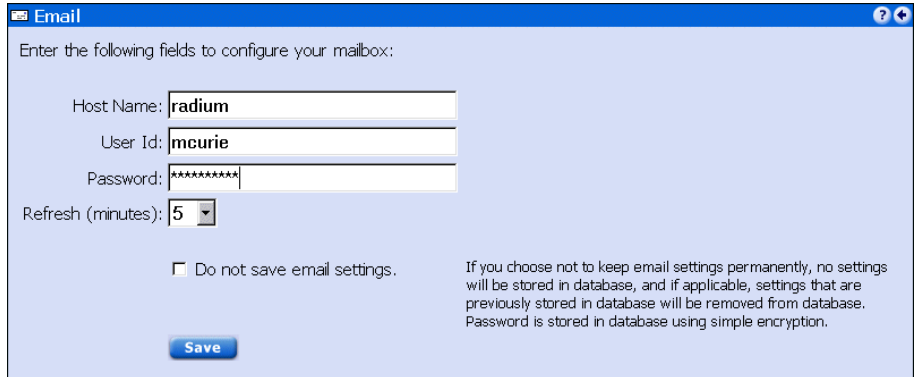

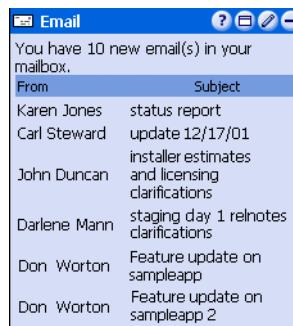
Figure 7-2 Email Portlet—Edit



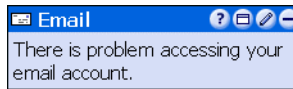



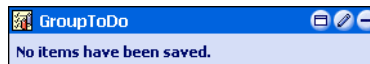

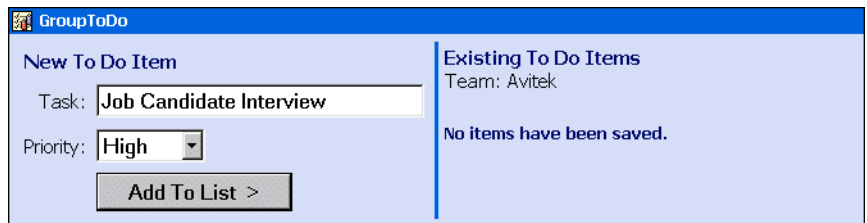

Figure 7-9 GroupToDo Portlet—No Items Saved



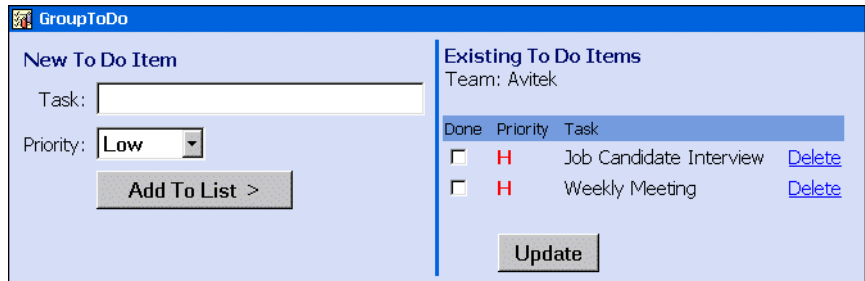

Figure 7-10 GroupToDo Portlet—New To Do Items



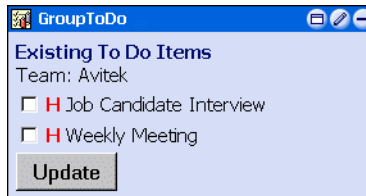

Figure 7-11 GroupToDo Portlet—Item Added



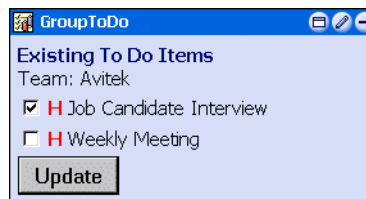



Figure 7-14 CustomerService Portlet—Default (Visitor 5)



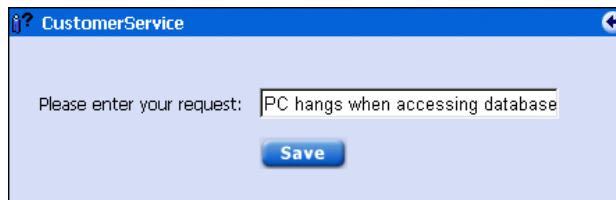

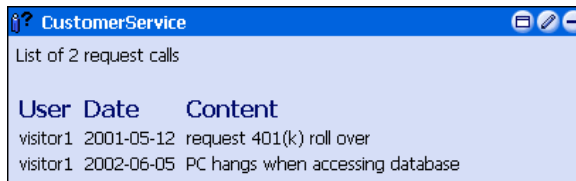

Figure 7-15 CustomerService Portlet—Default (Visitor 1)

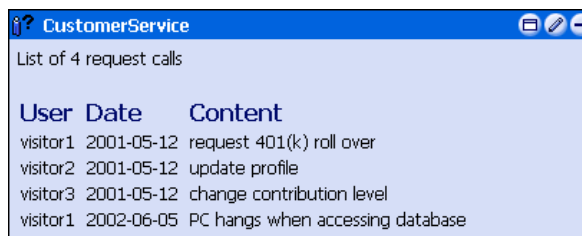
- In the Visitor 1 CustomerService portlet, click the **Edit** button. The portlet expands as shown in [Figure 7-16](#).
