Fixes in the Oracle Insurance Rules Palette

This section describes fixes that were made to the Oracle Insurance Rules Palette Release 9.0.1.0.0.

Events

- When XML is deleted for Action and Events pane it is now also removed from the XML Source.
- When the Global check box is checked in the New Math Section wizard, the XML is written as GLOBAL="Yes" rather than GLOBAL="YES".
- Updates to the ScreenMath MathVariable Name, DataType and Value are now saving correctly to the XML Source.

Explorer Tabs

 The "AS" was removed from all explorer tab names. The names display as Admin Explorer, XML Navigator, Main Explorer and Global Explorer.

Log-in

 User can access the Admin Explorer when logging into a non-IVS environment.

Market Maker

- Validation was added to ensure that each Market Maker name is unique.
- The error messages are now clearing. These messages appear when a user fails to enter a Market Maker name during creation.

Release Management

- Users can create empty configuration packages for non-IVS palette items.
- Release packages and migration sets are organized by status in the Admin Explorer.
- Configuration Packages now can include updated Segments.
- TransactionBusinessRulePacket is now automatically added to configuration package in Release Management. It is also versioned.
- Progress bar when deploying a Release Package is now functional.

Memory Management

- Enhancement to improve memory management.

Security

- Asterisks will display in the password field in Security
 Administration instead of a blank field. This allows the user to
 see that a password has been entered and allows the user to
 verify the password length.
- When a security role with assigned users is deleted, the users assigned to that role will have Read Only access the next time they log-in.

Segments

- Users can visually edit Onload and Onchange in segments, plan rules and copybooks.

Transactions

- The right-click menu is functional on the Assignment tab.
- The status in the New Transaction wizard has a default value of Active.

Uncommitted Rules Wizard

 Uncommitted Rules Wizard now includes Admin Items and Security Groups.
