Oracle Insurance Rules Palette Release Notes

The Oracle Insurance Rules Palette is a standalone application that can be used in conjunction with Oracle Insurance Policy Administration. The Rules Palette provides straightforward functionality that assists with configuration tasks. The Rules Palette mitigates the need to know XML and features user-friendly visual configuration tools.

Enhancements in the Oracle Insurance Rules Palette

This section describes enhancements that were made to the Oracle Insurance Rules Palette release 9.2.0.0.0.

Error Catalog

- The Error Catalog in the Admin Explorer was revised to make it consistent in appearance with other Administration Editors.

Internationalization

- Currency displays can now be set at the Activity level, Plan level or Company level. You can also specify a default currency at the Fund level.
- Math supports a look-up of the currency code of a particular field.
- A calendar offset was added to allow OIPA to calculate the correct price dates on money movement in international unit based funds. Each calendar code will have a different offset based on the time zones associated to the exchange markets and the designated timing of the trade report.

Transactions

- The second step of the New Transaction Wizard has a new combo box called NAV Correction. Financial transactions need this indicator to be set to YES in order to participate in price corrections in OIPA.
- The Transaction Fields pane now has a vertical scroll bar to make it easier for the user to view fields when multiple fields are added.



Version History

- The version history node under a transaction or business rule now displays the version number of the rule, the date the version was saved and the user who saved the modification.

Web Services

 The PAS Properties Web Service is exposed to allow an external application to retrieve all property values from the PAS.properties configuration file.
