The Netra CP2060 CompactPCI host/satellite board is a crucial building block that network equipment providers (NEPs) can use when scaling and improving the availability of next-generation, carrier-grade systems. Based on industry standards, it provides a low-cost solution easily customized for satellite processing.

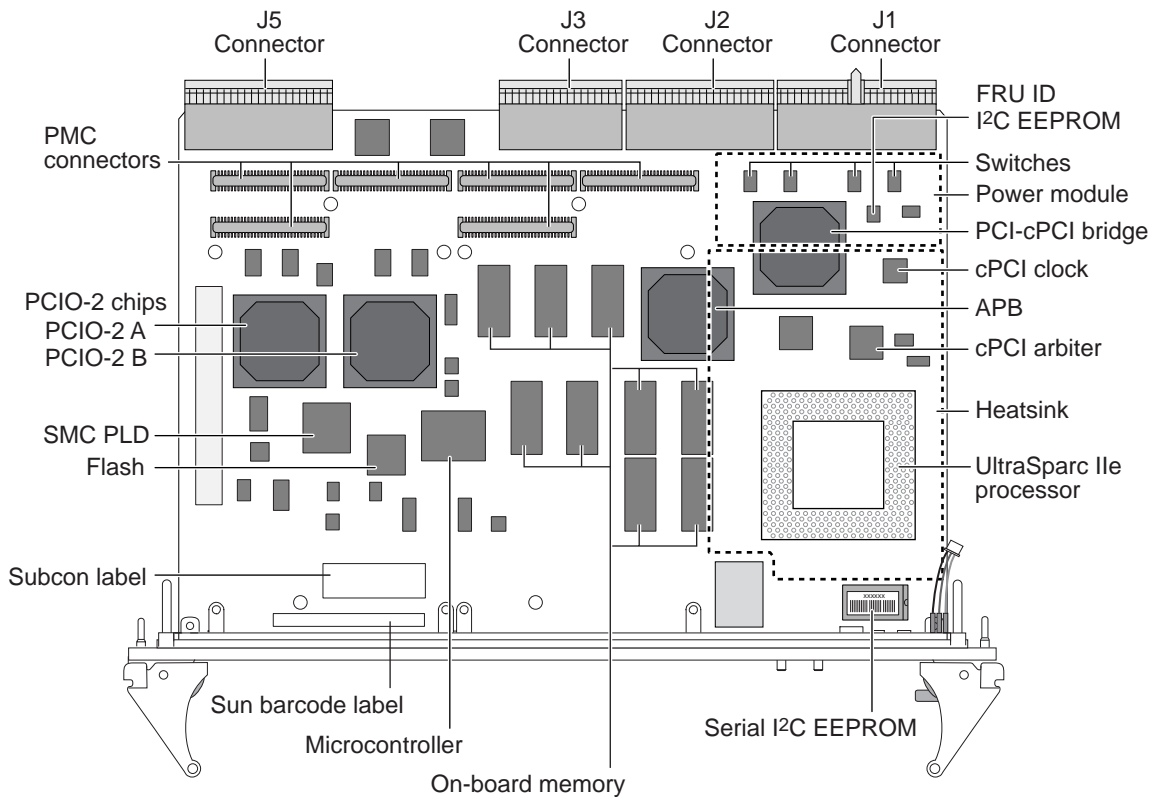


FIGURE 1 Illustration of a Typical Netra CP2060 Board

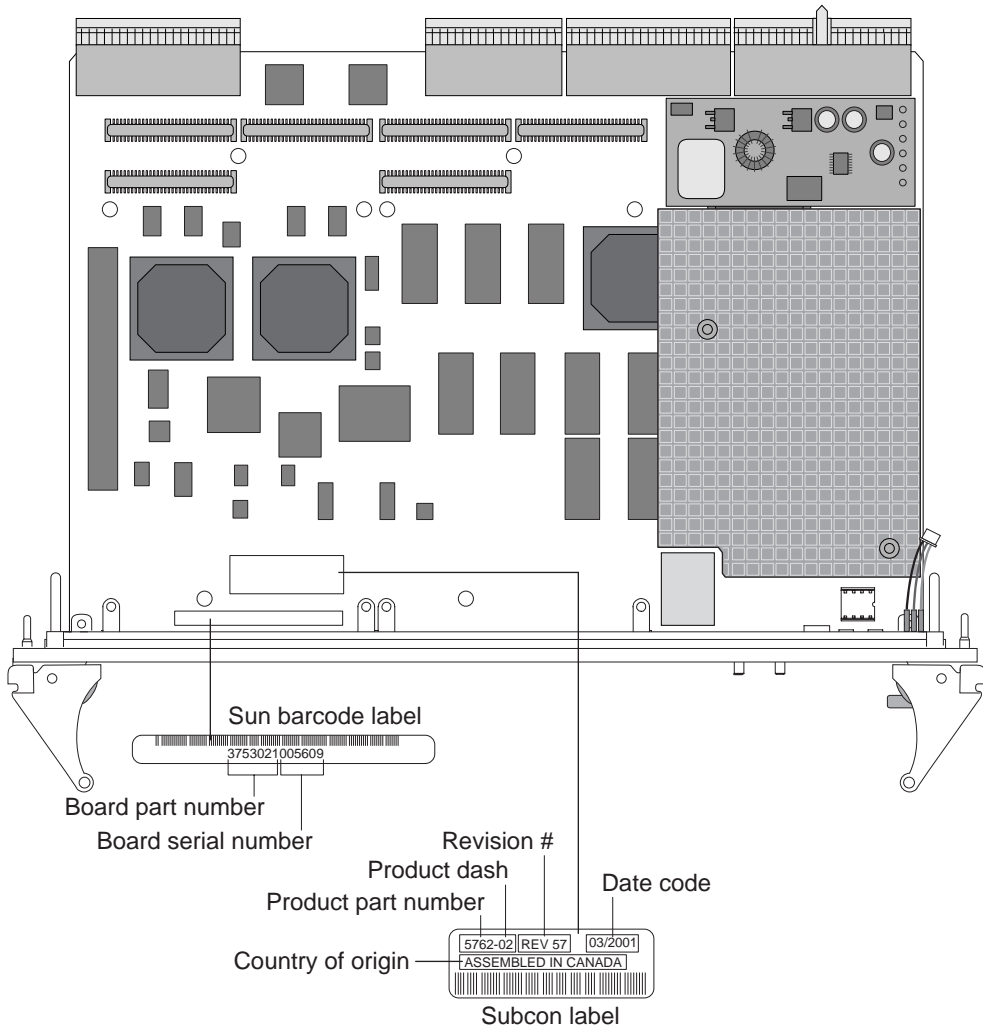


FIGURE 2 Labeling on a Typical CP2060 Board

For proper identification of the board, please see the list below and FIGURE 2. The Sun Microsystems™ barcode label provides the following information:

The Sun barcode label provides the following information:

- Board part number (for example, 3753021) which is the first seven digits on the barcode label.
- Board serial number (for example, 005609) which is the next six digits on the barcode label.

The Subcon label provides the following information (see FIGURE 2):

- Product part number (for example, 5762), product dash (for example, 02) and revision number (for example REV 57).
- Board date code (for example, 03/2001) which represents the third week of year 2001.
- Country of origin (for example, ASSEMBLED IN CANADA)

Before Returning Your CP2060 Board to Sun Enterprise Services Or World Wide Solution Center

You *must* get Return Material Authorization (RMA) numbers from Sun Enterprise Services or the World Wide Solution Center for each part you intend to return.

Note – If Sun Enterprise Services asks for a system serial number, be sure to indicate that the board was purchased separately and is not associated with a system. Identify the product by part number as indicated in the section above.

Sun Enterprise Services will give you specific details on the return procedure for your geographic area. In addition, follow these guidelines in packaging the hardware and addressing the package.

- Take electrostatic discharge (ESD) precautions while handling the board:
 - Handle the board only by the nonconducting edges.
 - Do not touch the components or any metal parts.
 - Always wear a grounding wrist strap when handling the board and be sure the wrist strap is connected to ground.
- Please use the original or equivalent packaging material to return the failed part.
- Make sure the RMA number is on the box containing the part. The outermost box needs to have the RMA number and the part number of its primary contents and the following: destination address, source address, for international shipments, Sun Enterprise Services shipping number to expedite handling in customs.
- Remove and retain the Serial EEPROM. The Serial EEPROM holds specific network address data. It may also hold configuration data specific to your installation. You must remove the Serial EEPROM before you return the CP2060 board (see the section “Replacing the Serial EEPROM” on page 7).

Replacing the Serial EEPROM

The Serial I²C EEPROM is the MAC address carrier and it stores the backup copy of the board MAC address and Host ID information (see FIGURE 1). The CP2060 board supports the Serial I²C EEPROM. *If you need to replace the CP2060 board, remove the Serial I²C EEPROM from the original board and install it on the new CP2060 board. To correctly position the host ID board and to precisely install it on the CP2060 board, see *Netra CP2060 and CP2080 Technical Reference and Installation Manual* (part no. 806-6658-xx.*
