About Instant Messaging 7 2005Q4

Sun Java System Instant Messaging delivers secure presence and extended real-time messaging, enabling communities of users to communicate and collaborate instantly and securely. It combines instant messaging capabilities with conferences, alerts, news, polling and file transfer to create a rich collaborative environment. It leverages an existing community, managed using LDAP, Sun JavaTM System Identity Server or Sun JavaTM System Portal Server.

Installation

The *Instant Messaging Installation Guide* has been discontinued. If you are installing Instant Messaging 7 2005Q4 for the first time, see the *Sun Java™ Enterprise System Installation Guide* for installation instructions. Upgrade is not supported in this beta release.

If you are using Access Manager with Instant Messaging you need to install the "Compatible (version 6.x style)" Access Manager using the Java Enterprise System installer. This version of Instant Messaging is not compatible with the "Enhanced (version 7.x style)" Access Manager.

If you are upgrading from a previous release of Instant Messaging, see the *Sun Java*TM *Enterprise System Upgrade and Migration Guide* for instructions.

New Features

This section describes the following new features added to Instant Messaging in this release:

Hardware and Software Requirements

This section lists the requirements for installing Instant Messaging software. Before you install, ensure that you have met the minimum hardware and operating system requirements. JRE 1.4 is supported by both the server and the client.

For the current list of required patches for Sun Java System Instant Messaging go to SunSolve Online (http://sunsolve.sun.com) and select either "Patches" or "Patch Portal". Follow the Sun Java System Instant Messaging links. As system patch requirements change and patches to Java Enterprise System components become available, updates will be made available on SunSolve, initially in the form of recommended patch clusters.

Server Operating System Requirements

This release of Sun Java System Instant Messaging requires the following platform:

HP-UX 11i v1

Server Software Requirements

This version of Instant Messaging is compatible with the following versions of other server software:

Server Hardware Requirements

Instant Messaging requires approximately 5 Kbytes of disk space for each user. Though 256 Mbytes of RAM is specified, the amount of RAM needed depends on the number of concurrent client connections, and whether the server and multiplexor are deployed on the same host.

The following are the minimum server hardware and software requirements for installing Sun Java System Instant Messaging:

Client Operating System Requirements

This release supports the following client platform:

- Microsoft Windows 98 or later (ME, NT (SP 6a), 2000, XP)
- Mac OS X 10.1 or later
- Red Hat Linux 7.2 or later

Client Software Requirements

On Windows, you can run Instant Messenger using the browser's java plug-in from the following browsers:

- Netscape 4.7x, 7 or later
- Mozilla 1.2 or later
- Internet Explorer 5.0 or later

If the client machine has Java 1.4 or a higher version installed, there are no additional requirements to use either Java Plug-in or Java Web Start. Netscape Navigator v7 and the recent versions of the Mozilla browser include Java v1.4 or higher but Internet Explorer does not.

If the client machine does not have Java v1.4 or a higher version installed, you need to install Java Web Start. You can download and Install Java v1.4. from the following location:

HTML links can be exchanged over Instant Messenger and activated from the messenger by clicking them. When a link is activated, the messenger invokes a browser. The following table lists supported operating system and browser combinations:

Client Hardware Requirements

Instant Messenger uses between 20 to 40 Mbytes of memory on most platforms. You should estimate the memory requirement by including the requirements of other applications (including operating systems) used on the client machine. In most cases, at least 128 Mbytes RAM is recommended in order to run Instant Messenger and other applications comfortably. This number becomes higher when using memory-intensive operating systems such as Windows XP.

The following are the minimum client hardware and software requirements for installing Sun Java System Instant Messaging:

Running the Instant Messaging Configure is not working in CLI Mode (6233608)

Trying to launch the Instant Messaging Configure from the CLI mode fails

Workaround

Run the configure in the GUI mode.

When Instant Messaging L10N depots are installed many soft links are not created (6369077)

Workaround

After Instant Messaging installation, create the softlinks manually as described below:

1. In /opt/sun/im/html: that is in <your installed location>/im/html

en_US -> /opt/sun/im/html/en
es_ES -> /opt/sun/im/html/es

Instant Messaging configurator crashes on any.utf8 EMEA locales (6370601)

Workaround

Instant Messaging configurator sometimes fails to start on non-English locales with a message like 'Invalid character'. This happens due to presence of mutability characters in the script header.

To resolve follow the below mentioned steps:

1. Open the configure script with vi.

```
# vi /opt/sun/im/configure
```

2. Save without editing and restart.

:w!

/opt/sun/I/configure

Configuring Instant Messaging for the first time throws an IO exception (6376725)

Workaround

Run the following script:

<IM install Directory>/im/lib/imServiceConfigure

or

Run Instant Messaging configurator script again:

<IM install Directory>/im/configure
