



Sun™ Expert3D and Fan Card Installation for Sun Enterprise™ 450 Server

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Installing a Sun Expert3D and Fan Card in a Sun Enterprise 450 Server

Refer to the hardware installation documentation provided with your Sun™ system for general instructions on accessing your system internal modules and handling Sun PCI graphics cards.

The Sun™ Expert3D Installation Kit for your Sun™ Enterprise 450 is accompanied by a Fan Card Installation Kit. The Fan Card Installation Kit includes:

- Sun Expert3D-F Fan Card
- Sun Expert3D multiview cable (longer for multiple card configurations)

The Sun Expert3D graphics card connects into the 66-Mhz or 33-Mhz PCI connector on the Sun Enterprise 450 motherboard. Each Sun Expert3D requires a fan card in the adjacent PCI slot below the Sun Expert3D. See TABLE 1 for the Sun Expert3D and fan card configuration options.

TABLE 1 Sun Expert3D and Fan Card PCI Slot Configuration for the Sun Enterprise 450 Server

Number of Sun Expert3Ds	Sun Expert3D and Fan Card Configuration
One Sun Expert3D	Sun Expert3D: use one of the following 66Mhz slots: 4, 5, or 6 Fan card: use adjacent slots: 3, 4, or 5, respectively.
Two Sun Expert3Ds	Sun Expert3D: use 66Mhz slots 4 and 6. Fan card: use adjacent slots: 3 and 5.
Three Sun Expert3Ds	Sun Expert3D: use slots 2 (33Mhz), 4 (66Mhz), and 6 (66Mhz). Fan card: use adjacent slots: 1, 3, and 5.

- 1. Shut down your system and remove the Sun Enterprise 450 enclosure.**
- 2. Attach the antistatic wrist strap.**
- 3. If necessary, remove the system rear panel filler panel.**

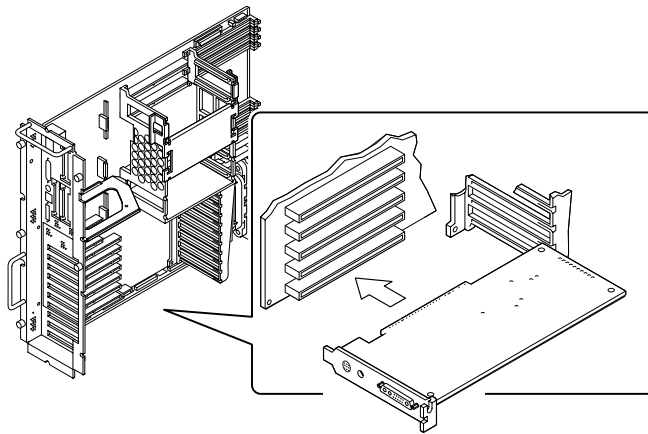


FIGURE 1 Installing Sun Expert3D Graphics Card

4. Insert the Sun Expert3D card into the appropriate slot on the main logic board (FIGURE 1).
 - a. Insert the left side of the Sun Expert3D card into the selected opening on the rear panel. At the same time, insert the right side of the card into the corresponding groove on the CPU cage.
 - b. Push the card into the slot on the main logic board.

- c. Align the left side of the card with the appropriate opening on the rear panel.
 - d. Push the card into the corresponding slot on the main logic board.
5. Secure the Sun Expert3D card faceplate to the rear panel with the Phillips screw.

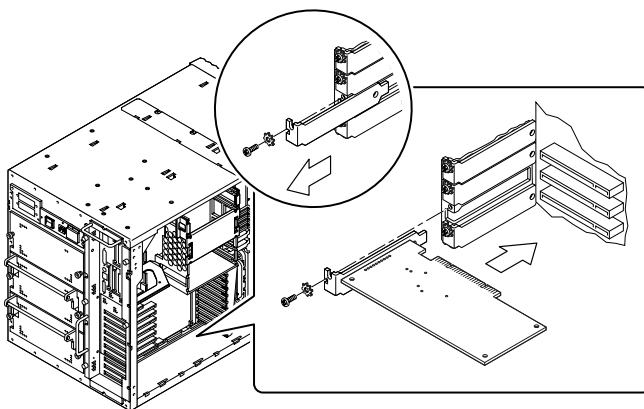


FIGURE 2 Securing Sun Expert3D Graphics Card

6. Install the Sun Expert3D fan card.

Each Sun Expert3D requires a fan card in the adjacent PCI slot below the Sun Expert3D (TABLE 1). Use the procedure in Steps 4 through 5 for installing the fan card.

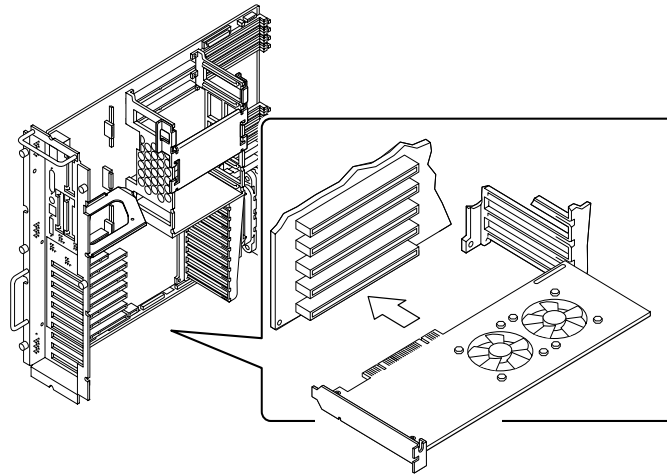


FIGURE 3 Installing the Fan Card

7. If applicable to your configuration, cable the Sun Expert3D cards for multiviewing.

The Fan Card Installation Kit provides a longer multiview cable for cabling two or more Sun Expert3D cards in the Sun Enterprise 450. This is required because the fan card occupies the card slot between two Sun Expert3D cards.

Note – See “Expert3D Multiview Ports” on page 35 of the *Sun Expert3D Graphics Card Installation Guide*, provided with your Sun Expert3D Installation Kit, for procedures on cabling two or more Sun Expert3D graphics cards for multiviewing.
