This guide gets you started with a base configuration for Oracle Enterprise Single Sign-on Logon Manager (ESSO-LM).

Product Overview

ESSO-LM enables users to log onto all of their applications with a single password. ESSO-LM supports any type of user authentication, from passwords to smart cards, and can store user credentials and its own system settings and policies in Active Directory, any LDAP directory, or one of several SQL databases. The ESSO-LM Administrative Console simplifies administration by automatically recognizing and configuring applications for sign-on with minimal effort by the administrator. Enterprise users gain sub-second single sign-on while connected or disconnected to the corporate network, while roaming between computers, or while sharing a kiosk with multiple users.

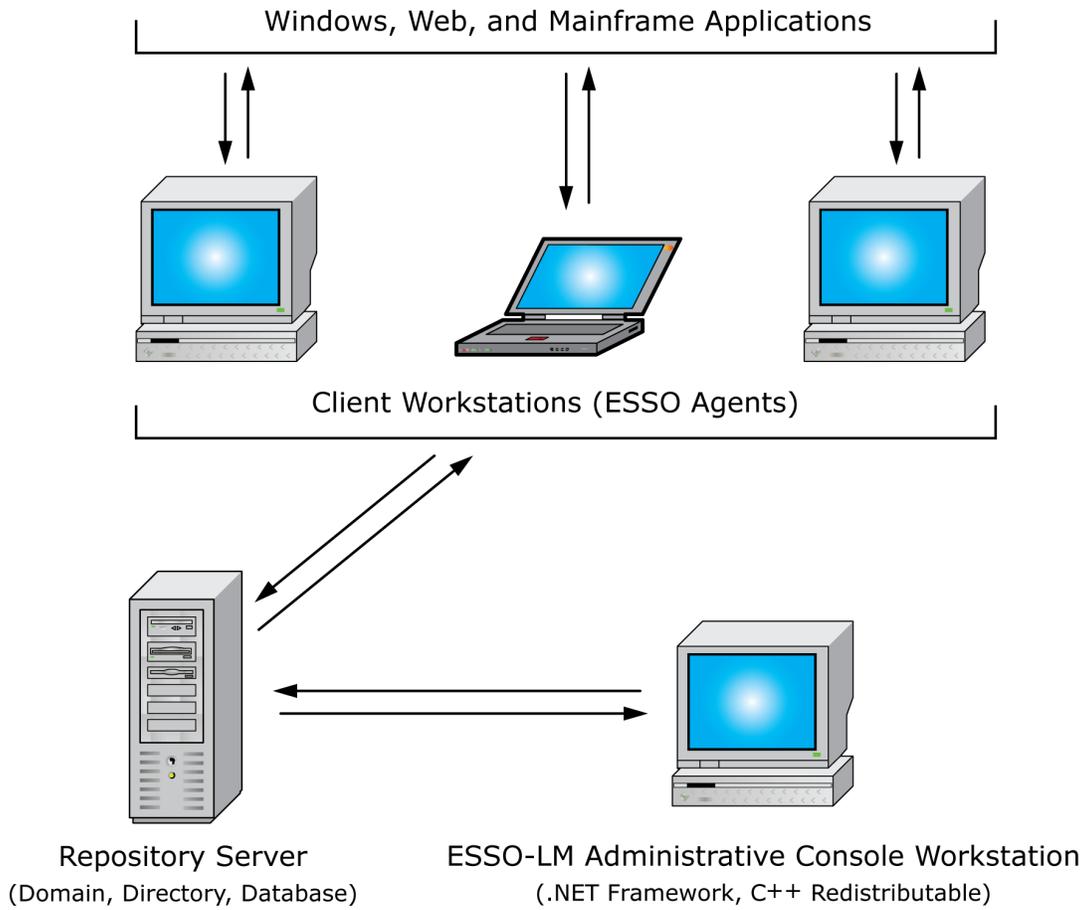
