Release overview

This document contains the release notes for Relate 11.1. These release notes cover new features and enhancements for this version, and the resolved issues that were identified in previous versions.



The rebranding for the latest version of this documentation set is in development as part of post MICROS acquisition activities. References to former MICROS product names may exist throughout this existing documentation set.

Features

This section includes brief summaries of some of the more significant enhancements and new features for Relate 11.1.

Action menus in the Card Definition pages now include refresh options

After making a change to a Card Definition, the changes can now be viewed by selecting a Refresh option in the Actions menu for the Card Definition page, and the Card Definitions list page.

Customer eligibility processing configuration

Relate now includes a configuration to identify a loyalty cardholder when evaluating segment eligibility rules.

Deal distributor

Relate can now generate deal files for exporting deals to Xstore. These deal files can be imported into Xadmin, allowing Xstore to download the files and import the deals.

Configuration to display or hide the Intended Industry setting

Relate can now be configured, when creating a Deal, to either display the Intended Industry setting for the Deal, or hide the setting and use a default value for all Deals.

License keys no longer required for Relate modules

License controls, as implemented in release 11.0, have been removed to align with newly adopted policy guidelines.

Issue resolution

The following list summarizes the corrective actions for previously detected issues:

Category	Ref #	Description
Promotion	CRM-1006	Date fields display the month, day, and year.
Web Services	CRM-1032	After changing the intended industry for an item, the item will only have attributes for that intended industry.
User Interface	CRM-1056	Password rules are applied uniformly.
Web Services	CRM-1064	The addOrUpdateItem WSDL message keeps the previously defined intended industry for an item if no intended industry is included in a message.
Promotion	CRM-1116	Intended industry flag included for deal objects in the promotion export file.
XML API	CRM-1117	All tender card activities include the franchise ID.
Promotion	CRM-1155	The Promotion List page has been enhanced to maintain performance levels through high volumes of active promotions.
Promotion	CRM-1176	When editing a promotion after it has been saved or exported, values for boolean attributes are saved as "True" or "False".
Web Services	CRM-1181	The getCustomerCardsInquiryData WSDL method stores one inquiry activity per account in the database.
Web Services	CRM-1184	When retrieving customer transaction history, Relate uses security group settings rather than franchisee permissions.

Intended Industry Prompt Option	Determines whether to prompt for an intended industry during Deal creation, or if the intended industry for a Deal should default to a defined value (Merchandise or Culinary).
