This document provides information about the Oracle Communications Unified Communications Suite (UCS) documentation.

Important Changes to Installing Unified Communications Suite Software

Beginning in June 2015, UCS software is delivered as three separate products - Oracle Communications Messaging Server, Oracle Communications Calendar Server, and Oracle Communications Instant Messaging Server. Each product download enables you to download additional software that you have a right to use. For example, the Oracle Communications Messaging Server download enables you to download Oracle Communications Convergence and Oracle Communications Indexing and Search Service software.

As a result of the changes to the packaging of the software, the process for installing UCS software has changed. The **commpkg install** command no longer installs all UCS software. Instead, you now run **commpkg install** for each product you are installing. The **commpkg** script is bundled with each individual product.

Note that the installation guides for the following products have not yet been updated to reflect this change:

- Oracle Communications Delegated Administrator
- Oracle Communications Indexing and Search Service

Important Installation Changes for Delegated Administrator 7.0.0.11.0

A bug in the Linux RPM for Delegated Administrator inadvertently requires the NSS packages. They are not needed by Delegated Administrator. In addition, the **config-commda** command assumes certain directories have already been created. If you are performing a new installation of Delegated Administrator 7.0.0.11.0 on Linux, you must do the following:

1. Install the RPM and override the dependency check.

```
cd Linux_x86/DA/Packages
rpm -i --prefix /opt/sun/comms/da --nodeps sun-commda-7.0-11.00.i386.rpm
```

2. Before running **config-commda**, create the following directories if they do not already exist.

```
mkdir -p /opt/sun/comms/da/install
mkdir -p /var/opt/sun/install
```

After completing this procedure, you can run the Delegated Administrator configuration `config-commda` command.
