This document highlights the major changes for Release 16.0.4.9 of Oracle Retail Brand Compliance Management Cloud Service.

Overview

Oracle Retail Brand Compliance Management Cloud Service is an integrated suite of applications designed to meet all aspects of sourcing, developing, and protecting retailer brands. The suite provides solutions for product development, compliance, quality, and traceability. It is designed specifically for retail, food service, and manufacturing businesses to develop and protect their brands, manage their suppliers, and ensure full end-to-end product lifecycle management.

Oracle Retail Brand Compliance Management Cloud Service is composed of the following applications:

- Library enables the issue, receipt, and acceptance of policies, guidelines, and key working documents.
- Product supports the development of products and production specifications.
- Project supports the development of project briefs, plans, and workflow management.
- Supplier enables the identification, selection, and approval of suppliers.

Oracle Retail Cloud Services and Business Agility

Oracle Retail Brand Compliance Management Cloud Service is hosted in the Oracle Retail Cloud with the security features inherent to Oracle technology and a robust data center classification, providing significant uptime. The Oracle Cloud team is responsible for installing, monitoring, patching, and upgrading retail software.

Included in the service is continuous technical support, access to software feature enhancements, hardware upgrades, and disaster recovery. The Cloud Service model helps to free customer IT resources from the need to perform these tasks, giving retailers greater business agility to respond to changing technologies and to perform more value-added tasks focused on business processes and innovation.

Oracle Retail Software Cloud Service is acquired exclusively through a subscription service (SaaS) model. This shifts funding from a capital investment in software to an operational expense. Subscription-based pricing for retail applications offers flexibility and cost effectiveness.

Table 1 General Fixed Issues

Defect Number	Description
26751140	Incorrect 'Go to' System Text A fix is made to rectify an issue where the system text for the 'Go to' menu item label was incorrect. The issue occurred when presenting the 'Go to' menu option in an alternative language translation, such as when selecting to open a Product Specification from a Project.
26887002	Error when Printing Branding Configuration Glossary A fix is made to rectify an error when selecting the Print action in the Branding configuration system control glossary. In addition, there is a fix to the printing of Attachment pages to ensure a large number of attachments do not overlay the following page. Impact on Existing System The fix requires an amendment to the print theme style sheet in order for the style sheets to be visible on the printed copy of the Branding configuration glossary. Existing version 16.0 systems will need to apply this manually as a post release task.
26954668	Overdue UIM Activities Error A fix is made to rectify an error during the login of a user who has overdue tasks in their Urgent Items Manager app.

Table 1 (Cont.) General Fixed Issues

Defect Number	Description
27001827	<p>Glossary Priority Setting</p> <p>A fix is made to rectify an issue with the ordering of certain glossary entries when presented for selection. The issue occurred where the Priority field is used on the glossary entry to order the list in an alternative to the default sequence. The selections affected were the Visit Locations on the Audit details page and the Risk Levels on the Site details page.</p> <p>When the contents of the glossaries are presented for selection, if a priority has been set on any entries, that order now correctly overrides the default alphabetical sequencing.</p>
27097330	<p>Error when Logging Off</p> <p>A fix is made to rectify a Session Timeout error when logging off the system. The system now correctly displays the Login page when the user logs off.</p>
27109322	<p>Error Opening Product Area Glossary</p> <p>A fix is made to rectify an error when opening a Product Area glossary entry. The error occurred in entries that had been imported. It was due to not all fields having been initialized.</p>

Table 2 Supplier Fixed Issue

Defect Number	Description
26724766	<p>Incorrect Column Headings in Supplier List Views</p> <p>A fix is made to rectify an issue with the Status column heading in Supplier list views. The column is now labelled Status Code to reflect that the column contains the Supplier Status code, not the Supplier Status description.</p>

Table 3 Product Fixed Issue

Defect Number	Description
26751177	<p>Translation of Ingredients Selector Title</p> <p>A fix is made to rectify an issue where the title of the Ingredients Selector dialog box was not showing any language translations that had been configured for it.</p> <p>The Ingredients selector, which is accessed from the product specification's Recipe section, now correctly translates the title if translations are present for the user's language; otherwise the base language (English) title is shown.</p> <p>Impact on Existing System</p> <p>Translations for the supported languages were already in place, so there is no need for new system text.</p>

Table 4 Project Fixed Issues

Defect Number	Description
26941942	<p>Error when Unlinking Activities from Projects</p> <p>A fix is made to rectify an error when attempting to unlink a Project Activity from another record, such as a Product Specification. The error occurred when using the unlink action from the Project's Linked Records page.</p> <p>The system now correctly completes the action and removes the record link.</p>

Table 4 (Cont.) Project Fixed Issues

Defect Number	Description
27084660	<p>Projects Access Control Issues</p> <p>A fix is made to rectify an issue with the way the Enhanced Access Control (EAC) facility was controlling users' access to Projects, based on their designated Area.</p> <p>The system now correctly applies the access control rules as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Users with edit access to Projects (Project Manager and Project Administrator authority profiles) have access to all projects in the All Project, All Product, and Hierarchy All list views. For users with the Project Editor authority profile who have EAC Area restrictions, their access to the list views will only display the projects that are within the user's Area (that is, projects linked to suppliers within the user's Area), and to projects that are not linked to suppliers. <p>Users with EAC Area restrictions cannot see projects in the list views that are linked to suppliers outside of their Area; they can see projects that are not linked to any specific supplier.</p>
27087878	<p>Issue opening Project Briefs</p> <p>A fix is made to rectify an issue where a Project Brief would not open once the Project had been saved.</p>
27116011	<p>Project Activities not visible to Project Manager Users</p> <p>A fix is made to rectify an issue where users with Project Manager access rights did not have visibility of Activities within a Project.</p> <p>Users with the Project Manager authority profile now have visibility of activities regardless of whether they are a member of the project's team or not.</p>

Post Release Tasks

The **Error when Printing Branding Configuration Glossary** issue requires an amendment to the print theme style sheet in order for the style sheets to be visible on the printed copy of the Branding configuration glossary.

Existing version 16.0 systems will need to apply the following style sheet change manually as a post release task.

The change should go immediately after the definition of '.print-control-button.x-btn-text' in the style sheet.
