2 OIDF Application Pack Maintenance Release v8.1.2.3.0

This Maintenance Release of the Oracle Insurance Data Foundation Application Pack includes all enhancements and bug fixes that are done since the OIDF Application Pack v8.1.2.2.0 release.

NOTE

The schemas or domains for OIDF are referred to as OFS_OIDF.

2.1 Pre-installation Requirements

These are the pre-installation requirements for the OIDF Application Pack v8.1.2.3.0 release:

NOTE

Before installing OIDF Application Pack v8.1.2.3.0, if Data Management Release v8.0.5.0.0 Application Pack (full installer) is already installed on the system, then execute the following command in the Atomic Schema:

- DROP INDEX DIM_DATES_CALENDAR_DATE;
- DROP INDEX DIM_KI_GROUP_LRI;
- To resolve the Primary Key and Not Null Column changes in specific tables, follow the Preinstallation steps mentioned in the MOS DOC ID <u>2912904.1</u>.

NOTE

On successful installation of OIDF 8.1.2.3.0 Release, correct the data and restore it to the tables as mentioned in the MOS note 2912904.1.

Oracle Insurance Data Foundation (OIDF) Application Pack v8.1.2.0.0 Minor Release patch ID
33024795 plus other prerequisite OIDF patches (download from My Oracle Support (MOS))
must be installed and configured on your machine. For more information, see the Preparing for
Installation section in the Oracle Insurance Data Foundation Application Pack Installation and
Configuration Guide Release 8.1.2.0.0.

NOTE

The erwin files for OIDF Application Pack v8.1.2.3.0 is available on My Oracle Support (MOS) in patch **35201199.**

Enable the unlimited cryptographic policy. By default, JCE Policy JAR files are available for the
Java versions mentioned in the following link and for later versions:
 https://bugs.java.com/bugdatabase/view_bug.do?bug_id=8170157

For the Java versions, where unlimited cryptographic policy is disabled by default, follow these steps:

- **a.** Download the JCE Policy related jar files local_policy.jar and US export policy.jar.
 - For Oracle Java, download the local_policy.jar and US_export_policy.jar files from http://www.oracle.com/technetwork/java/javase/downloads/jce-7-download-432124.html.
 - For IBM Java, download the local_policy.jar and US_export_policy.jar files from https://www14.software.ibm.com/webapp/iwm/web/preLogin.do?source=icesdk.
- **b.** Copy (or replace) the downloaded JCE Policy related jar files <code>local_policy.jar</code> and <code>US_export_policy.jar</code> to the <code>/jre/lib/security</code> directory of the Java installation directory used for OFSAAI and the web application servers.

NOTE

2.2 Applying this Maintenance Release

This section provides information about installing this Maintenance Release.

NOTE

This Maintenance Release patch is applicable only for an RDBMS mode of installation.

2.2.1 Downloading OIDF Application Pack

To download and extract the release contents, follow these steps:

NOTE

Enable the unlimited cryptographic policy. By default, JCE Policy JAR files are available for Java.

- 1. Log in to My Oracle Support (MOS). In the Patches & Updates tab, search for patch ID 34803961.
- 2. Download the OIDF Application Pack v8.1.2.3.0 archive file and copy it to your OFSAA server in the **Binary** mode.

NOTE

The archive files are different for different operating systems such as AIX, Solaris, and RHEL or Oracle Linux.

- 3. Stop all the OFSAAI Services. For more information, see the Stop the Infrastructure Services section in the Oracle Financial Services Advanced Analytical Applications Infrastructure Installation Guide Release 8.1.2.0.0.
- 4. Log in to the OFSAA Server as a non-root user.
- **5.** Execute the following command:

```
chmod -R 750 $FIC HOME
```

- **6.** Assign the WRITE permission to the files and folders such as commonscripts, EXEWebService, ficapp, ficweb, and ficdb by using the following command: chmod -R 775 *
- 7. If you have an Unzip utility, skip to the next step. Download the Unzip utility (OS-specific) unzip <os>. Z and copy it in the Binary mode to the directory that is included in the PATH variable, in the \$HOME path or directory in which you copied the OIDF Application Pack v8.1.2.3.0 installer.
 - **a.** Extract the unzip installer file using the following command:

```
uncompress unzip <os>.Z
```

NOTE

If you notice an error message: "uncompress: not found [No such file or directory]" when the package is not installed, contact your UNIX administrator.

b. Give the EXECUTE permission to the file using the following command:

```
chmod 751 OFS_OIDF_8.1.2.3.0_<OperatingSystem>.zip
```

8. Extract the contents of the OIDF v8.1.2.3.0 archive file using the following command:

NOTE

Rename or remove the existing OFSAA Application Pack folder from the OFSAA server before extracting the contents from the release archive (.zip).

For example: When this release is extracted from the archive, it creates a folder named OFS OIDF PACK. Rename or remove any existing folder with the same name, which exists in the path where the release archive is copied.

-a option in this step is mandatory to unzip the archive file.

For example:

```
unzip aix -a
OFS OIDF 8.1.2.3.0 <OperatingSystem>.zip
```

Pre-installation Activities 2.2.2

This section provides pre-installation activities required for the installation of the OIDF Application Pack v8.1.2.3.0 release.

Topic:

Model Upload Parameter

Model Upload Parameter 2.2.2.1

You must upload the configuration file params.conf before triggering the installation. The params.conf file is present in the /OFS OIDF PACK/appsLibConfig/conf/ directory.

The following are the input parameters for the params.conf file:

Model Upload Process

- The required input value is 0 or 1.
 - **0** is an indication to skip the model upload process.
 - 1 is an indication to trigger the model upload process.
- If the value is 1, then select the type of the model for the model upload process:
 - **0** indicates the Released Data Model.
 - 1 indicates a Customized Data Model.

If the value is 1, then provide the inputs for the Data Model Name and the Path of the Data Model.

Installing the OIDF Application Pack 2.2.3

To install the OIDF Application Pack v8.1.2.3.0 release, follow these steps:

1. Assign the EXECUTE permission to the Maintenance release archive file. Navigate to the./OFS OIDF PACK directory and execute the following command:

```
chmod 750 OFSAAIUpdate.sh
```

2. Execute the OFSAAIUpdate.sh file using the following command:

```
./OFSAAIUpdate.sh
```

3. Verify if the release is applied successfully by checking the log file generated in the installation folder. The log file such as OFS OIDF installation.log is stored in the

/OFS_OIDF_PACK/OFS_OIDF/logs/ directory. You can ignore the ORA-00001, ORA-00955, ORA-02260, ORA-01031, and ORA-01430 errors in the log file. For any other errors, contact My Oracle Support.

2.2.4 Post-installation Activities

The following sections provide information about the post-installation activities for the OIDF Application Pack v8.1.2.3.0 release.

2.2.4.1 Platform-related Post-installation Activities

After OIDF Application Pack is successfully installed, to perform the OFSAAI related post-installation activities, follow these steps:

- Install and Configure Oracle Financial Services Analytical Applications Infrastructure (OFSAAI)
 mandatory patch 35340701 post installation of Oracle Financial Services Analytical
 Applications Infrastructure (OFSAAI) 8.1.2.3.0.
- **2.** Clear the application cache.
- **3.** Navigate to the following directory depending on the configured web application server and delete the following files:
 - Tomcat:

<Tomcat installation folder>/work/Catalina/localhost/<Application name>/org/apache/jsp

WebLogic:

<Weblogic installation location>/domains/<Domain
name>/servers/<Server name>/tmp/_WL_user/<Application name>/<auto
generated folder>/jsp servlet

Websphere:

<Websphere installation directory>/AppServer/profiles/<Profile
name>/temp/<Node name>/server1/<Application name>/<.war file name>

- **4.** Add umask 0027 in the .profile file of the UNIX account, which manages the webserver to ensure restricted access permissions.
- **5.** Perform any necessary additional configuration mentioned in the *Additional Configuration* section in the <u>Oracle Insurance Data Foundation Application Pack Installation and Configuration</u> Guide Release 8.1.2.0.0.
- **6.** Generate the application EAR or WAR file, and redeploy the application on the configured web application server. For more information on generating and deploying the EAR or WAR file, see the *Create and Deploy the EAR/WAR Files* section in the <u>Oracle Financial Services Advanced</u>
 Analytical Applications Infrastructure Installation Guide Release 8.1.2.0.0.

7. After the successful installation of the OIDF Application Pack v8.1.2.3.0 Release, restart all the OFSAAI services. For more information, see the *Start the Infrastructure Services* section in the Oracle Financial Services Advanced Analytical Applications Infrastructure Installation Guide Release 8.1.2.0.0.

2.2.4.2 OIDF Related Post-installation Activities

This section provides the post-installation procedures for the OIDF Application Pack v8.1.2.3.0 release.

Topic:

Change Batch ICC Ownership

2.2.4.2.1 Change Batch ICC Ownership

All the seeded batches in the OIDF Application Pack are automatically assigned to the SYSADMN user during the installation process. To see batches in the **Batch Maintenance** menu, execute the following queries in the Config schema of the database.

Syntax:

```
begin
AAI_OBJECT_ADMIN.TRANSFER_BATCH_OWNERSHIP ('fromUser','toUser','infodom');
end;
OR
begin
AAI_OBJECT_ADMIN.TRANSFER_BATCH_OWNERSHIP ('fromuser','touser');
end;
```

- fromUser indicates the user who currently owns the batch.
- toUser indicates the user to whom the ownership must be transferred.
- infodom is an optional parameter. If you specify this parameter, the ownership of the batches of that infodom is changed.

For example:

```
begin
AAI_OBJECT_ADMIN.TRANSFER_BATCH_OWNERSHIP
('SYSADMN','OIDFOP','OFSOIDFINFO');
end;
```

3.1 Frequently Asked Questions

What checks does the v8.1.2.3.0 release patch perform?

This release patch performs the following checks:

- Environment Check: During the environment check, it performs Java validation, Environment Variables validation, OS-specific validation, DB specific validation, and shuts down all the OFSAAI Services (Infrastructure Server, ICC Server, and back-end services).
- Post-installation check: As a part of the Post-installation check, the patch checks if the OFSAAI services can be successfully started.

Which version of the erwin Data Modeler does OFSAAI support?

For the erwin Data Modeler version supported in this release, see the <u>Oracle Financial Services</u> <u>Analytical Applications (OFSAA) Technology Matrix Release 8.1.2.0.0</u>.

What should I do for viewing the log files at the Debug level for troubleshooting?

By default, the log level is set as **INFO**. You must manually change the log level to **Debug** to view the log files in the debug level. Based on your requirements, you can also change the log level to Warn, Error, or Fatal. To view log files, follow these steps:

- 1. Navigate to the \$FIC HOME/conf directory in the APP layer of your OFSAAI installation.
 - Change the priority value to Debug in the RevLog4jConfig.xml file.

For example:

```
<root>
<priority value ="debug" />
<appender-ref ref="ConsoleAppender1"/>
</root>
```

 Replace the value of the LOGGERLEVEL parameter in the DynamicServices.xml file from 20 with 0 (20 is the value for Info and 0 for Debug).

NOTE

For a multi-tier installation, also change the LOGGERLEVEL value to 0 (Debug) in the DynamicServices.xml and RevLog4jConfig.xml files, which are present in the \$FIC_APP_HOME/conf, \$FIC_DB_HOME/conf, and \$FIC_WEB_HOME/conf directories.

- 2. Navigate to the <code>\$FIC_WEB_HOME/webroot/conf</code> directory and change the <code>priority</code> value to <code>Debug</code> in the <code>ExportLog4jConfig.xml</code>, <code>MDBLogger.xml</code>, and <code>PR2Logger.xml</code> files to view the log files at the Debug level for the modules Archive or Restore, Metadata Browser, and RRF, respectively.
- **3.** Generate the application EAR/WAR file and redeploy the application on the configured web application server. For more information on generating and deploying the EAR/WAR file, see the *Post-installation* section in the <u>Oracle Financial Services Advanced Analytical Applications Infrastructure Installation Guide Release 8.1.2.0.0.</u>
- **4.** Restart the OFSAAI Services (APP and WEB). For more information, see the *Start the Infrastructure Services* section in the <u>Oracle Financial Services Advanced Analytical Applications Infrastructure Installation Guide Release 8.1.2.0.0</u>.
