

Known Issues for Oracle SQL Developer Web

The following table lists known issues for Oracle SQL Developer Web release 19.2.1 and provides details on how to work around them. Unless otherwise specified, each issue affects all database versions.

Issue	Description	Workaround
Invalid JSON format in Export.	Exporting data in JSON format results in an invalid JSON file.	Within the exported file, replace the "], " string at the beginning of the file with "{" and append the "]}]" string at the end of the file.
Object Navigator shows repeated objects.	If you load a long list of objects using the object Navigator and scroll to the bottom to view more objects, the same set of objects are loaded and displayed.	If you are looking for a specific object, use the Search field at the top of the object Navigator pane.
Loading icon in export does not resolve.	After data is exported, the loading icon at the bottom of the page continues showing the processing mode.	Reload the page so that the loading icon disappears.
Unable to navigate back from SQL Monitor Details to Performance Hub using the browser.	The steps are: 1. From the menu, select Performance Hub. 2. Click the SQL Monitor tab. 3. Click one of the SQL IDs in the list. 4. In SQL Monitor Details, click the browser Back icon. There is no response.	Use the Back button on the top-left side of the SQL Developer Web user interface.

Issue	Description	Workaround
When you download the query result as an XML file, there are extra commas in the downloaded file.	Exporting data in XML results in an incorrect XML file. There are extra commas at the end of every line: <pre><?xml version='1.0' encoding='UTF8' ?>, <RESULTS>, <ROW>, <COLUMN NAME="C1"><! [CDATA[1]]></COLUMN>, <COLUMN NAME="C2"><! [CDATA[aaa]]></COLUMN>, </ROW>, </RESULTS></pre>	Delete extra commas in the exported file.
File downloaded from query result for a long SQL statement is blank.	If the user inputs a long SQL statement and then exports the data in any format, the file downloaded is blank (0 kb).	A workaround is not available.
The expression for virtual columns is not displayed in the Table dialog.	The expression for virtual columns is not displayed when the column is selected in the Columns page.	A workaround is not available.
The maximum value is not presented properly for a sequence.	The max value (1E+28 -1, which is 99999999999999999999999999999999) is not presented properly for a new sequence and when the existing sequence is edited, it shows 1E+28, which is 10,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000,000.	A workaround is not available.
The sequence is dropped and recreated.	When edited (even without changing anything), a sequence is always dropped and recreated.	A workaround is not available. However, a user can check the value for last_number for that sequence and add it in start with. For example: Select last_number from user_sequences where sequence_name = 'LOCATIONS_SEQ';
Uploading data in a schema different from the one you are logged in to fails.	When you upload data in a different schema from the one you are logged in to, one of the internal processes fail canceling the whole operation and no entries are generated in the error logging summary.	You need to log in to the schema to upload data.

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
