## Upgrade Types

The different types of Oracle Utilities Testing Accelerator upgrades available are listed as follows:

- Upgrading custom components and flows from an Oracle Utilities' application to a newer version (Example: Oracle Utilities Customer Care and Billing v2.6.0.0 to Oracle Utilities Customer Care and Billing v2.6.0.1) within Oracle Utilities Testing Accelerator v6.0.0.2.

## About Upgrading Custom Components and Flows

After installing Oracle Utilities Testing Accelerator v6.0.0.2, you can upgrade the custom components and flows from an older version of an Oracle Utilities' application to the current version using the CM Content Upgrade feature. You can validate the existing automation scripts against the new version of the Oracle Utilities' application.

For example: Using the CM Content Upgrade feature available in this Oracle Utilities Testing Accelerator release, you can upgrade Oracle Utilities Customer Care and Billing v2.6.0.0 to Oracle Utilities Customer Care and Billing v2.6.0.1. Also, you can validate the Oracle Utilities Customer Care and Billing v2.6.0.0 automation scripts against those in Oracle Utilities Customer Care and Billing v2.6.0.1.

# Chapter 2

## Upgrading Custom Components and Flows

This chapter guides you through the process of upgrading the custom components and flows from one version of Oracle Utilities application to a later version.

Note that the procedures/tasks in this chapter use a sample scenario of migrating from Oracle Utilities Customer To Meter v2.6.0.0 to Oracle Utilities Customer To Meter v2.6.0.1.

## Before You Upgrade

Before upgrading to Oracle Utilities Testing Accelerator v6.0.0.2, perform the following steps:

1. Login to the target Oracle Utilities Testing Accelerator server and stop it.
2. Take a backup of the Oracle Utilities Testing Accelerator database using the Database Export Tool.

**Important:** Make sure to provide the database administrator credentials while exporting the database. “UTA” schema should also be specified.

3. Start the Oracle Utilities Testing Accelerator server.

## Upgrading Components and Flows

To upgrade custom components and flows:

1. Log into the Oracle Utilities Testing Accelerator application.
2. Navigate to the **Administration** tab.
3. Click **CM Content Upgrade** in the left pane.
4. In the right pane, select **Release**, **Portfolio**, **From Product**, and **To Product**, along with the tag name for the custom components and flows.
5. Select either **Overwrite** or **Skip**.
  - **Overwrite:** Overwrites the target product component/flow with the source product. (“From Product”).
  - **Skip:** The source product component/flow will not be upgraded to the target product.

This step is needed in the scenario where while upgrading the CM content, the target product (“To Product”) may already contain some of the components/flows being upgraded.

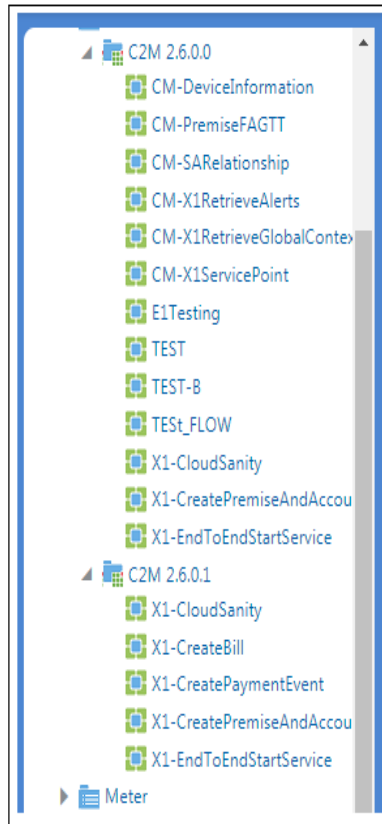

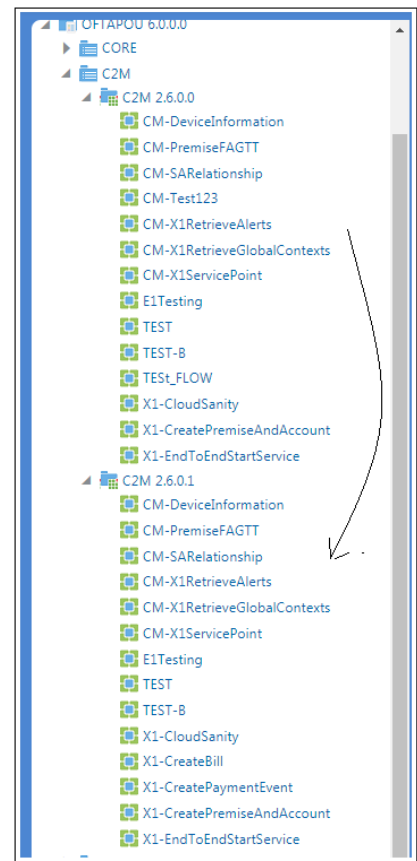
6. Click **Upgrade** to start the upgrade process.

After the upgrade process is complete, all the custom components and flows as per the selected criteria are copied from “From Product” to “To Product”.

For example: From Oracle Utilities Customer To Meter v2.6.0.0 to Oracle Utilities Customer To Meter v2.6.0.1. The following screenshots show the custom flows in Oracle Utilities Testing Accelerator.
