2.1 Party

This section describes the upgrade impacts of functionality in Party.

2.1.1 Define Party Bank Policy (Fast Path: PI314)

2.2 Pricing

2.2.1 Price Definition (Fast Path: PR006)

The Negotiable check box is replaced with the Type of Negotiation drop down in this screen. The values of this drop down list are:

- Negotiable
- Negotiable-Waive Full Fee
- Non-negotiable

The Negotiable-Waive Full fee option is applicable only if the Price Category option is selected as Fee.
