Note: You need to create a new application environment for ORMB Version 4.0.0.0.0 and not upgrade the existing application environment.

1. Database Upgrade from 2.3.0.2.0 or Any Later Version to 4.0.0.0.0

This section explains how to directly upgrade Oracle Revenue Management and Billing (ORMB) database from 2.3.0.2.0 or any later version to 4.0.0.0.0. It also lists the pre-requisites for upgrading ORMB database from 2.3.0.2.0 or any later version to 4.0.0.0.0. In addition, it lists all packages and patches that you need to download to upgrade the database.

1.1 Direct Database Upgrade

There are two ways in which you can upgrade Oracle Revenue Management and Billing (ORMB) database from 2.3.0.2.0 or any later version to 4.0.0.0.0:

- Using the Step-by-Step Upgrade Process (as shown in the left side of the below figure)
- Using the Direct Upgrade Process (as shown in the right side of the below figure)

The following figure indicates the number of steps involved in both the Step-by-Step Upgrade and Direct Upgrade processes:

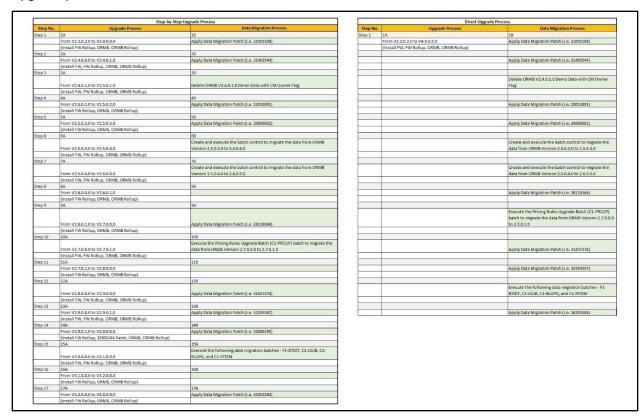


Figure 1: Database Upgrade Process

To follow the Step-by-Step Upgrade process, you need to refer the *Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Upgrade Path Guide* and *Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Upgrade Guide* of the respective version.

To follow the Direct Upgrade process, you need to execute the following steps:

We recommend you to follow the direct upgrade process while upgrading the ORMB database from 2.3.0.2.0 or any later version to 4.0.0.0.0 because it involves less number of steps and saves time.

1.2 Prerequisites

If you are already using the Transaction Feed Management feature and want to upgrade to Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Version 4.0.0.0.0, then you need to ensure the following (before upgrading):

- All bills generated in the system are in the Complete status. In other words, there should not be
 any bills in the Pending status. If there are any bills in the Pending status or if any billable charge
 (generated through TFM) is not yet billed, disaggregation and cancellation of transactions which
 are uploaded using 2.3.0.2.0 or any later version will not happen successfully.
- Transactions which are uploaded using 2.3.0.2.0 or any later version must not be in the Initial Product Determined (INPD) status. They can be in the Uploaded (UPLD), Invalid (INVL), Error (EROR), Completed (COMP), or Cancelled (CNCL) status.
- Equal to (=) or tilde (~) symbol is not used in any existing price item parameter code or value. Otherwise, erroneous results might occur.

If you are already using the On Demand Billing feature and want to upgrade to Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Version 4.0.0.0.0, then you need to ensure the following (before upgrading):

- The billable charges and adhoc bills are generated and completed for the usage data files where billing method is set to **Adhoc Billing**.
- The file types created in 2.3.0.2.0 or any later version must no longer be used in 4.0.0.0.0. You should create new file types in 4.0.0.0.0.

Also, ensure that no data exists in the CI_BCHG_TEMP table before you start the upgrade process. If there is data in the CI_BCHG_TEMP table, it means all billing batches are not yet executed for a set of bills. We recommend you to either complete the billing process for such bills by executing all the billing batches or delete the data from the CI_BCHG_TEMP table. Otherwise, erroneous results might occur when you execute the billing batches after the upgrade.

In addition, you need to ensure the following before upgrading ORMB database from 2.3.0.2.0 or any later version to 4.0.0.0.0:

• ORMB data is imported on Oracle Database Server 19c and the MAX_STRING_SIZE parameter is set to EXTENDED.

Note: For more information on how to set the MAX_STRING_SIZE parameter to EXTENDED, refer to the pre-requisites information available in the **Upgrading** *the ORMB Database section of the Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Version 4.0.0.0.0 Upgrade Guide*.

- Allocate minimum SGA and PGA memory per node (i.e. approximately 150 to 200 GB for SGA and 60 to 90 GB for PGA) so that you can execute the upgrade process with parallel threads 32/64/128 depending on the number of available CPUs.
- Remove the ALTER_CI_PRCE_CALC_LN.sql script from the CDIIni.Drv file which is located at <DESTINATION_FOLDER_1>/RMB/Upgrade/Oracle/Install-Upgrade and add it in the beginning of the CDIPost.Drv file which is located at <DESTINATION_FOLDER_1>/RMB/Upgrade/Oracle/Install-Upgrade.

Note: The <DESTINATION_FOLDER_1> folder is the location where you have extracted the contents of the **Oracle Revenue Management and Billing V4.0.0.0 Oracle Database** package.

- Take a backup of the CI_BATCH_RUN_CNTRL table and then truncate this table.
- Execute the Pre_BlueprintScript.sql query which is available in the Apply the PACKAGE FOR DATA UPGRADE FROM 2.3.0.2.0 to 2.4.0.0.0 patch (Patch Number: 21055108) before you upgrade the database from 2.3.0.2.0 to 4.0.0.0.0. For more information, refer to the Executing the Pre_BlueprintScript.sql Query section in the Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Version 2.4.0.0.0 Upgrade Guide. Note that this prerequisite is applicable only when you are upgrading from 2.3.0.2.0 to 4.0.0.0.0 and not applicable when you are upgrading from any version later than 2.3.0.2.0 to 4.0.0.0.0.

Besides the above changes, you need to ensure the following before upgrading ORMB database from 2.9.0.1.0 to 4.0.0.0.0:

 Execute the PreprocessingScript.sql query which is available in the V30000 MIGRATION PATCH DEPLOYMENT ISSUE AFTER DIRECT UPGRADE FROM 29010 TO 31000 patch (Patch Number: 33459344).

We have articulated some known issues that you may come across while upgrading ORMB database from 2.3.0.2.0 or any later version to 4.0.0.0.0. Please read the <u>Known Issues and Solution</u> section before you start upgrading the database.

1.3 Downloading the ORMB Packages and Patches

For upgrading from Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Version 2.3.0.2.0 or any later version to 4.0.0.0.0, you must download the following packages from the Oracle Revenue Management and Billing V4.0.0.0.0 media pack which is available on Oracle Software Delivery Cloud:

- Oracle Utilities Application Framework V4.4.0.3.0 Single Fix Prerequisite Rollup for RMB V4.0.0.0.0
- Oracle Revenue Management and Billing V4.0.0.0.0 Oracle Database

In addition, you must download the following patches from My Oracle Support:

- PACKAGE FOR DATA UPGRADE FROM 2.3.0.2.0 to 2.4.0.0.0 (Patch Number: 21055108)
- PACKAGE FOR DATA UPGRADE FROM 2.4.0.0.0 TO 2.4.0.1.0 (Patch Number: 21463544)
- UPGRADE FROM 2.5.0.1.0 to 2.5.0.2.0 (Patch Number: 23013891)
- UPGRADE FROM 2.5.0.2.0 to 2.5.0.3.0 (Patch Number: 24606002)
- UPGRADE FROM 2.6.0.1.0 TO 2.7.0.0.0 (Patch Number: 28118364)

 V2.9 UPGRADE - DEFERRED REVENUE RECOGNITION FUNCTIONALITY ISSUES (Patch Number: 31437274)

Note: You must download this patch only when you are upgrading the ORMB database from any version below 2.6.0.1.0 to 4.0.0.0.0.

- UPGRADE FROM 2.9.0.0.0 TO 2.9.0.1.0 (Patch Number: 32359347)
- PRE BLUEPRINT SCRIPT TO BE APPLIED BEFORE UPGRADING TO 3.0.0.0.0 (Patch Number: 32905246)
- UPGRADE FROM 3.2.0.0.0 TO 4.0.0.0.0 (Patch Number: 34203584)

The downloaded files will be in the ZIP format.

2. Step 1A – Database Upgrade Process

While upgrading from Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Version 2.3.0.2.0 or any later version to 4.0.0.0.0, you need to install the following on the database (in the specified order):

- 1. Oracle Utilities Application Framework (OUAF) Version 4.4.0.3.0
- 2. Rollup Pack for Oracle Utilities Application Framework (OUAF) Version 4.4.0.3.0
- 3. Oracle Revenue Management and Billing (ORMB) Version 4.0.0.0.0

Once you install ORMB Version 4.0.0.0.0, you need to apply the release-specific patches on the database. To view the list of patches that you need to apply on the database, refer to the *ORMB V4.0.0.0.0 Patch Guide (Document ID: 2878927.1)* on My Oracle Support.

Note: There might be situations when you do not want to recreate one or more table indexes. You can skip the recreation process of one or more table indexes by adding the following line in the <DESTINATION_FOLDER_1>/RMB/Upgrade/Oracle/InstallUpgrade/CDXSchUpg.inp file:
-INDEX: 'INDEX1', 'INDEX2', 'INDEX3'
For example, -INDEX: 'XXT033PO', 'XXT034PO', 'XXT035PO'

For more information on how to install the packages and patches on the database, refer to the respective section in the *Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Version 4.0.0.0.0 Upgrade Guide*.

Alternatively, instead of individually applying the patches, you can download and install the rollup packs, if available, to apply a set of patches at once. For more information about the rollup packs, refer to **Appendix J: ORMB V4.0.0.0 Rollup Packs** in the Oracle *Revenue Management and Billing Version* 4.0.0.0.0 Upgrade Guide.

Once you install the packages and patches on the database, you need to drop few columns and tables from the database using the following SQL commands:

Note: If any of the above table or column does not exist in the database, ignore the error message and proceed further.

3. Step 1B - Data Migration Process

Once you upgrade the ORMB database, you need to do the following to migrate the data from 2.3.0.2.0 to 4.0.0.0.0:

- 1. Apply the PACKAGE FOR DATA UPGRADE FROM 2.3.0.2.0 to 2.4.0.0.0 Patch (Patch Number: 21055108) For more information on how to apply this patch, refer to the Migrating Data section in the Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Version 2.4.0.0.0 Upgrade Guide.
- 2. Apply the PACKAGE FOR DATA UPGRADE FROM 2.4.0.0.0 TO 2.4.0.1.0 Patch (Patch Number: 21463544) For more information on how to apply this patch, refer to the Migrating Data section in the Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Version 2.4.0.1.0 Upgrade Guide.
- 3. **Delete ORMB V2.4.0.1.0 Demo Data with CM Owner Flag** Execute the following SQL commands to delete the ORMB V2.4.0.1.0 demo data with the CM owner flag:
 - DELETE FROM SC_ACCESS_CNTL WHERE USR_GRP_ID = 'ALL_SERVICES'
 AND APP_SVC_ID = 'CIPRICEPARM' AND ACCESS_MODE='A' AND
 OWNER FLG='CM';

Note: If you are directly upgrading the ORMB database from 2.3.0.2.0 or any later version earlier than 2.6.0.1.0 to 4.0.0.0.0, you should not execute the **Upgrade Batch for Deferred Revenue Recognition (C1-RRUPG)** and **Revenue Recognition Division Upgrade Batch (C1-RRDIV)** batches mentioned in the **Data Migration** section of the *Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Version 2.7.0.0.0 Upgrade Guide.* Otherwise, erroneous results might occur.

- 9. Execute the Pricing Rules Upgrade Batch (C1-PRCUP) Batch to Migrate the Data from ORMB Version 2.7.0.0.0 to 2.7.0.1.0 For more information about this batch, refer to the Migrating Data section in the *Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Version 2.7.0.1.0 Upgrade Guide.*
- 10. Apply the V2.9 UPGRADE DEFERRED REVENUE RECOGNITION FUNCTIONALITY ISSUES Patch (Patch Number: 31437274) For more information on how to apply this patch, refer to the Migrating Data from ORMB Version Below 2.6.0.1.0 to 2.9.0.0.0 section in the Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Version 2.9.0.0.0 Upgrade Guide.

Note: You must execute the above step (10) only when you are upgrading the ORMB database from any version below 2.6.0.1.0 to 4.0.0.0.0.

- 11. Apply the UPGRADE FROM 2.9.0.0.0 TO 2.9.0.1.0 Patch (Patch Number: 32359347) For more information on how to apply this patch, refer to the Migrating Data section in the *Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Version 2.9.0.1.0 Upgrade Guide.*
- 12. Execute the following data migration batches: F1-BTIDT, C1-LSUB, C1-BLUPG, and C1-PITEM For more information about the C1-LSUB, C1-BLUPG, and C1-PITEM batches, refer to the Data Migration section in the *Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Version 3.1.0.0.0 Upgrade Guide*. And, for more information about the F1-BTIDT batch, refer to the Start Date, End Date, and Time Added to Batch Thread Instance section in the *Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Version 3.1.0.0.0 Release Notes* or refer to the detailed description of the batch in the application.

Note: You must execute the above step (12) only when you are upgrading the ORMB database from any version below 3.1.0.0.0 to 4.0.0.0.0 and not when you are upgrading the ORMB database from 3.1.0.0.0 or 3.2.0.0.0 to 4.0.0.0.0.

13. Apply the UPGRADE FROM 3.2.0.0.0 TO 4.0.0.0.0 Patch (Patch Number: 34203584) - For more information on how to apply this patch, refer to the Migrating Data section in the *Oracle Revenue Management and Billing Version 4.0.0.0.0 Upgrade Guide*.

If you upgrade the ORMB database from a version later than 2.3.0.2.0 to 4.0.0.0.0, you need to accordingly perform the steps listed above to migrate the data. For example, if you want to directly upgrade the ORMB database from 2.6.0.0.0 to 4.0.0.0.0, you just need to follow the steps from 8 to 13 to migrate the data.

4. Known Issues and Solution

This section lists the known issues that may occur when you upgrade ORMB database from 2.3.0.2.0 or any later version to 4.0.0.0.0 and how to handle these issues in the database.

Issue	ORA-38824: A CREATE OR REPLACE command may not change the EDITIONABLE property of an existing object		
Solution	Drop all views and functions before you upgrade ORMB database from 2.3.0.2.0 or any later version to 4.0.0.0.0. The Oracle Revenue Management and Billing V4.0.0.0.0 Oracle Database package will recreate the required views and functions in the ORMB database.		

Issue	ORA-01451: Column to be modified to NULL cannot be modified to NULL	
	Drop the primary key from the table using the following command:

Solution	Backup data from the tables where the issue occurs and then truncate the table. Once the ORMB database is upgraded, you need to insert the backup data in the respective tables before you proceed with the data migration process.
