## **Process Code Maintenance**


Process code maintenance enables the user to set the process code to the individual stages according to the process. In the subsequent steps, let's look at the details for creating a process code:

1. Using the entitled login credentials for registration stage, login to the application.




2. Click Core Maintenance > Process Code Maintenance on the left pane of the application.







3. Click **Plus** Icon to create a new process code.

Field	Description	Sample Values
Seq Order	The sequence order identifies the order of the stage in the complete process.  Registration must be first in sequence order.	
Source Stage	Enables to identify if the particular stage is the starting point of the process.
