CORBA APIs are no longer supported from ASR 60. Oracle recommends that you use ASR Web Services to integrate ASR with other Oracle products or with external applications. See *ASR Web Services Developer's Guide* for more information about the ASR Web Services.

3663	The existing EVC QTY field is deleted from EVC form and is added in the Admin2 form.
	The validation changes are implemented in the UI and the API for the EVC QTY field in the Admin form.

	When an order was sent from the upstream system with EVCNUM value as 1 or 2 instead of 0001 and 0002, the MSS application does not display information in EVC UNI MAPPING Details page.
	Resolution
	The user can now see the EVC UNI MAPPING Details in the ASR order when the EVCNUM value is sent with or without leading zeros in API.
34350760	Issue
	When clicking Service Request Detail in the Connection Design window, the users received an invalid service request type error for the ASR orders with the request type as D - DIS.
	Resolution
	The user can now open Service Request Detail from the Connection Design window for the ASR orders with the request type as D - DIS.

	Resolution

	When installing ASR67, the logger entry cmm.Integration.ASR version API is not added to the loggingconfig.xml automatically.
	Resolution
	When installing ASR version greater than 67, the logger entry cmm.Integration.ASR version API is added to the loggingconfig.xml automatically.
