This chapter provides an overview about Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service Integration to Oracle ERP Financial Cloud for General Ledger and Accounts Payable using Oracle Integration Cloud. It also provides information about software requirements, participating applications and supported business processes by this integration.

Overview of the Integration

Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service Integration to Oracle ERP Financial Cloud for General Ledger and Accounts Payable helps facilitate the transfer of chart of accounts and ledger information between the two applications.

This integration supports three key functionalities:

- One Way Integration from Oracle ERP Financial Cloud to Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service for creation of Cost Center and Expense Account using Chart of Account strings that are validated within ERP and stored in Account Combinations.
- One way Integration from Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service to Oracle ERP Financial Cloud for journal creation that sends General Ledger information for material issues, returns, purchase, labor cost, freight, PO adjustment and tax.

The following diagram provides a high-level representation of the integration.

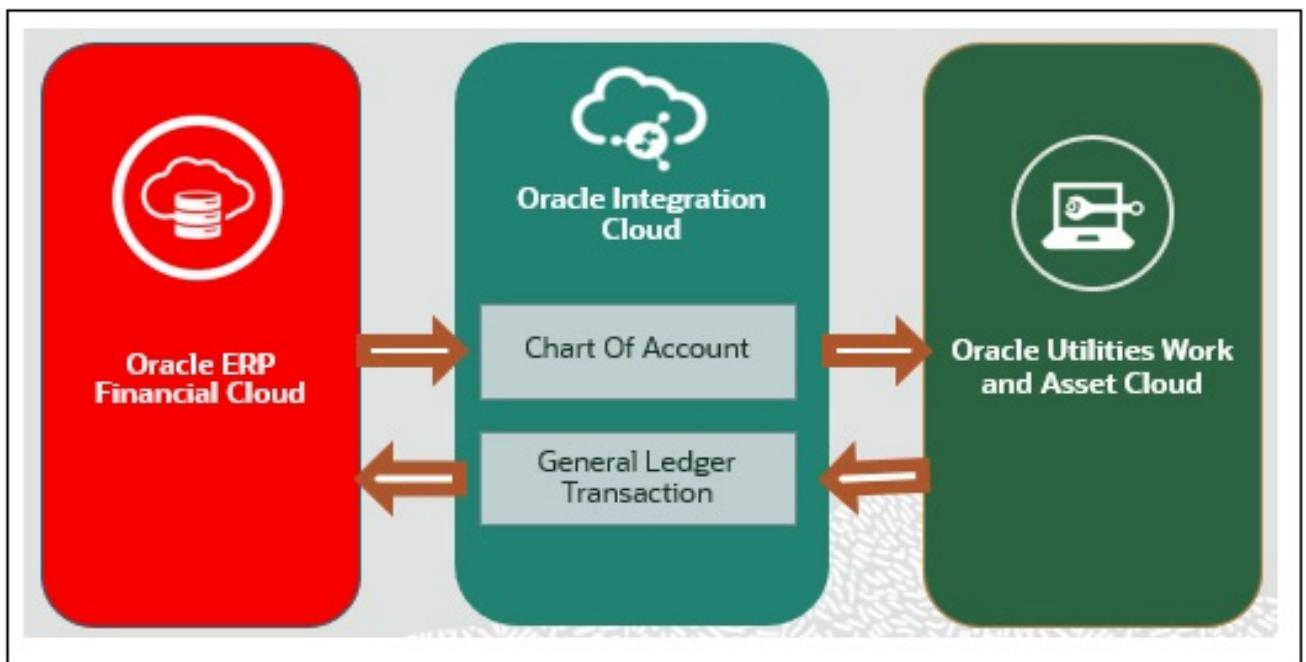


Chart of Accounts

- Oracle ERP Financial Application Cloud stores all the valid Account code combinations in the Manage Account combination table. The extract of the Chart of Accounts is based on segments and mandatory parameters which allow the customer flexibility to use varied combination to extract.
- Chart of Accounts is used to record transactions in a company's general ledger. As part of the accounting cycle, the CoA is used in the journaling process (performing journal entries) and also serves as the title for each ledger. In general, all accounts are filed under one of five categories: assets, liabilities, owner's equity, revenue, and expenses.

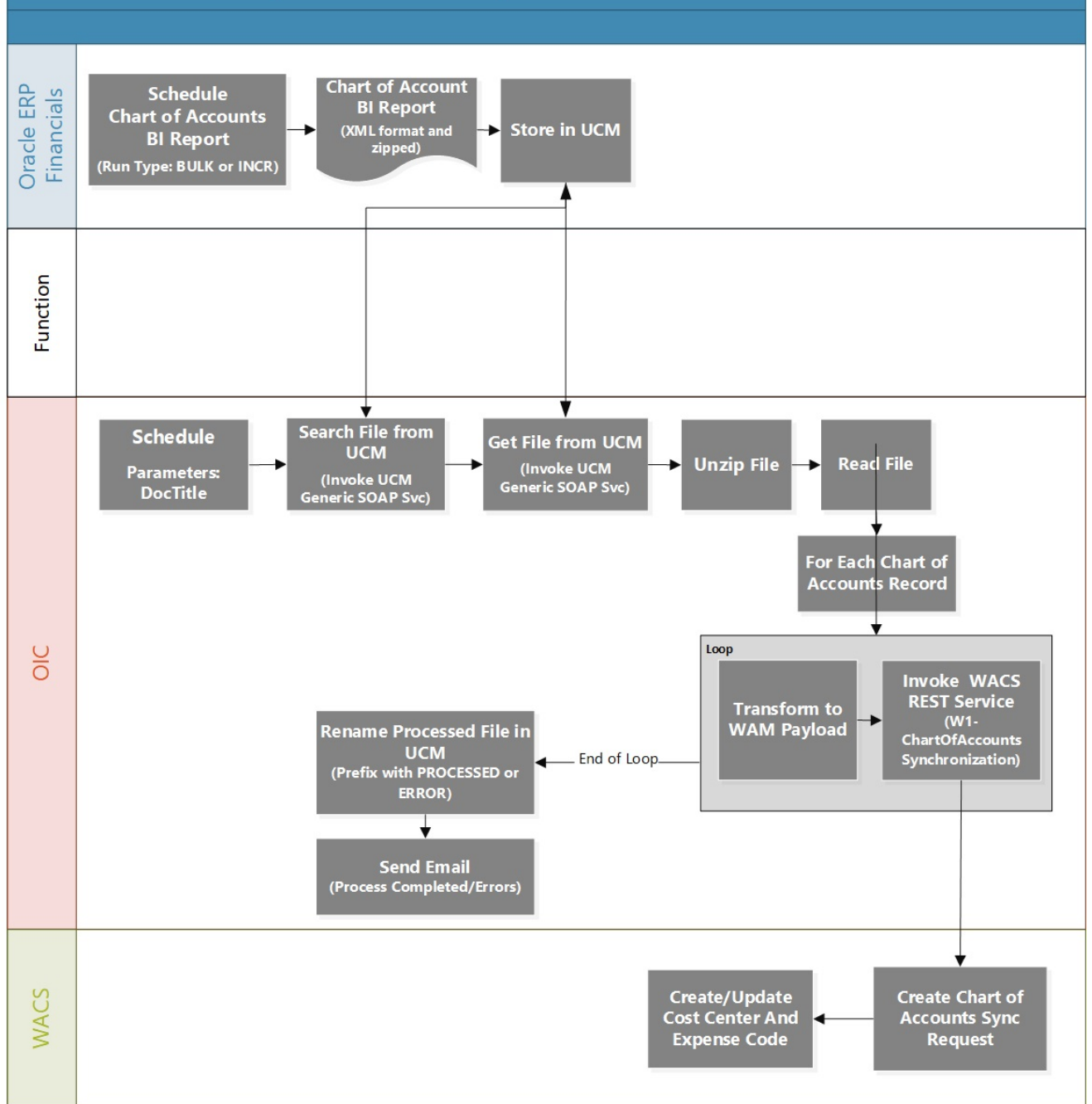
- Each company will have its own Chart of Accounts numbering system and can assign a number for identification purposes. A block of numbers can be assigned to one of those five categories and then be further divided into sub-categories. Gaps can be left between sub-category listings to allow for the addition of new accounts.

This integration includes:

- **Oracle ERP Financial Cloud Initiated:** Business Intelligence report created using the OTN Accelerator project is a prerequisite for the integration.
- Run the Report for Chart of Accounts, selecting all the mandatory parameters based on the business requirement. The extract is published in UCM in XML format.
- Report Extract is available for extract of chart of account. Report will only filter enabled code combination and the Allowed posting flag as “Y”.
- Business User can use the filters provided in the report to extract data pertaining to the integration. Filter is available for all the segments in the extract requiring few mandatory parameters.
- Guide on how to configure and run the report, check the setup configuration guide for Chart of Accounts.
- Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Flow: This Chart of Accounts integration uses the Seeder Sync objects, and requires the following Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service admin data setup for the integration.
- External System and master configuration helps to derive the cost center and expense account from the General Ledger string received from ERP.

General Ledger Integration

The objective of General Ledger interface is to integrate the General Ledger transactions originating in Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service with Oracle ERP Financial Cloud - General Ledger. As Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service users take actions within the application that necessitates sending the accounting entries to Oracle ERP Financial, this interface extracts the General Ledger transaction data from Oracle

Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service, translate it and move it to cloud as Journal voucher transactions in the General Ledger.

This integration includes:

- Batch process “W1-ERPGL” in Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service extracts all General Ledger transaction and load the zip file to object storage. This batch process creates a file using the Journal Import FBDI template.

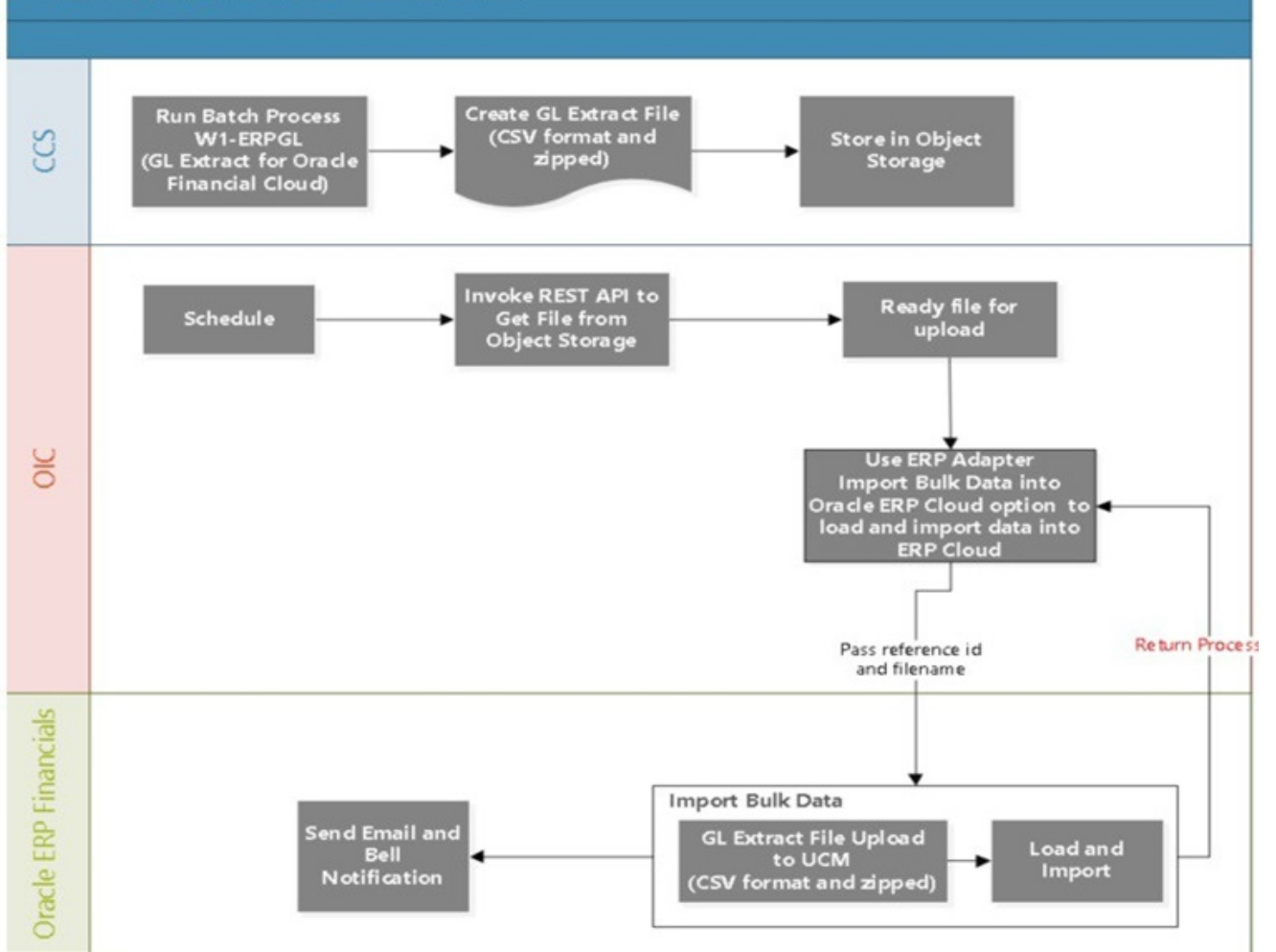
Note: Import Journal FBDI process is used to import ledger lines in Oracle ERP Financial Cloud. A batch is created in Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service using the FBDI template.

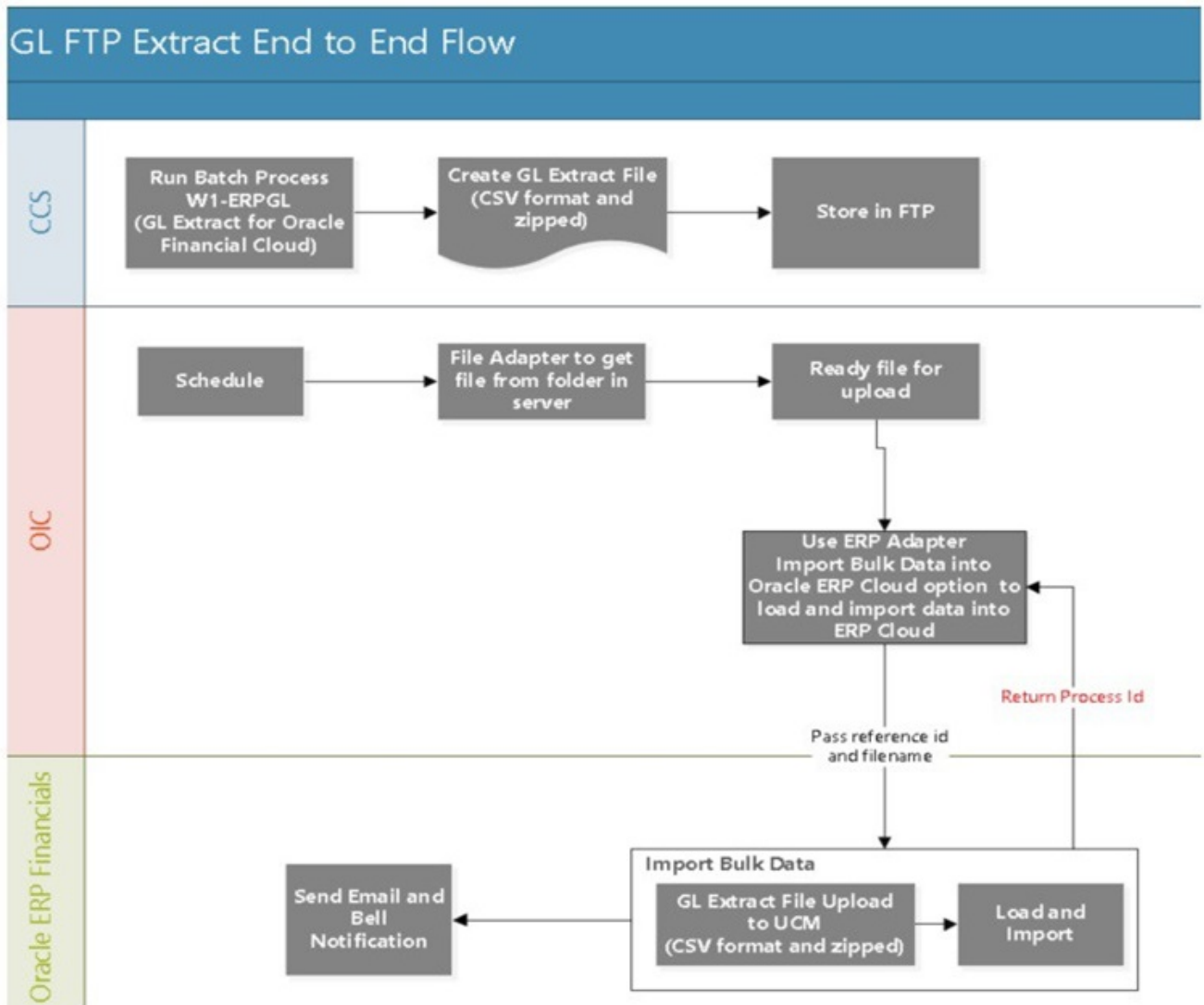
- **ERP Flow:** Batch process “Load to Interface” picks the transaction data from the UCM interface, inserts the information into an Oracle ERP Financial Cloud interface table and invokes a journal import data into the Oracle ERP Financial Cloud application.
- Financial interface procedure(s) picks transaction information from the interface table and imports the data into Financial General Ledger.
- The data imported into Oracle ERP Financial Cloud will be posted by submitting the Posting Journal Program as per the business process. “Import Journal” will load the records to the actual journal table that are then open for posting.

- Verification of data can be done in Oracle ERP Financial Cloud before making the posting.
- All the transaction are based on the existing code combinations interfaced by ERP system. Any correction or changes in the transaction would be new transaction to adjust the values (if needed).

Solution Overview

The technical aspects involved in Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service Integration to Oracle ERP Financial Cloud for General Ledger and Accounts Payable are:

- The integration layer is made up of integration processes deployed on Oracle Integration Cloud.
- The integration processes interact with other applications using the following adapters:
 - Oracle ERP Cloud Adapter to import bulk data into Oracle ERP Financial Cloud by performing FBDI-compliant bulk operations like Journal Entries.
 - REST Adapter to interact with Oracle Cloud Infrastructure Object Storage REST APIs
 - FTP Adapter to retrieve files
 - Oracle Utilities Adapter to interact with Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service REST APIs.
 - SOAP Adapter to interaction with Oracle UCM Generic Web Service to search, get and rename files in Oracle UCM.
- The integration pattern used for the solution is:
 - One-way asynchronous for all flows

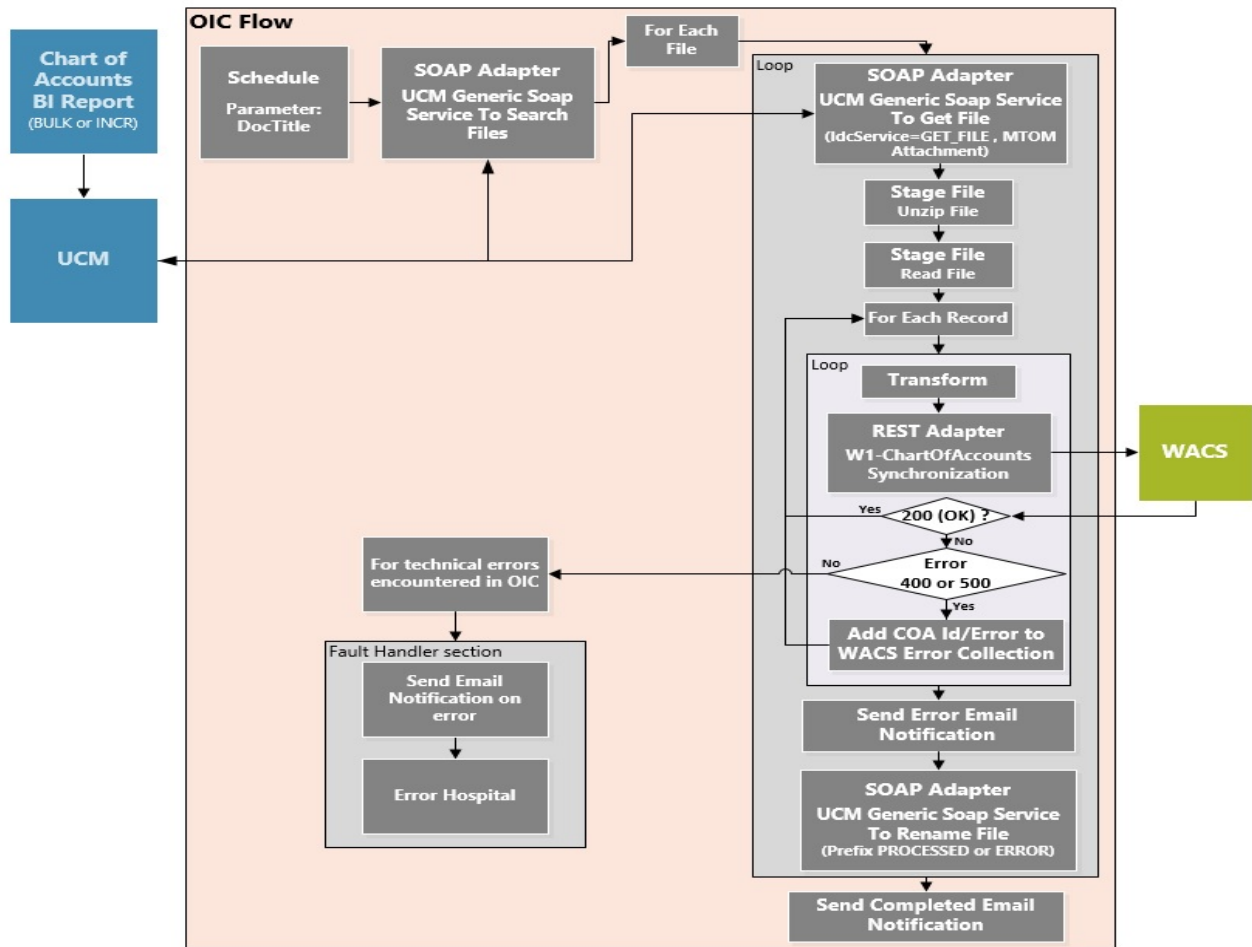

Chart of Accounts Synchronization Process (Oracle ERP Financial Cloud Initiated)

This integration process is used to synchronize Chart of Accounts from Oracle ERP Financial Cloud to Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service as cost center and expense code combination.

On initial load, only chart of accounts in active status are sync from Oracle ERP Financials. For incremental sync, active and inactive chart of account records are sync from Oracle ERP Financials.

The diagram shows a graphical representation of the Chart of Accounts Synchronization integration process.



Processing Details

This is a scheduled integration process deployed on Oracle Integration Cloud and does the following activities:

1. This process is triggered by a schedule and has one schedule parameter.

Parameter	Description	Default
DocTitle	Filename of the Chart of Accounts Report created in Oracle ERP Financials	FIN_COA_WACS

Define the integration schedule for this process and make sure it coordinates with the Chart of Account BIP Report schedule in Oracle ERP Financials.

Note that Chart of Accounts BIP Report should always run first in Oracle ERP Financial Cloud before this integration process is ran so the file to process is available in Oracle Universal Content Management (Oracle UCM).

2. Invoke the UCM Generic SOAP service to search for Chart of Account file(s) in Oracle UCM with Doc Title equal to the DocTitle schedule parameter.

If the schedule of the Chart of Accounts BIP report and this integration process are in sync, the search result list should return only one file. If not, it may return more than one file sorted by the doc created date in ascending order.

3. For each file in the search result list:
 - Invoke the UCM Generic SOAP service to get the Chart of Accounts File from UCM given the Doc ID obtained from the search result.
 - Unzip the file
 - Read the File
 - For each chart of account record in the file, the process does the following:
 - Transform the Chart of Accounts information received from Oracle ERP Financials to the Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service format.

Note: Refer to the [Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service Integration to Oracle ERP Financial Cloud Data Mapping Guide 20C](#) for more details about mapping.

- Invoke the W1-ChartOfAccountsSynchronization WACS REST API.
- If the WACS REST API returns:
 - Status 200 (OK), process the next chart of account record in the file
 - Error status 400 or 500, add the Chart of Accounts ID in error and the error details to the WACS Error Collection. Then, it continues to process the next Chart of Accounts record.
 - Error status NOT 400 or 500, stop the process and send out an error email notification from the global fault handler. These errors are considered technical or remote faults (Sample Error Status: 401, 404, 503, etc)
- Check if the error count in the Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service Error Collection reached the value in property name maxerrorcount.per.emailnotification defined in the configuration properties lookup.
 - If yes, send an error email notification with the chart of account records in error.

Note: This property maxerrorcount.per.emailnotification determines the number of errors sent out in an error email notification and how frequent an error email notification is sent out.

- When all Chart of Accounts records in the file are processed, invoke the UCM Generic SOAP service to rename the file.
 - If no record are in error, prefix the filename with 'PROCESSED-'
 - Else, prefix the filename with 'ERROR-'

4. After all files are processed, send a process completed email notification with the name of the file(s) processed, record processed count per file and records in error count per file, if any.

Note: All email notification are optional. By default, this is enabled to true in the Configuration Properties file.

General Ledger Extract Process (Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service Initiated)

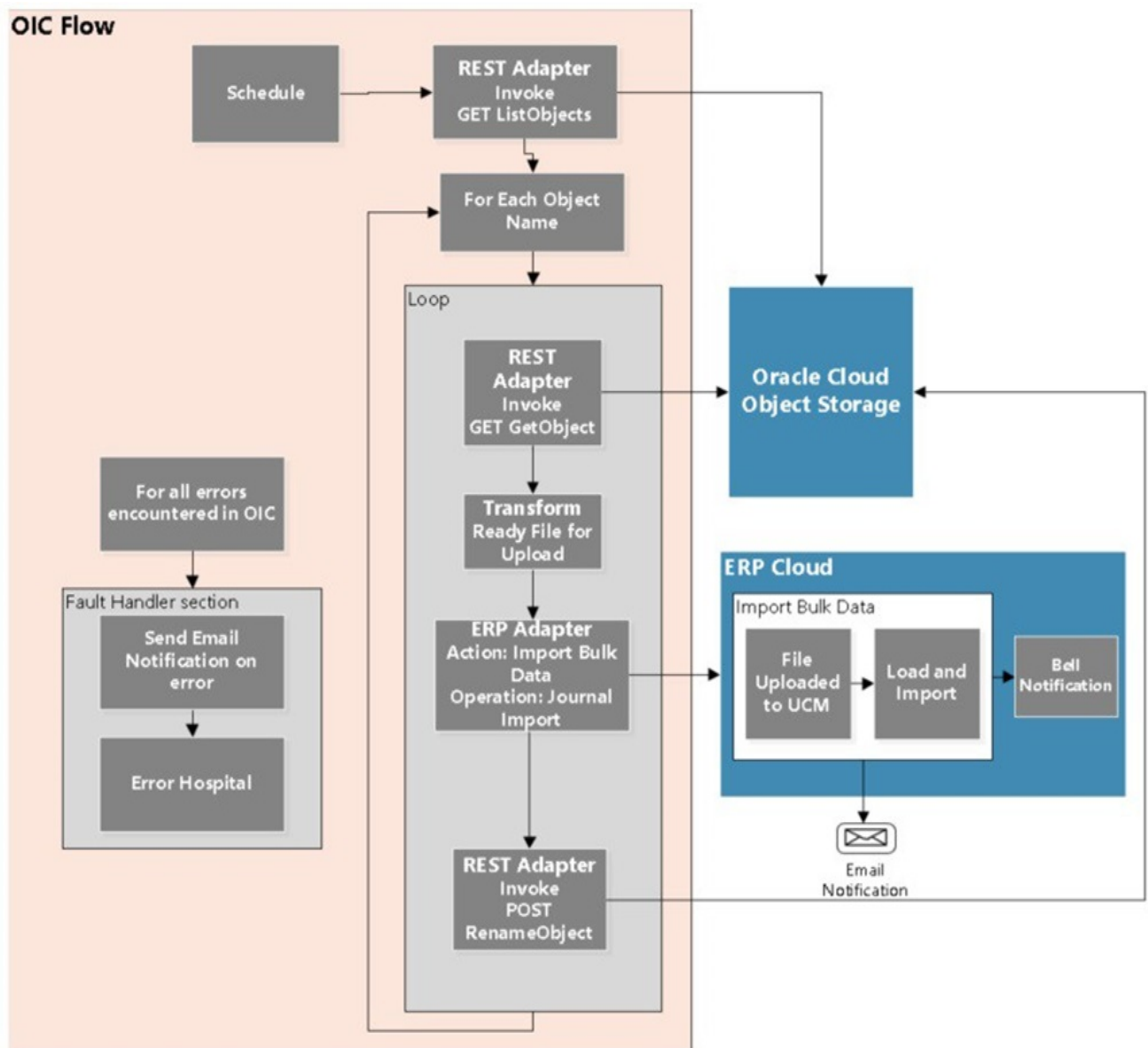
This integration process is used to transfer all approved General Ledger transactions from Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service to Oracle ERP Financial Cloud for General Ledger for journal creation via data file.

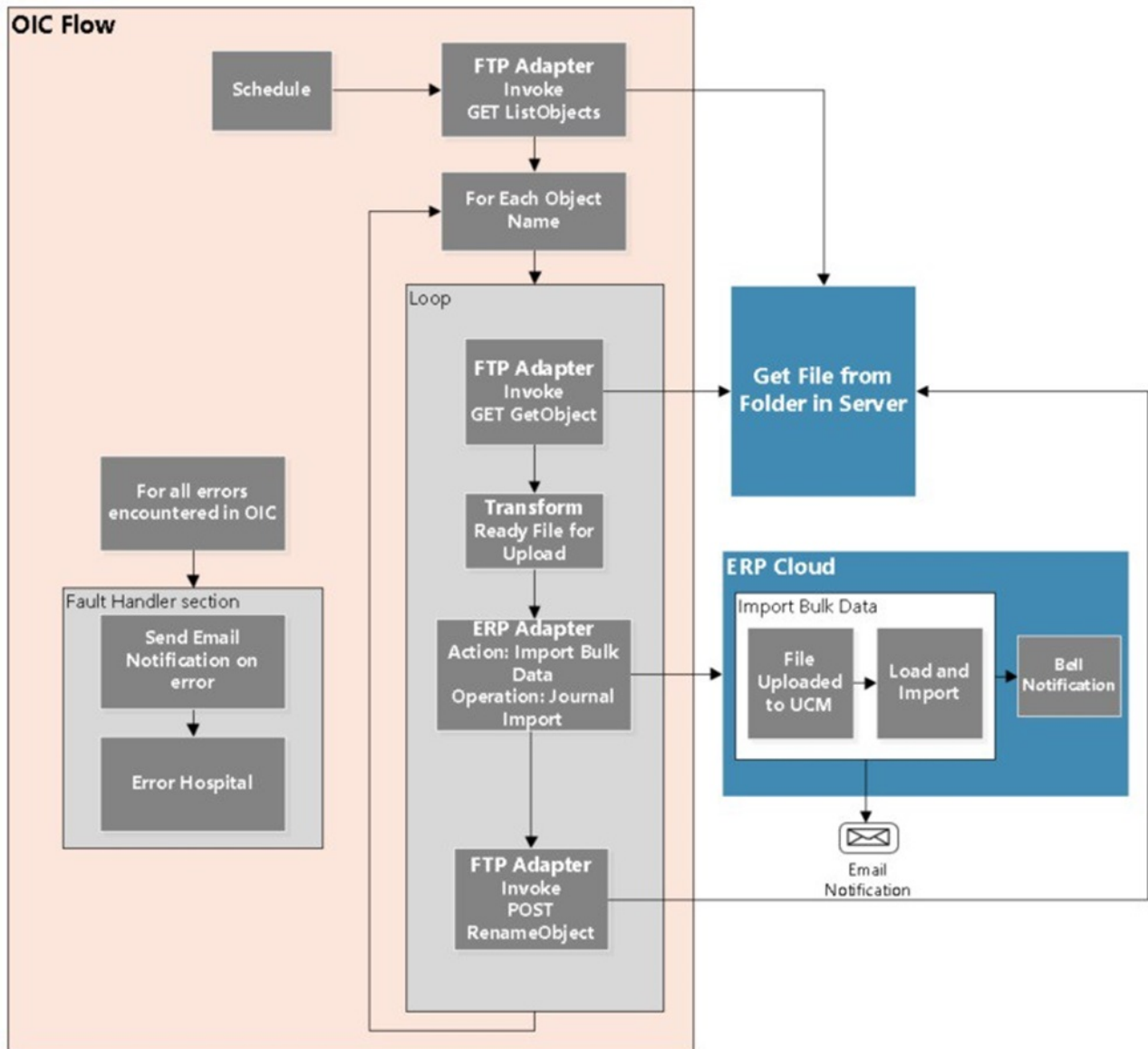
Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service creates the GL Extract file, following the Oracle ERP Journal Import FBDI template, in csv and zip format.

The file is picked up by the integration process and uploaded to Oracle ERP Financial Cloud using Oracle ERP Adapter Import Bulk Data action for Import Journal. This is just a file pass through and no transformation will be done by the integration.

Make sure the GL extract batch process (W1-ERPGL) in Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service is ran before running this integration process.

The following diagram shows a graphical representation of the General Ledger Extract integration process:





Processing Details

This asynchronous integration process is split in 2 flows with same functionality to extract files from FTP and one to extract from Object Storage each deployed on Oracle Integration Cloud and does the following activities:

1. This process is triggered by a schedule. Define the integration schedule for this process and make sure it coordinates with the GL Extract batch process (W1-ERPGL) schedule in Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service.

Note: GL Extract batch process (W1-ERPGL) should always be run first before this integration process is ran so the GL extract file is available in Object Storage.

2. Get default information from WACS-ERPFIN Integration Configuration Properties (OUTL-BRT-WACS_ERPFIN_ConfigProps) lookup. This lookup should be configured first to make this integration work.

3. Determine the file location of the GL Extract file from property name `wacs.filelocation.flag` in `OUTL-BRT-WACS_ERPFIN_ConfigProps` Lookup.
4. If the extract file is in Object Storage, it invokes the Object Storage - List Objects REST API or from FTP - List Files to get the list of files to be processed.
Only files that starts with the string entered in property name `gl.extract.filename.prefix` in the `OUTL-BRT-WACS_ERPFIN_ConfigProps` Lookup are returned.
5. Repeat the following steps for each file to process.
 - a. Invoke the Object Storage or FTP - List Files: Gets the actual file to process.
 - b. Prepare the file to be uploaded to Oracle ERP Financial Cloud.
 - c. Use ERP Adapter Import Bulk data option with operation Journal Import to load and import the GL data into Oracle ERP Financial Cloud.
Note: Bell and email notifications are enabled for any case in the Oracle ERP Financial Cloud Adapter. This means when the load and import process are done, bell and email notification are sent out as long as these notifications are setup in Oracle ERP Financial Cloud.
 - d. After the file is uploaded to Oracle ERP Financial Cloud, rename the file just processed in Object Storage or FTP. Rename by adding a prefix to the filename. This prefix is obtained from the property name `os.prefixtag.fileuploaded` in the `OUTL-BRT-WACS_ERPFIN_ConfigProps` Lookup.
6. Error Handling for this process.
Any errors encountered in the process are handled by the global fault handler.
Retry Option: Rerun from Oracle Integration Cloud
7. An optional email notification with error details are sent to the user(s) configured in the `OUTL-BRT-WACS_ERPFIN_Email_ID` lookup. Property name `email.flag` in the `OUTL-BRT-WACS_ERPFIN_ConfigProps` Lookup must be set to 'true' to receive email notification when errors are encountered.

Configuring Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service

One-Time Configuration Setup

Certain one-time configuration settings must be coordinated manually to make sure of the proper flow of data between the two applications.

General Ledger Configuration

Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Management for General Ledger and Accounts Payable is the source of truth for all General Ledger information. Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service is considered to be the sub-ledger. It is assumed that the General Ledger has already been configured to accommodate your business needs.

Distribution Codes

Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service uses distribution codes to map sub-ledger transactions to the General Ledger accounts. As part of the Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service set up, it is assumed that the distribution codes are properly mapped to the Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Management General Ledger chart of accounts.

Chart of Accounts

Oracle ERP Financial Cloud uses Chart of Accounts for tracking financial transactions. Each Chart of Accounts consists of a series of accounting segment strings. Financial transactions can be charged against these strings.

The Chart of Accounts Synchronization Process should be ran for initial load so the Chart of Accounts segments from Oracle ERP Financial Cloud are sent to Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service, and the Cost Center and Expense Code used in Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service can be derived from the segments. Transactions from other Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service integration flows can then reference these Chart of Accounts.

Note: Chart of Accounts Synchronization Process for incremental sync should also be setup and run to get the updates for Chart of Accounts in Oracle ERP Financial Cloud, if any.

Configuring Admin Data

For GL Extract

To configure Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service admin data setup for the GL Extract integration:

1. Login to Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service.
2. Navigate to **Algorithm**.

Define the **Journal Categories** in algorithm **W1ERPGLEXREC**.

The parameter values for the different journal categories must be a valid value in **Manage Journal Categories Setup Task** page in Oracle ERP Financial Cloud.

3. Navigate to **Master Configuration > ERP Integration Master Config.**
 Define the Ledger ID, Journal Source and Delimiter parameters under the Financial Configuration section of the ERP Integration Master Configuration.
 The Ledger ID provided must be a valid value in **Manage Primary Ledgers** page in Oracle ERP Financial Cloud.
 The Journal Entry Source provided must be a valid value in the Manage Journal Sources Setup Task page in Oracle ERP Financial Cloud.
 Define the Delimiter to be used for the GL Extract integration. This is the same delimiter used in the Chart of Accounts integration.
4. Navigate to **Master Configuration > Financial Master Configuration.**
 Define the GL Extract Batch Code under the Financial Transaction Parameters section. This value must be set to W1-ERPGL batch control.
5. If applicable, navigate to ERP Integration.
 Define the Owning System of the Maintenance Objects responsible for generating Financial Transactions and GLs. The Owning System must be set to Work and Asset Management.

For Chart of Accounts Synchronization

To configure Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service admin data setup for the Chart of Accounts Sync integration:

1. Navigate to **External System.**
 Define the External System representing the Oracle ERP system. This will be referenced in other Admin objects.
2. Navigate to **Master Configuration > Seeder Sync Request Master Configuration.**
 - a. Create a row for the ERP External System and Cost Center Maintenance Object (MO): W1-COSTCTR for Chart of Account Sync Integration.
 - b. Defines the Ongoing Sync Request Business Object and Key Reference View for the Chart of Accounts integration. The Ongoing Sync Request Business Object processes the Sync Request. The Key Reference View tracks previously synced Chart of Accounts, and is used to determine if the Sync Request transaction will add or update Cost Centers and Expense Codes.

The following table shows a sample reference:

Create a Key Reference Mapping row for the Cost Center Foreign Key Reference and ERP External System. This row should reference Initial and Ongoing Sync Key Reference Views to track Cost Centers that have already been synced. This configuration will be used to convert external keys to Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service keys.

In the **Cost Center Parameters** section, set **Validate Cost Center/Expense Code** to **Yes**. This allows the Expense Code collection to be visible on the Cost Center Portal.

5. Navigate to **Data Area**.

Create a Cost Center Account Segments Data Area that references the "W1-CostCenterAccountSegments" as an Extended Data Area.

This Data Area defines how the Account Segments will be stored within the Cost Center object. The schema should define 10 segments and 10 descriptions, with the element names matching the ERP Integration Master Config - Financial Configuration mappings. All elements should be group by the CM element "cmAccountSegments".

- a. In the **Main** section, define the Oracle ERP External System.
- b. In the **Financial Configuration** section, 10 segments must be populated. One must be the Cost Center segment and another the Expense Code segment defined. The Delimiter will define the separation character sent in the REST Web Service request.

7. Navigate to **Business Object > Cost Center Ongoing Sync Request BO**.

For Cost Center Ongoing Sync Request BO Lifecycle: The Cost Center Ongoing Sync Request is used for SOA-based ERP integrations. The configuration for these existing integrations needs to be modified as follows.

- a. On the Pending Lifecycle Status, a deferred monitor is enabled by default. This defers processing of the Sync Request until the Ongoing Sync Request - Pending (W1-SIOPE) Batch Control job is run. Clearing this deferred monitor would allow immediate processing of the Sync Request. This is an optional change.
- b. SOA-based ERP integrations required positive/negative acknowledgement messages to be returned to the ERP system. These are not need for the Oracle Application Cloud - ERP Financial Cloud integrations. On the Cost Center Ongoing Sync Request Business Object, inactivate the following lifecycle algorithms. To inactivate the algorithm, add an option within the Status with an Inactive Algorithm Option Type and the name of the algorithm within the Value field.
 - a. Synchronized (SYNCHRONIZED) Status - Create Positive Acknowledgement for ERP (W1-CPOSAERP)
 - b. Negative Acknowledgement Sent (NEG-ACK-SENT) Status - Create Negative Acknowledgement (W1-CRENEGACK)

Scheduling the Batch Process

Run the following Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service Batch Processes to create the extracts:

GL Extract for Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Management Batch Process

- Schedule the W1-ERPGL batch process to create the GL extract file. Some of the batch parameters are already defaulted. Make sure these parameters are defined.
 - fileName: Name of the GL extract file. As a preference, add the batch code and batch number to make the file name unique. Also, add the batch thread number if this is run multi-threaded.

Example file name: GLEXTRACTFILE_{BC}_{BN}.csv.

In this example, the system variables {BC} - Batch Code and {BN}- Batch Number are added to the file name.

Note: The beginning of the extract file name entered here, without any system variables, should be defined in the property name `gl.extract.filename.prefix` of the OUTL-BRT-WACS_ERPFIN_ConfigProps in Oracle Integration Cloud. In the example above, only the GLEXTRACTFILE part should be defined.

- `filePath`: Give the path name to the object storage where the file will be stored.

Example Path: `file-storage://OS-APP/Int-Export`

Note: When this batch process is scheduled to run automatically at a preset time, make sure to have coordinated this timing with the GL Extract Oracle Integration Cloud process schedule.

Managing Catalog Services

The catalog service is used by Oracle Integration Cloud to communicate with the respective application. It is configured in Catalog URL in the Oracle Integration Cloud connection.

To configure the catalog service in Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service:

1. Login to Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service.
2. Navigate to the **Web Service Catalog** page either from the **Admin** menu or the **Search** menu.
3. Select **REST Web Service Class**.
4. Add the REST inbound web services mentioned below to the catalog.

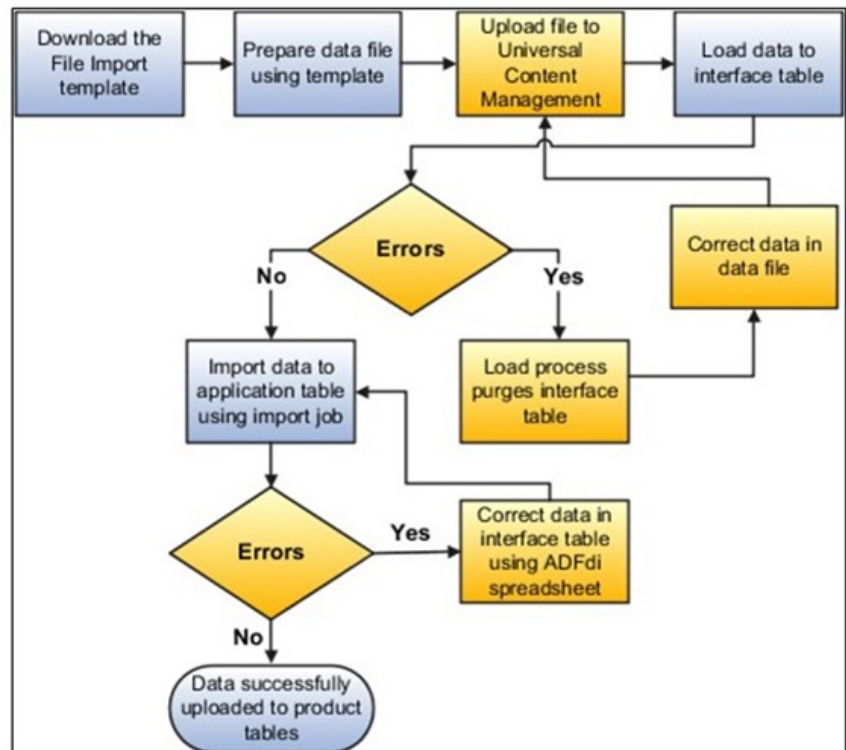
ERP Configuration for General Ledger

This section focuses on the configuration requirements for Journal Integration between Oracle ERP Financial Cloud and Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service. The General Accounting module under the Finance umbrella in ERP can handle journals, period close, and general accounting. The process starts with Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service running the batch to collect all journals on financial transactions. Oracle Integration Cloud processes to get the General Ledger extract file created in Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service and load the file into the Oracle ERP Financial Cloud through “import bulk data integration” (FBDI).

Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service generates a data file based on the Journal Import Template in a comma-separated value (CSV) format. Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service places the generated file to Object Storage or FTP Server. Oracle Integration Cloud flow picks file from Object Storage or FTP Server and places in UCM.

The file is scheduled within ERP from the UCM folder. The following figure shows the process to load the data to the GL_Interface table.

Configuration Overview for General Ledger

In addition to the set up to run General Ledger in ERP, to import journals with a specific source, create a reference source in ERP.

Journal import creates journal entries from accounting data imported from Oracle and non-Oracle feeder systems. It supports multiple charts of accounts, as well as foreign currency, intercompany, statistical, budget, and encumbrance journals. It creates journal entries from data in the GL_INTERFACE table.

Defining Journal Sources

Journal sources identify the origin of the journal entries. General Ledger supplies a number of predefined journal sources. In addition, define one journal source for Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Management, non-Oracle feeder systems to help track imported journal entries.

If journal approval is enabled in the system for set of books, set up journals with a specific journal source approved by higher management levels before the journal can be posted. This will follow the usual setup defined in ERP.

To create a new journal source:

1. Login to the system.
2. Navigate to the **Journal Sources** window.
3. Enter a unique **Name** and **Description** for the journal entry source. The source name cannot be deleted after saving the work.
4. Choose whether to **Import Journal References** from the feeder systems to maintain a mapping of summarized transactions. This information is stored in the GL_IMPORT_REFERENCES table.
5. Check whether to **Freeze Journals** for this journal entry source.
If the checkbox is selected, journals from this source cannot be changed in the **Enter Journals** window. If it is not selected, changes can be made to journals from this source.
6. Check whether to **Require Journal Approval** for this journal source.
7. If journal approval is enabled for the set of books and a journal is entered whose journal source requires journal approval, the batch must be approved before it can be posted.
8. (Average Balance Processing only) From the list, select an **Effective Date Rule** for the journal source.

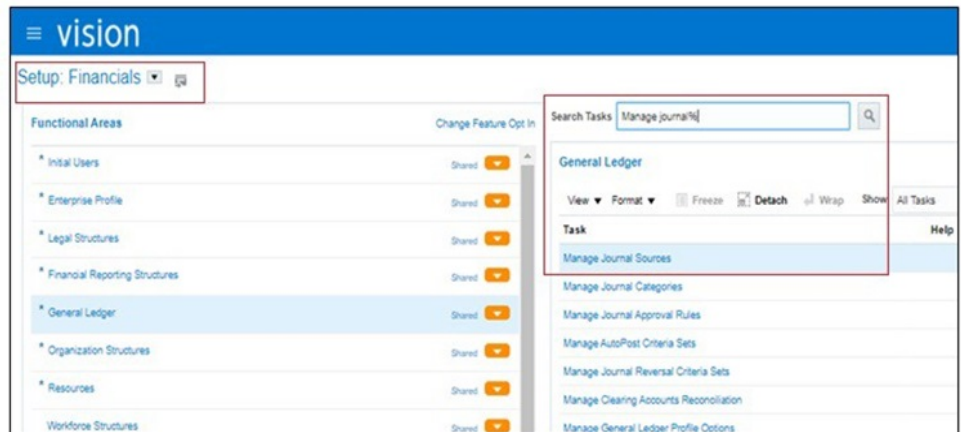
Note that the **Effective Date Rule** field does not appear unless the average balance processing is enabled for at least one set of books.

- **Fail:** Journal Import rejects transactions when the effective date is not a valid business day. Posting does not take place.
- **Leave Alone:** Journal import accepts all transactions regardless of the effective date.
- **Roll Date:** Journal import accepts the transaction, but roll the effective date back to the nearest valid business day within the same period. If there is no prior valid business day within the same period, the effective date is rolled forward.

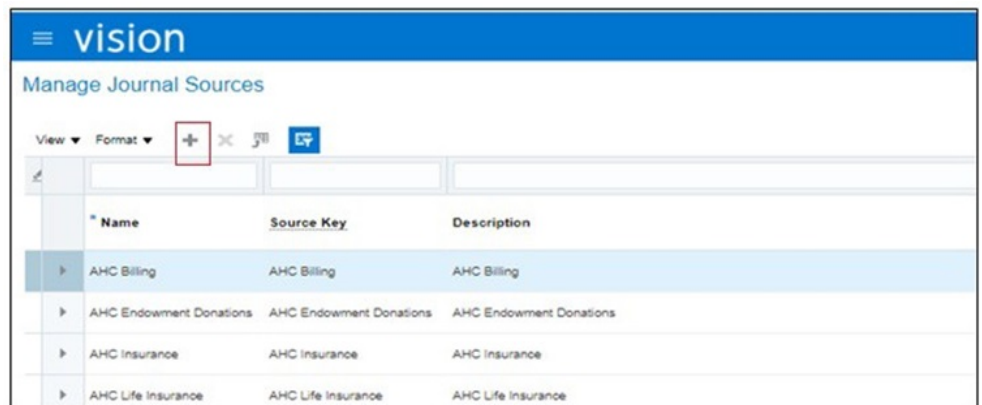
9. Save the work.

To manage a journal source:

1. Login to the ERP environment.
2. Navigate to **Others > Set up and Maintenance > Financials > General Ledger > Manage Journal Source**.



3. Click “+” to add the source.



4. Add the following details:

Name: WACS Transfer

Source Key: WACS Coexistence

Description: WACS Suite Coexistence

Other details on the task needs to be configured based on the business. (Approval is not needed as they are already approved in Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service)



5. Click **Save and Close**.

Scheduling the Import Journal

The file selected from UCM loads the records into the interface table. For the records to transfer to journal, ERP needs to run the Import Journal Process.

It is recommended to schedule the “Import Journal” batch once everyday, as all the records in the interface table may match to net debit and credit. Any mismatch in total of debit and credit may result in error and needs to be corrected in Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service to rerun the files.

To schedule this batch to run over time as per the business requirement:

1. Login to the system.
2. Navigate to **Tools > Scheduled Processes**.
3. From the **Name** list, select **Import Journals**. Click **OK**.
4. Enter the **Source** created in **Define Journal Source**.
5. Click **Advance > Schedule**.
6. Enter the **Schedule** details.
7. Select **Frequency** and **Start Date**.
8. Click **Submit**.

Importing the Oracle Integration Cloud Project from Oracle Cloud Marketplace

All integration points are shipped as part of a single project (.car) file.

To import a pre-built integration from Oracle Cloud Marketplace:

1. Launch the Oracle Cloud Marketplace portal.
https://cloudmarketplace.oracle.com/marketplace/en_US/homePage.jspx
2. Click **Applications**.
3. Search for “Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service”.
4. Browse through the list of applications and select the pre-built integration project to import.
5. Click **GetApp**.
6. Review and accept “Oracle Standard Terms and Restrictions”.
7. Click **Next**. The My Oracle Support portal opens.
8. Download the integration project from MyOracle Support.
9. When prompted, select the server where the pre-built integration file should be uploaded.

The pre-built integration is imported as a project file that is visible on the **Projects** page in Oracle Integration Cloud.

10. On the **Integrations** page, the individual integrations of the imported project file that are designated with a BUILT BY ORACLE message are displayed.

Important! This note is applicable only for existing customers. Make sure to take a backup of the existing project and lookups, and perform the cleanup before proceeding with the new project import. The cleanup includes deactivating the existing flows in this project and deleting the project, connections, lookups and libraries used in the integration.

To import a project in Oracle Integration Cloud:

1. Login to Oracle Integration Cloud.
2. Navigate to **Projects**.
3. Click **Add**.
4. Select the .car file downloaded from Oracle Cloud Marketplace.
5. Verify if the project is imported is successfully.

Asynchronous Flow Error Handling

Technical Fault

This fault occurs when there is a data mismatch or any Xpath related error. When this error occurs, the flow immediately goes to global fault handler and an optional email to the respective user is sent.

Remote Fault

This fault occurs when the target system is down. When this error occurs, the flow immediately goes to global fault handler and an optional email is sent to the respective user.

Business Fault

These faults are application-specific that occurs when there is a problem with the information being processed in the target application due to invalid data or business error validations.

For processing records in a file

When Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service returns HTTP status codes 400 or 500, these are considered business faults by the integration. When these errors occur, the flow will not stop but continue to process the next record and the errors will be stored in a temporary error collection. When the file is done processing an optional email is sent with the list of errors to the respective user.

Resubmitting the Error Instances in Oracle Integration Cloud

In this integration, all processes are asynchronous, so the resubmit option is in Oracle Integration Cloud if the process ends in a fault.

To resubmit the error instances in Oracle Integration Cloud:

1. Login to Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Management.
2. Navigate **Integrations > Monitoring > Errors**.
3. Select the integration to resubmit.
4. Click the **Resubmit** icon.

Reprocess Chart of Accounts (COA) File

To reprocess the Chart of Accounts (COA) file:

1. Navigate to Oracle UCM.
2. Make sure the filename of the Chart of Accounts file to reprocess is FIN_COA_WACS. If it has been renamed to ERROR-FIN_COA_WACS, manually change the filename to FIN_COA_WACS so the COA Sync Process will pick up the file again.
3. Login to Oracle Integration Cloud.
4. Navigate to **Integrations > Integrations**.
5. Navigate to Oracle Utilities ERPFIN WACS ChartofAccounts Sync integration and click **Run**.

6. Click **Submit Now** to display the **Schedule Parameters**.
7. Click **Submit**.

Email Notifications

This pre-built integration includes a configurable email notification.

To receive an email notification:

1. Login to Oracle Integration Cloud.
2. Navigate to **Integrations > Designer > Lookups**.
3. Edit the **OUTL-BRT-WACS_ERPFIN_Email_ID.dvm** look up.
 - a. In the **from** field, enter the email ID to receive an email from.
 - b. In the **to** field, enter the email ID to send the email to.
 - c. In the **Email_Id** field, provide the comma separated email IDs.

Note: In the OUTL-BRT-WACS_ERPFIN_Email_ID lookup, do not edit the values provided under the **Recipient** column.

In Oracle Integration Generation 3, you can extend (customize) an integration in an accelerator project by adding and configuring an extension group. An extension group enables you to extend your integration by adding invoke connections; stitch, for-each, switch, map, and integration actions; and global variables to the integrations in your accelerator project.

Prerequisites

The prerequisites are:

- All lookups and DVMs are setup in the Oracle Integration Cloud.
- Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service configurations related to this integration are setup correctly.
Refer to [Configuring Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service](#) for more information.
- Oracle ERP Financial Cloud configurations related to this integration are setup correctly.
Refer to [Configuring Oracle ERP Financial Cloud](#) for more information.
- Setup the schedule details of all the scheduled processes needed for this integration. Make sure to coordinate the timing of the WACS Batch Process (W1-ERPGL) and ERP Financial Cloud BIP Report (FIN_COA_WACS) by run them first before the OIC Integration Processes.
- Chart of Account integration is a prerequisite to General Ledger. Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud has a limit for 10 segments, similarly Oracle ERP Financial Cloud should also send 10 segments in the integration flow.
For instructions to set up Chart of Accounts, refer to the [Chart of Accounts](#) section in [Configuring Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Cloud Service](#).
Note: Oracle Work and Asset Cloud has a limit of 10 segments. ERP should only send up to 10 segments in the Chart of Account Sync process.
- In the integration, the extract report generates data for Code Combination table within Oracle ERP Financial Cloud. In case the valid code combination are not available in the table, users' needs to manually add the details to the task "Manage Account Combination". Consultant in the integration team implementing the integration needs to list all the valid combination and add to the above-mentioned task in Financial Cloud. (The above action also required to add the segment values in "Manage Value" if not available in Oracle ERP Financial Cloud).
- If the business wants to create a new Chart of Account, follow the usual practice of creating Value sets/Segment and values and defining the configuration for new Chart of accounts.

Activating Integration Flows

To activate the integration flows:

1. Navigate to the integration to activate.
2. Drag the slider for that integration. When prompted to enable tracing, click **Yes** to view the instances.
3. Click **Activate**.

The integration takes time to get activated. The activated integration appears at the top of the integrations list.

Oracle Integration Cloud

This section focuses on the monitoring Oracle Integration Cloud and troubleshooting any issues that occur during the integration activation.

Monitoring Integration Flows

Integration flows are monitored using the following:

- Dashboard
- Cloud Logs

To monitor the integration flows from the Oracle Integration Cloud dashboard:

1. Login to Oracle Integration Cloud.
2. On the **Home** page, click **Observability**.
3. Select any of the following as required:
 - **Dashboards:** To monitor the complete dashboard of integration.
 - **Integrations:** To monitor each integration.
 - **Instances:** To monitor instance and flow trace/activity stream of the integration.
 - **Error:** To monitor the integrations in 'error' state. Re-submit the asynchronous integration flows.

To monitor the integration flows using Oracle Integration Cloud logs:

1. Login to Oracle Integration Cloud.
2. On the **Home** page, click **Observability**.
3. On the navigation pane, click **Dashboards** to view the overall success/failure rate of the integration.
4. Navigate to the **Logs** menu.
5. In the right pane, click the link to show options for downloading the Oracle Integration Cloud logs or diagnostics logs.
6. In case of any issues, attach the diagnostic logs to a service request for help.

Troubleshooting

If an activation fails, the Integrations page displays an error message.

To troubleshoot the activation error:

1. Click **Download Diagnostic Logs** to download the logs for diagnosing the issue.

2. Select **Enable Tracing**.

TRACE ENABLED is displayed next to ACTIVE.

Some of the sample cases are as follows:

- For any connectivity errors while activating the integration, make sure the trigger connection is successful. Test the connection and refresh the metadata, and then activate the integration.
- If the integration (Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Management initiated flows) is activated for the first time, ensure the Oracle Utilities Work and Asset Management catalog is configured accurately.
