Table 3 List of Basic Actions


Action	Description
Approve	Click Approve to approve the initiated report. This button is displayed, once the user click Authorize .
Audit	Click Audit to view the maker details, checker details of the particular record, and record status. This button is displayed only for the records that are already created.
Authorize	Click Authorize to authorize the record created. A maker of the screen is not allowed to authorize the report. Only a checker can authorize a record. This button is displayed only for the already created records.
Close	Click Close to close a record. This action is available only when a record is created.
Confirm	Click Confirm to confirm the performed action.
Cancel	Click Cancel to cancel the performed action.
Compare	Click Compare to view the comparison through the field values of old record and the current record. This button is displayed in the widget, once the user click Authorize .
Collapse All	Click Collapse All to hide the details in the sections. This button is displayed, once the user click Compare .
Expand All	Click Expand All to expand and view all the details in the sections. This button is displayed, once the user click Compare .
New	Click New to add a new record. The system displays a new record to specify the required data. <div style="border-left: 2px solid #0070C0; border-bottom: 2px solid #0070C0; padding: 10px; margin-top: 10px;"> <p> Note: The fields which are marked in asterisk red are mandatory fields.</p> </div>
OK	Click OK to confirm the details in the screen.
Save	Click Save to save the details entered or selected in the screen.

Action	Description
View	Click View to view the report details in a particular modification stage. This button is displayed in the widget, once the user click Authorize .
View Difference only	Click View Difference only to view a comparison through the field element values of old record and the current record, which has undergone changes. This button is displayed, once the user click Compare .



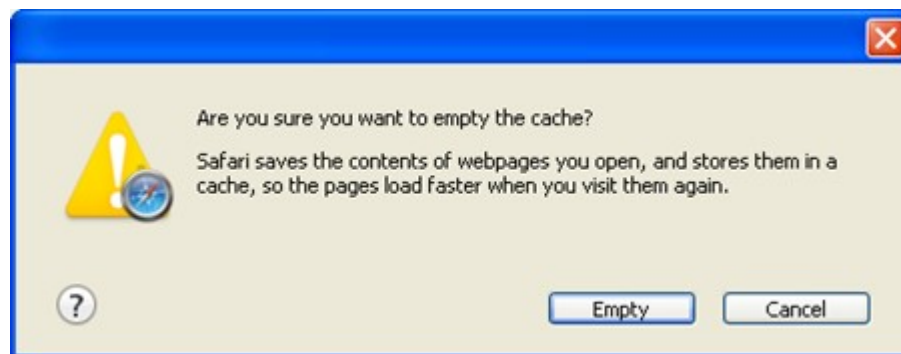
1.1 Clear Cache

1. Start the **Apple Safari** and go to the **Edit** option.
2. Click on the **Empty Cache** option.

Figure 1-1 Empty the Cache Message

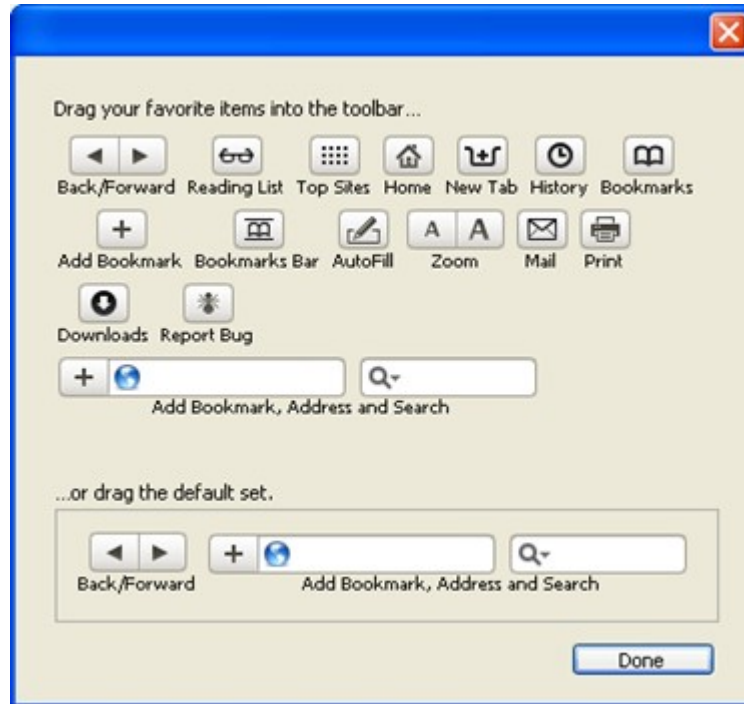


3. Click on the **Empty** button.

2.1 Clearing Cache

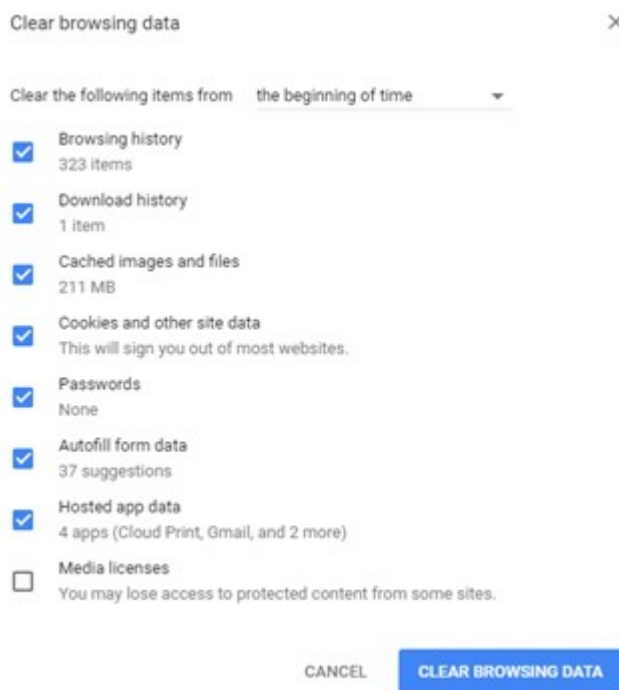
To clear cache, follow the steps given below:

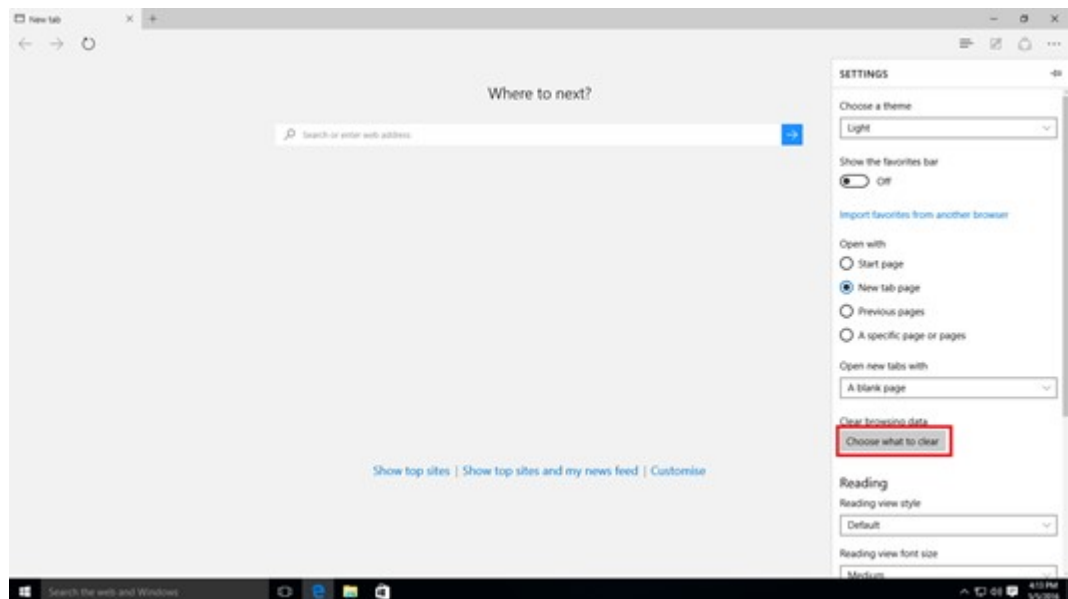

3.1 Clearing Cache

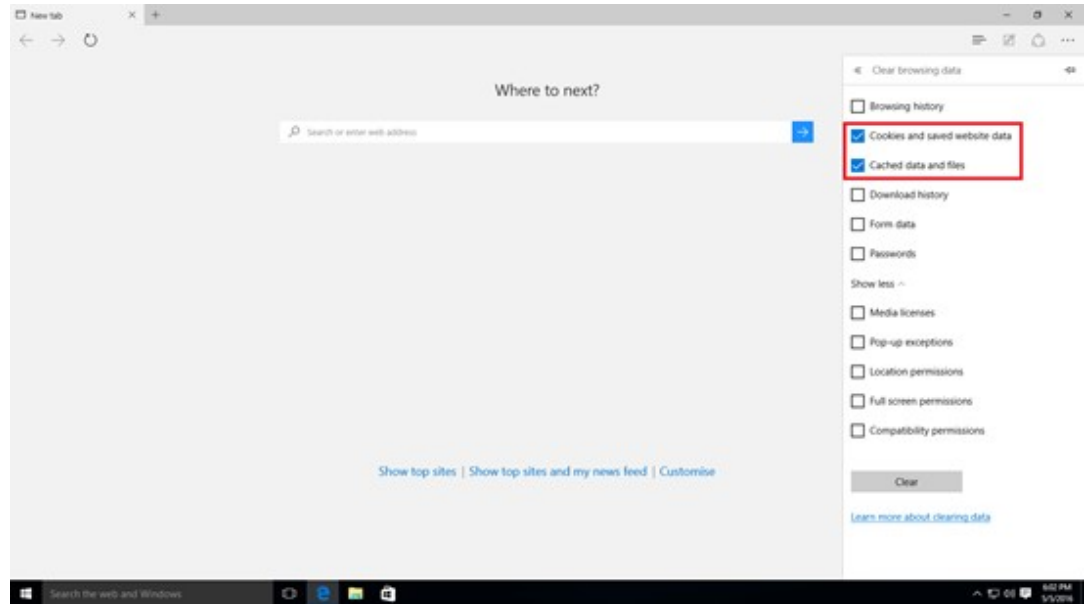
To clear cache, follow the steps given below:

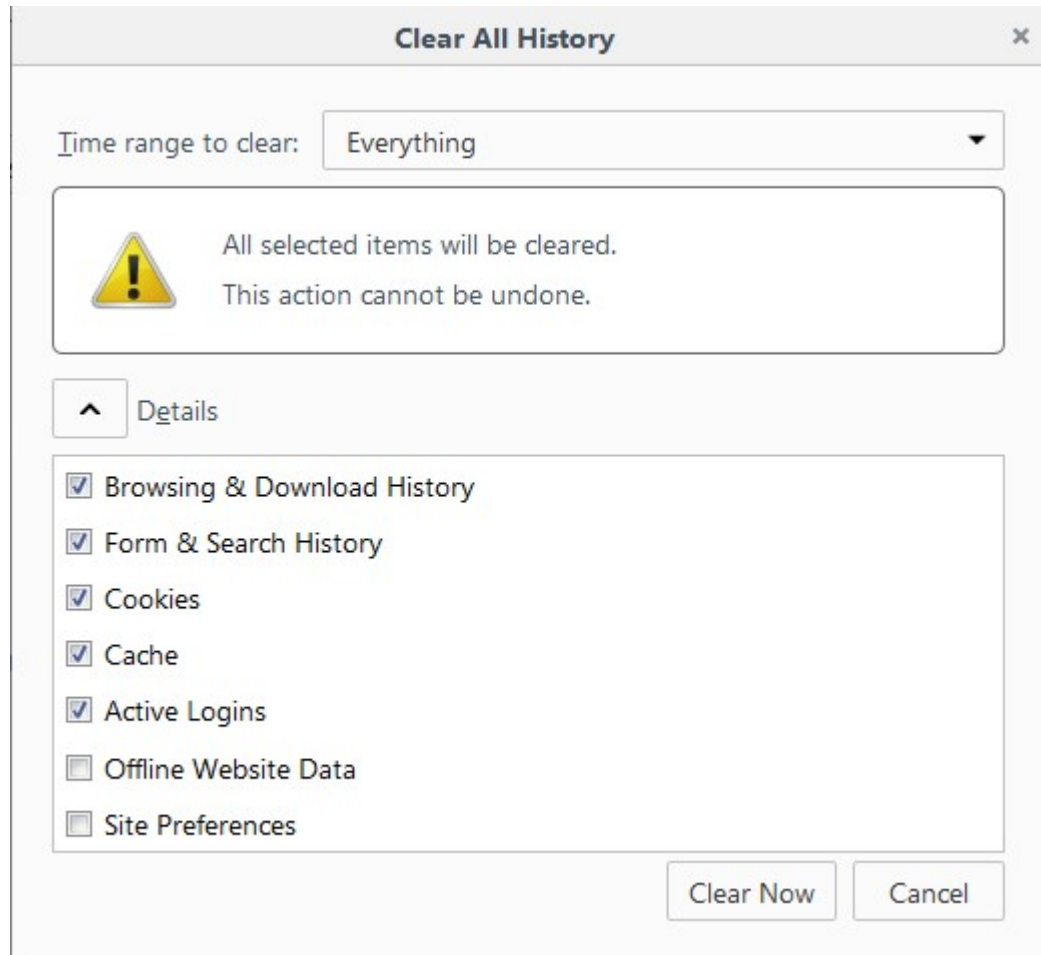

Figure 4-1 Clear All History

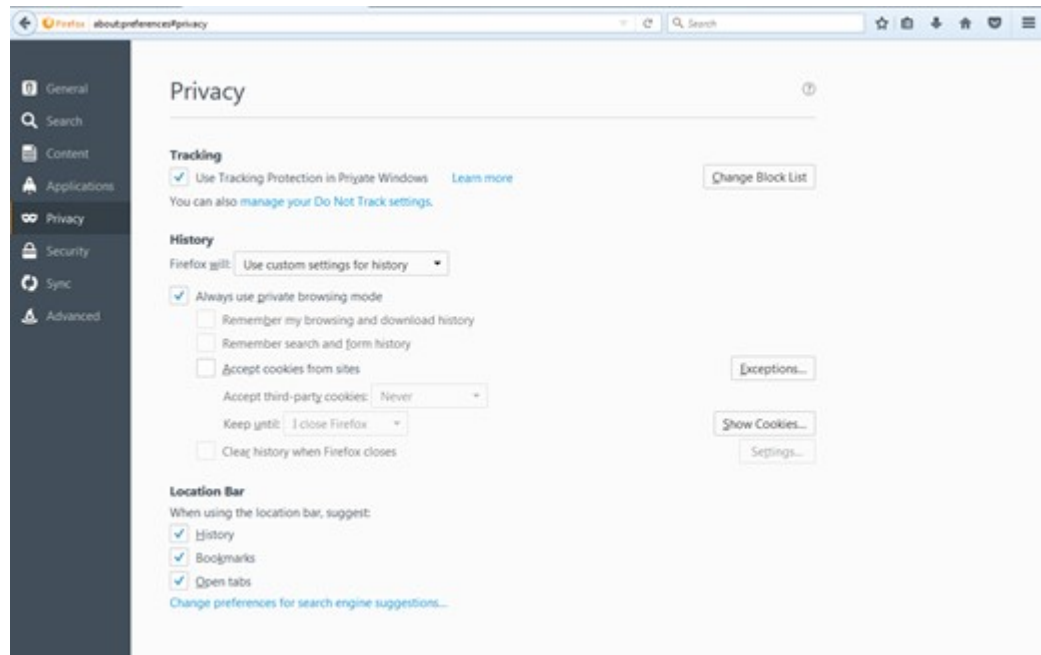


4. Choose **Everything** in the field of **Time range to clear** and then click on the **Clear Now** button.

Figure 4-2 Privacy



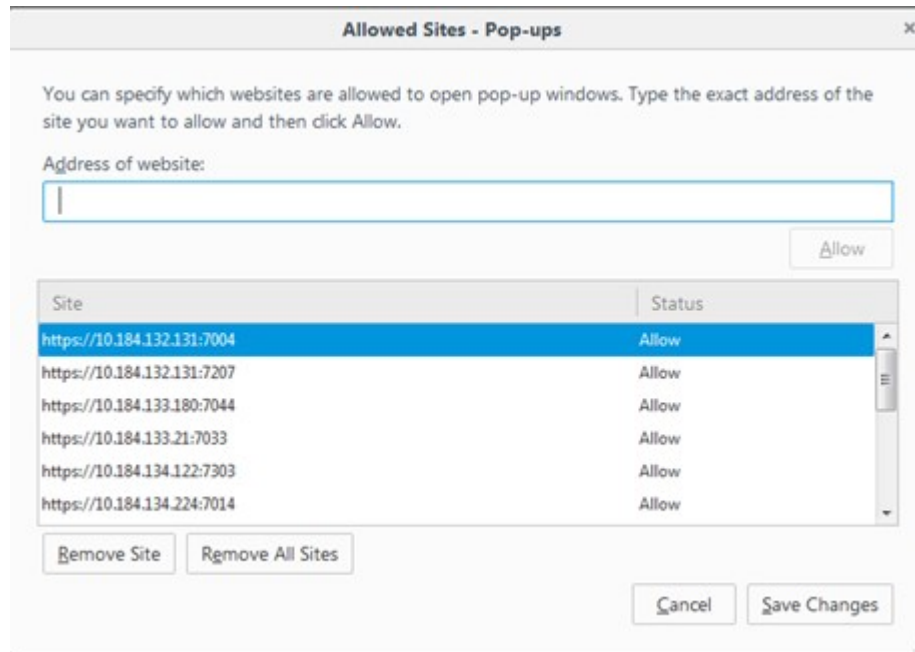
4. Under the **History**, select **Use custom settings for history** option from the drop-down list for the **Firefox will** field.
