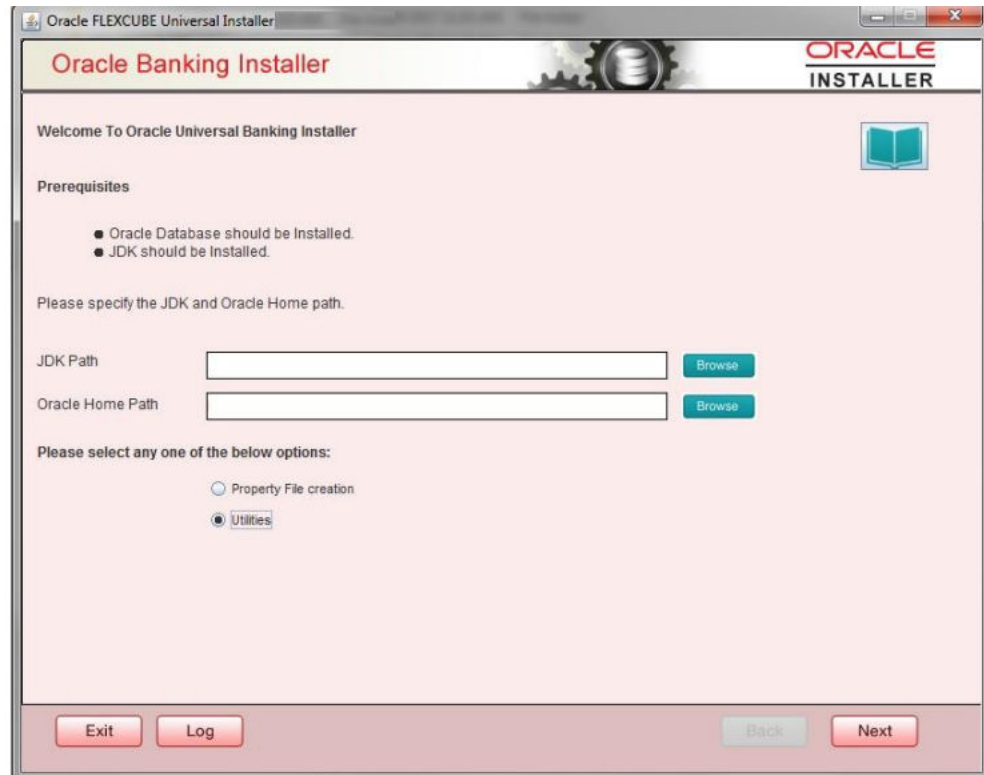
1.1 Introduction

1. Double-click **FCUBSInstaller.bat** batch file to launch the Oracle Application Installer.

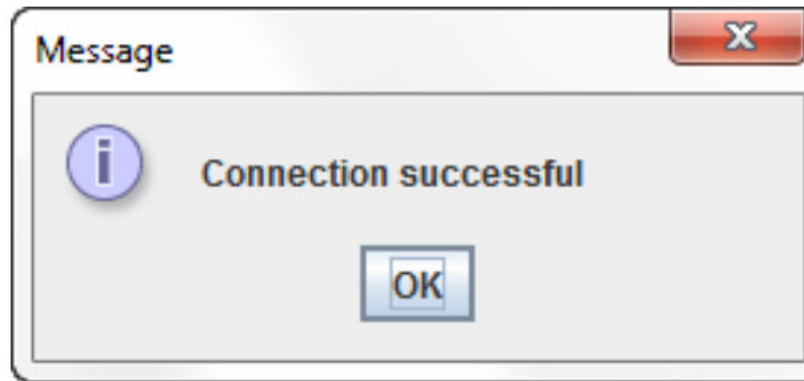
4. On the **User Creation Utility** screen, specify the **Entity ID**.

Table 1-1 DSN Entries Schema Details

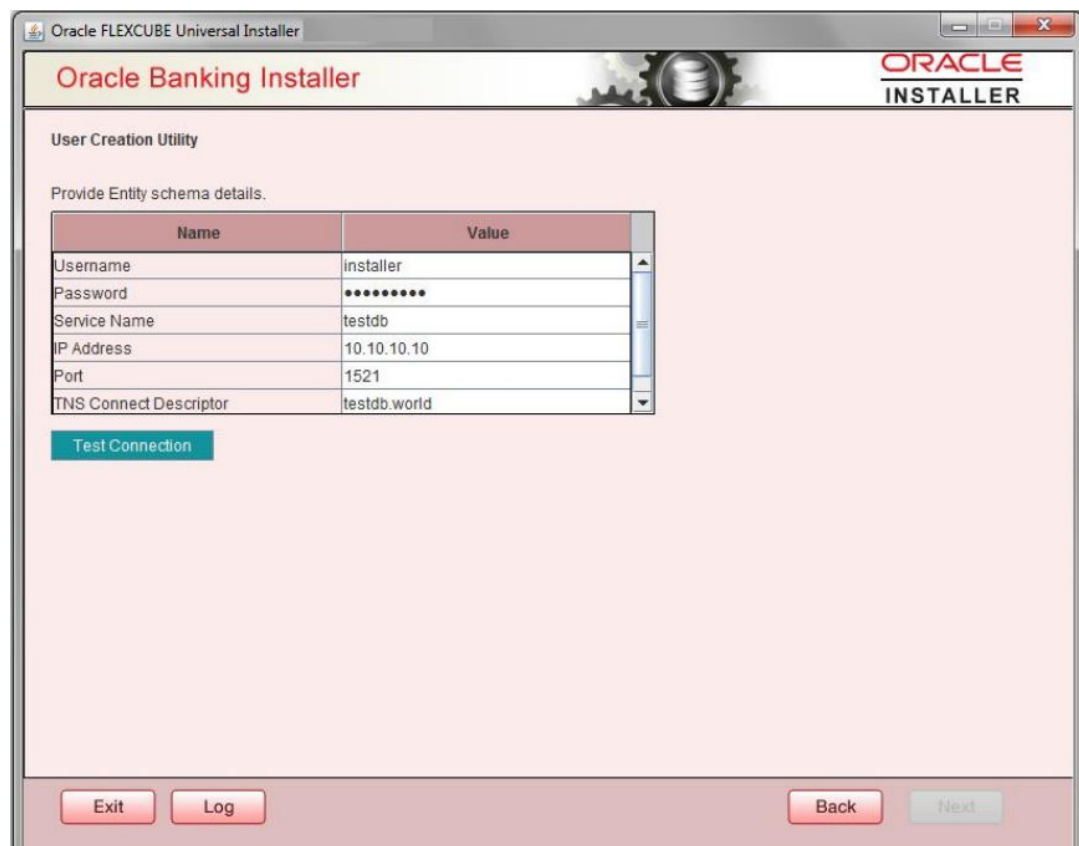
Field	Description
User Name	Specify the user name to access the schema.
Password	Specify the schema password.
Service Name	Specify the service name of database.
IP Address	Specify the IP address of the system where the database schema is installed.
Port	Specify the port number.
TNS Connect Descriptor	Specify a valid connect string that contains the details for database connectivity.

7. Click **Test Connection** to check the status of the connection to database.
- If the connection is established, the system displays the following message.

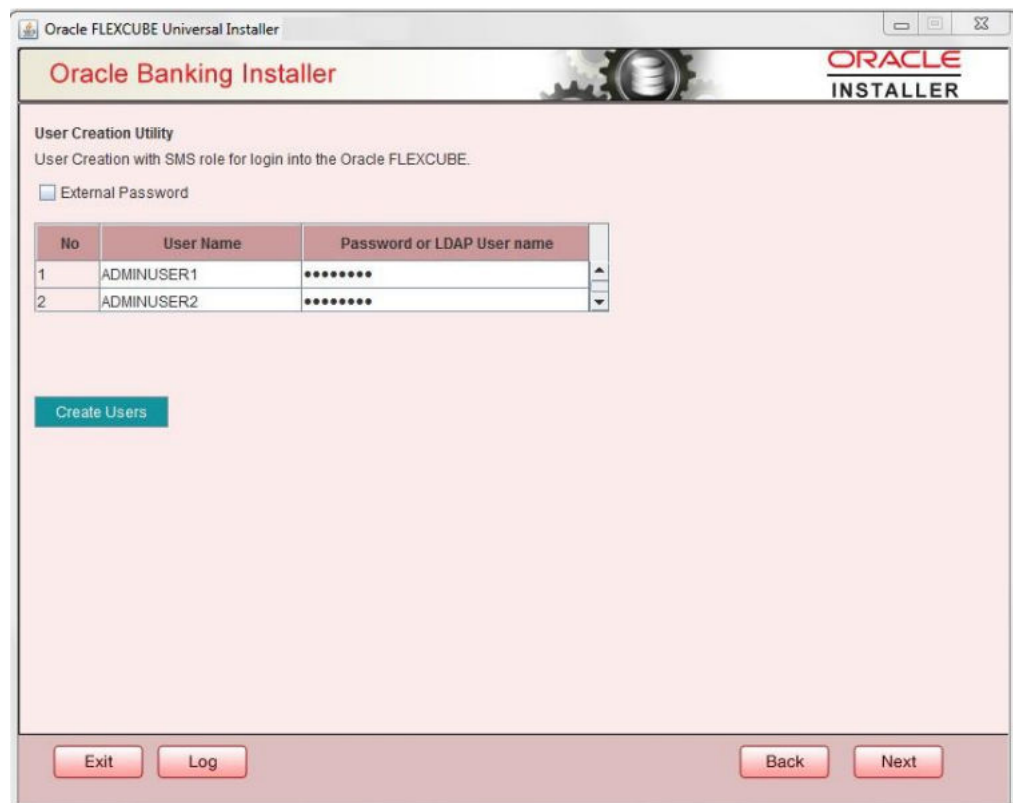

- Two users can be created at a time.
