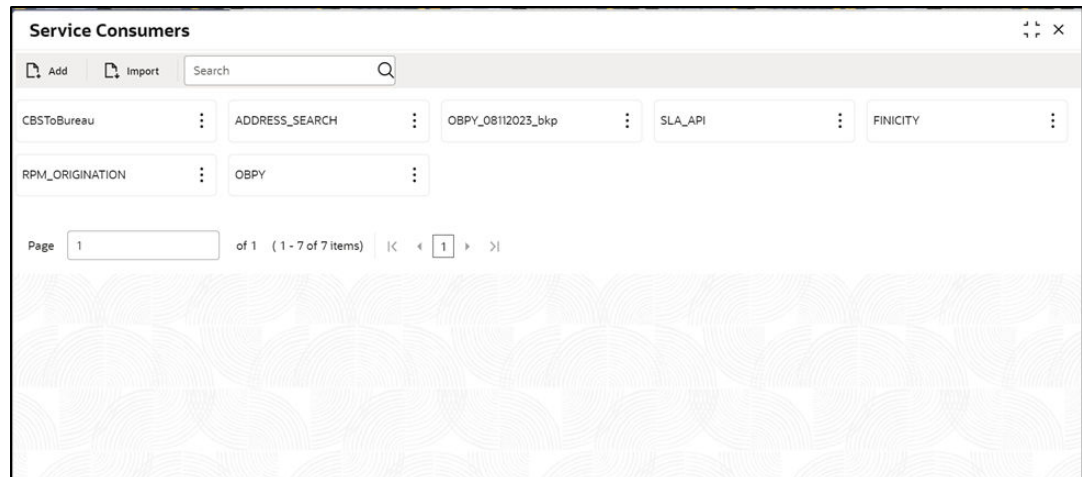

To maintain Oracle Banking Routing Hub configuration in common core for the Oracle Banking Payments Integration Service.

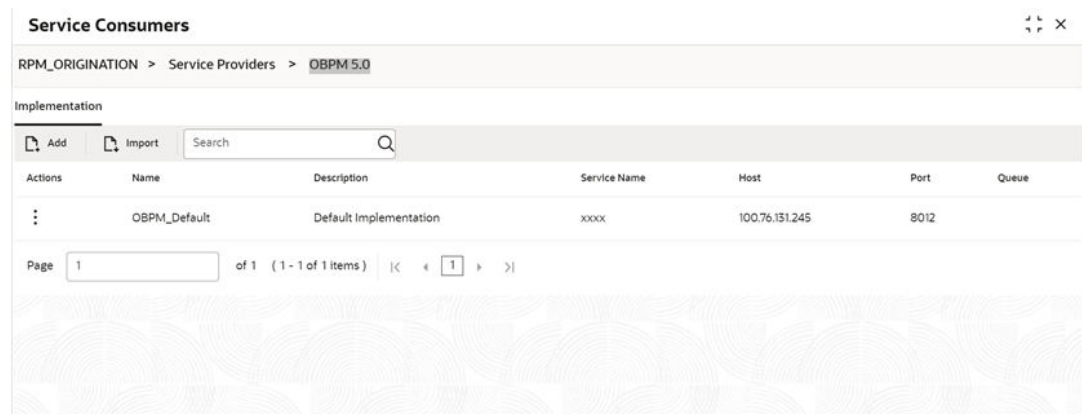
### To import the services:

1. From **Home** screen, click **Core Maintenance**. Under **Core Maintenance**, click **Routing Hub**.
2. Under **Routing Hub**, click **RPM\_ORIGINATION**.

The **Service Consumers** screen displays.

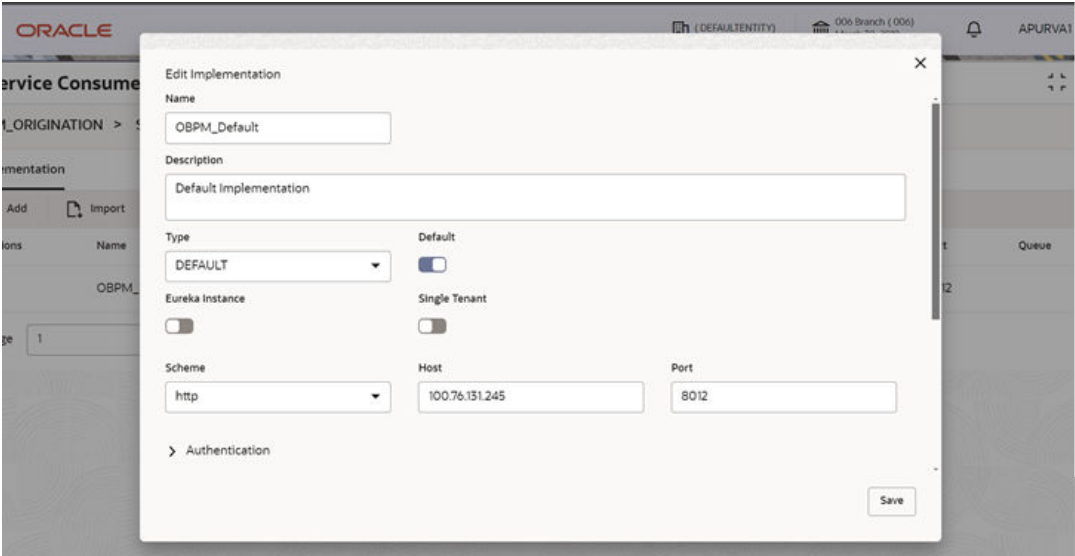
**Figure 1-1 Service Consumer**

3. Click **Import** and select the **RPM\_ORIGINATION\_OBPM5.0\_Provider.json** provided in the release into the respective Routing Hub configuration levels.
4. Under **RPM\_ORIGINATION Service Providers**, click **OBPM**.

**Figure 1-2 RPM\_ORIGINATION-OBPM**

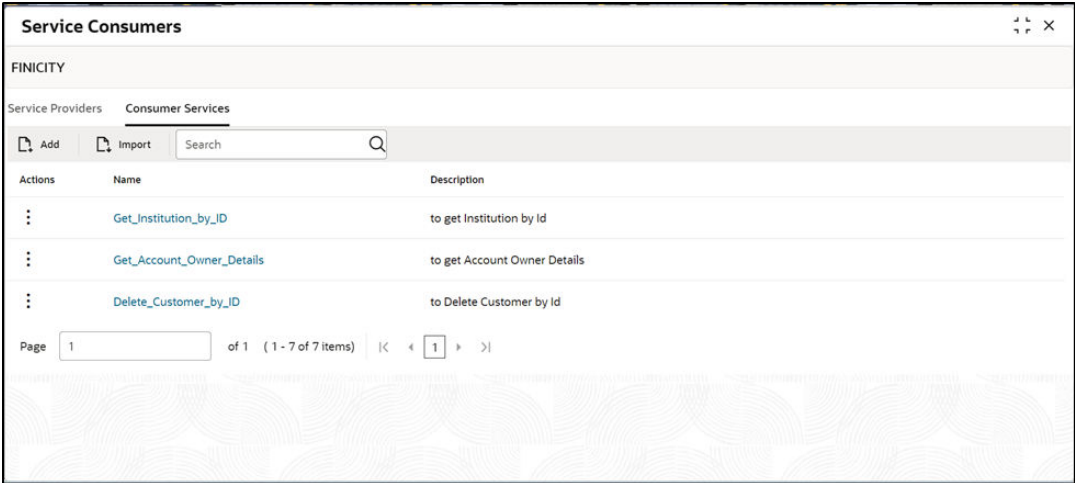
5. Click **Edit**.
