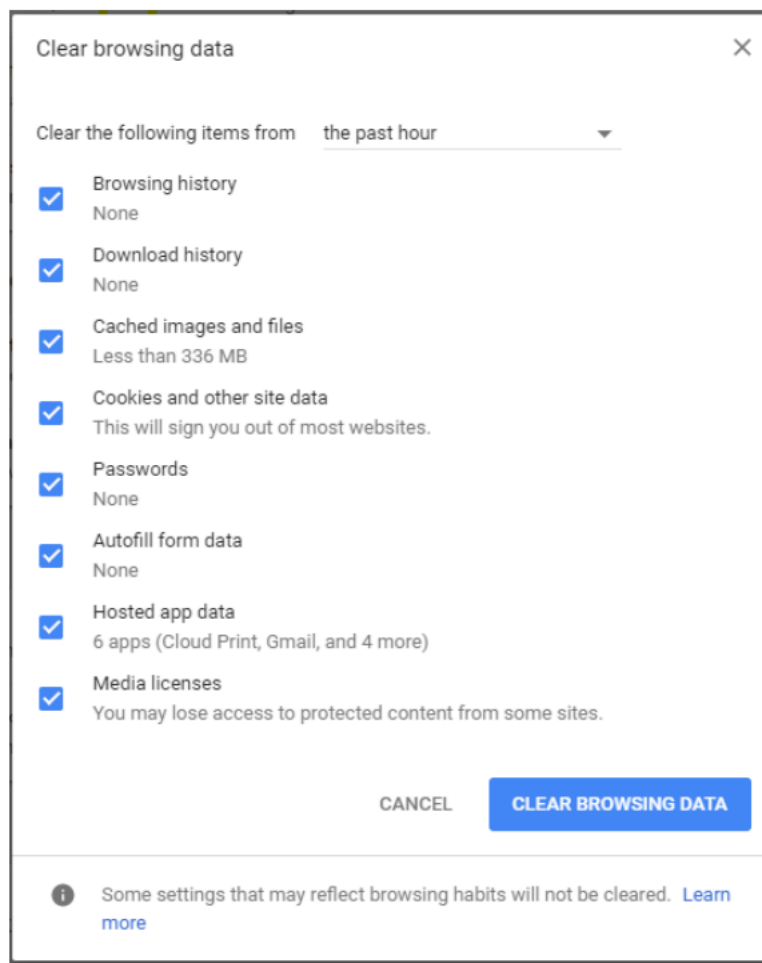

2.1 Clear Cache

This topic explains systematic instructions to clear the cache.

1. Launch **Google Chrome** browser.
The **Homepage** of the browser displays.
2. On the **Homepage**, click **Settings**.
The **Settings** screen displays.
3. On the **Settings** screen, click **Privacy and security** on the left panel.
The **Privacy and security** window displays.
4. On the **Privacy and security** window, click **Clear browsing data**.
The **Clear browsing data** pop-up window displays.

5. On the **Clear browsing data** window, check the item boxes that are to be cleared.
6. Click **Clear Browsing Data**.

2.2 Limitations

Once the user changes the branch, the title of the screen will be updated or refreshed only after double-clicking the screen title. It is refreshed once the user tabs out from the browser window and tabs back in.

2.3 Browser Behavior

On clicking **List of Values (LOV)** in the **Google Chrome** application, the cursor is positioned after the **%** symbol in the query field.
