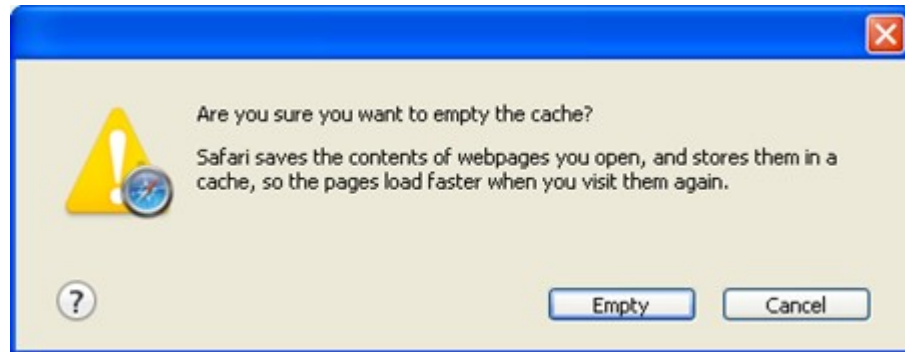

Figure 1-1 Empty the Cache Message

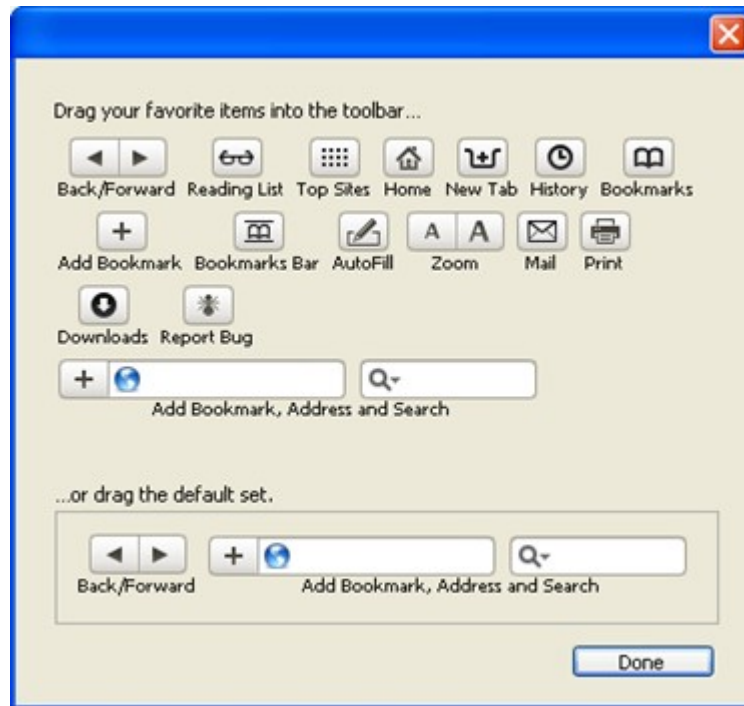


3. Click on the **Empty** button.

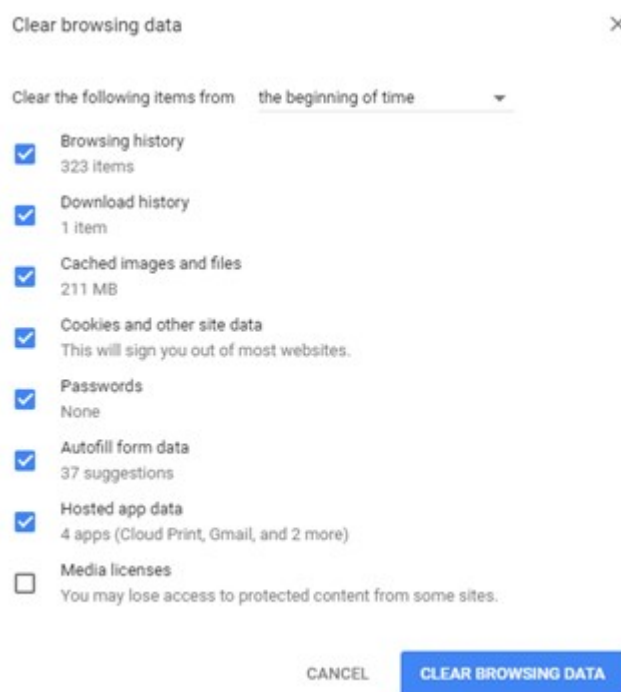
To clear cache, follow the steps given below:

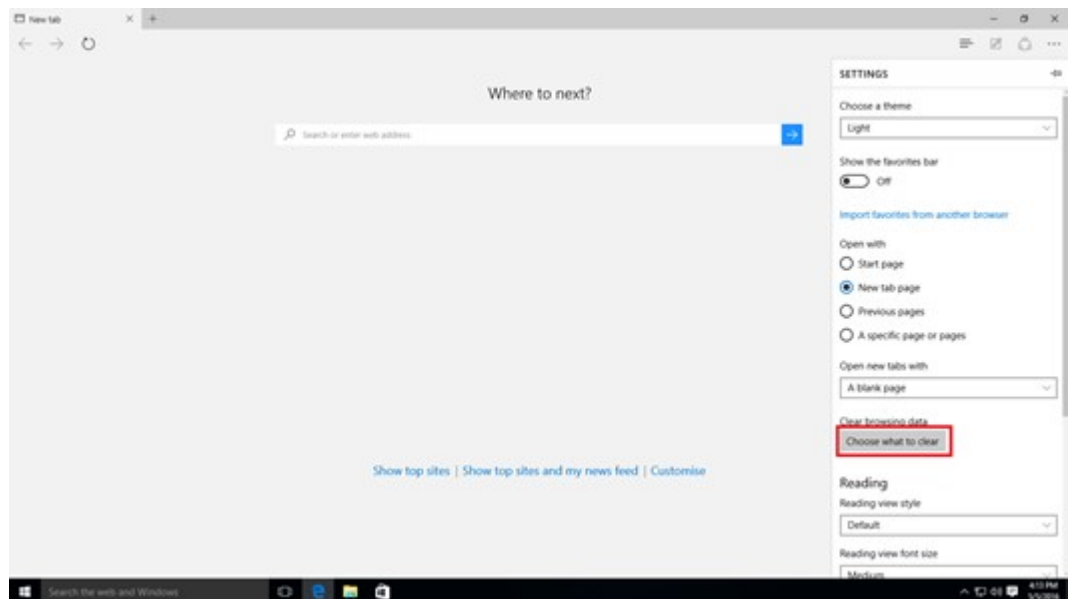

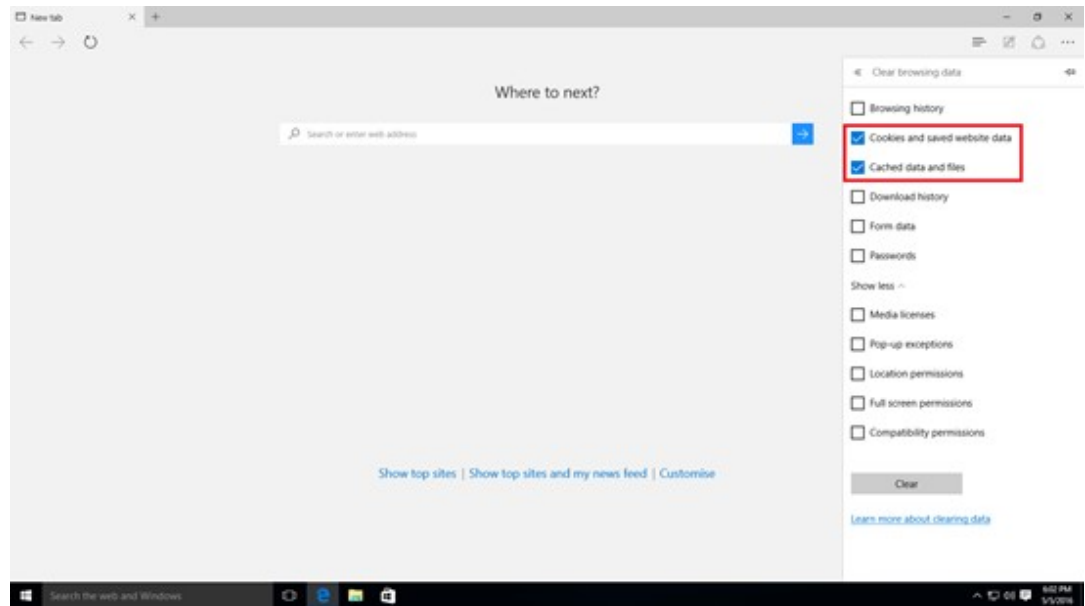
To clear cache, follow the steps given below:

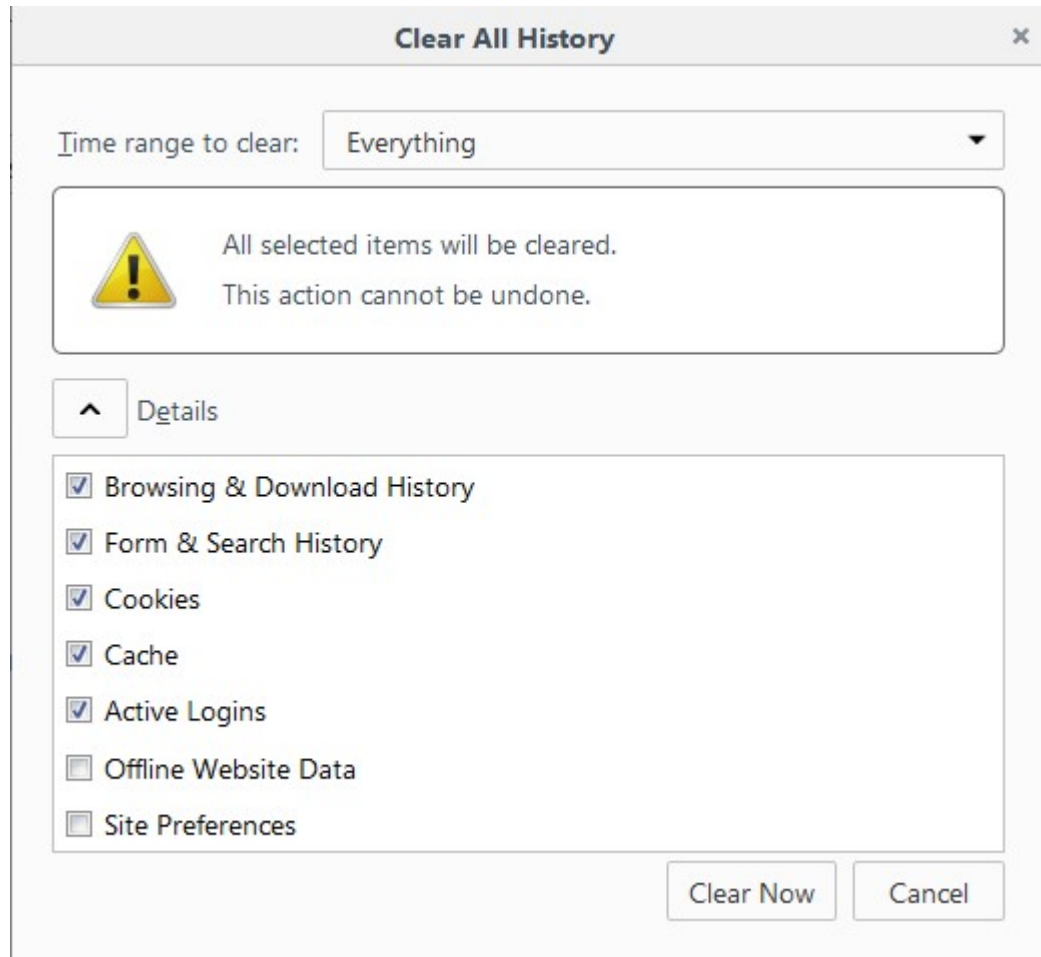

4.1 Clear Cache

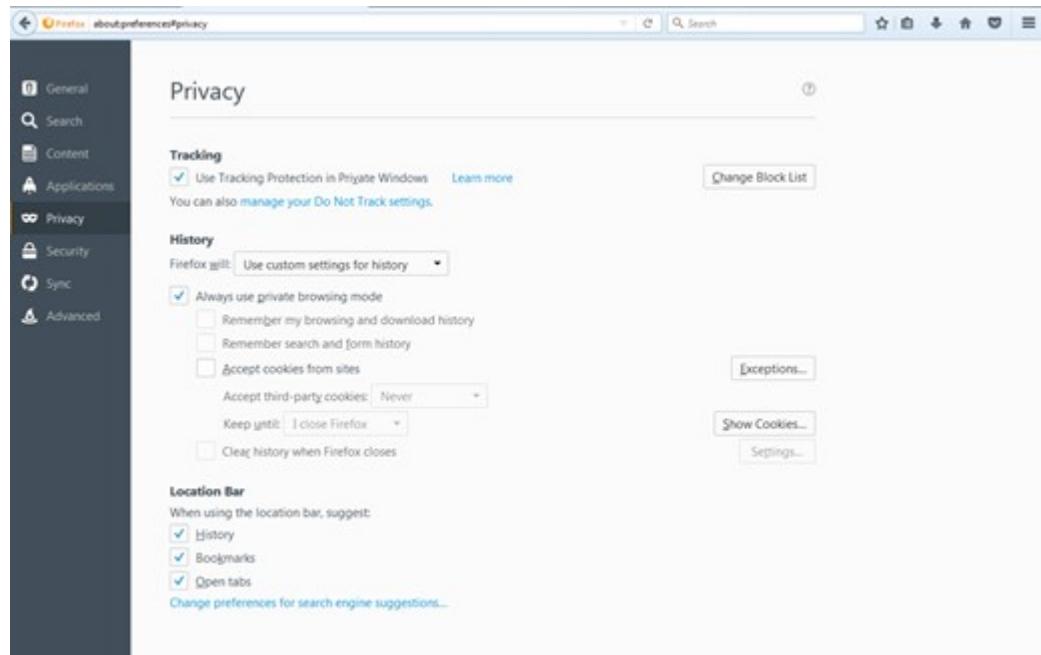
1. Start the **Firefox** application.
