When upgrading a prior 32-bit implementation to a 13.0.2 (or later) 64-bit implementation, a full recompile will be required using new headers. Certain function and structure prototypes have changed. For instance, any functions conforming to the FAPHANDLER call parameters will have changed.

It will be important to review any compile errors or warnings complaining about the size of "long" versus "pointer" type variables. In 64-bit, a pointer cannot be stored in a long value as previously supported by 32-bit applications.
