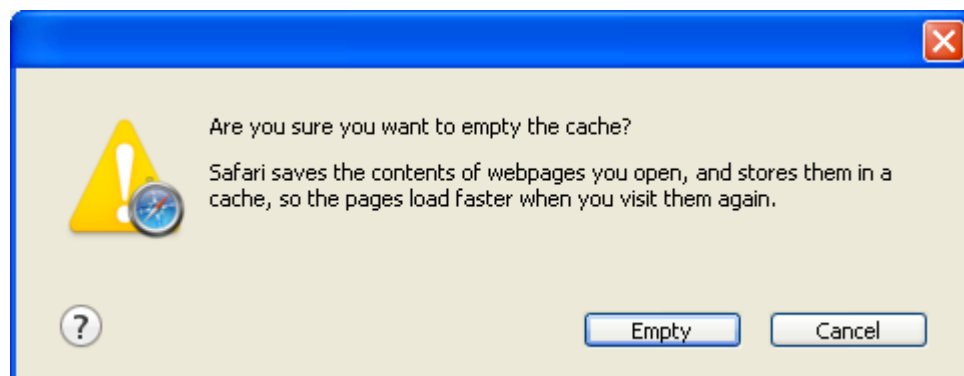

**Figure 1-1 Clear Cache**



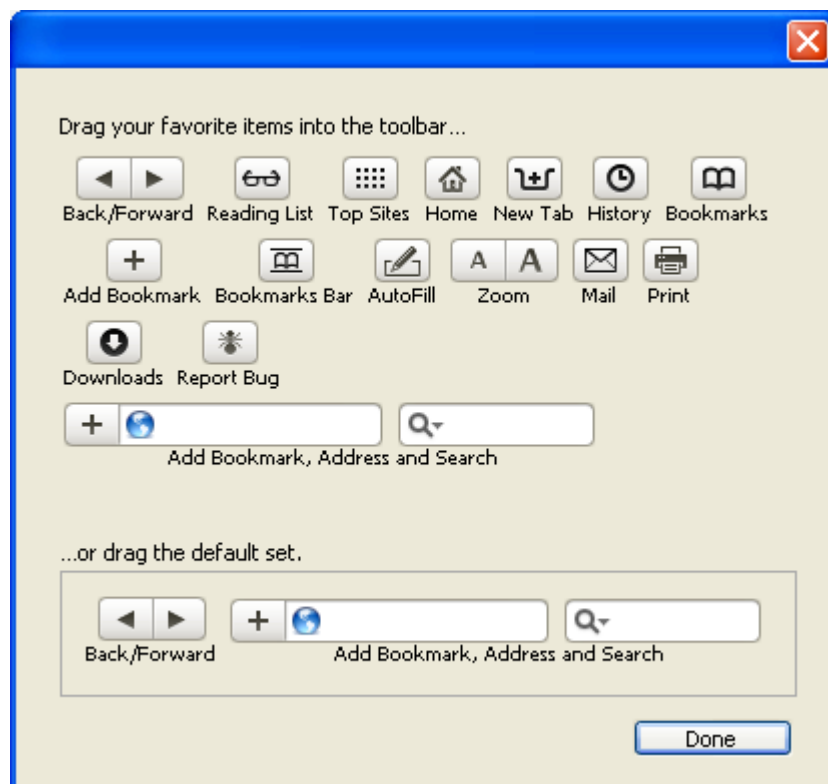
4. Click **Empty** to clear the cache.
