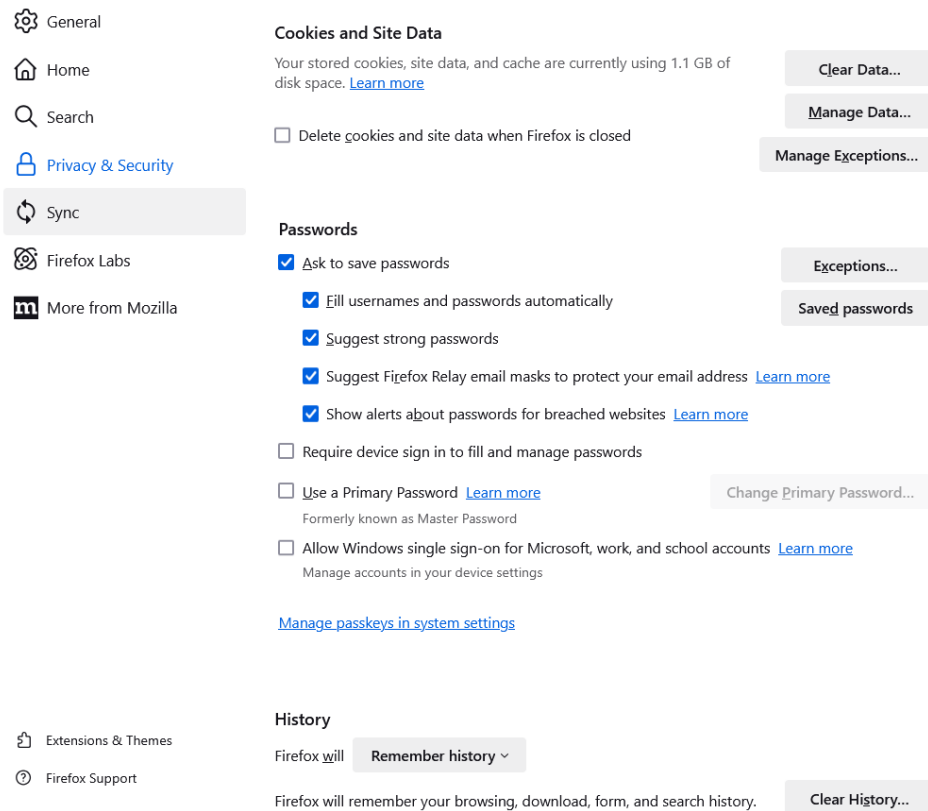

Figure 1-1 Clear Cache

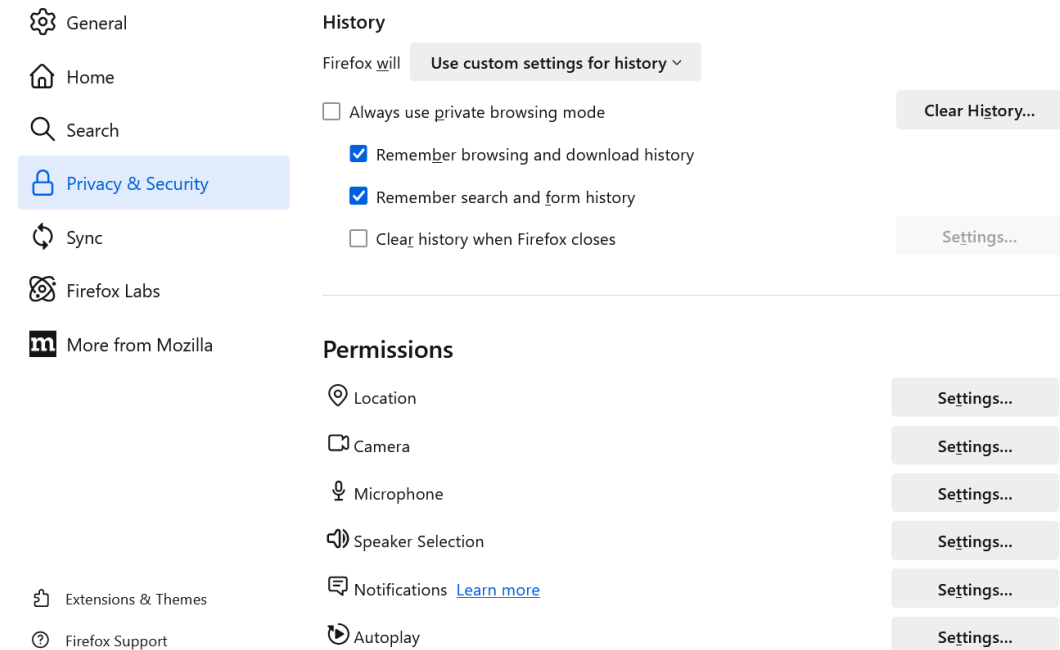
5. On the **Privacy and Security** screen, under **History**, click **Clear History**.

6. On the **Clear Recent History** window, select the **Everything** option in the field of **Time range to clear**.
7. Click **OK**.

6. Under **History**, check the **Always use private browsing mode** box.
7. Click **OK**.

5. On the **Privacy and Security** screen, under **Permissions**, check the **Block pop-up windows** box, and then click **Exceptions**.
