Overview

Oracle Retail Brand Compliance Management Cloud Service is an application designed to meet all aspects of sourcing, developing, and protecting retailer brands. The application provides solutions for product development, compliance, quality, and traceability. It is designed specifically for retail, food service, and manufacturing businesses to develop and protect their brands, manage their suppliers, and ensure full end-to-end product lifecycle management.

Oracle Retail Brand Compliance Management Cloud Service is composed of the following modules:

- Library enables the issue, receipt, and acceptance of policies, guidelines, and key working documents.
- Product supports the development of products and production specifications.
- Project supports the development of project briefs, plans, and workflow management.
- Supplier enables the identification, selection, and approval of suppliers.
- Reports - reporting tool for reporting across the system, using standard templates and custom reports.

When starting a Brand Compliance Management cloud service implementation, there are a number of key considerations and actions you will need to take. This document outlines the most important actions and provides a general timeline for when many of these actions should be completed to ensure success for your implementation. These actions are divided up into the following phases:

Audience

This document is intended for your service administrator. The service administrator is the key person in your business that manages your Brand Compliance Management cloud service. Oracle will target important communications to the service administrator, such as the initial welcome email that is described in this document. If the person who receives this email is not the person or part of the group of people that will be taking responsibilities for the tasks in this document, please work with your Customer Success Manager (CSM) to have that the name updated.

Pre-Provisioning

Pre-provisioning is the period after contracts are signed, but before receiving your environments, where some key activities can occur related to your upcoming implementation. For Brand Compliance Management cloud service implementations, your Customer Success Manager (CSM) will be your main point of contact for these activities.

Activate IDCS

Identity Cloud Service (IDCS) is the user identity solution for most Oracle Retail cloud services. A foundation-level IDCS subscription comes with your retail subscription, but can also be purchased separately, if desired, such as for use as an enterprise identity provider or to manage PaaS or IaaS instances, metrics, and so on. However, it should be noted that these are not applicable for your Brand Compliance Management subscription, as the Brand Compliance Management solution utilizes it only for administration of users. IDCS requires your subscribed cloud service to be attached within an Oracle Cloud Account.

You will receive an activation email from Oracle in the initial stages of provisioning, often immediately following your subscription order being booked. You will need to activate your IDCS account in order to begin the Brand Compliance Management provisioning activities. Promptly completing the activations steps will better enable on-time environment delivery.

Note:

IDCS activation does NOT impact billing or the subscription service period. Those details are connected to the subsequent environment delivery of the Brand Compliance Management cloud service.

The activation process after login may take you to Oracle Cloud My Services Dashboard. Once you have an account with login credentials, you can sign in directly using the following URL: <https://cloud.oracle.com>. From here, you are able to confirm activation status by clicking in the Account Management section. Within Account Management, find the Activate tab/section. If there are pending activations, they will be provided in list format with a link next to each item for you to complete the action.

Creating an Oracle Cloud Account



Note:

An Oracle Cloud Account is not the same as your My Oracle Support account. The Oracle Cloud Account account exists within IDCS and is used for managing user security within the Brand Compliance Management solution.

To start the setup, you click the Activate link provided in the received email. Then the following steps are required:

1. Provide the desired name for the Oracle Cloud Account.
2. Provide a valid email address for the Cloud Account.
3. Provide the initial Administrator information.
4. Create the account.



Note:

For Brand Compliance Management you will require two instances of IDCS, one for the stage environment, and one for the production environment.

You must create the additional instance of IDCS for stage in order for Oracle to progress provisioning. The IDCS instance for production will be created at Cloud Account activation.

Contact Oracle for instructions on how to complete this task.

Prepare Project Team

During this time, you will also be putting together your project plan for the deployment and go-live phases of your implementation. It is important to consider the following during this planning phase to prepare your project team for the Brand Compliance Management implementation:

- **Identity Cloud Service** - As noted above, you will be using IDCS as part of user management for your Brand Compliance Management cloud service. During the pre-provisioning timeframe, familiarize yourself with this solution and its features. <https://docs.oracle.com/en/cloud/paas/identity-cloud/index.html>
- **Project Team Training** - Consider the training that the members of your team will need in order to make your implementation successful. This includes both your employees, as well as your systems integration partner. Suggested training topics to consider include:

- Functional User Training
- BI Publisher
- **Security Configurations** - During this phase, you should designate a portion of your team to becoming familiar with IDCS and the enterprise roles, duties, and privileges that will be part of the Brand Compliance Management cloud service you are implementing.

Note:

IDCS manages Brand Compliance Management user access, however new user accounts are created within Brand Compliance Management and automatically synchronized with IDCS.

- **System Options Configuration** - Start reviewing the system options available in the Brand Compliance Management solution to determine how these should be configured. Work with your systems integrator to identify those you are unsure about or need to be considered in the program planning. See the *Oracle Retail Brand Compliance Management Cloud Service Administration Guide* for details of the configuration options for Brand Compliance Management.
- **Integration Planning** - Start reviewing the available existing integrations available as part of the Brand Compliance Management cloud service to support any integrations you may need to external solutions. Key documents to review include:
 - Brand Compliance Cloud Service Implementation Guide - This will be an important document to review if you are implementing Brand Compliance Management external systems using the available ReST services. The *Oracle Retail Brand Compliance Management Cloud Service Implementation Guide* is located with the Brand Compliance Management Cloud Service user documentation on Oracle Help Center.
 - Retail Reference Library - This tool is free to all Oracle Retail customers and can be downloaded from My Oracle Support under [Doc ID 2058843.2](#). This tool is composed of multiple parts, but the most critical to become familiar with are the Retail Reference Models (business process flows) and the Retail Reference Architecture (integration diagrams, payloads, and so on).

Provisioning

Once your environments are ready for you, the person designated as your service administrator will receive a welcome email: one for each cloud service and each environment (stage, production, and so on). This email has several key pieces of information:

- User name
This user is referred to as the Service Administrator user in this document. A temporary password will be sent in a separate email.
- Link to IDCS (Identity Cloud Service)
- Links to your Brand Compliance Management cloud services
You should receive one email for each cloud service you purchased, including the Oracle Retail Integration Cloud Service.
- Customer Support (CSI) Number

It is recommended that you save this email for future reference, because at this point the service administrator is the only person with access.

Access IDCS

Once you receive your welcome email, it is recommended that you, as the system administrator, log in to IDCS to verify your access and create a new password. You will be assigned to the application administrator group for your production Brand Compliance Management cloud service environment. For more details on the default groups, refer to the administration guide specific to your cloud service.

It is also recommended that you add additional administrators in order to have a backup administrator and share in user management administration, as at this point no one else in your organization will have access to IDCS or Brand Compliance Management solutions. For assistance in creating users or adding them to groups, see the following documents:

Note:

As Brand Compliance Management will have two instances of IDCS, one for the stage environment, and one for the production environment, you must complete this task for each instance.

Validate Cloud Service Access

Next, you should validate that you are able to access and successfully log in to the Brand Compliance Management cloud services for which you have been provisioned using the URLs provided in the email, along with the user name and password.

Register Customer Support Identifier

The welcome email will also include your Customer Support Identifier (CSI). This should be registered with My Oracle Support (MOS), which you will use to log questions or issues about these services. Follow the link in the email or access support.oracle.com to create a new account. If you already have an MOS account, remember to add your new CSI to your existing MOS account.

The first person to request access to a CSI will be checked by Oracle to ensure the domain of their email address matches the domain associated with the CSI. Once approved, they will be made the Customer User Administrator of that CSI, and can approve others to use it. If someone else has already been made the administrator of that CSI, then an email will be sent with the request to that person for approval. Note:

You will not be able to register your CSI number until your production environment has been provisioned.

Post-Provisioning

In the first few days after your initial provisioning, it is recommended that you do each of the following tasks, as they are applicable for your implementation.

Cloud Service Documentation

Refer to the Deployment chapter for a complete list of documentation, training materials, and information about the Oracle Retail community.

Cloud Service Access

Set up accounts for users who will be part of implementing the service, including business owners and implementation partners.

Access My Oracle Support

Validate access to the My Oracle Support portal (see Register Customer Support Identifier for registration and access to the Support portal) to ensure you have access to log Service Requests, view the knowledge base, and download content.

BI Publisher

BI Publisher is available as part of your Brand Compliance Management cloud service subscription. It allows you access to create custom reports directly against the Brand Compliance database. Reports created in BI Publisher can be scheduled, exported into a spreadsheet or other document, or can be configured to run as a custom report. For more information on using BI Publisher to create custom reports, see the *Oracle Retail Brand Compliance Management Cloud Service Reports User Guide*. See also the Oracle documentation on BI Publisher.

Note:

Brand Compliance Management uses the BI Publisher software in an embedded model. This means that you as a user will not interact directly with BI Publisher. Instead, you will have access to report templates within Brand Compliance Management that can be utilized. You will also have the ability to create your own templates and upload these into Brand Compliance Management for report generation.

Retail Home

Oracle Retail Home is a role-based, web portal for the retail enterprise and a user's launch pad to data and supporting solutions most relevant to their role: buyer, planner, inventory analyst, promotional manager, to name just a few.

Frequently Asked Questions

This chapter provides answers to frequently asked questions.

IDCS Activation

Since the Brand Compliance Management cloud services are installed using the activated IDCS details, it is important to ensure any activation concerns are resolved during the pre-provisioning/provisioning period, as making changes after your Brand Compliance Management cloud services are provisioned may require extended downtime.

What should I do if I cannot activate IDCS into an existing Oracle Cloud Account?

Inform your CSM or sales representative if you run into issues, providing the following information:

- Existing Oracle Account name
- Subscription ID of a service in the account
- Administrator email for the account

What do I do if I experience errors or failures while attempting to activate IDCS?

The administrator email address must match the email which received the activation notification. If this does match and you are still running into issues, inform your CSM or sales representative, providing the following information:

- Intended activation approach (new Oracle Cloud Account or activate within an existing)
- Any error or failure messages received - include screen shots if possible

Can I use another identity management solution?

Only IDCS is supported in Brand Compliance Management Cloud Service implementations, however IDCS could also be integrated with external identity management providers, such as Active Directory, using its APIs.

I have multiple pre-production environments and want to have different security configurations for the same users/roles in each, can I do that?

For Brand Compliance Management, if you have multiple pre-production environments you will also have multiple IDCS tenants. This allows you to configure the Brand Compliance Management environments with different users and different role setups without having an effect on the production environment.

Cloud Service Access

I have added new users. Why are they unable to access the application?

Validate that you have the correct group/role assigned to your users in IDCS.

Ensure that the equivalent user is also set up within Brand Compliance Management.

The sequence of events to create new users for Brand Compliance Management, is to create these through the Brand Compliance Management user interface. This will in turn create the IDCS user and associate that user with the appropriate groups in IDCS.

Other

I want other users in my company to receive notifications about upgrades, planned downtime, and maintenance periods. How do I add other users?

To get the backup member or distribution list added to notifications about upgrades, monthly updates, planned downtime, and maintenance periods, raise a MOS SR with the details of the members to be added to the Notification.
